

JOINT MOTION FOR ENTRY OF STIPULATIONS AND APPROVAL OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENT

ON THE JOINT MOTION OF:

- 1. the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police, Video Gaming Division (hereinafter "Division"), and
- 2. Michael J. Hebert d/b/a Tropical Island, License No. 5002204972 (hercinaster "licensee"),

who respectfully represent the following:

WHEREAS:

- 1. During the course of attempting to conduct a routine compliance audit of the licensee, the Division discovered that the licensee's establishment was closed from October of 2002 until March of 2003 because of damages sustained from Hurricane Lilli;
- 2. It was further discovered that the licensee failed to notify the Division of the closure and surrender its license, as required by LAC 42:XI.2405(B)(12)(a);
- 3. Device revenue reports reflect that the machines were played occasionally during the establishment's closure;
- 4. Pursuant to this information, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board issued a Notice of Recommendation of Revocation or Suspension to the licensee on or about August 26, 2003; and
- 5. This matter has been scheduled for hearing on November 10, 2003 at 9:30 a.m. before the Ilonorable J. E. Anzalone, Jr.,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing stipulations, the Division and the licensee hereby propose the following settlement, that:

- 1. The licensee acknowledges that it was in violation of LAC 42:X1.2405(B)(12)(a), in that it did not notify the Division that it's establishment was closed from October of 2002 through March of 2003, nor did it surrender its license pursuant to that closure;
- In lieu of revocation or suspension of the licensee's video gaming license, the licensee shall pay \$244.70, which represents the licensee's share of five (5) days of video gaming revenue;
- 3. The Division hereby agrees to accept the licensec's payment of the above stated penalty in full and final settlement of this Notice of Recommendation of Revocation or Suspension;
- 4. The Division reserves the right to take into consideration these violations in connection with any future violation;
- 5. The form and substance of this settlement are to be interpreted under the laws of the State of Louisiana;
- 6. This settlement constitutes the entire agreement between the Division and Michael J. Ilebert d/b/a Tropical Island pertaining to the subject matter contained herein, and supercedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations, and understandings of the parties;
- 7. This settlement is subject to approval by the Hearing Officer of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board; it is expressly understood that if this proposed settlement is approved by the Hearing Officer, this agreement is not executory and will be submitted to the Board for its determination as to whether the matter should be heard by the Hearing Officer; if approved, however, payment of the above penalties must be submitted to the Division within fifteen (15) days of approval of this settlement by the Board; the failure to submit the civil penalty within fifteen (15) days of approval by the Board shall result in the video gaming license of the licensec being suspended and its gaming devices being disabled; and
- 8. The Division and the licensee waive their rights to appeal this settlement if the Order is signed by the Hearing Officer and accepted by the Board.
