 6 public comment period. If anyone would
 7 like to comment on an agenda item before
 8 the Board today, now is the time to come
 9 forward.
 10 Okay. Seeing none.
 11 We will now move on to Item III, the
 12 approval of the minutes. I would ask for
 13 a motion to waive the reading and approve
 14 the minutes of the February 26, 2026 Board
 15 meeting.

 18 Is there any discussion?
 19 Any opposition?
 20 Hearing none, that motion carries.
 21 Moving on to Item IV on our agenda,
 22 our revenue reports.
 23 Good morning, Ms. Jackson.
 24 MS. JACKSON:
 25 Good morning, Chairman Hebert and

1 Next, is a summary of the February
 2 2026 gaming activity for Caesars New
 3 Orleans, found on page 3. Caesars
 4 generated \$25,227,947 in gross gaming
 5 revenue. These revenues represent an
 6 increase of \$4.1 million or 19% from last
 7 month, but a decrease of \$5.4 million, or
 8 17.7%, from the same month last year.
 9 During February, the state received
 10 \$4,986,301 in minimum daily payments.
 11 To date, Adjusted Gross Receipts for
 12 fiscal year '25-'26 are approximately \$197
 13 million, an increase of \$21 million or 12%
 14 from fiscal year '24-'25. As of February
 15 28, 2026, the state collected \$43.3
 16 million in fees for fiscal year '25-'26.
 17 Next, I'll present the revenues for
 18 Slots at the Racetracks. During February,
 19 the four racetrack facilities combined
 20 generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
 21 \$27,820,646, an increase of \$3.7 million
 22 or 15.4% from the previous month and an
 23 increase of \$2.6 million or 10% when
 24 compared to the same month last year.
 25 During February, the state collected

 4 In February, the 15.
 5 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 6 Ms. Jackson, could you pull your mic
 7 a little closer?
 8 MS. JACKSON:
 9 In February, the 15 operating
 10 riverboats generated Adjusted Gross
 11 Receipts of \$158,797,111. The state
 12 collected fees totaling \$34,141,379.
 13 Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
 14 year '25-'26 to date are approximately
 15 \$1,234 million, an increase of \$92.8
 16 million or 8% from fiscal year '24-'25.
 17 As of February 28, 2026, the state
 18 has collected \$265 million in fees for
 19 fiscal year '25-'26.
 20 Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue
 21 broken down by regional market. The
 22 overall increase from January was \$5
 23 million or 3.3%. Compared to last
 24 February, this month's revenues represent
 25 an increase of \$9 million or 6%.

1 approximately \$4.2 million in state fees.
 2 To date, Adjusted Gross Receipts for
 3 fiscal year '25-'26 are \$206.8 million, an
 4 increase of \$5.4 million or 3% from fiscal
 5 year '24-'25. As of February 28, 2026,
 6 the state has collected \$31.4 million in
 7 fees for fiscal year '25-'26.
 8 I will now move to the Video Gaming
 9 information.
 10 There are 12,763 video gaming
 11 devices activated at 1,371 locations. Net
 12 Device Revenue for February 2026 was
 13 \$68,531,172, an increase of \$4 million or
 14 6.7% when compared to January 2026, and an
 15 increase of \$5.5 million or 8.7% when
 16 compared to last February. Total
 17 Franchise Fees for February were \$20.7
 18 million. Fiscal year to date Net Device
 19 Revenue is \$521 million, an increase of
 20 \$31 million or \$6.3% when compared to last
 21 fiscal year.
 22 As of February 28, 2026, the state
 23 has collected \$157 million in franchise
 24 fees for fiscal year '25-'26.
 25 Next, I will present the February

1 revenue for sportsbook. In February,
 2 retail sportsbooks accepted \$15.5 million
 3 in sports wagers, generating net proceeds
 4 of \$578,000 and \$76,000 in state taxes.
 5 The mobile sportsbooks accepted \$289.4
 6 million in sports wagers, resulting in net
 7 proceeds of \$31.7 million and \$6.8 million
 8 in taxes paid to the state.
 9 Finally, for Daily Fantasy Sports,
 10 gross revenues for February were
 11 approximately \$634,000, with net revenue
 12 of \$75,000 and taxes of \$6,000.
 13 Any questions?

 8 providing services as hearing officer in

 3 Good morning, I'm Steven Sumblar,
 4 Assistant Attorney General.
 5 MS. HOTARD:

 7 Police, Gaming Audit Section.
 8 INVESTIGATOR HERSON:
 9 Good morning, Board members. I'm
 10 Investigative Specialist Dwight Herson

 12 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 13 Okay. You may proceed.
 14 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL SUMBLER:
 15 We're here in this matter of the
 16 renewal of the gaming license of Golden
 17 Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, doing business
 18 as Golden Nugget Lake Charles.
 19 Riverboat Gaming Licenses are issued
 20 for a five-year term. Pursuant to
 21 Louisiana Revised Statute 27:75 A, the
 22 Board is required to act on any renewal
 23 application no later than 30 days prior to
 24 the expiration of the current license.
 25 Golden Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, doing

1 Can you hear me?
 2 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 3 You're going to have to pull it
 4 closer.
 5 MS. HOTARD:
 6 Oh, okay.
 7 The Golden Nugget Lake Charles, LLC,
 8 doing business as Golden Nugget Lake
 9 Charles (Golden Nugget), seeks a five-year
 10 renewal of its Riverboat Gaming License.
 11 Fertitta Entertainment, Incorporated is
 12 the ultimate parent of Golden Nugget
 13 through several intermediate subsidiaries.
 14 Since commencing gaming operations
 15 in December of 2014, the licensee has
 16 generated approximately \$3.3 billion in
 17 gaming revenues and paid \$716.6 million in
 18 state gaming fees. During the past five
 19 fiscal years, Golden Nugget generated
 20 approximately \$1.5 billion in Adjusted
 21 Gross Revenue.
 22 Golden Nugget has a Ground Lease
 23 Agreement for the land underlying its
 24 hotel and casino with Lake Charles Harbor
 25 and Terminal District (the port), for

1 business as Golden Nugget Lake Charles'
 2 Riverboat Gaming License is due to expire
 3 on May 19, 2026. The Division has
 4 reviewed the financial circumstances of
 5 the licensee and completed its suitability
 6 investigation of the licensee, its parent
 7 companies and its principals.
 8 At this time, Ms. Lisa Hotard and
 9 Investigator Dwight Herson will provide
 10 their findings to the Board. Following
 11 their presentation, if it is the Board's
 12 pleasure to renew the Riverboat Gaming
 13 License of Golden Nugget Lake Charles,
 14 LLC, doing business as Golden Nugget Lake
 15 Charles, a proposed Resolution has been
 16 prepared for the Board's adoption and the
 17 Chairman's signature.
 18 MS. HOTARD:
 19 Good morning, Chairman.
 20 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 21 Good morning.
 22 MS. HOTARD:
 23 Chairman Hebert and Board members,
 24 my name is Lisa Hotard with the Louisiana
 25 State Police, Gaming Audit Section.

1 which it pays an annual base rental
 2 payment in addition to monthly fees based
 3 on a percentage of net gaming proceeds.
 4 For the past five fiscal years, the
 5 combined payments to the port totaled over
 6 \$19.4 million.
 7 Finally, the Golden Nugget pays the
 8 Calcasieu Parish Gaming District a
 9 percentage of net gaming, adjusted for the
 10 rental payments made to the port, which
 11 totaled approximately \$53.5 million for
 12 the years 2021 through 2025. A percentage
 13 of these funds are disbursed to various
 14 local entities to support local
 15 infrastructure, community projects and
 16 public services within the parish.
 17 For the years 2021 through 2025,
 18 Golden Nugget made approximately \$82
 19 million in enhancements to the property,
 20 including the construction of its
 21 DraftKings sportsbook lounge and
 22 renovations.
 23 Additionally, the licensee is
 24 committed to investing in further
 25 improvements to the property over the next

21

1 five years, as shown on page six of the
 2 Audit's report.
 3 In conclusion, no financial issues
 4 came to our attention to preclude the
 5 Board from approving the Golden Nugget's
 6 Riverboat Gaming License for a period of
 7 five years, effective May 19, 2026.
 8 Licensing will now present their
 9 findings.
 10 INVESTIGATOR HERSON:
 11 Good morning, Chairman and Board
 12 members. Again, my name is Investigative
 13 Specialist Dwight Herson with the
 14 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement
 15 Division.
 16 On December 29, 2025, the Golden
 17 Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, doing business
 18 as Golden Nugget Lake Charles and its
 19 parent companies submitted their five-year
 20 renewal application packet.
 21 In accordance with the rules and
 22 regulations of the Gaming Enforcement
 23 Division, a background investigation was
 24 conducted on Golden Nugget Lake Charles,
 25 LLC, doing business as Golden Nugget Lake

 21 And this is just for the benefit of
 22 the reporter. Could you please repeat the
 23 name?

 25 John Hamati.

1 Charles, its affiliated entities,
 2 officers, directors, key individuals and
 3 persons with 5% or more ownership or
 4 economic interest in the licensee.
 5 The background investigation
 6 consisted of inquiries to federal, state
 7 and local law enforcement agencies, civil
 8 jurisdictions, gaming regulatory agencies,

 18 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 19 Okay. Thank you, Mr. Herson.
 20 We do have representatives from the
 21 licensee here this morning.
 22 Before we hear from them, Board
 23 members, are there any questions for the
 24 Attorney General's Office or the State
 25 Police on this matter?

24

1 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 2 Okay. Thank you. All right. So
 3 what's going on at the Golden Nugget?
 4 MR. HAMATI:
 5 Well, first of all, you know, Mr.
 6 Chairman and Members of the Board, thank
 7 you very much for -- for hearing us today.
 8 And we're very, very proud to be part of
 9 Louisiana and the Golden Nugget in
 10 Louisiana.
 11 The Golden Nugget Lake Charles has
 12 been a cornerstone of Lake Charles for
 13 over seven years now. And according to
 14 Visit Lake Charles, we have been named as
 15 the number 1 destination of visitors to
 16 Lake Charles. We represent the big
 17 cornerstone. We're very proud and would
 18 like to hold on to that.
 19 In the eleven years the property has
 20 been in operation, we have done quite a
 21 bit of capital improvement to the property
 22 including really the sportsbook that was
 23 mentioned earlier, but we also have done
 24 -- have -- have put into submission, the
 25 total renovation of the guest rooms, which

25

1 is about 200 rooms and we're managing and
 2 doing a full renovation of the guest
 3 rooms. However, it is here that we focus
 4 on the exterior property of the -- of the
 5 facility. And the -- the meaning by that
 6 on landscaping and the way -- the way you
 7 approach the property is all being
 8 renovated. And we've -- we've hired a
 9 designer to make sure that the entrance
 10 continues to be of good quality for -- for
 11 the area and for the facility itself.
 12 In addition to the -- to the --to
 13 the beautifications, I want to bring to
 14 the attention that Golden Nugget, you
 15 know, holds about twenty-six concerts a
 16 year, that brings into the area visitors
 17 from the neighboring state as well as from
 18 southwest Louisiana. And we are the --
 19 the number 1 choice for -- for the
 20 Louisiana Association including the police
 21 jury, including the government purchasing,
 22 LIPA and the correctional institute -- the
 23 Correctional Association.
 24 So well -- we are very well
 25 established and we would like to continue

1 MR. HAMATI:
 2 Yeah, we have some. Yes.
 3 MR. SHOLES:
 4 Can you explain to us why when
 5 you're so profitable people are not making
 6 a living wage?
 7 MR. HAMATI:
 8 I really cannot answer that question
 9 because it depends on the market and the
 10 market demands, and the demand of the
 11 market -- if falls within the market of
 12 demand.
 13 MR. SHOLES:
 14 So if -- if the market -- if
 15 everybody else is underpaid, you agree
 16 that that's what you should do?
 17 MR. HAMATI:
 18 Well, we stay competitive as the
 19 market demands.
 20 MR. SHOLES:
 21 I -- I -- I'm just having some
 22 difficulty accepting that folks are making
 23 -- are doing so well, being profitable in
 24 the state of Louisiana and then not being
 25 willing to pay a living wage to our

26

1 to be established for this area and we
 2 wanted the Board to know that we are part
 3 of this -- this establishment, part of
 4 Louisiana, part of the establishment and
 5 we will continue to be part of it. And
 6 thank you for listening to us.
 7 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 8 Do we have any questions for the
 9 Board -- from the Board from this
 10 licensee?
 11 MR. SHOLES:
 12 Not today.
 13 CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
 14 Okay.

 2 law and whether their conduct poses a
 3 threat to the public interest or the
 4 effective regulation of gaming.
 5 Additionally, Louisiana Revised
 6 Statute 27:28(D) makes clear that the
 7 Board may consider evidence relating to

 9 determining suitability regardless of the
 10 outcome of those proceedings. In other
 11 words, suitability determinations are not
 12 dependent on criminal convictions. The
 13 focus is the conduct itself and whether

 16 evidence presented at the revocation
 17 hearing established conduct that clearly

 20 Greenwood Police Department obtained an

 22 of a Motor Vehicle and Aggravated Criminal
 23 Damage to Property. On January 3rd of
 24 2025, the Permittee surrendered to the
 25 Caddo Parish Sheriff's Office pursuant to

 2 The Louisiana law is clear that
 3 hearing officers serve as the primary
 4 factfinders in administrative proceedings.
 5 The role of the Board on appeal is limited
 6 to determining whether the decision is
 7 supported by sufficient competent evidence

 9 the legal conclusions reached. In this
 10 matter, the record fully supports the
 11 Hearing Officer's determination.
 12 The Louisiana Gaming Control Law
 13 establishes strict and comprehensive
 14 suitability standards for anyone seeking

 16 industry. Under the Louisiana Revised
 17 Statute 27:28(A), the Board and the
 18 Division must determine whether an
 19 individual possesses the good character,
 20 honesty, and integrity necessary to
 21 participate in gaming. The statute
 22 further indicates that the Board can
 23 consider a person's prior activities,
 24 criminal history, habits, reputation, and
 25 associations to determine whether that

1 that warrant. Subsequently, on March 5th
 2 of 2025, a Bill of Information was filed
 3 in the First Judicial District Court
 4 charging her with violations of Louisiana
 5 Revised Statute 14:67.26 and Louisiana
 6 Revised Statute 14:55, the latter being
 7 classified as a crime of violence.
 8 The testimony presented at the
 9 hearing provided detailed evidence
 10 regarding the underlying conduct. An

 23 gate, the Permittee ignored that
 24 instruction, entered a vehicle that had
 25 been lawfully repossessed for failure to

 2 As the employee attempted to secure the
 3 gate, the Permittee drove the vehicle
 4 toward him and struck the gate and fence
 5 of the business while fleeing the
 6 property.
 7 Officer Trammell further identified
 8 the casino identification card the
 9 Permittee left at the scene, which
 10 displayed her name, photograph, position
 11 at the casino, and her gaming permit
 12 number. Investigator Sam identified the
 13 permit number and expiration date on that
 14 card that corresponded with the
 15 Permittee's gaming permit. Photographs of
 16 the damaged gate and fence were also
 17 introduced into the record, demonstrating
 18 the property damage caused during the
 19 incident.
 20 In short, the evidence establishes
 21 that after her vehicle was lawfully
 22 repossessed, the Permittee chose not to
 23 pursue any lawful means of resolving the
 24 matter. Instead, she entered private
 25 property without authorization, forcibly

 5 Even setting aside the statutory
 6 disqualification, the underlying conduct
 7 alone demonstrates that the Permittee does
 8 not possess the character and integrity
 9 required to hold a gaming permit.
 10 The Permittee also asserts that she
 11 has always valued her career as a
 12 blackjack dealer and that she has
 13 demonstrated honesty and integrity at
 14 work. However, those assertions are not
 15 supported by the record and cannot be
 16 considered by the Board on appeal.
 17 More importantly, suitability in the
 18 gaming industry is not limited to conduct
 19 during working hours. Every gaming
 20 permittee has a continuing duty to
 21 maintain suitability at all times. The
 22 standard is not whether an individual
 23 behaves appropriately while on the casino
 24 floor. The standard is whether that
 25 individual consistently demonstrates the

54

1 retook the vehicle, and rammed through a
 2 gate while an employee attempted to stop
 3 her. This behavior demonstrates far more
 4 than poor judgment. It reflects a blatant
 5 disregard for the law, the safety of
 6 others, and the property rights of others.
 7 Conduct that is fundamentally inconsistent
 8 with the standards of honesty, integrity,
 9 and good character required for gaming
 10 permittees.
 11 The Permittee argues in her appeal
 12 that she has not been convicted of a
 13 felony. However, that argument
 14 misunderstands the law governing
 15 suitability. A criminal conviction is not
 16 required for the Board to determine that
 17 an individual is unsuitable. Louisiana
 18 Gaming Law expressly allows the Board to
 19 consider arrests, charges, and surrounding
 20 conduct in determining suitability.
 21 Moreover, the record reflects that a Bill
 22 of Information was filed charging the
 23 Permittee with Theft of a Motor Vehicle
 24 and Aggravated Criminal Damage to
 25 Property. Offenses punishable by more

56

1 good character, honesty, and integrity
 2 required to protect the public interest
 3 and the integrity of the gaming industry.
 4 The Permittee's actions in this incident
 5 clearly fall short of that standard.
 6 Finally, it is important to
 7 emphasize that even if the criminal
 8 charges were later dismissed, that would
 9 not change the conduct established in this
 10 record. The issue before the Board is not
 11 whether the Permittee is criminally guilty
 12 beyond a reasonable doubt. The issue is
 13 whether her actions demonstrate that she
 14 is suitable to hold the privilege of a
 15 gaming permit. The evidence clearly shows
 16 that she does not.
 17 And for these reasons, the Hearing
 18 Officer correctly determined that the
 19 Permittee is unsuitable to participate in
 20 the Louisiana gaming industry and that her
 21 Non-Key Gaming Employee Permit should be
 22 revoked.
 23 Accordingly, the Division
 24 respectfully requests that the Louisiana
 25 Gaming Control Board affirm the Hearing

1 Officer's decision and uphold the
 2 revocation of the Permittee's gaming
 3 permit and the finding of unsuitability.
 4 Thank you.
