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1	I. CALL TO ORDER
2	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
3	Okay. Members, it's 10:00 and

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
Thank you, Ms. Hood. Members, we do
have a quorum. And, first, let me say thank you
for for participating this morning. I know
it's a busy time of the year for a lot of us
and but this is a really important meeting, and
we hope to get through it as quickly as possible.
First, I would like to open this
meeting with a prepared statement that I have I
have put together. I will read this so that it
will be part of the record, and then we will get
into some presentations.
So, Members, the purpose of this
meeting this morning is to discuss and hopefully
approve a path for the new Horseshoe Casino in

Westlake, Louisiana, to open their doors for 1 business. As you will hear in the presentation, 2 this project began back in December of 2019, when 3 the Board approved the licensee's request to relocate its operations to a landside facility. This was the first of the Legacy riverboats to participate in Act 469 of the 2018 Regular (inaudible) to petition to move their operations 8 landside. 9 10 Two things happened that legitimately contributed to setting back the progression of the 11 12 project. First, COVID shut the project down; and 13 then in August of 2020, Hurricane Laura did 14 substantial damage to the entire property. But as 15 we've moved forward to today, the project has 16 grown substantially, and they will very, very far exceed the original expected \$100 million cost. 17 18 Yesterday, Vice-Chairman Berry and I 19 attended and witnessed a mock opening that was 20 conducted by our State Police Gaming Division. 21 Also in attendance was a large presence by the 22 Attorney General's Gaming Division and also by Ms. Hood from our staff. A three-hour exercise of 23 2.4 actual gaming activity was conducted, along with 25 numerous security challenges that were posed to

the employees of the Horseshoe. As in the opening of any business, a number of recommendations were made, and State Police has conferred with the Horseshoe in order for there to be a final recommendation by the Division to this Board to approve their actual opening to the public.

Should the -- should the Board approve the proposed resolution today, a soft opening will be held tomorrow. December 10 in

approve the proposed resolution today, a soft opening will be held tomorrow, December 10, in which a limited number of guests will attend and participate in live gaming. Once again, State Police Gaming will be there to monitor the activities and, once again, make a recommendation to me, as Chairman, as to whether the Horseshoe is capable of opening to the public in a safe and a compliant way. It is our hope that this can be completed for a December 12 opening to the public.

I will share with the Board that the property is absolutely first-class and will be a great asset to the gaming market in Louisiana. I can honestly say that it has far exceeded my expectations. It is a property that we -- we can be proud of, and it paves the way for many other licensees to build land-based facilities.

Today the Attorney General's Office

1	will make a presentation and outline the path
2	needed for the opening of the property. Following
3	that, Major Chuck McNeal with our Louisiana State
4	Police, Gaming Division, will make a presentation
5	on their behalf and accept questions from the
6	Board. Also, we will hear a presentation from
7	Mr. Dan Real with Caesars Entertainment, the
8	parent company of Horseshoe.
9	At any time I would welcome any
10	questions from the Board. Following all
11	discussions and questions, I will ask the Board to
12	consider a resolution that has been prepared by
13	our staff.
14	So at this time I would like to ask
15	Mr. Jeremy Gathe with the Assistant Attorney
16	General to make his presentation for the Board.

14	comment, Ms. Hood, do you feel comfortable moving
15	on?

21	III. CASINO GAMING ISSUES
22	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
23	Mr. Gathe, if you would, proceed.
24	MR. GATHE:
25	Good morning, Chairman Johns, Members

of the Board. I'm Assistant Attorney General 1 Jeremy Gathe here in the matter of St. Charles 2 Gaming Company, LLC, doing business as 3 Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles' Petition to 4 Commence Gaming Operations as amended. There are several requests concerning Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles which all require the Board's consideration for approval. 8 Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles has 9 10 filed a Petition to Commence Gaming Operations 11 seeking the Board's determination or authorization 12 of the Chairman to determine substantial completion and authorization of commencement of 13 14 its gaming operations. Additionally, the licensee 15 requests a waiver of completion for certain 16 non-gaming amenities as it relates to the approved 17 project. Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles would like to commence gaming operations at its facilities 18 19 for a soft opening on December 10, 2022, and to 20 recommence gaming operations at its facility on December 12, 2022. 21 22 In order to do that, all of the conditions set forth in the statement of 23 2.4 conditions imposed on the license of 25 Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles must be met, in

addition to compliance with the Board's 1 August 19, 2021, resolution. As a part of the 2 Board's August 19, 2021, resolution, the licensee 3 4 is prohibited from commencing gaming operations until the entire approved project is substantially 6 complete. Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles has informed the Division that several non-gaming 8 amenities regarding the approved project will not 9 10 be substantially complete by December 10, 20 --11 2012 -- I'm sorry -- 2022. Specifically, 116 12 hotel rooms out of 253 will not be completed until 13 January 31, 2023; the outdoor pool and fitness 14 room will not be completed until March 20, 2023; 15 the third restaurant will not be completed until 16 December 12, 2022; the fourth restaurant will not 17 be completed until July 1, 2023; and all other required amenities will not be completed until 18 19 August 19, 2023. 20 Despite the fact that several 21 amenities will not be completed until a later 22 date, the licensee would like to commence gaming 23 operations. In order for that to occur, however, 2.4 the Board will have to approve the new timeline 25 for completion and amend the licensee's conditions

to allow the commencement of gaming operations 1 2 before completion of the non-gaming amenities. The other items which require Board 3 4 approval prior to the commencement of gaming operations by the licensee are the issuance of a Temporary Certificate of Compliance by the Board, a determination of substantial completion by the Board, and authorization to commence gaming 8 operations from the Board. 9 10 As it relates to the issuance of a 11 Certificate of Compliance, the Board must be in 12 receipt of an inspection report from the Fire 13 Marshal indicating that the facility is in compliance with all codes and requirements 14 15 required and that the facility can be issued a 16 Certificate of Compliance, the Division's 17 confirmation that all state and local permits have been obtained, and a Certificate of Occupancy from 18 19 the Fire Marshal. 20 As the Fire Marshal has noted 21 deficiencies and only granted a Temporary 22 Certificate of Occupancy, a Temporary Certificate of Compliance is the most that the Board can issue 23 at this time. The Temporary Certificate of 2.4 25 Compliance is proposed to expire January 31, 2023,

as the Fire Marshal has given the licensee until January 13, 2023, to remedy the deficiencies and will, therefore, require the licensee to come back to the Board for the issuance of a Certificate of Compliance once the Fire Marshal is prepared to recommend such issuance.

Additionally, before the licensee can commence gaming operations, the Board must make a determination of substantial completion, or the Board must authorize the Chairman to make that determination. This determination is required by the Board's August 19, 2021, resolution and the licensee's Statement of Conditions.

In order for the required determination to be made, the Board must be in receipt of a Certificate of Substantial Completion and Readiness for Occupancy and Use from the approved project's architect, a Certificate of Occupancy from the State Fire Marshal, and the Division's written confirmation of substantial completion. The determination of substantial completion is completely within the Board's discretion.

At this time the requirements for a determination by the Board are not satisfied;

therefore, the licensee is asking the Board to 1 2 authorize the Chairman to make the determination once the requirements are met. 3 In order for the licensee to commence 4 gaming, there must first be a determination of substantial completion. As that has not happened yet, the Board may either deny the commencement of gaming operations or may authorize the Chairman to 8 9 approve the commencement of gaming operations once 10 he has determined substantial completion and the 11 Division approves the commencement and 12 recommencement. 13 A resolution has been prepared for 14 the Board's consideration, and we also have 15 representatives from the licensee and the Division 16 who may want to make a few comments. 17 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 18 Okay. Thank you, Mr. Gathe. I 19 appreciate that very much. Members, are there any 20 questions for Mr. Gathe at this point before we 21 move over to State Police? Any questions? 22 (NO RESPONSE) 23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 2.4 Okay. Don't hear any. So at this 25 time we will hear from Major Chuck McNeal with

Louisiana State Police, Gaming Division. Welcome, 1 2 Major. 3 MAJOR McNEAL: Good morning, sir. Good morning, 4 Board Members. Again, Major Chuck McNeal with State Police. I just want to give you kind of a brief overview of what occurred yesterday so you can understand where we are and what the path 8 forward is that we're looking at. 9 10 So yesterday we had approximately 100 11 personnel from the State Police and AG's Office 12 come in and conduct a -- a test -- we called it a mock -- but a test run of the casino. And what 13 14 that was -- entailed was the table games -- so we 15 had individuals playing table games as -- live. 16 We had individuals in the cage. We tested 17 security and surveillance. So we had individuals 18 do scenarios. We had individuals playing games. 19 We had people going to the cage to cash in chips, 20 pull markers, all the things that you would do in 21 a normal business day's operation. 22 After that was done, like the 23 Chairman mentioned, for three hours, we then went 2.4 back with our team and sat down and discussed it. 25 The one overlying issue we see is -- is the

training. The individuals -- as you know, this casino has not been in operation for over two years; so a lot of the employees here -- this is their first time dealing and interacting with individuals in their current jobs.

So what we would like to do is -- if the Board approves, is allow Horseshoe tomorrow -- from 12:00 p.m. till 8:00 p.m. tomorrow night -- they have a list of invited guests that are going to be coming in -- let them conduct gaming operations on the floor, table games, slot machines, everything, the whole casino itself. We will then shut down the casino. We will then go and have them rake -- rake over the file, all their records -- financial records, and make sure that they are able to account for revenue and do the things that are necessary to move forward.

I just want to make sure -- they're not going to be 100 percent. We know that, that they're learning, but we feel like this is the best opportunity to allow them to get more training in a live environment. State Police will have personnel there the whole time monitoring the situation and making sure things proceed in a safe and legal manner.

After we do that, then Sunday we're 1 2 going to get together with our team, look at everything, and then get with the Chairman and the 3 4 Board, however y'all wish to proceed, and then when we give our final recommendation, we think 6 Monday is a go-live date. And I just want everybody to understand we're looking at public safety 8 issues -- Mr. Real will talk about this -- and 9 10 regulatory issues that will pertain to the floor itself in the gaming operations. That's -- that's 11 12 what we're focusing on, and I just want to make sure everybody understands that's what we're 13 14 looking at, what our requirements are, to make 15 sure that it's a safe environment. 16 Some things that are being done are 17 by Horseshoe, and it's a business decision, and that's fine. That's the decision of Horseshoe and 18 how they wish to proceed on things, but we're 19 20 strictly going to be looking at regulatory matters 21 and public safety. 22 With that, Chairman, if anybody has 23 any questions or anything, I would be glad to 2.4 answer them. 25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1	Okay. Any questions from board
2	members for Major McNeal at this point?
3	MS. BERRY:
4	I have a question.
5	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
6	Ms. Berry.
7	MS. BERRY:
8	Major McNeal, on the soft opening
9	tomorrow night that you mentioned to additionally
10	train the employees, is it going to be real
11	dollars used, or is it going to be the artificial
12	like yesterday?
13	MAJOR McNEAL:
14	No, ma'am, this will be true live
15	gaming operations; so that what that's going to
16	allow us to do is, A, not just to test the table
17	games like we did yesterday when you were there
18	MS. BERRY:
19	Uh-huh.
20	MAJOR McNEAL:
21	but also they'll have individuals
22	test slot machines. So the slot machines are up
23	and running and satisfactory, but things happen.
24	They run out of paper. They do those things. We
25	just do not always see those things, that they can

test the entire casino itself. 1 2 The sportsbook will be open; so they'll be taking bets at the sportsbook. So when 3 those bets are taken, we can then reconcile those 4 things in the back of the house and then prove to us they can account for the money they're taking in. So that's why we're just doing -- excuse 8 9 me -- a limited group. I think Mr. Dan Real will 10 explain the numbers, but I think no more than 500 11 people are invited, and they don't anticipate 12 that many; so it gives us a little bit more than 13 our 100 yesterday to then test more the casino 14 itself, see how the revenues do, give the people 15 more training, because this is -- you know, it's 16 one thing to train, as you all know, at a table by 17 yourself with two people. MS. BERRY: 18 19 Right. 20 MAJOR McNEAL: 21 It's actually another thing when 22 you're actually dealing with real money and 23 individuals you don't know. So that's why we want 2.4 to give them that opportunity. 25 MS. BERRY:

1	And do you have controls to show that
2	all the different types of gaming, whether it be
3	slots or craps or in all the different gamings
4	will be used to test them?
5	MAJOR McNEAL:
6	I don't I don't know which games.
7	I'm sure they're going to use they're going to
8	have a specific number of games that they'll want
9	to use and test. And Mr. Dan Dan will probably
10	tell you what games exactly they're going to
11	table games they're going to have open, but I
12	would assume it's pretty much like the ones they
13	had yesterday, the blackjack, the baccarat, I
14	mean, pai gow, and some Texas Holdems, some
15	different games, but I'm assuming and craps.
16	They had a craps table, also,
17	MS. BERRY:
18	Right. Right.
19	MAJOR McNEAL:
20	as you remember, yesterday. So
21	I'm sure it's going to be those games, but it's
22	whatever they want to do
23	MS. BERRY:
24	Okay.
25	MAJOR McNEAL:

1	to to show us and to show
2	everyone that they're that they did the
3	training into their

5	Maybe that was a question for Dan.

1 Yes, sir. We're going to have 2 personnel from the Audit, Enforcement, and tech side there, as we did yesterday, and then Audit 3 will then, like, go, as we call it, back of the 4 house, make sure there's an accounting record -reconciliation for everything and make sure that what they say is in they can account or they can verify, and so forth, yes, sir. 8 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 9 10 Okay. Thank you very much, and I 11 want to thank you and -- and all of your staff 12 that were there yesterday. It was an incredible experience just to witness, and thank you for --13 14 for their hard work to make that happen. Any other questions from the board 15 16 members before we hear from Mr. Dan Real? 17 MR. SHOLES: 18 Yes. 19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 20 Judge Sholes. 21 MR. SHOLES: 22 I want to make sure -- I noticed that the Fire Marshal had reservations on certain 23 2.4 Are those areas going to be off limits to 25 any of these participants both in the temporary

mock opening and in the soft -- and in the opening 1 2 on Monday, if it happens? MAJOR McNEAL: 3 4 I'll answer that question. As I understand it, Judge, they're going to have to be required -- it's -- patrons will not be in these These areas are what we call back of the areas. house; so it's where employees are mostly located 8 9 or (inaudible), but they're going to be required 10 to have somebody in those locations at all times 11 to monitor, as they call it, firewatch. Horseshoe will have to have personnel there the 12 13 whole time, and that will be something that we'll 14 be continuously monitoring to make sure they have 15 the personnel there as they're supposed to. 16 MR. SHOLES: 17 Thank you. 18 MAJOR McNEAL: 19 Yes, sir. 20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 21 Judge -- Judge, we have discussed 22 this with the Fire Marshal, and I will tell you the Fire Marshal's Office has -- has just been 23 2.4 incredible in working with this, but they feel --25 they feel comfortable with their -- their

Temporary Certificate of Compliance, and, of 1 2 course, there's only about a three- or four-week period before Horseshoe will be required to have 3 final compliance; so the Fire Marshal feels 4 comfortable with what they're -- they're signing They -- they have actually signed a document of temporary compliance. So great question. Any other questions from the Board? 8 9 Any other questions? 10 (NO RESPONSE) 11 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 12 If not, I would like to ask 13 Mr. Dan Real, who is representing Ceasars 14 Entertainment this morning, to make his 15 presentation. Mr. Real, welcome. 16 MR. REAL: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman, 17 18 Members of the Board, the AG's Office, Louisiana 19 State Police. Very grateful to be on this call 20 with you today. I'm in the office with the leader 21 of the property, -- most of you know him --22 Jeff Favre. He's really the heart and soul of the 23 property. I'm here trying to help get us to where 2.4 we need to be. There's a lot of passion and pride 25 in this project, but as you've heard, we still

have some stuff to work on. Some of it's 1 2 controllable, and some of it's uncontrollable. I'll give you a quick example of 3 4 control -- uncontrollable. We were really excited to have the AG's Office be our first quests in our hotel. We're very proud of the rooms that we have. And, as luck would have it, they're heading up to the rooms, and we had a pipe burst on the 8 tenth floor; therefore, the wire for the -- or the 9 10 water for the entire building had to be shut down. 11 That's unfortunate. 12 As I've learned, after openings 13 you're going to have -- you're going to have 14 things coming at you left and right. You just 15 need to be able to handle them. And I appreciated 16 the understanding of the AG's office, and I 17 welcome everybody back to check out the rooms, 18 because they really are spectacular. The floor is 19 also beautiful. It's laid out as well as any that 20 operate in our region, I believe as any in the 21 state. Our slot banks are up-to-date. product is fantastic. And I just want to say it's 22 23 a very exciting time for Caesars Entertainment 2.4 Louisiana in Lake Charles, Westlake in particular. 25 As always, I want to -- I want to

1 thank you all for your oversight. We are, obviously, in a heavily regulated business for 2 very, very good reason, but working with the 3 Board, the AG's Office and the State Police, it's clear that, you know, you're firm. You understand the rules, but you're fair, and you're consistent. And as a -- as an operator, consistency is the most important thing for us. 8 9 We know what we need to do, and it's 10 upon us to achieve it, and I feel like we've been 11 given every single chance to do exactly that to 12 get -- to get open on Monday. And we're going to 13 use tomorrow as a very big, important driver to 14 make sure that that's the case. 15 Yesterday was great because it really 16 showed us some of our exposed areas, and I can tell you, after the meeting with the State Police 17 and the AG's office, we had -- I had personally 18 19 called in leadership from the highest areas of my 20 other properties to come in to make sure that 21 today, which is a free for us, every employee is 22 at work, and leadership has expertise in every 23 single functional area. 2.4 We are going to take full advantage 25 of today, and we're also going to take full

1 advantage of the fact that we have a very tenured team that is coming back. It's odd because, as 2 you know, many of them have been off for a couple 3 4 of years. They need to get back into the groove, but it's -- it is somewhat like riding a bike. You just need to remind them of the rules and the regulations that have since changed or that are being looked upon right now. 8 We will be ready for tomorrow, and 9 10 we're going to use Sunday as another day to listen 11 to Major McNeal and the AG's Office and regroup 12 again, and the beauty of that is we have another 13 full day to get ready and prepare. Monday at noon 14 is going to be a day of celebration. We will have 15 earned your trust and the ability to show that we 16 know how to run this business and, once we get the doors open, for those who get to visit. 17 18 Mr. Chairman, thank you for the words 19 about the quality of the property. I can only 20 assure you, for those who will be visiting us 21 soon, it is first-class. It is absolutely 22 stunning, and if you remember the boat and where 23 we are now, it's not even in the same ballpark.

We will be ready to go by January 20, 19 20 earlier than Mr. Jeremy's date, I believe, of 21 January 31; so we're going to -- we're going to 22 exceed the guarantee that we had given and make 23 sure that we get those rooms. It's better for us 2.4 to get them, and we're not that far off.

For those who had visited our sportsbook two weeks before we opened in New Orleans, some of y'all looked around and said, you know, "There's no way you're going to get open in two weeks." And I have to admit even I was a little bit nervous, but they had a plan, and they delivered, and that's exactly what I'm seeing happen right now. Most of the areas that are relevant to the opening of the business are ready to go already at this minute, and by the end of the day today, some carpet edging and some other things that are more detailed will be done as well.

Our food outlets, we will have three ready to go on Monday: Slice Pizza; Brew
Brothers, with over 200 seats; and our Asian noodle bar, which is delivering great food. We have been dry-running all of those restaurants.

We're -- we're testing all of the menu items. I believe those who visited yesterday had a chance to eat at our outlets, and I have only received good feedback to this point. We're very proud of

the food outlets.

2.4

And, as you now, we're going big with our others, and one of them is Gordon Ramsey, and we state July for that, but we're really, between us, shooting for earlier dates. The sooner we can get those restaurants open the better it's going to be for us, for the state, for the customers, et cetera, but, as you know, we've gone through quite a journey to even get to where we are today.

I am proud to say that, even without those restaurants, you will have the ability to come in, sit down, and have a great meal. We're adding steaks to Brew Brothers. It's going to be as high-end as you want it, or if you want a burger and a salad, we're going to have that as well.

Our outdoor pool and our fitness center are targeted for March 20. It's under construction as we speak. We will have that completed without a doubt. We will not need to come back for any exceptions or understanding of -- of that date. We are very confident. We had already filled in the pool. We had done the prework, and now that the major facility is getting completed, the pool and the fitness center

are going to jump right in, and we're going to keep moving forward there as well.

2.4

And then, finally, we will -- well, we have the dates of all other required amenities set by August 19, because that is the window we truly have to get completed, but I do not see a scenario, barring anything major or unforeseen, weather, something terrible, whatever it may be. That is the only way I could see even pressing up against that date; so I appreciate the opportunity to state that we will be -- be within the two (inaudible) window, and for this group, we're hard-charging to get that done before then.

We did have the mock opening yesterday. The findings were very helpful. We also had our own findings through that journey. It wasn't just what the State Police was able to provide to us. It was our own management team identifying opportunities; so it was a -- it was a great day for us.

And today is great because of the time and the opportunity to train. I would have been worried if we jumped right into -- yesterday into our soft opening, but I have full confidence that our -- our timeline -- obviously, it's

completely dependent upon y'all, but our timeline 1 2 right now is to have a great eight hours tomorrow; we're going to have an amazing training day on 3 4 Sunday; and then we're going to have a celebration on Monday. And that's what we have planned for 6 you right now. And, of course, I would be happy to answer any questions whatsoever. CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 8 9 Well, thank you, Mr. Real. I can see 10 you and Jeff have probably been up all night. 11 appears to me you've got your work clothes on; so 12 thank y'all. I know y'all have worked hard. 13 So in terms of your hotel rooms, 160 14 rooms are not completed at this point, and the 15 resolution will ask for a January 31, 2023, 16 completion date, but it's my understanding that you're actually going to roll out a number of 17 18 rooms per week -- is that correct? 19 MR. REAL: 20 Absolutely. 21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 22 -- as they become completed? MR. REAL: 23 2.4 Yes, sir. We have Floors 6 through 25 10 locked in right now, and we're going down each

floor. It's about a two-week period in between each room -- each floor. I apologize. So we will be ready to go by that -- that January 31 date easily. And the goal for us, operationally and from a business perspective, is to get as many ready for New Year's Eve as possible; so that's what the team is doing.

2.4

We've separated our casino construction team to our hotel construction team. There was too much overlap, where they were helping each other, where we were getting to about 90 percent completion and not checking things off the box. Now where we are is the hotel team is just focused on the hotel. The construction team is focused on the casino floor, the porte cochere, and we're hard-charging, but I expect that number to exceed all expectations that we've offered you today.

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

All right. And, Members, I personally have visited some of the completed hotel rooms. I will share with you that they are absolutely first-class, something that you personally would be very proud to stay in. And congratulations, Mr. Real, on what y'all have

1 done. You completely renovated an existing hotel, and it's -- you've come a thousand percent from 2 3 where you were; so . . . In terms of the pool, I can fully 4 understand it not being completed. You really 6 don't need a pool during the winter months, and as you'll get into the -- to the spring months, by March 20, your pool will be ready to go. Once 8 9 again, they -- they tore out the existing pool 10 that was there, building a much larger, much --11 much nicer pool area, with amenities in that pool 12 area. 13 And then, again, lastly, all -- all 14 but one of your restaurants will actually be open 15 by Monday. Is that correct? 16 MR. REAL: Did you say -- you broke up a little 17 18 for me. Did you say all --19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 20 All but Gordon Ramsey will be open by 21 Is that correct? Monday. 22 MR. REAL: 23 I'm sorry. I should have stated No. 2.4 it differently. We have three ready to go. 25 have Slice -- we -- there are four that are

1	required of us.
2	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
3	Right.
4	MR. REAL:
5	We are going to eventually have five.
6	So what we're going to do is have 7 Seven
7	Noodle Bar, Brew Brothers, and Slice Pizza will be
8	open for Monday.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Right.
11	MR. REAL:
12	And then Dunkin' Donuts and Baskin
13	Robins will be coming on shortly thereafter.
14	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
15	That's great.
16	MR. REAL:
17	In the mean in the meantime, we're
18	going to be serving breakfast in Brew Brothers the
19	whole time; so all meal periods will be covered
20	until Dunkin' Donuts and Baskin Robins opens. And
21	then the last piece, because it's very
22	complicated, will be Gordon Ramsey.
23	And what I would love you to know is
24	part of the reason of the delay is we were really
25	demanding about how beautiful it would be, because

1	I believe it's going to become the number one			
2	restaurant in the in the City of Lake Charles			
3	and Westlake. We're having an outdoor seating			
4	area to the steakhouse right off the water, and			
5	we're taking some time to build something that's			
6	weatherproof for 12 months out of the year; so			
7	we're going to have 100 waterfront seats. It's			
8	it's just going to be amazing, but it's taking a			
9	little bit of time.			
10	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:			
11	So, actually, you've added one			
12	additional food outlet from your original			
13	commitment?			
14	MR. REAL:			
15	Yes, sir.			
16	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:			
17	Okay. Thank you very much. Okay.			
18	Members, any any questions for Mr. Real?			
19	MR. SHOLES:			
20	I just need a little clarification.			
21	What happened with the hotel rooms that you were			
22	not able to use them the other day? I didn't			
23	quite hear that.			
24	MR. REAL:			
25	Sure. So the AG's Office was going			

1	to stay with (inaudible). We love having people
2	try the room, break them in, let us know what they
3	like, what they didn't like. As the group was
4	going up or as some were were already up there,
5	we had a pipe burst on the tenth floor. Our
6	guests were staying on the ninth floor.
7	And, unfortunately, what we had to do
8	when the pipe burst, Judge Sholes, was we had
9	to if you're the one who asked the question. I
10	apologize. I've got a lot of faces up there.
11	What we had to do was shut down the water for a
12	period of time. We didn't know how long that
13	would take to fix the pipe. And so,
14	unfortunately, that didn't allow those guests to
15	stay with us, because we had to repair the pipe
16	and get water back running to the hotel.
17	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
18	And that's been completed
19	MR. SHOLES:
20	Did the pipe burst sustain cause
21	any damage? Was it
22	MR. REAL:
23	It did not.
24	MR. SHOLES:
25	Okay.

MR. REAL:
No, it did not. We've had we've
had some issues with condensation, but other than
that you know, that's being worked on right
now. Other than that pipe burst you know, we
had general things happen. We had a trash hauler
pop our fiber in a room, take away all of our TV
and our our wifi; so we had to come and get an
emergency crew in.
It's just a matter of, stuff happens
when you're trying to open a new property. And
the pipe bursting is not systemic. It was just an
incident, and we're going to have more, I'm sure,
as we go, but we we have the right people here
to fix things.
MR. SHOLES:
Thank you.
CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
Okay. Any any questions from
other board members?
MS. BERRY:
Chairman?
CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
Yes, Ms. Berry.
MS. BERRY:

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I would just like -- I would just like to take a minute to reiterate what you said, Chairman Johns and Mr. Real, that this --Horseshoe is in my district, and I feel a special bond with this property, because I was here before, during, and after. And I just have to say real quick to the rest of the Board and all the members and people on the TV that -- that this is one first-class operation run by first-class people. You can see their heart and their soul is in this property, and, I mean, if you get a chance, please go see. You will not even believe the transformation and the work they have done. But knowing Mr. Favre and knowing Mr. Real recently, I can totally tell you that this is one first-class operation. It's going to help the city of Lake Charles tremendously with employment, with tourism, with -- just on and on and on, and it will also help the state of Louisiana; so I just wanted to throw that out there being that I got the chance yesterday to go see it and visit with y'all and congratulate you on all of your hard work, and we're looking forward to many, many, many years of this beautiful operation.

1	MR. REAL:
2	Thank you.
3	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
4	Thank you, Ms. Berry, and thank you
5	for being there yesterday alongside with with
6	me.
7	MS. BERRY:
8	I wouldn't have missed it.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	And, once again, I will absolutely
11	concur with what you've just said about the
12	quality of the project and the heart and soul that
13	we've seen what's going into it.
14	Any further discussion, Mr. Real? Is
15	there anything further you would like to discuss
16	with us or
17	MR. REAL:
18	No. I would just genuine
19	genuinely, one more time, just like to thank the
20	whole group here. We couldn't do it without
21	y'all. You added a little confidence to us after
22	a little bit of a you know, a finding. And
23	what we want to do is we want to open like my
24	other properties in the state, to where we run
25	them in a first-class manner and we also make

those who regulate us proud, and that's our goal. 1 2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 3 Okay. Any further questions for Mr. Real from the Board? 4 (NO RESPONSE) 6 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: Hearing none, any other comments from the Board? 8 9 (NO RESPONSE) 10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 11 Members, I will share with you that over the past year, I guess, I have been out to 12 13 that property many times, more than I have fingers 14 on my -- on both hands for sure, and I'm very 15 fortunate in that because it's about ten minutes 16 from my -- my home. So they've been very cordial 17 and very inviting for me to inspect every square 18 inch of that property. 19 You know, I -- fortunately, I've been 20 able to see what was there prior to 2019, or 21 actually prior to 2020, when it was destroyed, and 22 to what it is today, and it's just an absolute 23 remarkable transformation. This is exactly what 2.4 the Legislature intended when they approved 25 land-based properties back in 2018.

I do know Mr. Real and Mr. Favre have experienced exactly what everybody else in this country has been going through for the past year, and that's supply chain issues. I can remember y'all telling me that something was going to be here in July, and it showed up in October. And so y'all have experienced -- I think we're where we're at today because of -- in great part because of supply chain issues.

2.4

The other thing I'm just absolutely pleased with is that y'all have acquired and actually hired over 700 employees. So you're growing the casino market in the Lake Charles market by well over 700, 750 employees; so we thank you greatly for -- for that.

So, Members, this is where we are.

We will read a res -- we will -- we will ask for a motion shortly to adopt a resolution, and should that motion be made and seconded, we will -- we will read the resolution. But it -- bottom line with the resolution is, we're asking for a number of things that I -- as Chairman, I feel very confident about, and you will be giving me, as Chairman, the -- the authority this coming Sunday to make a decision whether the Horseshoe can open

Monday approximately at 11:30 a.m. or 12:00 noon 1 on Monday, December 12. 2 My commitment to this Board and to 3 4 the people of Louisiana is if this property is not ready to open, then -- and that recommendation comes from State Police, that we will live up to that recommendation, and then we will proceed with whatever needs to be done to rectify their 8 9 recommendations. I would never put the safety of 10 people in jeopardy or the quality of this project 11 in jeopardy. We want to do it the right way, and 12 I know that Ceasars wants to do it the right way. 13 I cannot thank you, Mr. Real and 14 Mr. Favre, enough for your incredible hard work, 15 and not once have you denied our staff or State 16 Police or the Gaming Division an opportunity to inspect, to ask questions, to get us legitimate 17 18 answers to your questions; so I thank you very, 19 very much for -- for that. 20 So, Members, if there's no further 21 discussion -- if there's any further discussion at 22 this point, please let me know. 23 MS. BERRY: 2.4 I'd like to make a motion that we --25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13	Failure to meet the above deadlines
14	or to receive an extension may result in
15	forfeiture of all privileges of the license.
16	Be it further resolved that the
17	Chairman is hereby authorized to accept the
18	architect's Certificate of Substantial Completion
19	and Readiness for Occupancy and Use, the
20	Certificate of Occupancy issued by the Louisiana
21	Office of State Fire Marshal, and all other
22	required state and local permits, for which
23	issuance shall be confirmed by the Division, and
24	to determine substantial completion of the
25	Approved Project, in accordance with the

To my own staff, to Ms. Hood, thank 16 you very much for your hard work. I actually got 17 an e-mail from Ms. Hood at 2:22 this morning; so 18 she was up late last night working. And to the 19 fire marshal, our new fire marshal, 20 Mr. Dan Wallace, and his staff, we thank you for, 21 at the last minute, helping out with -- with your 22 recommendations. And, last, to Ceasars, to 23 Mr. Real and Mr. Favre, thank you for your 2.4 leadership, your hard work, your commitment to the 25 State.
