6	Any opposed? [No response.] No
7	opposition, motion carries.
8	IV. REVENUE REPORTS
9	CHAIRMAN NOEL: The next item,
10	Revenue Reports, State Police, I believe
11	Ms. Jackson.
12	MS. JACKSON: Yes, good morning,
13	Chairman Noel and Board Members. My
14	name is Donna Jackson with Louisiana
15	State Police Gaming Enforcement
16	Division.
17	The casinos are operating at 50
18	percent capacity with 75 percent of
19	gaming positions in operation, with the
20	exception of Harrah's New Orleans and
21	Fair Grounds which are at 25 percent
22	capacity.
23	The 14 operating riverboats
24	generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
25	\$132,044,556 in June. This total
	11
1	represents an increase of \$72 million
2	from last month when most riverboats
3	were open for only 14 days and a
4	decrease of \$19.7 million or 13 percent
5	from last June. As information, this
6	June had one less Saturday and Sunday
7	than last June.
8	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal

9	year 2019-2020 are \$1,456,000,000, a
10	decrease of \$407 million or 22 percent
11	from fiscal year 2018-2019.
12	During June the State collected fees
13	totaling \$28.4 million. As of
14	June 30th, 2020, the State collected
15	\$313 million in fees for fiscal year
16	2019-2020, which is \$87.5 million less
17	than last fiscal year.
18	Next is a summary of the June 2020
19	gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans
20	found on page three. Harrah's reopened
21	on June 13th and generated \$5,609,758 in
22	gross gaming revenue. These revenues
23	represent a decrease from last June of
24	\$16.8 million or 75 percent.
25	Revenues for fiscal year 2019-2020
	12
1	are \$210.3 million, a decrease of
2	\$81 million or 28 percent from fiscal
3	year 2018-2019. During June the State
4	received, \$14,958,904 in minimum daily
5	payments. This amount includes payments
6	for April, May and June due to Harrah's
7	receiving approval to defer the payments
8	during the closure.
9	As of June 30th, 2020, the State
10	collected \$60,040,872 in fees for fiscal
11	year 2019-2020.

12	Next I'll present the revenues for
13	Slots at the Racetracks. During June
14	the four racetrack facilities combined
15	generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
16	\$26,744,164, an increase of \$16 million
17	from last month but a decrease of
18	\$3.3 million or 11 percent from last
19	June.
20	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
21	year 2019-2020 are \$277 million, a
22	decrease of \$77.7 million or 22 percent
23	from fiscal year 2018-2019.
24	During June the State collected
25	\$4.1 million in fees. As of June 30th,
	13
1	2020, the State collected over
2	\$42 million in fees for fiscal year
3	2019-2020, down \$11.8 million or
4	22 percent from last fiscal year.
5	Overall in June, Riverboats, Land
6	Based and Slots at the Racetracks
7	combined generated \$164 million in AGR,
8	which represents a decrease from
9	June 2019 of 19 percent.
10	Are there any questions before I
11	present the video gaming statistics?
12	[No response.]
13	One new video gaming license, a
14	device owner's, was issued during June.

15	Two new Type 1 or bar applications were
16	received by the Gaming Enforcement
17	Division during June and are currently
18	pending in the field.
19	The Gaming Enforcement Division
20	assessed no fines in June but collected
21	\$7,000 in civil penalties. There are
22	presently \$2,750 in outstanding fines.
23	As of June 30th, there were 12,669
24	video gaming devices activated at 1,567
25	locations. Net device revenue for
	14
1	June 2020 was \$60.6 million, a
2	\$36.7 million increase when compared to
3	May 2020, and a \$10.7 million increase
4	when compared to June 2019.
5	Net device revenue for fiscal year
6	2019-2020 is \$528.6 million, a decrease
7	of \$82 million or 13.4 percent when
8	compared to fiscal year 2018-2019.
9	Total franchise fees collected
10	during June 2020 were \$18.3 million, an
11	increase of \$11 million when compared to
12	May 2020, and a \$3.4 million increase
13	when compared to June 2019.
14	Total franchise fees collected for
15	fiscal year 2019-2020 are \$158.7
16	million, a decrease of \$24.2 million or
17	13.2 percent when compared to fiscal

18 year 2018-2019. 19 In summary, revenue for all four 20 gaming venues combined in fiscal year 21 2019-2020 is down \$648 million or 22 21 percent with fees to the state being 23 down \$126.6 million or 18 percent when 24 compared to last fiscal year. 25 Any questions? 15 1 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions from 2 any of the Board Members? [No 3 response.] 4 Thank you, Ms. Jackson. 5 One thing to note based on the 6 Governor's Executive Order from this 7 past weekend regarding bars, the devices 8 that were in operation at bars were 9 disabled, so that will -- will have an 10 impact on July's numbers. I believe, 11 you know, it's close to 2,000, 12 perhaps -- 2,000 machines that were 13 disabled. 14 V. CASINO GAMING ISSUES 15 A. Consideration of Application for Shelf 16 Approval of Debt Transactions by Boyd Gaming 17 Corporation 18 CHAIRMAN NOEL: All right. We'll 19 move on to our Casino Gaming Issues.

First one will be, Consideration of

21	Application for Shelf Approval of Debt
22	Transactions by Boyd Gaming Corporation.
23	MS. MOORE: Chairman Noel, Board
24	Members, for the record I am Assistant
25	Attorney General Charmaine Moore.
	16
1	Boyd Gaming Corporation, which is
2	the parent company of five Louisiana
3	casino licensees, namely riverboat
4	licensees Amelia Belle, Sam's Town and
5	Treasure Chest and slots licensees,
6	Evangeline Downs and Delta Downs, has
7	petitioned the Board for approval of a
8	shelf for debt financing in the amount
9	of \$7.5 million billion dollars,
10	sorry.
11	Section 2525 of Title 42 allows
12	publicly-traded companies meeting
13	certain criteria to be granted shelf
14	approval for a period not to exceed a
15	period of three years subject to any
16	conditions or limitations as determined
17	by the Board. A shelf approval for Boyd
18	will allow the company to enter into
19	debt transactions without prior Board
20	approval up to the amount approved by
21	the Board on the condition that the
22	Board is notified within ten days of the
23	transaction, and thereafter the company

24	provides copies of all executed
25	documents to audit for review. Boyd has
	17
1	previously received Board approval for a
2	shelf in 2014 and 2017.
3	At this time State Police Auditor,
4	Trnessia Ware, will present Audit's
5	review and findings to the Board.
6	MS. WARE: Good morning, Chairman
7	Noel and Members of the Board. My name
8	is Trnessia Ware with Louisiana State
9	Police Corporate Securities Audit.
10	Janet Boles, local counsel for Boyd
11	Gaming, submitted a letter to the Board
12	on May 27th, 2020, seeking shelf
13	approval of debt transactions up to
14	\$7.5 billion for a period of three
15	years. Boyd anticipates using the
16	proceeds for any future indebtedness for
17	refinancing of existing outstanding
18	debt, repayment of amounts outstanding
19	under Body's revolving credit facility
20	and general corporate purposes including
21	working capital.
22	Boyd's long-term debt schedule is
23	shown on page four of your report.
24	May 31st, 2020, Boyd's long-term debt
25	approximated \$5 billion. With

1	\$945.5 million available under the bank
2	credit facility as of March 31st, 2020,
3	Boyd has borrowed \$865 million from the
4	revolving credit facility.
5	\$64.9 million was borrowed on the swing
6	loan and \$12.6 million allocated to
7	support various letters of credit.
8	As a precautionary measure to
9	increase liquidity during the
10	uncertainty of COVID-19, Boyd increased
11	the borrowings on its revolving credit
12	facility by \$670 million on March 16th,
13	2020. Boyd projects sufficient cash
14	flows from operations to maintain its
15	debt.
16	In conclusion, other than the
17	unknown economic impact of COVID-19, no
18	financial issues came to our attention
19	to preclude the Board's approval of
20	Boyd's shelf application.
21	Representatives of Boyd Gaming are
22	in attendance today and also available
23	for questioning regarding this
24	transaction.
25	Are there any questions?
	19
1	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions from
2	the Board? [No response.]
3	Ms. Boles, did you have anything you

- 4 needed to add?
- 5 MS. BOLES: No, sir. I just
- 6 appreciate your timely handling this

7	Resolution:
8	Be it resolved that Boyd Gaming
9	Corporation's application for shelf
10	approval for debt transactions be and is
11	hereby approved subject to the following
12	terms and conditions:
13	For a period of three years
14	beginning July 16th, 2020, Boyd Gaming
15	Corporation is granted approval pursuant
16	to LAC 42:III.2525 to enter into debt
17	transactions as defined in LAC
18	42:III.2522 not to exceed a cumulative
19	total of \$7.5 billion. For purposes of
20	this shelf approval, the cumulative
21	total of \$7.5 billion shall include debt
22	currently existing or approved in
23	earlier debt transactions.
24	Second, within ten days of
25	consummation of a debt transaction,
	21
1	including amendments and modifications
2	of existing debt transactions, Boyd
3	Gaming Corporation shall provide a term
4	sheet or executive summary of the debt
5	transaction and an executed copy of the
6	documents evidencing the debt
7	transaction to the Louisiana State
8	Police Gaming Enforcement Division Audit
9	Section, Corporate Securities Unit.

10	Third, this shelf approval may be
11	rescinded by the Chairman of the Board
12	upon issuance of a written notice of
13	rescission setting forth the reasons
14	therefore. The rescission shall remain
15	in effect until lifted by the Board upon
16	such terms as are satisfactory to the
17	Board.
18	Fourth, this shelf approval shall
19	expire on July 16th, 2023.
20	It is hereby further resolved that
21	the Chairman of the Louisiana Gaming
22	Control Board be delegated the authority
23	to issue a written rescission of the
24	shelf approval in accordance with LAC
25	42:III.2525.E and as provided
	22
1	hereinabove.
2	Thus done and signed in Baton Rouge,
3	Louisiana, this 16th day of July 2020.
4	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you,

7	Do we have a representative from ABS	
8	Consulting Maritime Services to give us

10	MS. LANDRY: Hi, morning, Chairman	
11	Noel and Board Members. I'm Assistant	
12	Attorney General Lisha Landry. Joining	
13	me today is Mr. John Francic of ABSG	
14	Consulting, and we're here in the matter

16	rule promulgation.
17	Act 141 of the 2020 regular session
18	required this Board to initiate
19	rulemaking for fantasy sports prior to
20	August 1st of this year, which brings
21	these rules before you today.
22	The rule changes allow for the
23	conducting licensing application
24	enforcement and regulation of fantasy
25	sports contests in accordance with the
	32
1	law.
2	The proposed rule changes are as
3	follows: Create LAC Tile 42, Part 7,
4	Sections 101 through 1303, Louisiana
5	Fantasy Sports Contests, amend LAC
6	42:III.102, Issuance and Renewal of
7	Licenses by the Department; 105 (Civil
8	Penalties) and 107, (Standards of
9	Conduct and Ethical Rules.)
10	By adding the Louisiana Fantasy
11	Sports Contest Act, LA R.S. 27:301, et
12	seq., and changing the citation for
13	video poker to LA R.S. 27:401, et seg;

14	amend LAC 42.III.104, (Delegation to
15	Chairman) by maintaining the Board's
16	exercise, all powers and authority to
17	issue fantasy sports contests to
18	operator licenses and to approve
19	transfers of ownership interest in a
20	fantasy sports operator rather than
21	delegate such powers to the Chairman;
22	amend LAC 42:III.3120, (Application and
23	Reporting Forms) adding preliminary
24	forms for fantasy sports; amend LAC
25	42:III.1907 (Construction of the
	33
1	Regulations and Administrative Matters)
2	by changing the citation from Chapter 6
3	to Chapter 8 to accurately reflect the
4	changes that were made by the
5	legislature.
6	Should the Board approve a motion to
7	institute the rulemaking procedures
8	today, next our office will send the
9	fiscal and economic impact statement
10	(inaudible) notice of intent with the
11	required forms to the legislative fiscal
12	office by Monday. Before August 10th,
13	we will send the insertion order, notice
14	of intent, impact statements and
15	(inaudible) to the legislative oversight

committees following that, the Register

17	should publish the notice on
18	August 20th.
19	There will be a public comment
20	period from August 20th through
21	September 10th. If no public comments
22	are received, the second reports will be
23	sent to the legislative oversight
24	committees on September 11th, then they
25	will have 30 days to review and hold
	34
1	hearings on the rules if they so choose.
2	If they do not hold hearings, the Board
3	will be able to place the rules on its
4	agenda for the October board meeting for
5	adoption. Once the rules are adopted,
6	our office will send the final rules to
7	the Register by November 10th, and the
8	Register will publish the final rules on
9	November 20th. Please note that this
10	time line presumes that no hearings are
11	called and no substantive changes are
12	made to the rules.
