4	And let the record reflect that Ms.
5	Becnel is here, and we do have a quorum.
6	Thank you members for being here this
7	morning.
8	First, we would ask that any
9	witnesses please state your name for the
10	record and speak into the microphone this
11	morning. Additionally, we ask that all
12	members and those in the audience please
13	silence your cell phones; and if you need
14	to a receive a phone call, please step out
15	of the room.
16	And, finally, no eating or drinking
17	is allowed by audience members in the
18	room.
19	At this time we will move to item 2
20	on the agenda, Public Comments. Ladies
21	and gentlemen, this is our public comment
22	period. If anyone would like to comment
23	on any agenda item before the board today,
24	now is the time to come forward.
25	Seeing none, but before moving on to

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1	our next agenda item, I would like to take
2	the opportunity to welcome Ms. Lisha
3	Landry, our new confidential assistant to
4	
5	the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. Ms.
	Landry replaces Ms. Hood, who has moved on
6	to a new position within the department of
7	public safety.
8	Ms. Landry is a graduate of
9	Louisiana State University and obtained
10	her law degree magna cum laude from the
11	Southern University Law Center. Ms.
12	Landry began her career in public service
13	in the consumer protection section of the
14	Louisiana Attorney General's office in
15	2005. She later served as a staff
16	attorney for the House of Representatives
17	in the legal division.
18	Ms. Landry came back to the AG's
19	office in 2017 in the gaming division
20	where she served as assistant attorney
21	general specialist who specialized in all
22	aspects of gaming regulation.
23	Board members having worked with Ms.
24	Landry on many complex gaming issues over
25	the years, I assure you that our board is

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1	in good hands. Please join me in
2	welcoming Ms. Lisha Landry.
3	(All applause.)
4	We will now move on to item 3, the
5	approval of the minutes. I would ask for
6	a motion to waive the reading and approve
7	the minutes of the August 15th, 2024
8	meeting.
9	MR. JACKSON:
10	So moved.

21	Moving on to item 4 on our agenda,
22	our revenue reports.
23	Good morning, Ms. Jackson.
24	MS. JACKSON:
25	Good morning, Chairman Hebert, board



1	members. My name is Donna Jackson with
2	Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit
3	Section.
4	In August, the 14 operating
5	riverboats generated adjusted gross
6	receipts of \$147,258,964. The state
7	collected fees totalling \$31,660,677.
8	Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year
9	'24-'25 to date are \$285 million, an
10	increase of \$2.6 million or 1% from fiscal
11	year '23-'24.
12	As of August 31st, 2024, the state
13	collected \$61.3 million in fees for fiscal
14	year '24-'25. Page 2 shows the riverboat
15	revenue broken down by regional market.
16	The overall increase from July was \$9
17	million or 6.6%. Compared to last August,
18	this month's revenues represent an
19	increase of \$11 million or 8.2%. As
20	information, this August had an additional
21	Friday and Saturday than last August.
22	Next is the summary of the August
23	2024 gaming activity for Harrah's New
24	Orleans, found on page 3. Harrah's
25	generated \$18,886,071 in gross gaming

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1	revenue. These revenues represent an
2	increase from last month of \$1.2 million
3	or 6.7%, and an increase of approximately
4	\$1 million or 5.2% in the same month last
5	year.
6	During August, the state received
7	\$5,520,548 in minimum daily payments.
8	Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year
9	'24-'25 to date are approximately \$36.6
10	million, an increase of \$1 million or 3%
11	from fiscal year '23-'24. As of August
12	31st, the state collected \$11 million in
13	fees for fiscal year '24-'25.
14	Next I'll present the revenues for
15	slots at the Racetracks. During August,
16	the four racetrack facilities combined
17	generated adjusted gross receipts of
18	\$26,505,790, an increase of \$1.4 million
19	or 5.8% from the previous month, and an
20	increase of \$1.5 million or 5.9% when
21	compared to the same month last year.
22	During August, the state collected
23	\$4 million in state fees. Adjusted gross
24	receipts for fiscal year '24-'25 to date
25	are \$51.6 million, a decrease of \$1



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1	million or 2% from fiscal year '23-'24.
2	As of August 31st, 2024, the state
3	has collected \$7.8 million in fees for
4	fiscal year '24-'25.
5	I'll now move to the video gaming
6	information. There are 12,011 video
7	gaming devices activated at 1,392
8	locations. Net device revenue for August
9	2024 was \$62,159,168, an increase of \$1.6
10	million or 2.7% when compared to July, and
11	an increase of .9% when compared to last
12	August. Total franchise fees for August
13	totaled \$18.8 million.
14	Fiscal year to date, net device
15	revenue is \$122.7 million, a decrease of
16	.4% when compared to last fiscal year. As
17	of August 31st, 2024, the state has
18	collected \$37.2 million in franchise fees
19	for fiscal year '24-'25.
20	Next, I'll present the August
21	revenues for sportsbook. During August,
22	the retail sportsbooks accepted \$16.3
23	million in sports wagers, resulting in net
24	proceeds of \$2.7 million and \$268,000 in
25	state taxes.

The mobile sportsbooks accepted \$218
million in sports wagers, resulting in net
proceeds of \$22.7 million and \$3.4 million
in taxes paid to the state.
Finally, for daily fantasy sports,
gross revenues for August were
approximately \$436,000, with net revenue
of \$45,000 and taxes of \$3,600.

sports wagering in the letter which was
sent on behalf of the gaming control
board. If you will recall, I indicated
during the last meeting that I sent a
cease and desist letter to the illegal
online betting site Bovada, which operates
out of Curacao. Well, I'm happy to report
that as of this week Bovada has added
Louisiana to its list of restricted
states. And hopefully, this will this



1 will drive our citizens who wold like to 2 wager to responsibly do so on our licensed 3 So definitely positive platforms. 4 progress in that area. 5 Moving on to item 5, Casino Okav. 6 Gaming Issues. First up is the 7 consideration of a certificate of 8 compliance for the riverboat gaming land 9 side facility of Louisiana Casino Cruises, 10 LLC doing business as The Queen Baton 11 Rouge. 12 Mr. Lewis, good morning. 13 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS: 14 Good morning, Chairman Hebert, board 15 I'm Assistant Attorney General members. 16 Kanick Lewis, Junior, and I'm here in the 17 matter of the issuance of the certificate 18 of compliance for The Queen Casino. 19 On August 9th, the Louisiana State 20 Fire Marshal began the inspection process 21 for the approval of The Queen Casino's 2.2 annual certificate of compliance. At the 23 time of that inspection, there were 24 deficiencies found at the property. The 25 board was provided a copy of that report



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1	at the last board meeting.
2	On September 6th, the fire marshal
3	completed a follow-up inspection, and the
4	deficiencies were corrected. A copy of
5	that report has been provided to the
6	board. I now present these findings to
7	the board and request that upon the board
8	accepting the report submitted by the
9	state fire marshal, you will move for the
10	issuance of The Queen Casino a certificate
11	of compliance, which will expire on August
12	31st, 2025.
13	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:

4	Mr. Barbin, good morning.
5	MR. BARBIN:
6	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
7	board members.
8	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
9	Gentlemen, please make your
10	appearances for the record.
11	MR. BARBIN:
12	I'm Jeff Barbin representing Queen
13	Casino
14	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
15	I'm sorry, Jeff. Can you please
16	restate that? I didn't have your mic on.
17	MR. BARBIN:
18	Yes. Good morning, Chairman Hebert
19	and board members. I'm Jeff Barbin
20	representing Louisiana Casino Cruises, LLC
21	doing business as The Queen Baton Rouge.
22	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
23	I'm Assistant Attorney General
24	Kanick Lewis, Jr. representing the
25	division of the attorney general's office.

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1 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 2 Okay. 3 MR. BARBIN: 4 And just a little bit of background 5 about this request. The Queen is 6 requesting that the -- a determination 7 from this board that the certificate of 8 compliance for the vessel no longer be 9 required. And a little bit of background 10 on that. You'll recall that The Queen's landside facility was opened on August 11 12 24th of last year, and at that time the 13 licensee continued to own the riverboat 14 gaming vessel and was not using the vessel 15 for casino gaming, but used it for several 16 months just to store sensitive gaming 17 equipment. 18 At the time, the division because of 19 that requested that The Queen maintain the 20 certificate of compliance. Since that 21 time, the sensitive gaming equipment has 2.2 been moved off of the vessel; and 23 obviously, no more gaming is happening on 24 the vessel. 25 You'll recall that Viking is using



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1	the dock to land its cruises in Baton
2	Rouge. Viking is landing approximately
3	every four to six weeks. Since that time
4	Viking has been using the existing vessel
5	to ramp up against that vessel and unload
6	its passengers from its vessel on to the
7	Motor Vessel Casino Rouge and then to the
8	dock.
9	We fully expected that the situation
10	would exist where that boat would be
11	removed at some point in time; and in
12	fact, The Queen sold the vessel to a third
13	party.
14	However, since that time, Viking has
15	expressed an interest in keeping that boat
16	in place because without the boat
17	additional dredging would need to occur,
18	and they have they would prefer that
19	the boat stay in place. So Viking
20	continues to be in discussion with the now
21	owner of the vessel to try to work out a
22	deal on that.
23	The Queen is requesting a
24	determination that we, you know, no longer
25	need to have a certificate of compliance.

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1	In lieu of that, we would be requesting an
2	extension of a certificate, which expires
3	at the end of this month and that would
4	give the AG's office some time to make
5	sure that you know, that determination
6	can be made.
7	So at this point in time, you know,
8	we're either asking for a determination
9	that the COC no longer be needed or some
10	type of an extension of that COC.
11	I'm happy to answer any questions
12	you have.
13	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
14	I'd like to hear from the AG's
15	office on this issue as well.
16	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
17	Chairman Hebert, board members, the
18	board's jurisdiction specifically covers
19	vessels owned or leased by the licensees
20	that are used for gaming operations. Per
21	Louisiana Gaming Regulations 21 I'm
22	sorry 2117, riverboat gaming licensees
23	must provide proof of safety compliance
24	for their vessels. Non-certificated
25	vessels such as The Queen, required



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1	compliance certificate based on
2	third-party annual inspections and
3	quarterly inspection by the licensee with
4	documented results being submitted to the
5	division.
6	The Queen had been conducting gaming
7	activities on this vessel, which required
8	to maintain a certificate of compliance or
9	COC in accordance with state regulations.
10	However, The Queen transitioned gaming
11	activities to a landside facility and now
12	maintains a COC for that facility.
13	With the vessel no longer in use for
14	gaming, The Queen informed the board of
15	their desire to sell or dispose of it and
16	remove it from the licensed premise.
17	In 2022, the board approved this
18	request largely due to the cost and safety
19	concerns associated with keeping the
20	vessel in its current location. As long
21	as the vessel remained on the property,
22	The Queen was instructed to remove all
23	gaming devices and equipment from the
24	vessel, which it did, maintain security
25	and fire watch and maintain insurance on



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1	the vessel until its removal from the
2	property.
3	At the time of that approval, The
4	Queen indicated that Viking Cruise Lines
5	planned to use the gangway and dock as a
6	port for river cruises.
7	The information presented to the
8	board and the understanding was that the
9	vessel would be relocated allowing Viking
10	to rebuild a gangway and dock and tie-in
11	to the new and improved dock.
12	However, instead Viking desired to
13	use the vessel to dock and tie-in to and
14	as a point of ingress and egress for
15	loading and unloading passengers with
16	passengers exiting the cruise ships,
17	entering the vessel, then exiting the
18	vessel on to the gangway and entering the
19	landside facility.
20	Based on the belief of temporary use
21	of the vessel for Viking and gaming
22	patrons, the board, on September 21st of
23	2023 modified the manual requirements for
24	the vessel with different manual
25	requirements based on the presence or



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1	absence of passengers.
2	Per the board's resolution, the
3	licensee must maintain a COC or
4	certificate while the vessel is not
5	shuttered and is being used as a
6	passthrough for Viking's passengers from
7	the cruise ship to the landside facility.
8	The current riverboat COC from
9	September of 2023, requires The Queen to
10	maintain certain staffing on the vessel
11	when in use for disembarking and boarding
12	the cruise ship, and it expires on
13	September 30th.
14	Based on the latest known
15	information, The Queen owned the vessel
16	but had the intention to sell it and have
17	it removed from its berth site; and that
18	Viking would rebuild or repair the gangway
19	and dock. However, The Queen recently
20	submitted a request to the board to be
21	relieved of the requirement to have a COC
22	alleging the vessel was sold in December
23	and posing whether the board still has
24	jurisdiction over the vessel. The Queen
25	further eluded that the plans for the



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1	vessel to remain to be used as a passenger
2	throughway.
3	The AG's office has asked for a time
4	period on how long this setup is intended
5	to last and has not received a response.
6	The division has not received any formal
7	documentation regarding the alleged sale
8	nor clarion who currently insures the
9	vessel or maintains liability for its use.
10	If The Queen no longer owns or
11	leases the vessel and it is not used for
12	gaming activities, there is a question as
13	to whether The Queen or owner is required
14	to maintain a COC and marine staffing.
15	However, without clear evidence of the
16	sale and given the vessel remains in its
17	original location, we cannot provide an
18	opinion on that at this time.
19	To fully analyze this situation, we
20	must obtain necessary documentation and
21	answers to specific questions. For
22	instance, does The Queen retain ownership
23	and, if not, when and whom when and to
24	whom was the vessel sold? Why is the
25	vessel still on the property? And what



1	permissions are needed for docking?
2	Additionally, we need clarity on any
3	existing lease agreements and financial
4	arrangements among The Queen, Viking and
5	any alleged new owner. Moreover, we need
6	to address who is responsible for insuring
7	the vessel and whether The Queen is named
8	on the policy, having identification
9	agreements being signed to protect the
10	board and other agencies, if The Queen is
11	relieved of the COC requirement, who would
12	be responsible for inspections and safety
13	staffing on the vessel? Does an
14	obligation remain since the vessel is
15	being used for Viking's cruise passengers
16	to disembark the cruise ship in order to
17	enter the landside facility and to enter
18	the landside facility to board the cruise
19	ship?
20	Additionally, is the proposed
21	situation of the vessel remaining even
22	desired or appropriate considering the
23	intent behind the legislation and board
24	approval for the landside facility was to
25	reduce the risk associated therewith; or



1	is that no langer a beaud consideration if
	is that no longer a board consideration if
2	The Queen has, in fact, sold the vessel;
3	or does such remain that The Queen has
4	contractual relationships with the Viking
5	and vessel owner in order for the vessel
6	to remain and the Viking ships to connect
7	to the vessel?
8	It is crucial that we gather the
9	necessary information and documentation in
10	order to fully analyze this issue,
11	understanding the ownership, usage and
12	regulatory responsibilities surrounding
13	the vessel is essential not just for
14	compliance, but also for ensuring the
15	safety and well-being of passengers and
16	patrons, and the protection of this board
17	and the division.
18	With the COC expiring, the licensee
19	requested to be relieved of any
20	responsibility to have the vessel
21	inspected or to maintain a COC and marine
22	staffing.
23	And the division not possessing
24	crucial documentation and information at
25	this time, it is recommended that the



1 board grant a 30-day extension for the 2 COC, so the division may obtain and you 3 may review and analyze that documentation 4 and information. 5 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 6 It sounds like it's in the best 7 interest of both parties that we do grant 8 this 30-day extension. The only other 9 question or concern that I would have if 10 we do this is regarding life safety issues 11 currently at the casino. 12 I know we have Mr. Taylor here with 13 the AVS. 14 Mr. Taylor, would you mind coming 15 forward? And I have that one question for 16 you. What would cause any life safety 17 issues should the board decide to issue a 18 certificate of compliance that would last 19 through the end of October of next month? 20 MR. TAYLOR: 21 Well, I've never attended the vessel 2.2 myself, but I think 30 days would be a 23 benefit of the board and the state. 24 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 25 Any questions for Mr. Taylor?

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And I'm sorry, Mr. Taylor, would you 1 2 please give your full name for the record. 3 MR. TAYLOR: 4 My name is Billy Taylor with the 5 American Vessel Services, LLC. 6 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 7 Okay. So it's come to my attention 8 that within the packet that we -- the 9 board members currently have that AVS did 10 represent that there would be no life safety issues should we grant this 11 12 certificate of compliance --13 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS: 14 Yes. 15 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 16 -- which expires next month. 17 Any further questions from board 18 members? 19 If none, I would entertain a motion 20 to issue a certificate of compliance, 21 which expires October 31st, 2024. 2.2 MS. BERRY: 23 Move. 24 MS. LEWIS: 25 Second.

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1	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
2	It's been moved by Ms. Berry;
3	seconded by Ms. Lewis. Okay.
4	Is there any discussion? Any
5	opposition?
6	Hearing none, that motion carries.
7	Thank you, gentlemen.
8	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
9	Thank you:
10	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
11	Okay. Moving on to item C under
12	Casino Gaming Issues. Next we have the
13	consideration of a five-year hull
14	extension request for Catfish Queen, LLC
15	doing business as The Belle of Baton
16	Rouge.
17	Gentlemen, you may proceed.
18	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
19	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
20	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
21	General Kanick Lewis, Junior, and with me
22	is Mr. Billy Taylor of AVS.
23	We're here in the matter of the
24	consideration of the five-year hull
25	extension request for Catfish Queen, LLC

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	rage 20
1	doing business as the Belle of Baton
2	Rouge.
3	On July 26th, the Belle of Baton
4	Rouge requested an extension for the
5	completion of its five-year hull
6	inspection. The property requested a
7	one-year extension, and Mr. Taylor will
8	now provide AVS's information regarding
9	that extension request.
10	MR. TAYLOR:
11	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
12	board members. I'm Billy Taylor with
13	American Vessel Services, LLC.
14	The last five-year hull inspection
15	was completed in 2019 by American Bureau
16	of Shipping Group and at that time the
17	vessel passed the inspection and there
18	were no life safety issues.
19	On July 26th, 2024, the Belle of
20	Baton Rouge requested a one-year extension
21	for the inspection. AVS has recommended
22	that the extension be granted for a period
23	of three months. AVS feels that the
24	extension would not pose a risk for the
25	safety of the passengers or employees of



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1	the property. This extension request is
2	included in your packet.
3	It is the recommendation of AVS that
4	Catfish Queen, LLC doing business as Belle
5	of Baton Rouge be issued a three-month
6	extension for the five-year inspection.
7	And I would be happy to answer any
8	questions that the board may have.
9	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
10	Board members, are there any
11	questions for the AG's office or AVS or
12	for the licensee?
13	Mr. Barbin, is there anything you
14	would like to add?
15	MR. BARBIN:
16	No. Just for the record, Jeff
17	Barbin appearing for Catfish Queen, LLC.
18	Just as you'll hear in a few minutes, just
19	a reminder that that Catfish Queen is
20	trying to move its operations to the
21	temporary facility and hopefully within a
22	three-month time period the vessel will no
23	longer be needed.
24	I'm happy to answer any questions
25	you have.

2	Okay. At this time I will entertain
3	a motion
4	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
5	Excuse me, Chairman.

15	resolution has been prepared for the
16	board'S adoption and signature.
17	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
18	Thank you, Mr. Lewis.
19	At this time I will entertain a
20	motion to adopt the resolution.
21	MS. BECNEL:
22	Move.
23	MR. POOLE:
24	Second.
25	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:

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1	Moved by Ms. Becnel; seconded by Mr.
2	Poole.
3	Okay. At this time you're going to
4	read the resolution into the record,
5	right, Ms. Landry? Keeping me on my toes
6	up here.
7	MS. LANDRY:
8	On the 19th day of September 2024,
9	the Louisiana Gaming Control Board did, in
10	a duly noticed public meeting, consider
11	the five-year alternative hull examination
12	request filed by Catfish Queen, LLC doing
13	business as the Belle of Baton Rouge, and
14	upon motion duly made and seconded, the
15	board adopted this resolution:
16	Whereas, the licensee has requested
17	approval to extend its September 2024
18	deadline to complete its five-year
19	alternative hull examination for its
20	riverboat gaming vessel, the Argosy III.
21	Now therefore, be it resolved that,
22	based on the recommendation of the board's
23	third-party inspector, American Vessel
24	Services, the licensee's deadline to
25	complete its five-year alternative hull

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1	examination is hereby extended to December
2	2024.
3	Thus done and signed in Baton Rouge,
4	Louisiana this 19th day of September of
5	2024.
6	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
7	Okay. Ms. Hernandez, would you

22	Thank you.
23	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS:
24	Thank you.
25	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:



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1	Next is item D, which is a
2	consideration of a petition to approve
3	substantial completion of temporary gaming
4	operations and for approval to close
5	existing operations for Catfish Queen, LLC
6	doing business as the Belle of Baton
7	Rouge.
8	Mr. Meek, good morning.
9	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MEEK:
10	Good morning, Chairman Hebert, board
11	members. I'm Assistant Attorney General
12	Matthew Meek here in the matter of Belle
13	of Baton Rouge's request to cease gaming
14	operations on its riverboat vessel and to
15	approve substantial completion of its
16	temporary landside casino.
17	On July 18th, 2024, the board
18	approved the licensee's request to
19	construct and relocate its gaming
20	operations to a temporary facility while
21	its permanent facility is under
22	construction.
23	At this time, the licensee is
24	requesting board approval to open and
25	commence gaming operations at its

1	temporary facility. The licensee intended
2	to be completed with construction and to
3	have had its mock opening for the or
4	there to be an official opening on
5	September 24th. However, there have been
6	several delays, and there are still
7	deficiencies with the temporary facility.
8	The licensee can't commence gaming
9	operations at a landside facility until
10	the division determines all necessary
11	staffing, training, security and
12	surveillance, technical, accounting and
13	internal controls are acceptable. The
14	division determines compliance and
15	confirms substantial completion through a
16	preoperative inspection, which includes a
17	mock opening. Due to the delays, the
18	division has been unable to hold a mock
19	opening or complete its preoperative
20	inspection.
21	The preoperative inspection is just
22	one requirement before substantial
23	completion and commencement. The other
24	requirements include riverboat gaming
25	landside facility certificate of

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1	compliance to operate and an inspection
2	report from the state fire marshal, a
3	certificate of substantial completion from
4	the approved architect, a certificate of
5	occupancy and written information from
6	Louisiana State Police Gaming Enforcement
7	Division of substantial completion.
8	The division has received the
9	necessary permits. However, the fire
10	marshal has not yet signed a certificate
11	of compliance, and the division has not
12	yet determined substantial completion.
13	At a prior resolution, the board
14	ordered the licensee to continue operating
15	in its vessel until the commencement of
16	gaming operations at its temporary
17	facility. Since that date the licensee
18	has indicated that it requires certain
19	gaming equipment from the vessel in order
20	to operate in the temporary facility,
21	which means the licensee must cease
22	operations on the vessel and relocate that
23	equipment prior to the division being able
24	to determine substantial completion and
25	prior to commencement of gaming.



1	
1	Therefore, the licensee will need to
2	be relieved of that requirement as there
3	are still deficiencies which have
4	prevented the division from being able to
5	conduct a mock and conclude its
6	preoperative inspection. The board cannot
7	at this time determine substantial
8	completion or the ability to commence
9	gaming.
10	It is recommended that the board now
11	authorize the licensee to cease operations
12	on its vessel at this time. As the
13	licensee desires to commence gaming prior
14	to the next board meeting, the board may
15	grant the chairman the authority to cease
16	operations, determine substantial
17	completion and issue any required approval
18	on the board's behalf subject to the
19	inspection and division approval.
20	If the board chooses to grant the
21	chairman such authority, the division can
22	continue to work with the licensee
23	throughout the completion of the
24	temporary. The licensee can cease
25	operations when the division is ready to



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1	mock the facility, the division can
2	determine substantial completion and at
3	the appropriate time send a written
4	notification to the chairman informing him
5	of the findings and recommendations.
6	Subsequently, the chairman can authorize
7	commencement of gaming operations at the
8	temporary facility.
9	A resolution has been prepared based
10	on this recommended approach for the
11	board's consideration granting the
12	chairman the authority to approve the
13	cessation of gaming on the vessel,
14	determine substantial completion, issue
15	the landside certificate of compliance,
16	approve the commencement of gaming in the
17	temporary facility and grant any other
18	necessary approvals.
19	Representatives from the licensee
20	are present to provide a presentation to
21	the board.
22	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
23	Okay. Any questions for the AG's
24	office or for state police? Okay. At
25	this time, we'll hear from the licensee.



MR. BARBIN:

T	MR. BARBIN:
2	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
3	board members. I'm Jeff Barbin appearing
4	for Catfish Queen, LLC, To my immediate
5	left is Bruce Woods. He's the general
6	manager of the Belle of Baton Rouge, and
7	to Bruce's left is Stacy Stagg, who is the
8	V.P. of operations for Queen Casinos.
9	As as you heard from the division
10	and the AG's office, a substantial amount
11	of work has gone into getting this
12	temporary casino ready for operation and
13	there have been hundreds of meetings with
14	the staff and with the division and things
15	are coming together very quickly here.
16	We've been working, I believe, well with
17	everyone trying to get everyone's concerns
18	resolved and I think we're very, very
19	close to doing that.
20	We have a couple of vendors that we
21	have to arrange between the time that we
22	close down operations on the boat and
23	reopen them on the temporary facility. So
24	we'll be working with the division to get
25	the timing right. Once they're



1	comfortable with the mock can be done,
2	we'll do the mock opening with the
3	division. And then at that point in time,
4	if the division is satisfied that
5	everything is ready for operation and
6	we'll get the approval from the chairman
7	to close down, we'll move those few pieces
8	of critical equipment from the boat to the
9	temporary facility, and then assuming the
10	division is satisfied, the vessel opening
11	and the chairman grants us that authority,
12	we'll proceed to open.
13	So at this point in time, we're
14	happy to answer any questions you have. I
15	want to just give a thanks to the division
16	staff, the AG's office and the board's
17	staff. Obviously, this is a huge
18	undertaking and these guys will say that,
19	you know, we've been given lots of
20	assistance and help along the way and it
21	takes an entire team to pull this thing
22	together and we've been working very well
23	with the division and the AG's office and
24	board staff and we appreciate all of the
25	assistance in getting us this far.



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1	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
2	Any questions, board members?
3	MR. POOLE:
4	Jeff, do you have an anticipated
5	time frame to cease operations from
6	shutting the boat down to starting another
7	one? Is that
8	MR. BARBIN:
9	Very, very short. Probably 72 hours
10	is probably more than enough time. We
11	literally have to move, you know, a
12	handful of pieces of equipment from the
13	count room and the server that connects to
14	all of the gaming equipment. We have to
15	make sure that once it's moved, all of
16	that stuff is operational.
17	MR. POOLE:
18	Sure.
19	MR. BARBIN:
20	Those machines have been hooked up
21	to that server a long period of time and
22	you never sort of know what's going to
23	happen when you disconnect, you know,
24	hundreds of machines from the network
25	systems. But it's anticipated that we can

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1	get back up and operational in 48 to 72
2	hours.
3	MS. STAGG:
4	Yeah, for sure.
5	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
6	Any further questions? And, board
7	members, I want to certainly echo Mr.
8	Barbin's sentiments as it relates to the
9	state police and the attorney general's
10	office. I know firsthand that they are
11	working feverishly to assist the property
12	in in getting this facility up and
13	running. I have been to the property
14	personally both in my former and current
15	capacity, and I vow to you that I will
16	continue to do so. I even spoke to Mr.
17	Poole this morning about accompanying me
18	on my next visit there just to have
19	another set of eyes on the facility.
20	So if there are no further questions
21	from the board and if it's the board
22	pleasure the board's pleasure, I would
23	entertain a motion to adopt a resolution
24	which will grant me the authority to give
25	board approvals related to the temporary

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1	landside facility.
2	MS. TRAYLOR:
3	Moved.
4	MR. POOLE:
5	Second.
6	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
7	So it's been moved by Ms. Traylor
8	and seconded by Mr. Poole.
9	Ms. Landry, would you please read
10	the resolution into the record.
11	MS. LANDRY:
12	On the 19th day of September 2024,
13	the Louisiana Gaming Control Board did, in
14	a duly noticed public meeting, consider
15	the petition to approve substantial
16	completion for temporary gaming operations
17	and for approval to close existing
18	operations filed by Catfish Queen, LLC
19	doing business as Belle of Baton Rouge,
20	and upon motion duly made and seconded,
21	the board adopted this resolution:
22	Whereas, on July 18, 2024, the board
23	approved the licensee's request to no
24	longer operate on its riverboat gaming
25	vessel, the Argosy III, and to conduct and

1	operate a temporary casino landside
2	facility during the pendency of the
3	construction of the full approved project
4	and permanent landside facility.
5	Whereas, the licensee has indicated
6	a desire to commence gaming operations in
7	its temporary facility prior to the
8	board's monthly meeting on October 17th,
9	2024.
10	Whereas, the Louisiana State Police,
11	Gaming Enforcement Division's preoperative
12	inspection of the temporary facility is
13	ongoing.
14	Whereas, the board is in receipt of
15	the following items for the temporary
16	facility: An inspection report issued by
17	the Louisiana Office of State Fire
18	Marshal, a certificate of occupancy issued
19	by the City of Baton Rouge, the
20	certificate of substantial completion
21	submitted by the licensee's approved
22	architect, and all other required state
23	and local permits for the temporary
24	facility.
25	Now, therefore, be it resolved that

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1	the Chairman is hereby authorized to issue
2	a riverboat gaming landside facility
3	certificate of compliance with the
4	temporary facility, based on the
5	recommendation of the Louisiana Office of
6	State Fire Marshal and written
7	confirmation of substantial completion
8	from the division, on behalf of the board.
9	Be it further resolved that, based
10	on written recommendation from the
11	division, the Chairman, on behalf of the
12	board, is hereby authorized to allow the
13	licensee to cease gaming operations on the
14	vessel in order to transport gaming
15	devices, gaming equipment, and all other
16	necessary equipment to the temporary
17	facility. Unless otherwise required by
18	the division, ceasing gaming operations
19	for longer than 96 hours may result in a
20	nonperformance penalty, the issuing of a
21	civil penalty, administrative action, or
22	forfeiture of all privileges to the
23	licensee.
24	Be it further resolved that the
25	Chairman is hereby authorized to determine

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1	substantial completion of the temporary
2	facility, in accordance with the
3	licensee's statement of conditions to the
4	riverboat gaming license, and to eliminate
5	the requirement for weekly
6	work-in-progress reports on the
7	construction of the temporary facility, on
8	behalf of the board.
9	Be it further resolved that the
10	Chairman is hereby authorized to approve
11	the licensee's request to commence gaming
12	operations at its temporary facility,
13	subject to the successful completion of
14	the preoperative inspection by the
15	division and the Chairman's determination
16	of substantial completion of the temporary
17	facility, on behalf of the board.
18	Be it further resolved that, upon
19	recommendation of the division, the
20	Chairman is hereby authorized to order the
21	licensee to cease gaming operations in
22	order to correct any issues or
23	deficiencies that may arise after the
24	opening of the temporary facility until
25	such time as said issues or deficiencies



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1	have been corrected and determined
2	satisfactory by the division, and to issue
3	an order allowing the recommencement of
4	gaming operations in accordance with the
5	division's determination and
6	recommendation for such.
7	
	Be it further resolved that the
8	Chairman is hereby authorized to grant any
9	other related and/or incidental approvals
10	necessary for the licensee's commencement
11	of gaming operations at the temporary
12	facility and/or the cessation of gaming
13	operations on the vessel, including but
14	not limited to, removing the requirement
15	for a certificate of compliance for the
16	licensee's shuttered vessel at the
17	appropriate time.
18	Be it further resolved that the
19	licensee shall seek full board approval to
20	sell or otherwise dispose of the riverboat
21	gaming vessel only after the board
22	approval is obtained to commence gaming
23	operations at its temporary facility.
24	Thus done and signed in Baton Rouge,
25	Louisiana, this 19th day of September

7	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
8	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
9	General Delancey Houston here today to
10	present Treasure Chest Casino's request
11	for approval to dispose of its vessel.
12	On December 16th, 2021, the board
13	approved the licensee's request to move
14	its gaming operations to a landside
15	facility.
16	On June 5th, 2024, the licensee
17	opened its landside facility.
18	On June 26th, 2024, the board
19	approved the licensee's request to suspend
20	all requirements for its vessel including
21	but not limited to removing all
22	requirements for manning its shuttered
23	vessel with marine personnel. The
24	licensee was still required to maintain a
25	qualified security person to make hourly

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1	rounds of the vessel and property for
2	fire, flood and safety hazard watch every
3	hour of the day seven days a week.
4	On September 4th, 2024, the licensee
5	filed a petition requesting the board's
6	approval to dispose of its vessel. The
7	vessel is closed to the public and
8	nonessential personnel. It's secured and
9	completely shuttered, has no gaming
10	devices or equipment on board and is not
11	being used for any purpose.
12	Currently the licensee has a
13	qualified security person to make hourly
14	rounds of the vessel and property for
15	fire, flood and safety hazard watch every
16	hour of the day seven days a week.
17	The licensee has contracted with the
18	Aids Construction to remove and dispose of
19	the vessel and barge. The licensee is
20	seeking board approval to remove and
21	dispose of the vessel and to be relieved
22	of their requirement to keep a security
23	officer at the site after the vessel and
24	barge are removed.
25	If it is the board's pleasure to



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1	approve the licensee's request to dispose
2	of the vessel, a resolution has been
3	prepared for the board's consideration.
4	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
5	Are there any questions, board
6	members, for Ms. Houston?
7	If not, I will entertain a motion to
8	adopt the resolution.
9	MR. SHOLES:
10	Moved.
11	MS. LEWIS:
12	Second.
13	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
14	Judge Sholes has moved, and Ms.
15	Lewis has seconded.
16	Okay. Ms. Landry, will you please

3	Whereas, on December 16, 2021, the
4	board approved the licensee's request to
5	relocate its gaming operations to a newly
6	constructed landside facility to be
7	included as part of the approved project;
8	Whereas, on June 5th, 2024, the
9	board previously approved the licensee's
10	request to commence gaming operations in
11	its riverboat gaming landside facility and
12	cease all gaming activity upon its vessel;
13	And, whereas, on June 16th I'm
14	sorry on June 26th, 2024, the board had
15	previously approved the licensee's request
16	to suspend all requirements for its
17	vessel's certificate of compliance issued
18	on May 20th, 2024, including, but not
19	limited to, removing all requirements for
20	manning for its shuttered vessel with
21	marine personnel.
22	Now, therefore, be it resolved the
23	licensee's request for approval to sell
24	and/or dispose of its vessel be granted.

And congratulations 17 on your success since opening the landside facility. 18 19 MS. ETLAND: 20 You're welcome. Thank you. Any 21 time. 2.2 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 23 Okay. We'll now move on to item 6 24 on the agenda, which is rule making. And 25 first we have the consideration of the

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1	institution of rule making procedures for
2	amendment of LAC 42:III.2905, weapons in
3	designated gaming area.
4	Ms. Gits, good morning.
5	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL GITS:
6	Good morning.
7	Good morning Chairman Hebert and
8	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
9	General Cathryn Gits here in the matter of
10	the rulemaking procedures for item No. 6
11	A, which is an amendment to the Louisiana
12	Administrative Code, Title 42, Part III,
13	Section 2905, weapons in the designated
14	gaming area.
15	The proposed rule change is a result
16	of Act No. 38 of the 2024 regular
17	legislative session. The rule change
18	allows for compliance with packet No. 38
19	and allows for qualified law enforcement
20	officers and qualified retired law
21	enforcement officers to possess a firearm
22	in a designated gaming area of the casino
23	provided there is valid identification
24	proving their status.
25	In accordance with Act No. 59 of the

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1	2024 regular legislative session, any
2	statute in conflict with the allowance of
3	concealed carry in any business
4	organization is null and void. And any
5	rule in violation must be amended within
6	six months after August 1st, 2024.
7	The rule the rule in its current
8	posture allows only full-time commissioned
9	law enforcement officers who are on duty
10	and within their respective jurisdiction
11	or on-duty gaming security personnel
12	licensed by the Louisiana State Board of
13	Private Security Examiners to possess
14	weapons in a designated gaming area, which
15	is in direct conflict with Act No. 38,
16	thus necessitating the proposed rule
17	change.
18	If the board has no questions, a
19	motion to institute the rulemaking
20	procedure is needed.
21	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
22	Questions, board members? Judge
23	Sholes.
24	MR. SHOLES:
25	I don't know if this is a question,
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1	but I at least have to voice my concern.	
2	Adding more people carrying guns in a	
3	casino just to me does not seem to make	
4	good sense. I understand why they may	
5	want qualified law enforcement officers	
6	but retired law enforcement officers who	
7	they have no control over, have no idea	
8	where they come from or if they're still	
9	in good mental capacity, that just seems	
10	to me as a bad idea.	
11	Although I know we have no right to	
12	do anything about it, I just wanted to	
13	voice my concern.	
14	Thank you.	
15	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:	
16	Thank you, Judge Sholes.	
17	Any other questions or comments from	
18	board members?	
19	If not, I will entertain a motion	
20	for the adoption of rulemaking procedures	
21	for this amendment.	
22	MS. LEWIS:

24	Fantasy Sports issues. Item A is the
25	consideration of fantasy sports contest

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1	renewal application for FanDuel, Inc.
2	Doing business as FanDuel.
3	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL HOUSTON:
4	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
5	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
6	General Delancey Houston here in the
7	matter of the consideration of the Fantasy
8	Sports contest operator renewal
9	application of FanDuel, Inc.
10	Here with me today is Ms. Donna
11	Jackson with Louisiana State Police Gaming
12	Enforcement or Gaming Audit Division,
13	excuse me, and Investigator Kevin Biddy
14	with Gaming Enforcement Division.
15	Pursuant to the Louisiana gaming
16	law, the board is the sole regulator of
17	paid Fantasy Sports contest in Louisiana
18	and is in charge of issuing or denying
19	applications for Fantasy Sports contest
20	operator licenses.
21	The gaming enforcement division has
22	reviewed the financial circumstances of
23	the applicant and completed its
24	suitability investigation for the
25	applicant, its parent company and its



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1	principals.
2	The division has also reviewed the
3	applicant's financial statements, platform
4	specifics and the other criteria required
5	under gaming law.
6	At this time, the division will
7	provide their findings to the board.
8	MS. JACKSON:
9	Good morning Chairman Hebert, board
10	members. My name is Donna Jackson. I'm
11	with the Louisiana State Police, Gaming
12	Audit Section.
13	FanDuel, Inc. is wholly owned by its
14	ultimate parent company, Flutter
15	Entertainment, plc through FanDuel Group
16	Parent, LLC and other intermediate
17	subsidiaries. FanDuel operates in 44 U.S.
18	jurisdictions and is one of two Fantasy
19	Sports Contests licensees currently
20	operating in Louisiana.
21	Fantasy Sports revenue is generated
22	from contest entry fees from users, net of
23	prizes, and customer incentives awarded to
24	users.
25	In addition to Fantasy Sports,

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1	FanDuel's U.S. segment provides online
2	sports betting product offerings in 23
3	U.S. jurisdictions, including Louisiana.
4	They also operate iGaming or online
5	casino in five U.S. jurisdictions.
6	For the six-month interim period
7	ending June 30th, 2024, Sportsbook
8	accounted for approximately 56% of
9	Flutter's total revenue, while iGaming
10	accounted for approximately 39% of total
11	revenue.
12	The other product category, which
13	includes Fantasy Sports, pari-mutuel
14	wagering, and exchange betting, accounted
15	for approximately 4.9% of Flutter's total
16	revenue.
17	For fiscal year ended December 31st,
18	2023, Flutter's U.S. segment reported its
19	first year of positive adjusted EBITDA of
20	\$65 million. The company stated that it
21	expects to achieve a second year of
22	profitability in 2024 based upon the
23	second quarter of 2024 results.
24	The audit section feels there's
25	minimal risk to the state of Louisiana or

FanDuel's players if FanDuel does not
achieve or maintain the projected
profitability, since they are not
investing in a brick-and-mortar facility
and the players' cash is maintained
separately from the operating cash
balances.
In conclusion, no financial issues
came to our attention to preclude the
board from approving the renewal of
FanDuel's Fantasy Sports Contest license
for a period of three years, effective
October 21, 2024.
Licensing will now present its
findings to the board.
MASTER TROOPER BIDDY:
Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
members of the board. I am Master Trooper
Kevin Biddy with the Louisiana State
Police Gaming Enforcement Division.
On June 27th, 2024, the Louisiana

State Police Gaming Enforcement Division received the renewal license application submitted on behalf of FanDuel, Inc. Doing business as FanDuel and their business



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1	affiliates.
2	During the investigation of FanDuel,
3	Inc. Doing business as FanDuel and
4	officers, their business affiliates, a
5	background investigation was conducted on
6	each of their officers, directors,
7	managers and persons with a 5% ownership
8	or economic interest in the company.
9	The background investigation
10	consisted of inquiries made to federal,
11	state, and local law enforcement agencies.
12	Inquiries were also made to civil courts
13	and gaming to regular I'm sorry and
14	gaming regulatory agencies.
15	There was no information found that
16	would preclude the applicant from
17	participating in the Louisiana gaming
18	industry.
19	It is the division's recommendation
20	that FanDuel, Inc. Doing business as
21	FanDuel Fantasy Sports Contest permit be
22	approved.
23	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL GITS:
24	If it's the board's pleasure to
25	approve the renewal application of



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1	FanDuel, Inc., a resolution has been
2	prepared for the board's adoption and the
3	Chairman's signature.
4	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
5	Okay. Board members, are there any
6	questions for Ms. Houston, Ms. Jackson or
7	Master Trooper Biddy?
8	Okay. If there are none, I would
9	entertain a motion to adopt the
10	resolution.
11	MS. BERRY:
12	So moved.
13	MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

14	Ms. Nathan, Trooper Cannon, good
15	morning.
16	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN:
17	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
18	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
19	General Andrea Nathan appearing before you
20	this morning in the matter of the approval
21	of the transfer of interest in Tiger Truck
22	Stop, Inc. doing business as Tiger Truck
23	Stop, which holds a Type 5 video draw
24	poker gaming license.
25	The truck stop is located in
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1	Iberville Parish. On July 9th, 2024, John
2	L. Ewing, Senior donated his 500 shares in
3	the licensee to his spouse, Danna J.
4	Glaser. The 500 shares equal a 50%
5	ownership interest in the licensee.
6	Master Trooper James Cannon
7	conducted an investigation of the transfer
8	of ownership interest. And he is present
9	this morning to present his findings to
10	the board.
11	MASTER TROOPER CANNON:
12	Good morning, Chairman and members
13	of the board. I'm Master Trooper James
14	Cannon with the Louisiana State Police
15	Gaming Enforcement Division. I
16	investigated the transfer that occurred in
17	the licensee. I also conducted an updated
18	background check on Danna J. Glaser and
19	John L. Ewing, Senior, who previously
20	submitted to suitability investigations in
21	connection with his video poker license
22	and others.
23	I found no information to preclude
24	the licensee or its owners from continuing
25	to participate in the Louisiana Gaming



1	Industry.
2	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN:
3	The Office of the Attorney General
4	has reviewed the file prepared by the
5	Louisiana State Police Gaming Enforcement
6	Division and the information contained
7	therein would not preclude the approval of
8	the transfer.
9	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
10	Okay. Board members, are there any
11	questions for Ms. Nathan or Master Trooper
12	Cannon?
13	If not, I will entertain a motion to
14	approve the transfer of ownership interest
15	in the licensee.
16	MR. JACKSON:
17	Motion to approve.
18	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
19	Approved by Mr. Jackson.
20	Can I get a second?
21	MS. BECNEL:
22	Second.
23	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
24	Ms. Becnel seconded.
25	Okay. Is there any discussion? Any



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1	opposition?
2	Hearing none, that motion carries.
3	Thank y'all.
4	Okay. Moving on to the next item
5	under video gaming issues, consideration
6	of the transfer of interest of Ewings of
7	Livonia, LLC doing business as LA Express
8	11 Deli.
9	Ms. Nathan.
10	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN:
11	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
12	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
13	General Andrea Nathan appearing before you
14	this morning in the matter of the approval
15	of the transfer of membership interest in
16	Ewings of Livonia, LLC doing business as
17	LA Express 11 Deli, which holds a Type 5
18	video draw poker gaming license.
19	The truck shop is located in Point
20	Coupee Parish.
21	On July 9th, 2024, John L. Ewing,
22	Senior donated his 100% interest in the
23	licensee to his spouse, Danna J. Glaser.
24	Master Trooper James Cannon conducted an
25	investigation of the transfer of the

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1	membership interest. He is here this
2	-
	morning to present his findings to the
3	board.
4	MASTER TROOPER CANNON:
5	Again, I'm Master Trooper James
6	Cannon with Louisiana State Police. I
7	investigated the transfer that occurred in
8	the licensee, and I also conducted an
9	updated background check on Danna J.
10	Glaser and John L. Ewing, Senior, both of
11	whom previously submitted to the
12	suitability investigations in connection
13	with this video poker license and others.
14	I found no information to preclude
15	the licensee or its member from continuing
16	to participate that in the Louisiana
17	Gaming Industry.
18	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN:
19	The Office of the Attorney General
20	has reviewed the file prepared by the
21	Louisiana State Police Gaming Enforcement
22	Division and the information contained
23	therein would not preclude approval of the
24	transfer.
25	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:



1	Okay. Any questions from the board?
2	If not, I will entertain a motion to
3	approve the transfer of ownership interest
4	in the licensee.
5	MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:
6	Moved.
7	MS. TRAYLOR:
8	Second.
9	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
10	Ms. Hamilton-Acker moves, and
11	seconded by Ms. Traylor.
12	Is there any discussion? Any
13	opposition?
14	Hearing none, that motion carries.
15	Thank you.
16	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN:
17	Thank you.
18	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
19	Our final agenda item is the
20	consideration of the appeal of Terrytown
21	Cafe, Inc. doing business as Terrytown
22	Cafe. Is anyone here on behalf of the
23	licensee?
24	Mr. Jackson, good morning.
25	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON:

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1	Good morning, Chairman Hebert and
2	ladies and gentlemen of the board. I'm
3	Assistant Attorney General Quintele
4	Jackson appearing on behalf of the
5	division. And we're here today in the
6	appeal filed by Terrytown Cafe, Inc. doing
7	business as Terrytown Cafe regarding the
8	hearing officer's decision in revoking the
9	licensee's gaming permit.
10	Now, the division recommended that
11	the video draw poker license issued to
12	Terrytown Cafe be suspended and then
13	subsequently revoked due to the licensee's
14	failure to comply with all federal, state
15	and local law regulations.
16	Specifically, the licensee failed to
17	maintain a valid ATC permit from the
18	department of the revenue, office of
19	alcohol and tobacco control, as well as
20	failing to have a valid local occupation
21	permit from the St Jefferson Parish
22	Sheriff's Office.
23	On March 27th, 2024, the division
24	conducted an inspection of the licensee's
25	establishment and discovered that the ATC

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1	permit on display expired on February
2	29th, 2024. The local occupation permit
3	on display expired on December 31st of
4	2023.
5	Now, these violations were noted in
6	the video gaming compliance inspection
7	form, which was signed by Ms. Songie, the
8	licensee's 100% owner.
9	On May 8th of 2024, the licensee and
10	the division came before the hearing
11	officer regarding the immediate emergency
12	suspension of the licensee's gaming
13	license. Ms. Songie was present at the
14	hearing and testified on behalf of the
15	licensee. The division showed the
16	testimony and evidence that Terrytown Cafe
17	was in violation of gaming law by
18	operating without a valid ATC permit.
19	Additionally, at the time of this
20	hearing, the licensee provided evidence
21	that it had at that time a valid
22	occupation permit. However, Ms. Songie
23	testified and admitted that the licensee
24	was not in possession of a valid ATC
25	permit. As a result, the hearing officer



1	sustained the immediate emergency
2	suspension of their gaming license and the
3	matter was set for revocation.
4	Now, on June 4th of this year, the
5	parties then appeared before the court
6	regarding the revocation of the Terrytown
7	gaming license. The division again
8	presented testimony and evidence that
9	showed that Terrytown was in violation of
10	gaming law. Ms. Songie was present at
11	this hearing as well and did not provide
12	any evidence that Terrytown was in
13	possession of a valid ATC permit at the
14	time of the revocation hearing. The
15	hearing officer considered the weight and
16	testimony of this evidence and correctly
17	revoked Terrytown's gaming license due to
18	its failure to have a valid ATC permit in
19	violation of gaming law.
20	The hearing officer finally revoking
21	the license is not in contrary to the law
22	in evidence that was submitted at all
23	stages of the proceeding.
24	Therefore, for these reasons, the
25	division respectfully requests that this



1	honorable board affirm the hearing
2	officer's decision revoking the gaming
3	license issued to Terrytown Cafe, Inc.
4	doing business as Terrytown.
5	Thank you for your time and your
6	consideration.
7	I'll be happy to answer any
8	questions the board may have.
9	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
10	Any questions from board members?
11	Judge Sholes.
12	MR. SHOLES:
13	Am I correct that now the lady has
14	the I know we're not allowed to
15	consider any information that the judge
16	probably didn't get, but clearly from the
17	packet, it is clear that there were two
18	things. There was a delay in getting the
19	ATC permit because of costs and the amount
20	of time the ATC takes to produce the
21	information, and the lady now has the
22	valid permit.
23	For that reason, I would be willing
24	to give Judge Ponder the opportunity to
25	consider that information to determine

1	whether or not she would like to alter her
2	decision.
3	I would move that we elect Option 2.
4	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
5	Okay. There's a motion on the floor
6	from
7	MR. JACKSON:
8	Second.
9	CHAIRMAN HEBERT:
10	Judge Sholes to remand for
11	consideration of new evidence and that has
12	been seconded by Mr. Jackson.
13	Any discussion? Any opposition?
14	Okay. And taking into consideration the
15	hard work from the AG and the state
16	police, we have no opposition of that
17	motion and I think in the interest of
18	justice a remand is is warranted here.
19	And so that motion carries, and that
20	matter will be remanded for the hearing
21	officer to consider that new evidence.
22	Okay. Moving on to our true final
23	agenda item, which is adjournment. I
24	would ask for a motion that we adjourn.
