COME NOW the State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police (hereinafter, the "Division") and Osage Gaming, LLC d/b/a Osage Gaming (hereinafter, "Osage Gaming" or "Licensee"), who file this Joint Motion for Approval of Compromise and Settlement Agreement, and in support thereof would respectively show unto the Hearing Officer as follows:

The Division and Licensee are desirous of compromising and settling all disputes between them relative to the referenced administrative proceeding. In connection therewith, the parties have entered into a compromise and settlement agreement which by its terms will become effective upon approval by the Administrative Hearing Office and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board.

COMPROMISE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State

Police (hereinafter, the "Division") and Osage Gaming, LLC d/b/a Osage Gaming (hereinafter,

"Osage Gaming" or "Licensee"), License No. 4600613597, do hereby represent and agree as

follows:

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board has issued a Notice of

Recommendation of Administrative Action, alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming

Control Law; and

WHEREAS, the issues raised by the said Notice of Recommendation of Administrative

Action are set for hearing before the Louisiana Gaming Control Board Administrative Hearing

Officer; and

WHEREAS, the Division and Licensee are desirous of fully and finally compromising

and settling all issues and disputes arising out of and in connection with the said Notice of

Recommendation of Administrative Action; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto do hereby

agree and stipulate as follows:

#### STIPULATIONS

- 1. On or about March 5, 2007, the Division issued, via United States Postal Service, an Annual Licensee Form to Osage Gaming. Osage Gaming was to submit the Annual Licensee Form and the appropriate annual fees and tax clearance certificates by July 1, 2007.
- 2. On September 7, 2007, the Division received the Annual Licensee Form, annual fees, and tax clearance certificates from Osage Gaming, which it mailed, via certified mail, to the Division on September 5, 2007.
- 3. On December 10, 2007, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board issued a Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action to the Licensee alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law.
- 4. The Licensee does admit it violated La. R.S. 27:311K(4)(a), La. R.S. 27:311K(4)(d), LAC 42:XI.2405(B)(4)(a), and LAC 42: XI.2405(B)(4)(b).

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1. Within fifteen (15) days of the approval of this settlement by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, the Licensee shall pay a civil penalty of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) for the violation of La. R.S. 27:311K(4)(a), La. R.S. 27:311K(4)(d), LAC 42:XI.2405(B)(4)(a), and LAC 42: XI.2405(B)(4)(b).
- 2. The Division hereby agrees to accept the payment of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in full and final settlement of the Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action.
- 3. The Division reserves the right to take into consideration these admitted violations in connection with any future investigation, violation or assessment of penalty, and in connection with any future assessments of the Licensee's suitability.

4. The terms of this Compromise and Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted

under the laws of the State of Louisiana.

This Compromise and Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement

between the Division and the Licensee pertaining to the subject matter contained herein and

supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations and understandings of the

parties.

5.

6. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement is subject to approval by the

Hearing Officer and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. It is expressly understood that if this

proposed settlement is approved by the Hearing Officer, this agreement is not thereby executory,

but will be submitted to the Louisiana Gaming Control Board for its determination as to whether

to approve same or to remand the matter to the Hearing Officer for a full hearing on the merits.

7. If approved by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, the Licensee must pay One

Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) within fifteen (15) calendar days of such approval. Any failure to

meet this requirement will result in immediate suspension of the gaming license without the

necessity of any further administrative action until such time as the penalty is paid in full.

I have read this entire Compromise and Settlement Agreement and agree to all stipulations and

terms and conditions hereof.
