- 15 CHAIRMAN NOEL: All right. We'll
- move onto the approval of the minutes.
- 17 I'd ask for a motion to waive
- 18 reading and approve the minutes of the
- 19 July 16th, 2020, meeting.
- 20 MR. POOLE: So moved.
- 21 MR. LAGASSE: So moved.
- 22 CHAIRMAN NOEL: I think Mr. Avant --
- okay. Mr. Poole moved and Mr. Lagasse
- seconded.
- 25 All in favor?

- 1 ("Aye" in unison.)
- 2 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any opposed?
- 3 No opposition. So the motion
- 4 carries. Thank you.
- 5 V. REVENUE REPORTS
- 6 CHAIRMAN NOEL: We'll move on --
- 7 into Revenue Reports. And I would ask
- 8 State Police to present the information.
- 9 MS. JACKSON: Good morning, Chairman
- 10 Noel, Board Members. My name is Donna
- 11 Jackson with Louisiana State Police,
- 12 Gaming Enforcement Division.
- 13 The casinos continue to operate at
- 14 50 percent capacity with 75 percent of

15	gaming positions and operations except
16	for Harrah's New Orleans and Fairgrounds,
17	which are at 25 percent capacity.
18	The 14 operating riverboats
19	generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
20	\$136,984,253 in July. This total
21	represents an increase of \$5 million or
22	3.7 percent from June 2020, but a
23	decrease of \$15.7 million or 10 percent
24	from last July.
25	As information, July is the first
	14
1	month to reflect the reduction of gaming
2	revenue due to promotional play no longer
3	being reported as revenue in accordance
4	with Senate Bill 5 of this year's First
5	Extraordinary Session. State fees
6	collected during July were \$29.5 million.
7	Next is a summary of the July 2020
8	gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans
9	found on page three.
10	Harrah's generated \$12,994,739 in
11	gross gaming revenue during July. These
12	revenues represent a decrease from
13	July last July of \$7.4 million or
14	36 percent, but and increase of
15	\$7.4 million from June 2020 when there
16	were only 18 days of operation.
17	During July, the state received

18	\$5,095,890 in minimum daily payments.
19	Next I will present the revenue for
20	Slots at the Racetracks.
21	During July, the four racetrack
22	facilities combined generated Adjusted
23	Gross Receipts of \$27,645,635, an
24	increase of \$900,000 from June 2020, but
25	a decrease of \$1.5 million or 5.2 percent
	15
1	from last July.
2	State fees collected from racetrack
3	facilities during July totaled
4	\$4.2 million.
5	Overall in July, Riverboats, Land
6	Based and Slots at the Racetracks
7	combined generated \$177.6 million in AGR,
8	which represents a decrease from
9	July 2019 of \$24.7 million or 12 percent.
10	Are there any questions before I
11	present the video gaming statistics?
12	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Questions from
13	members of the Board? Ms. Berry?
14	MS. BERRY: Donna, I just want to
15	verify something you said. The let's
16	see, where was I? There was an increase
17	in Harrah's from the previous month, and
18	they're only at 25 percent capacity; is
19	that what you said?
20	MS. JACKSON: That is correct.

- 21 MS. BERRY: Okay. Well,
- 22 25 percent --
- 23 CHAIRMAN NOEL: I also believe for
- June they had less days of operation.
- MS. JACKSON: Right.

- 1 MS. BERRY: Oh, okay.
- 2 MS. JACKSON: Only 18 days of
- 3 operation during June, right. They
- 4 opened on June 13th.
- 5 MS. BERRY: And they won't move to
- 6 more capacity until the Governor moves to
- 7 the diff- -- next phase; is that correct?
- 8 CHAIRMAN NOEL: That is likely.
- 9 They also have restrictions by the city,
- and that is why they're at 25 percent
- versus 50 percent for the casinos and
- 12 riverboats in other areas of the state.
- 13 MS. BERRY: Okay.
- 14 MR. LAGASSE: You've got to remember
- 15 too --
- 16 MS. JACKSON: As a -- sorry. Sorry.
- 17 MR. LAGASSE: Julie, New Orleans is
- 18 really struggling right now. Bourbon
- 19 Street is completely shut down. There's
- 20 no travel or tourism at all in the city.
- 21 In fact, they have a meeting today. They
- are trying to borrow money to keep the
- 23 city afloat. So, I mean, that whole area

24	is struggling down there right now.
25	MS. BERRY: And that's being
	17
1	declared our, quote, hot spot, I guess,
2	right?
3	MR. LAGASSE: Yes. Not as much
4	not as bad as Jefferson Parish where I
5	live. Jefferson is number one in the
6	state right now.
7	MS. BERRY: Well, not good, but
8	thank you. Thank you, Donna.
9	MS. JACKSON: You're welcome.
10	Okay. I'll move to the video gaming
11	statistics if there are no further
12	questions.
13	Thirteen new video gaming licenses
14	were issued in July: Seven bars, four
15	restaurants, and two device owners.
16	Two new video gaming applications
17	were received by the Gaming Enforcement
18	Division during July and are currently
19	pending in the field, one bar and one
20	device owner.
21	The Gaming Enforcement Division
22	assessed \$2,250 in July, but did not
23	receive any civil penalty payments. As
24	of July 31st, there were \$5,000 in
25	outstanding fines.

1	There are currently 12,700 video
2	gaming devices activated at 1,590
3	locations.
4	Net device revenue for July 2020 was
5	\$62.7 million, a \$12.8 million or
6	25.5 percent increase when compared to
7	July 2019, and a \$2.1 million increase
8	when compared to June 2020.
9	Total franchise fees collected
10	during July 2020 were \$19 million, an
11	\$800,000 increase when compared to
12	June 2020 and a \$4 million or
13	27.8 percent increase when compared to
14	July 2019.
15	That concludes the report. Are
16	there any further questions?
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions?
18	Thank you, Ms. Jackson.
19	MS. JACKSON: Thank you.
20	VI. RULEMAKING
21	A. Consideration of Institution of Rulemaking
22	Procedures for Amendment of LAC 42:III.2117
23	(Certification Required, Riverboat Only)
24	CHAIRMAN NOEL: All right. We'll
25	move onto the next item, rulemaking.
	19
1	Consideration of Institution of
2	Rulemaking Procedures for Amendment of
3	LAC 42:III.2117 (Certification Required,

4	Riverboat Only)
5	Ms. Himel?
6	MS. HIMEL: Yes. Good morning,
7	Chairman Noel, Members of the Board. I'm
8	Assistant Attorney General Dawn Himel
9	presenting this rule change.
10	In its 2018 Regular Session, the
11	Louisiana Legislature passed Act No. 469,
12	which provided the opportunity for
13	riverboat licensees to relocate their
14	gaming operations to a facility within
15	1,200 feet of their licensed berth.
16	The law requires riverboat licensees
17	to have the facilities inspected and
18	obtain certificate of compliance from
19	this Board regardless of whether it
20	operates on a vessel or in a landside
21	facility.
22	There's currently a process for the
23	licensee to operating on a vessel to be
24	inspected and issue a COC, but due to the
25	change in law, it is now necessary that
	20
1	the rules be amended to align with the
2	new facility.
3	This rule change would set forth a
4	process for licensees operating in a
5	landside facility to be inspected and to
6	be issued a COC.

7	If the Board has no questions, a
8	motion to institute the rulemaking
9	procedure is needed.
10	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. Yes.
11	What what right now I'll just add a
12	little bit. What brought this on, of
13	course, is with the current approved
14	project for Isle of Capri and others that
15	perhaps we'll bring one up today and
16	any in the future. There was some
17	concern of overlap between and
18	duplication between our current
19	third-party inspector and local local
20	government inspectors, as well as the
21	state fire marshal's office. And so we
22	wanted to clarify that when it comes to
23	the landside construction of new
24	projects, that we wanted to clarify
25	that what would be filed and who would
	21
1	have the ability to conduct those
2	inspections.
3	So any other questions or for
4	Ms. Himel?
5	MR. LAGASSE: I've got a question,
6	Mike. I guess if when they start
7	moving on shore, will will the local
8	fire departments have their jurisdiction,
9	or will that still be state fire marshal?

10 CHAIRMAN NOEL: No. Locals will 11 continue their jurisdiction, and I think, 12 in conversations with the fire marshal's 13 office, that they have a very good 14 relationship and they work together. So 15 the inspection process will be a 16 combination. Locals will look for their 17 local ordinances in compliance in those 18 areas and the fire marshal for life 19 safety --20 MR. LAGASSE: Good. 21 CHAIRMAN NOEL: -- related issues. 22 MR. LAGASSE: Thank you. 23 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Okay. We would need 24 a motion to institute rulemaking. A 25 motion? 22 1 MS. BERRY: I'll move. 2 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Ms. Berry. 3 MR. AVANT: Avant, second. 4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you, sir. 5 Ms. Thurman, could you call the 6 roll. 7 MS. THURMAN: Mr. Avant? 8 MR. AVANT: Yes. 9 MS. And this kind of 8 goes hand in hand with the rule that we 9 just approved for -- to institute 10 rulemaking on. 11 And I'll, again, turn it over to 12 Ms. Himel. 13 MS. HIMEL: Assistant Attorney 14 General Dawn Himel present in this matter

as well. In conjunction with the rule

16	change that was just instituted by this
17	Board to establish a process for the
18	inspection of landside facilities in
19	accordance with the law, it is necessary
20	that the Board consider the approval of
21	the state fire marshal as a third-party
22	inspector authorized to conduct the
23	required inspection of riverboat landside
24	facilities and to present those to the
25	Board or to prepare a report for the
	24
1	Board in order for the Board to issue a
2	certificate of compliance.
3	Should the Board chose to approve
4	the state fire marshal as a third-party
5	inspector, a resolution has been prepared
6	for consideration.
7	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. Are
8	there any questions from the Board
9	regarding this motion or this item?
10	All right. Do we have a motion to
11	adopt the resolution?
12	MR. JACKSON: Jackson. Recommend an
13	approval.

15	supplemental report.
16	MR. FRANCIC: Good morning, Chairman
17	and Board members. I'm John Francic with
18	ABSG Consulting here to report the status
19	of the annual certification for Amelia
20	Belle Casino.
21	On July 28th documentation was
22	received from Amelia Belle Casino on the
23	servicing of elevators and escalators,
24	and found they were compliant with
25	industry standards. This is considered

1	satisfactory.

2	The 2020 annual survey, as required

9	MR. FRANCIC: Good morning, Chairman
LO	and Board Members. John Francic with
l1	ABSG Consulting here to report the annual
12	certification for L'Auberge Baton Rouge
13	Casino.
L4	The inspectors Pete Bullard and Jeff
L5	Bullard did, on July 29th, attend the
L6	L'Auberge Baton Rouge Casino to conduct
L7	the annual inspection in accordance with
L8	the State of Louisiana Alternative
19	Inspection Program.
20	The surveyors reviewed fire
21	protections measures, life safety
22	equipment, egress routes, training
23	records, and conducted a fire drill.
24	There were a few deficiencies that
25	were corrected during the course of the
	31
1	inspection, but all were found
2	satisfactory.
3	The 2020 annual survey, as required
4	by Louisiana Gaming Control Board, is
5	complete and it is the recommendation of
6	ABSG Consulting that L'Auberge
7	Baton Rouge Casino be issued the
8	certificate of compliance.
9	MS. LANDRY: We now present these
10	findings to the Board and request that

- submitted by ABSG, you'll move for the

15	item, Certification Consideration of
16	Certification of Compliance for the
17	Alternate Riverboat Inspection for the
18	gaming vessel of Louisiana Casino
19	Cruises, Incorporated, doing business as
20	Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge - No.
21	R011700193.
22	MS. LANDRY: Assistant Attorney
23	General Lisha Landry and John Francic of
24	ABSG Consulting now here in the matter of
25	the issuance of the annual certificate of
	33
1	compliance to Louisiana Casino Cruises,
2	Inc., doing business as Hollywood Casino
3	Baton Rouge.
4	On June 16th, 2020, ABSG began the
5	inspection process for the approval of
6	Hollywood Casino's annual certificate of
7	compliance.
8	And now Mr. Francic will provide the
9	details on ABSG's inspection.
10	MR. FRANCIC: Chairman, Board
11	Members, I'm John Francic with ABSG
12	Consulting here to report the annual
13	certification for Hollywood Casino
14	Baton Rouge.
15	The inspectors Doug Chapman and Pete
16	Bullard did attend the riverboat casino

17	to conduct the annual inspection in
18	accordance with the alternative
19	inspection of riverboat gaming in the
20	state of Louisiana.
21	The inspectors reviewed fire
22	protection equipment, egress routes,
23	mooring systems, and inspected machinery
24	spaces and conducted a fire drill. There
25	were a few deficiencies found during
	34
1	inspection that can be found on page six
2	and seven of your report. A followup to
3	all the deficient items was done on
4	June 30th. And on July 31st, all
5	deficient items were corrected and found
6	satisfactory.
7	The 2020 annual survey, as required
8	by Louisiana Gaming Control Board, is
9	complete, and it is the recommendation of
10	ABSG Consulting that Hollywood Casino
11	Baton Rouge be issued the certificate of
12	compliance.
13	MS. LANDRY: We now present these
14	findings to the Board and request that
15	upon the Board accepting the report
16	submitted by ABSG, you'll move for the
17	issuance of the annual certificate of
18	compliance to Hollywood Casino, which
19	expires on September 30th, 2021.

20 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. Any 21 questions from the Board? 22 Okay. Then do we have a motion to 23 issue the certificate of compliance for 24 Hollywood? 25 MR. POOLE: I'll make a motion. 35 1 MR. LAGASSE: So moved. 2 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Motion by? 3 MR. POOLE: Lamar. 4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. And 5 seconded by Mr. Lagasse? 6 All right. All in favor say, "Aye." 7 ("Aye" in unison) 8 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any opposed? No 9 opposition. The motion carries, and the 10 certificate of compliance for Hollywood 11 Casino is approved. 12 E. Consideration of Petition for Approval to 13 Relocate Gaming Operations and for Modification 14 of License Conditions for Louisiana Casino 15 Cruises, Inc. d/b/a Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge 16 - No. R011700193 17 CHAIRMAN NOEL: All right. Next 18 item, Consideration of Petition for 19 Approval to Relocate Gaming Operations 20 and for Modification of License 21 Conditions for Louisiana Casino Cruises,

Incorporated, doing business as Hollywood

23 Casino Baton Rouge - No. R011700193. 24 Ms. Himel, I think you will be up 25 first. 36 1 MS. HIMEL: Yes. Good morning. 2 Again, Assistant Attorney General Dawn 3 Himel appearing in the matter of the 4 petition for Louisiana Casino Cruises, 5 Inc., for approval to relocate its gaming 6 operation to a new facility. 7 In the 2018 Regular Session, the 8 Louisiana Legislature passed Act No. 469, 9 which provided the opportunity for a 10 riverboat licensee to relocate its gaming 11 operations to a facility within 1,200 12 feet of its licensed berth. 13 The law and rules require a licensee 14 seeking relocation to submit a site plan, 15 a capital improvement and reinvestment 16 plan, a financing plan, a construction 17 schedule and property descriptions. All 18 required documents were submitted by the 19 licensee to the Division for review and 20 investigation. 21 The licensee's petition is up for 22 consideration today. Neither law nor 23 rule dictate a minimum monetary 24 investment for relocation. It is the 25 Board's discretion on a case-by-case

1	basis.
2	If it is the Board's pleasure to
3	approve the request, a resolution has
4	been prepared for your consideration.
5	The licensee will be allowed to
6	commence gaming activities on its new
7	facility once the Division determines
8	that all necessary staffing, training,
9	security, and surveillance, technical
10	accounting, and internal control
11	procedures are acceptable.
12	Paul West, who is licensee's
13	counsel, will now introduce the
14	licensee's representatives presenting
15	today.
16	Following the licensee's
17	presentation, Lieutenant Adam Albright
18	and Trnessia Ware from Louisiana State
19	Police Enforcement and Audit Office.
20	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.
21	MR. WEST: Good morning. Good
22	morning, Mr. Chairman and Board Members
23	It's an exciting time for Hollywood
24	Casino of Baton Rouge, and we have a team
25	here to present what I think everybody
	38
1	will agree is a very, hopefully,
2	successful move onto land.

3	Obviously, everybody is remote, but
4	we have in Pennsylvania, Peter Carlino
5	who is the President and Chairman and CEO
6	of GLPI, which is a parent company of
7	Hollywood Casino. With him is Brandon
8	Moore who is the Senior Vice-President of
9	General Counsel. And then we have
10	Jeannie Magdefrau here in Baton Rouge
11	who's the general manager of Hollywood
12	Casino itself.
13	I'm going to turn it over to Peter
14	who will make some opening remarks, and
15	then Jeannie will walk you through what
16	the project will look like.
17	MR. CARLINO: Let me see. I just
18	un-muted. Can I am I am I here?
19	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Yes.
20	MR. CARLINO: Okay. Well, thank
21	you. Good morning, everyone,
22	Mr. Chairman, Members of the Commission.
23	I'm pleased to be here with you
24	today. I must confess, I have never done
25	a presentation of this sort in this
	39
1	manner. It's a very strange arrangement.
2	I am, as it turns out, actually in
3	Massachusetts, and, you know, our team is
4	staggered everywhere. So we can't look
5	at each other, we'll do the best we can.

6	A little history, if I may. You
7	might recall that I am the founder of
8	Penn National Gaming. It's my business
9	for almost 50 years. And I bought from
10	Woody Weiser, if I can give you a name
11	from the past. Maybe some still
12	remember. Was the CEO at Carnival Cruise
13	Lines who developed this boat, and oh,
14	gosh, back in the '90s. And we've owned
15	it now for 20 years. Have some, oh,
16	\$300 million plus invested having made
17	some pretty significant improvements to
18	the boat. There's only so much you can
19	do with that thing. And on the land side
20	we, I think, did some very attractive
21	improvements over time.
22	It's been an interesting 20 years.
23	Lots and lots of ups and downs.
24	Tremendous performance. We've had
25	floods. We've had competition.
	40
1	L'Auberge down the road put a dent in our
2	business, as you would recall. But all
3	in all, it's been a wonderful property
4	for us and for our company, and we're
5	thrilled to own it. And this opportunity
6	to go landside, I think is just
7	marvelous. And we are most anxious to do
8	it. And I think when Jeannie goes

9	through the proposal, we'll use the same
10	architect, same interior design folks
11	that have done all my Hollywood casinos
12	over time. I should say that, I'm still
13	chairman of Meredith's and Penn, but my
14	day job is gaming and leisure properties.
15	That's they pay my salary. That's my
16	job day to day. So we are very, very
17	excited about the possibility of doing
18	this.
19	I think the market has faced a
20	number of challenges, declining
21	population. Certainly, I think, you
22	know, and I'm not complaining, but the
23	smoking ban put a real dent in
24	performance it is a sad reality, I
25	guess, that gamblers smoke. And we
	41
1	intend, of course, as part of this new
2	facility to build a patio, which Jeannie
3	will describe, that will allow us to get
4	some of that business back for our
5	smoking customers.
6	We also want to take advantage of
7	the Mississippi cruise market and
8	Viking's interest in our site. I can't
9	think of anything more exciting,
10	certainly for us, and I think for the
11	city, than to have these folks make this

12	a regular stop in their tour.
13	Parenthetically, I'll tell you that
14	my wife and I did our first Viking tour
15	ever just a year ago. I forget where we
16	started, someplace in Germany, and went
17	to Budapest, and it was a great
18	experience with them. I see my screen is
19	cut off. Am I still being heard?
20	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Yes. We can hear
21	you fine, sir.
22	MR. CARLINO: Fine. So we've had a
23	great experience with Viking. You'll
24	hear a little bit more about that from
25	Mr. Simmons.
	42
1	In addition, and I know Jeannie will
2	get to that as well, we have an alliance
3	with Shaquille O'Neal with the Big
4	Chicken facility, which should be a lot
5	of fun.
6	Jeannie, you want to show that now?
7	What's the right time you want to pick it
8	up in your presentation?
9	MS. MAGDEFRAU: In my presentation,
10	Peter, I do have a video from Shaq that I
11	will be sharing as well.
12	MR. CARLINO: Okay. Well, then I'm
13	going to pass over that and just just
14	highlight it.

15	You know, I think one of the big
16	advantages, frankly, is bringing our
17	facility closer to the road to parking
18	and convenience. It's going to help
19	immensely in trying to attract people to
20	our sports bar, sports restaurant, and
21	our entertainment center. Ultimately,
22	with perhaps the with sports betting
23	somewhere down the road and the like,
24	think we're going to turn out to be a
25	very, very convenient location for people
	43
1	who want to get in and get out. And it's
2	just an advantage, I think, or something
3	we can make an advantage for for our
4	location.
5	I think as you see the presentation,
6	we're very pleased with I think it's a
7	very attractive facility. And we're
8	excited to do it. I just can't emphasize
9	enough after 20 years there how thrilled
10	I would be to be able to do this project.
11	So we'll have time for questions and
12	answers. That's just a quick run through
13	of our disposition about this and our
14	long-term interest in this this
15	property and in Baton Rouge.
16	So with that, Jeannie, I think it's
17	over to you.

18	MS. MAGDEFRAU: All right. I'm	
19	hoping everybody can see my screen.	
20	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Doing fine.	
21	MS. MAGDEFRAU: All right. So let's	
22	get started here. I have well, first	
23	and foremost, thank you, Peter.	
24	Good morning, Chairman and	
25	Commissioners. Jeannie Magdefrau,	
	44	
1	General Manager, Hollywood Casino.	
2	I'm going to briefly review a	
3	condensed version of the presentation	
4	that was in your petition. So let's	
5	start on page three. This is our, you	
6	know, present-day site. The building was	
7	built in 1994. It has 64,000 square	
8	feet. Very solid, great structure for	
9	us. You see the riverboat. We have two	
10	ramps with the riverboat. We have about	
11	1,500 parking spaces.	
12	Page five is the interior of our	
13	existing casino along with, at the bottom	
14	right, is the pavilion. It's a	
15	three-level riverboat, first generation.	
16	Holds 859 slots right now and 12 table	
17	games. We do have outdoor gaming in the	
18	front of the facility with 26 slot	
19	machines.	
20	As Peter mentioned, we have spent a	

21	significant amount of funds and money
22	keeping both our properties, the pavilion
23	and the boat, in a great condition to the
24	tune of about 300 million in present
25	value.
	45
1	Okay. On page seven, this is the
2	overlay of the expansion. So basically,
3	there's going to be about 37,136 square
4	feet of expansion. That does not include
5	the porte cochere. We're going to be
6	renovating about 38,194 square feet. And
7	nonimpact areas is going to be about
8	25,000. The nonimpact areas are
9	basically office space. This is for a
10	total of about a little over 100,000
11	square feet.
12	You know, and we also own about 25.1
13	acres of land. What you you know,
14	it's you can't see it on this picture.
15	But if you go down to far the right,
16	that's our underpass. So we basically
17	own up to that underpass.
18	You know, this is very exciting for
19	us, because, you know, it is the start of
20	a project, and hopefully this will be the
21	catalyst for future development north of
22	us.
23	Page eight is our layout. And the

24	one thing I want to point out here is
25	there are three entries. There's the
	46
1	entry of the porte cochere. There's the
2	entry in the non-gaming facility, and
3	then you can see there's the entry for
4	the cruise ship.
5	So let's just start on kind of the
6	left-hand side. When you enter in
7	through the porte cochere, you can
8	actually go into our gaming patio. I
9	will be showing renderings of what I call
10	some of our wow factors, which is the
11	gaming patio.
12	When you look to the right side, the
13	entry there, you'll walk in to the
14	facility. You will enter into a sports
15	viewing area. That basically, has a
16	capacity of about 115 people and there
17	are 46 seats. To the right of that, is
18	going to be our sports entertainment
19	restaurant concept. This is going to
20	have a mezzanine along with outdoor
21	dining as well. You know, we want to
22	take advantage of, you know, the
23	Mississippi River.
24	As Peter mentioned, we do have an

agreement with Shaquille O'Neal's Big

1	Chicken restaurant. This restaurant also
2	includes a bar on the inside.
3	When you take a look at where you
4	enter from the Viking cruise ship, so
5	basically what will happen there, as you
6	know, obviously, we'll have to move our
7	ship out of the way. But Viking cruise
8	ships will come in, dock, and they will
9	be entering directly into our casino.
10	That entry will only be opened, you know,
11	when there is a ship, you know, at the
12	dock.
13	You know, the one thing that we kind
14	of are lacking right now is meeting
15	facility space. So our second floor is
16	going to be converted into meeting rooms.
17	This is going to be a pretty cool area,
18	because when you come up, you know, those
19	stairways that was shown in the previous
20	diagram, you'll see you can either go
21	into a pre-function area you know, so
22	if you're going to a have a nighttime
23	event, you know, you can have cocktails
24	there. We're also going to have a
25	servery area called the buffet seating
	48
1	area. So if you you don't want to
2	have, you know, your lunch, dinner in the
3	meeting rooms, they'll be an area for

4	servery, and then 200-feet meeting area.
5	Moving on to page 12, this just kind
6	of gives you the overall mass of the
7	project. You know, the right side is the
8	sports entertainment center, casino, and
9	then on the left is the gaming patio.
10	This is what it's going to look
11	like. So now let's get into some of the
12	fun stuff, you know, the renderings.
13	This is a proposed, you know, front
14	elevation. The one thing I do want to
15	point out on this slide is you'll notice
16	that there is no brand on this slide. We
17	believe that, you know, with a new
18	casino, all these new experiences, that
19	we need to find a new name for this to
20	basically describe, you know, all the wow
21	factors and all the different experiences
22	you'll have when you enter into our
23	facility.
24	So this is the gaming experience
25	when you walk through the porte cochere.
	49
1	You will walk directly in, and they'll be
2	table games, the Craps game. You'll have
3	lots of excitement right there. You can
4	also see on the top there, that's kind of
5	the walkover of the second floor of the

6 event center or the meeting space.

7	This is our gaming patio. Yes, it
8	doesn't look like, you know, it's an
9	outdoor, but so it's beautifully
10	designed. It has a bar in the inside,
11	slot machines. You probably won't even
12	notice that you're really outside in this
13	area.
14	Okay. This is Big Chicken,
15	Shaquille O'Neal's concept. So it has a
16	bar; you can see that. So let me just
17	so if I can click to activate his video
18	here and see what he has to
19	(Video playing.)
20	MS. MAGDEFRAU: I hope everybody
21	heard that okay. So we're very excited
22	to bring Shaquille O'Neal back to
23	Baton Rouge you know, or Big Diesel.
24	Maybe we'll get him to spin some records
25	at some point in time.
	50
1	And then moving onto page 18. This
2	is our sports and entertainment venue.
3	So there's a lot going on in this slide
4	that I would like to point out.
5	Obviously, you know, you can see
6	basically the TV screens and all the
7	sport screens. You look up onto the top
8	left-hand side, that's our mezzanine. So
9	you can actually go up there. You can

10	watch, you know, down below, a band,
11	karaoke, you know, however we have
12	whatever entertainment we have scheduled
13	for that. So very excited about that.
14	And then if you look out, you can
15	kind of see that there is outdoor seating
16	outside. So we are very excited about
17	the sports restaurant entertainment
18	venue. We think it will be, you know,
19	top class for the Baton Rouge market.
20	On page 19, this is basically when
21	you would walk right in the non-gaming
22	area, our sports viewing area. So you
23	can see lots of TVs. You can watch golf.
24	You know, you'll be able to watch soccer,
25	football football, basketball, you
	51
1	know, whatever is going on in that
2	particular time period.
3	So briefly talk about project
4	milestones. We really would like this
5	completed my February 18th prior to our
6	peak time period. So we're fully in our
7	building at that time. That gives us
8	enough time to move our boat out of the
9	way so Viking cruise can come in for
10	their first ship. This will be,
11	obviously, June 2022.
12	Our plans are basically that we

13	would only be you would have access to
14	the casino at all times with the
15	exception of the week leading up to our
16	grand opening. We would have to be shut
17	down at that time to finish the
18	transition. Other than that, fully
19	operational 100 percent of the time.
20	We will fast track this project once
21	it's approved to meet this deadline.
22	Obviously, there may be things that are
23	out of our control that could push it
24	back, but that is our goal.
25	On page 21 is the cost estimate.
	52
1	You know, as stated earlier, you know, we
2	have spent significant amounts of money
3	on capital to keep our, you know, slot
4	machines fresh. So we had and plus
5	the fact of we really have a great base
6	to start with with our pavilion being
7	such a strong, basically you know,
8	building that we can build off on. So
9	we're looking at about a 21,000 to 20
10	or 21,000 21 million to about
11	24 and a half million dollars to get this
12	all accomplished.
13	And, you know, I'm going to start
14	I'm going to click on to activate this

video. This is a message from Mayor

16	Broome. It takes a few seconds to come
17	up, so I'm going to start click onto
18	that while I go through some of this
19	here.
20	The estimated impact over six years
21	is about a half a billion dollars. So
22	it's a significant amount of economic
23	impact for us. We also have a letter
24	from
25	(Video playing.)
	53
1	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Okay. Mayor Broome
2	speaking on behalf of our future
3	investment.
4	So as mentioned earlier, this
5	project over six years is estimated to
6	bring about a half a billion dollars,
7	nonconstruction, to the Baton Rouge
8	market. One-time construction will be
9	about 166 jobs with about 10 million in
10	labor and about 30 million in output. We
11	do have a letter in your package from
12	Senator Johns basically that says, you
13	know, this meets the standard of the
14	substantial economic development that the
15	legislators are looking for when they
16	pass the you know, the landside bill.
17	So, in summary, you know, Viking
18	Cruise Lines, you know, wants to make

19	this their destination beginning
20	operation in 20 June 2022. You know,
21	Shaquille O'Neal coming back. We'll have
22	a great sports entertainment restaurant
23	and venue with outdoor entertainment and
24	a dining balcony overlooking the
25	Mississippi River. We have a sports
	54
1	viewing area. We have meeting space.
2	We'll have even, you know, the outdoor
3	patio. So we're very excited that we can
4	bring this development to the Board
5	today.
6	I would like to, at this time, if
7	David Simmons was able to join, to give
8	kind of a brief discussion about what
9	how the Hollywood partnership means a lot
10	to Viking cruise.
11	MR. SIMMONS: Yes. Thank you and
12	good morning to the Gaming Commission.
13	Viking for those of you who don't
14	know much about Viking, we're the world
15	leader in river cruising. We're going
16	through a lot of difficulty right now as
17	you-all would expect. We've got 80 plus
18	ships sitting around waiting for for
19	all of our guests to come back. And so
20	what's really interesting and what's
21	really good right now is our Viking

22	Mississippi project is brand-new, and
23	it's doing extremely well even during
24	this pandemic.
25	We've opened for sail starting in
	55
1	August of 2022, and I'll explain that in
2	a second. But August of 2022. And so
3	far in this very short period of time
4	from March, we have over 6,800 bookings.
5	Of that, 5,800 are just are going to
6	be touching Baton Rouge.
7	Our schedules are basically we
8	have four basic schedules, and of those
9	four, three of them have stopped in
10	Baton Rouge. So New Orleans round trip,
11	New Orleans to Memphis, and also the
12	great American rivers which goes from
13	New Orleans all the way to St. Paul.
14	So we have 41 days that we are going
15	to be stopping per ship in Baton Rouge.
16	Currently, Baton Rouge has a serious
17	problem with docking. It only has, what
18	we effectually call the paperclip, and
19	there are three cruise lines. So without
20	this Hollywood Casino dock, we would have
21	to pass Baton Rouge's market on many,
22	many days, because there's just no way to
23	dock there.
24	But more importantly is, we believe

25	that we should be able to deliver what we
	56
1	sell. So if we would not put
2	Baton Rouge on our schedule if we didn't
3	believe that we were going to be able to
4	offer that. There's nothing worse than,
5	you know, having your parents on the
6	on the balcony waving as you pass
7	Baton Rouge because we're not allowed to
8	land there. And that's just not
9	something Viking is willing to do. So
10	we've been working with Jeannie and her
11	group for many years to see how we can
12	both benefit.
13	Each schedule for each ship is
14	15,826 passengers per year, per ship to
15	Baton Rouge. We have done great studies
16	on this market, and we believe it's a
17	six-to-eight ship market without any
18	problem. Torstein, who owns the company
19	has no desire to build one ship in the
20	Mississippi.
21	So how's the ship going? We started
22	building it this year. We had a meeting
23	this morning, and I saw all the welding
24	and everything going on. And even with
25	COVID, we're actually on schedule. So
	57

even though I mentioned a few minutes ago

2	that we are first sailings are in
3	August, we will be opening up some of
4	June and some of July. But we don't want
5	to disappoint our customers. So we want
6	to make sure that the delivery is going
7	to happen during COVID and there won't be
8	any delays. So as soon as we get
9	confirmation, then we'll be able to open
10	back up into June and July.
11	So we're very excited about having
12	this partnership with Hollywood Casino,
13	and I hope that I help you understand a
14	little bit about what our volume would be
15	bringing it to the market. Thanks so
16	much.
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.
18	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Thank you, David. I
19	will turn it back over to Peter for any
20	closing comments.
21	MR. CARLINO: Thank you, Jeannie,
22	and thank you, David, for that
23	presentation.
24	As I said, I just had, a year ago, a
25	recent experience with Viking; it was
	58
1	really a wonderful, wonderful experience.
2	So we're excited about that on our end.
3	To you, Mr. Chairman, and Members of
4	the Commission, thank you for allowing us

5	to make this presentation. And we're
6	available now for any questions that you
7	might have.
8	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. What I'd
9	like to do is let State Police they
10	have a brief presentation to cover a few
11	topics. Let them present their material,
12	and then we'll open it up for questions.
13	MR. ALBRIGHT: Yes, sir. Good
14	morning, Chairman Jones and Members of
15	the Board.
16	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Chairman Jones?
17	MR. ALBRIGHT: Chairman Noel.
18	Sorry. Old habits.
19	Can y'all see me? I can't
20	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Yes, you're good.
21	MR. ALBRIGHT: Okay. I'm Lieutenant
22	Adam Albright with the Louisiana State
23	Police, Gaming Enforcement Division.
24	The Division has reviewed the
25	location plan as submitted, and Hollywood
	59
1	has submitted everything that we've
2	requested to date. We didn't find any
3	issues that would preclude approval, and
4	we are satisfied that Hollywood is
5	working through the process with
6	compliance to rule and law as a priority.
7	So as the project progresses and the

8	construction plans are finalized, the
9	Division will work closely with Hollywood
10	to ensure that they remain in compliance
11	throughout the whole process. And I can
12	answer any questions that anyone may
13	have.
14	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.
15	Trnessia, did you have some
16	MS. WARE: Yes.
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.
18	MS. WARE: Good morning,
19	Chairman Noel and Members of the Board.
20	My name is Trnessia Ware with Louisiana
21	State Police, Corporate Securities Audit.
22	The proposed project for the new
23	facility at Hollywood will range from
24	20.9 million to 24.5 million. GLPI
25	intends to finance the project with funds
	60
1	currently available under a 1.75 billion
2	revolving credit facility previously
3	approved by the Board.
4	As of June 30, 2020, GLPI had
5	649 million outstanding balance on the
6	amended term loan credit facility
7	consisting of approximately 225 million
8	term loan A1 facility and the 424 million
9	term loan A2 facility.
10	No amounts were outstanding under

11	the revolver. Additionally, GLPI was
12	contingently obligated under
13	approximately \$4.4 million letters of
14	credit resulting in 1 billion,
15	174.6 million of available borrowing
16	capacity under the revolver as of
17	June 30, 2020.
18	At June 30, 2020, the company was in
19	compliance with all required financial
20	covenants.
21	The Division's Corporate Security
22	Audit section received confirmation from
23	JP Morgan Chase Bank that GLPI has the
24	ability to draw \$1,174,605,389 on their
25	revolver facility.
	61
1	Based on the projected cost to build
2	the new facility and the confirmation of
3	funds available under the credit
4	facility, the Division determined GLPI
5	has the necessary funding available to
6	make the capital investment in the
7	project.
8	The Corporate Securities Audit
9	section found nothing related to the
10	available financing to preclude the Board
11	from approving the project.
12	Do you have any questions?
13	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you, Trnessia.

14	I did want to note that Board Member
15	Paul West has joined us. Appreciate it.
16	At this time, I think it's a good
17	point to open it up for questions from
18	the Board.
19	MR. LAGASSE: Chairman, I guess I
20	have a question. Is this the first of
21	anybody else made any indications that
22	other boats are going to try to move on
23	shore?
24	CHAIRMAN NOEL: I mean, obviously,
25	we have Isle who's in the process. There
	62
1	is some talk with Treasure Chest, but I
2	have not seen anything yet.
3	MR. LAGASSE: Okay. I was just
4	wondering. That's all.
5	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Yes, sir. Any other
6	questions from the Board?
7	MS. BERRY: I have a quick question.
8	When the Viking boats come in, is it just
9	for like a day or a certain number of
10	hours, or is it overnight?
11	MR. SIMMONS: The vessels will be
12	there from depending on the cruise.
13	But typically from 7:00 to 8:00 in the
14	morning to 22:00. So it's all day. We
15	do not go overnight, because we're
16	heading towards the next port of call.

17	MS. BERRY: Okay. Very good.
18	MR. SIMMONS: Thank you.
19	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any other questions?
20	MR. POOLE: Mike, I just have a
21	quick question about re-purposing the
22	boat that's currently there. Is that
23	anything that would stay in the State of
24	Louisiana, or would that be discarded off
25	to somebody else in another state
	63
1	somewhere?
2	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Yeah. Right now, I
3	mean, we don't have any once once
4	that property is, you know, transitioned
5	to landside, I think it would be up to
6	GLPI on what they do with it. But they
7	can address it. If you have any
8	additional on that, please please add
9	to it.
10	MR. CARLINO: Jeannie, where are we
11	on that?
12	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Yeah, so our
13	intent
14	MR. CARLINO: I have to ask the
15	question.
16	MS. MAGDEFRAU: So our intent would
17	be to sell the existing boat; however, I
18	will mention that some of these older
19	riverboats have been re-purposed into

20	vessels that will go up and down the
21	river. So I know that that has happened
22	with the one from Iowa. So it could
23	possibly. But we will be selling the
24	boat.
25	MR. CARLINO: It is a functioning
	64
1	boat. It's capable it's capable of
2	cruising.
3	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Yes.
4	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. Any
5	other questions?
6	Okay. I did have a question,
7	Ms. Magdefrau. Did and I noticed in
8	one or two of the renderings or pictures
9	of the current property, Hollywood has
10	two or three deflexion barges placed in
11	the river just to the north of the
12	existing boat, correct?
13	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Those deflexion
14	barges were removed about a year and a
15	half ago based upon, you know, the Corps
16	of Engineers.
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Right. And one of
18	the things I wanted to note is, you know,
19	back when the Riverboat Task Force was
20	considering the number of issues and
21	ultimately, in 2017, made recommendations
22	to the Legislature, part of the logic and

23	reasoning for, you know, providing or, at
24	least, proposing legislation to allow a
25	move to land was safety. And, actually,
	65
1	both properties both riverboats in
2	Baton Rouge were primary examples as to
3	the safety issues that sometimes occur on
4	that river, particularly you know,
5	Baton Rouge is a very high traffic
6	shipping area. Hundreds of barges a day.
7	And there have been times in the past
8	where the barges, in particularly, during
9	high water season, have broke loose, and,
10	you know, there is a concern with both
11	I don't think Hollywood. But Belle of
12	Baton Rouge, it sticks even further out
13	to the river. And we experienced some of
14	that same in north Louisiana, and
15	Shreveport and Bossier on the Red River
16	when some very high floods over the past
17	several years, in fact, caused some to
18	temporarily shut down and/or make some
19	significant changes to their boarding.
20	So there was a safety issue that was also
21	discussed back then for moving to land.
22	So I just wanted to point that out. I
23	know we look at the economics and the
24	project itself, but safety was also
25	another concern.

1	All right. If there are no other
2	questions
3	MS. BERRY: I have one more.
4	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Ms. Berry, go ahead.
5	MS. BERRY: I have one more
6	question.
7	I want to congratulate y'all on this
8	beautiful presentation. And if I may
9	have missed this, my question, in your
10	presentation bear with me. But in
11	addition to the construction jobs that
12	will be in the process of converting to
13	the land base, is there some type of
14	estimate on how many permanent jobs would
15	be added due to the larger facility and
16	moving on the land base as opposed to
17	being on the boat? Just an estimate?
18	MS. MAGDEFRAU: Well, right now we
19	are estimating about the same amount of
20	employees, but it's going to be a shift
21	in employees. Because of the amount of
22	employees it takes to be on the boat,
23	those employees will shift more to more
24	table games, dealer positions, more food
25	and beverage positions.

1	MS. BERRY: Okay.
2	MR. CARLINO: Yeah, let me say I

- 3 think we see that as a -- as a -- as a
- 4 plus. As you look around the country,
- 5 casinos, sadly, and restaurant
- 6 operations, hotels are cutting employees
- 7 left and right, which is just a sad
- 8 consequence of this -- this virus. How
- 9 long it's going to take any company to
- 10 get back to full --
- 11 (Connection interruption.)
- 12 MS. MAGDEFRAU: We lost you.
- 13 CHAIRMAN NOEL: We lost you. I
- think you paused for a minute.
- 15 MS. BERRY: Okay. I understand.
- 16 Even with the sports viewing and the
- 17 outdoor music venues and all that?
- 18 MS. MAGDEFRAU: That's correct.

23	with Investigator Rodney Perkins present
24	before the Board in the matter of the

1	interest in Galliano Properties, LLC,
2	doing business as Bayou Gold Casino,
3	which holds a Type V license.
4	The truck stop facility is located
5	in Lafourche Parish. On December 30th of
6	2019, Eric J. Stathes sold and
7	transferred his 50 percent membership
8	interest in the licensee to Ryan J.
9	Retif.
10	As a result of the sale and
11	transfer, Ryan Retif is now the sole
12	member of the licensee. Also on
13	December 30th of 2019, the licensee
14	entered into a device placement agreement

15	with Langosta Ventures, LLC.
16	Investigator Rodney Perkins conducted an
17	investigation of the transfer of
18	membership interest, and he is here this
19	morning to report his findings to the
20	Board.
21	MR. PERKINS: Good morning. I'm
22	Rodney Perkins. I investigated the
23	transfer of membership interest that
24	occurred in the licensee and found no
25	information that would preclude continued

4	suitability check on Ryan Retif and found
5	no information that would preclude him
6	from continuing to participate in the
7	gaming industry.

20	Investment, Inc., owns 100 percent of
21	Jacobs Entertainment, Inc. The ownership
22	interest of Jacobs Investment, Inc., is
