24	reports. Ms. Jackson, our favorite our
25	favorite part of the meeting every week



every month.

So good morning.

MS. JACKSON:

Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board Members.

My name is Donna Jackson with the Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit Section. In September, the 14 operating riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts of \$139,473,543. The state collected fees totaling \$29,986,812. Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date are over \$422 million, a decrease of \$5.4 million or 1% from fiscal year '22-'23.

As of September 30th, 2023, the state collected \$90.8 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24. Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue broken down by regional market. The overall increase from August was \$3.4 million or 2.5%. Compared to last September, this month's revenues represent a decrease of \$1.2 million or 1%.

Next is a summary of the September



2023 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans found on page 3. Harrah's generated \$20,689,879 in gross gaming revenues. These revenues represent an increase from last month of \$2.7 million or 15.2%, but a decrease of approximately \$2.2 million or 9.8% from the same month last year.

During September, the state received

During September, the state received \$5,327,869 in minimum daily payments.

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date are \$56 million, a decrease of \$8.8 million or 14% from fiscal '22-'23.

As of September 30th, 2023, the state collected \$16.3 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24.

Next I will present the revenues for slots at the racetracks. During September, the four racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted gross receipts of \$25,078,528, a minimal increase of .2% from August, but a slight decrease of 1.8% when compared the same month last year.

During September, the state



1 collected \$3.8 million in fees. Adjusted 2 gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to 3 date are \$77.7 million, a decrease of \$2.6 million or 3% from fiscal year '22-'23. 4 5 As of September 30th, 2023, the state has collected approximately \$11.8 6 7 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24. 8 I will now move to the video gaming 9 information. There are 11,811 video 10 gaming devices activated at 1,384 locations. Gaming device revenue for 11 September 2023 was \$60,084,551, a decrease 12 13 of \$1.5 million or 2.5% when compared to 14 August and a decrease of \$2.3 million or 15 3.7% when compared to last September. 16 Total franchise fees for September

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Total franchise fees for September totaled \$18.2 million. Fiscal year to date gaming device revenue was \$183 million, a decrease of \$10 million or 5.2% when compared to last fiscal year.

As of September 30th, 2023, the state has collected \$55.5 million in franchise fees for fiscal year '23-'24.

Next, I'll present the September revenues for sportsbook. During



1	September, the 18 retail sportsbook
2	accepted over \$31 million in sports
3	wagers, resulting in net proceeds of
4	approximately \$5.7 million and \$572,554 in
5	state taxes. The nine mobile sportsbook
6	operators accepted \$248.8 million in
7	sports wagers, resulting in net proceeds
8	of \$36 million and \$4.7 million in taxes
9	paid to the state.
10	This is the highest monthly total
11	generated by mobile sports wagering since
12	inception.
13	And I've added retail and mobile
14	sports wagering by month charts to your
15	chart folders for comparison purposes.
16	Finally, for daily fantasy sports,
17	gross revenues for September are \$1.5
18	million with net revenue of approximately
19	\$161,000 and taxes of just under \$13,000.
20	Are there any questions?

22	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24	Great work. Any questions from the Board

Just a couple of observations I'd like to make, first, I want to congratulate the QUEEN here in Baton Rouge on their first full month, exceptional month for them compared to the same month last year, almost an 85% income increase in their revenue, and compared to the previous month, over 90 percent.

So I think it just shows you what land-based properties are capable of doing, and I think that the most interesting fact is -- number is that they actually grew the Baton Rouge market by almost 3 million, so -- from the prior year.

So it wasn't a matter of cannibalizing anybody else. It was a net increase of the -- of the entire market. So to the QUEEN, congratulations to you.

On sports betting, just again some incredible numbers. I think it shows you what football, college and -- and the NFL mean to sports betting. But as Ms.

Jackson indicated, the very largest month

15	consideration of a temporary certificate
16	of compliance for the alternate riverboat
17	inspection of Louisiana 1 Gaming, and that
18	is doing business as Boomtown New Orleans.
19	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MS. HOUSTON:
20	Good morning, Chairman Johns and
21	Board Members. I'm Delancey Houston, with
22	me today is Moriah Reed with AVS, and we
23	are here today in regards to issuance of a
24	temporary certificate of compliance to
25	Boomtown Casino, which is located in



Harvey, Louisiana.

On August 16th, 2023, AVS began the inspection process for the approval of Boomtown Casino's annual certificate of compliance. However, Boomtown is requesting an extension of time to resolve discrepancies that remain outstanding.

Ms. Moriah Reed will now provide the details of AVS's inspection.

#### MS. REED:

Good morning, Chairman Johns and Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with American Vessel Services, and I'm here to report on the annual certification for the CT Boomtown Belle 2 at Boomtown Casino's New Orleans property in Harvey, Louisiana.

The inspector's people and I that on August 16th of 2023 attend the Riverboat Boomtown Belle 2 to conduct the annual inspection in accordance with the Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program.

We reviewed fire protection measures, egress ops, observed emergency lighting, tested the emergency generator, inspected the mooring system and conducted



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a fire drill as well as other required life safety items.

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The deficiencies are noted on pages 6 through 9 of your annual report. A follow-up inspection was done and seven deficiencies remained in our observation. These deficiencies are noted on pages 2, 3 and 4 of the supplemental survey dated October 3rd in your package.

As a result of these remaining deficiencies not being completely satisfied, the property has requested an extension of their COC to allow sufficient time to complete their deficiencies. The delay appears to be material and contractor availability.

AVS has worked with the property to understand the remaining deficiencies, and we feel that they do not pose a risk to the safety of the passengers or crew of the casino vessel.

AVS also feels confident that the property is working diligently on transferring these outstanding items and we are hopeful that the remaining items



should be completed by the next Board 1 2 meeting. 3 The 2023 annual survey as required 4 by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is 5 not complete. As such, the property has 6 requested an extension. This extension 7 request letter from the property is 8 included in your package. It is the recommendation of AVS that 10 the Boomtown Belle 2 be issued a temporary certificate of compliance for November of 11 12 2023 to allow additional time to satisfy 13 the remaining deficiencies. 14 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MS. HOUSTON: 15 We now present these findings to the 16 Board and request that upon the Board 17 accepting the report submitted by AVS 18 today, you will move forward on the 19 issuance of the temporary certificate of 20 compliance to Boomtown Casino, which will 21 expire on November 19th, 2023. 2.2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 23 Okay. Is anyone from Boomtown here? 24 MS. REED: 25 Yes, sir.

20	comfortable in telling this Board that all
21	of this can be remedied by the end of
22	by the next board meeting?
23	MR. MURRAY:
24	Yes, sir. We have PO's been issued.
25	Right now the vendors are scheduled for



1	Monday, so we should be good to go.
2	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
3	Should be good to go. Okay.
4	Any questions for Mr. Murray?
5	Judge Sholes.
6	MR. SHOLES:
7	I couldn't help but notice that one
8	of things is water in the bilge pump.
9	MR. MURRAY:
10	That has been corrected.
11	MR. SHOLES:
12	Clean water out of a bilge pump.
13	MR. MURRAY:
14	Sir, we had an AC backup an AC
15	unit backup the day before the inspection
16	and the engineers did not catch it, so
17	they had to pump that out.
18	MR. SHOLES:
19	And that lasted more than one
20	inspection period; is that correct?
21	MR. MURRAY:
22	We were not satisfied to declare it
23	fixed until we had our HVAC contractor
24	verify that it was not going to happen
25	again.



1	MR. SHOLES:
2	And that has been solved since?
3	MS. REED:
4	Yes, sir. I have seen the pictures.
5	He's submitted them. They just haven't
6	been able to be processed into the report.
7	MR. SHOLES:
8	Thank you.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Thank you, Judge.
11	You have a question, Ms. Berry?
12	MS. BERRY:
13	No other of these issues related to
14	major safety problems?
15	MR. MURRAY:
16	No, ma'am.
17	MS. BERRY:
18	It's just small things like trash
19	cans and parts?
20	MR. MURRAY:
21	Yes, ma'am.
22	MS. BERRY:
23	Okay. Thank you.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Okay. Thank you, Ms. Berry.



1	Mr. Murray, thank you for being here
2	today with us.
3	And so, Members, I have no further
4	questions. I would entertain a motion
5	that we issue a temporary certificate of
6	compliance, which will expire November the
7	19th of 2023.

23	Okay. Ladies and gentlemen, we will
24	move on to a consideration of a joint
25	petition of approval of the transfer of



1	membership interest of Louisiana Riverboat
2	Gaming Partnership doing business as
3	DiamondJacks Casino & Resort.
4	And good morning.
5	MS. LANDRY:
6	Good morning, Chairman Johns.
7	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
8	I've been waiting for this to be on
9	the agenda for awhile.
10	MS. LANDRY:
11	Well, today's the day.
12	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
13	Thank you.
14	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LANDRY:
15	Good morning, Chairman Johns. Good
16	morning, Members. I'm Assistant Attorney
17	General Lisha Landry, here with auditor
18	Tammy Haupt with the Louisiana State
19	Police Audit Section, and Investigator
20	Rodney Perkins of the Louisiana State
21	Police Gaming Enforcement Division.
22	We're here today for the approval of
23	the transfer of membership interest in
24	Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company, LLC
25	doing business as DiamondJacks Casino and

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Resort, which holds a riverboat gaming license and is located in Bossier Parish.

The Licensee is currently owned by Foundation Gaming & Entertainment, LLC, which became the Licensee's sole parent company in December of 2022. The Board has previously approved the Licensee's request to relocate its gaming operations to a landside facility as part of the Approved Project in accordance with the relocation plan and supporting documents submitted by Foundation Gaming and the Licensee.

On March 24th, 2023, the Licensee, Foundation Gaming, and LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC, filed a Joint Petition with the Board seeking approval for the proposed sale of the membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Gaming Investors.

Due to the pending sale, the Board approved the Licensee's request to extend the deadlines for submission of its architectural blueprints and detailed plan of design and construction, construction contracts, completion of the Approved



Project and commencement of gaming operations at the landside facility.

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The Board considered this request based solely on LRGC Gaming Investor's plans to re-brand the Approved Project as a future 'Live!' brand casino facility, supply chain issues, and the length of time required for full suitability and financial investigations related to the transfer of interest in the Licensee.

Those investigations are now complete and the request for Board approval for the transfer of the membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Gaming Investors and related transactions are now up for Board consideration.

On March 14th, 2023, Foundation

Gaming entered into a Purchase and Sale

Agreement with LRGC Gaming Investors for
the sale of 100% of the membership
interest in the Licensee for a total
purchase price of approximately \$33.1

million.

The total purchase price includes a



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base purchase price of \$3 million and reimbursements for approved costs and expenses incurred by Foundation Gaming from the time it acquired the Licensee until the closing of the sale of the Licensee to the LRGC Gaming Investors.

LRGC Gaming Investors is affiliated with Cordish Gaming Group, which is a division of The Cordish Companies, Inc., and operates casino and hotel properties and other gaming businesses. Jonathan Cordish, Blake Cordish and Reed Cordish are the only individuals with 5% or more ownership in LRGC Gaming Investors and its parent companies.

Upon closing of the transaction,
LRGC Gaming Investors will own 100% of the
membership interest in the Licensee. The
parties intend to close on the Purchase
and Sale Agreement and related agreements
by October 31st, 2023.

After LRGC Gaming Investors acquires the membership interest in the Licensee, Foundation Gaming will no longer manage the Licensee. But in consideration of the



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purchase of the membership interest in the Licensee and for Foundation Gaming's work on the Approved Project thus far, Foundation Gaming will enter into a Participation Agreement with the Licensee and will continue to have an economic interest in the Licensee, but serving only in an advisory role.

The Foundation Gaming will have no decision-making authority, voting rights or control with respect to the Licensee's business.

As far as the Licensee's landside facility, LRGC Gaming Investors intends to — intends to commit to a capital investment of over 250 million for the Approved Project. LRGC Gaming Investors will be making adjustments and enhancements to the Licensee's landside relocation plan to ensure the quality of the development and finishes associated with the future Live! brand casino resort facility.

To coincide with the change in ownership and future re-brand, the



Licensee is requesting that the non-gaming amenities contained in Condition No. 6 of its Statement of Conditions be slightly modified to now require: A hotel with a minimum of 405 rooms, a sports wagering lounge, a ballroom or event center totaling a minimum of 25,000 square feet capable of hosting live entertainment and with meeting space, a minimum of three food and beverage outlets with a total minimum seating capacity of 450, a minimum of one retail outlet selling sundries and other retail items, a fitness facility and an outdoor pool complex.

The Licensee will have until December 15th, 2023, to submit its full architectural blueprints and a detailed plan of design and construction for its Live! brand landside facility for Board acceptance.

Upon review and acceptance of the full plans and specs by the Board, the Licensee will have until March 15th, 2024 to submit its full construction contract for Board acceptance. The Licensee will



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also need to seek Board approval to change its d/b/a trade name and brand name from DiamondJacks Casino & Resort to 'Live! Casino & Hotel Louisiana' and to enter into any future trademark, management. Or shared services agreements at the appropriate time.

If the Board approves the proposed transfer of the Licensee to LRGC Gaming Investors, amendments to its non-gaming amenities for the Approved Project, and related requests, a Resolution, and an amended Statement of Conditions and an Indemnification and Hold Harmless Agreement have been prepared for the Board's consideration.

The deadline for the Licensee to complete construction and commence gaming operations in its riverboat future landside facility will be December 15th, 2025.

After the State Police reports its financial and suitability findings, a representative from the Licensee and LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC are here today to



provide a presentation on its acquisition of the Licensee to the Board and answer any questions that the Board Members may have.

#### CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

Thank you, Ms. Landry.

#### MS. HAUPT:

Good morning, Chairman Johns and board members. My name is Tammy Haupt, auditor supervisor with the Louisiana State Police Gaming Enforcement Audit Section.

As detailed by Ms. Landry, local counsels for the Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company, LLC, doing business as DiamondJacks, the Licensee, Foundation Gaming & Entertainment, LLC, seller and sole owner of the Licensee; and LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC, the buyer, have submitted a Joint Petition requesting Board approval of the proposed transfer of 100% membership interest in the Licensee from Foundation to LRGC Investors and other related transactions through the consummation of the Purchase and Sale



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Agreement that was executed in March of 2023.

In addition to the Board's approval -- in addition, the Board's approval is being requested for the following: Execution of the Participation Agreement between the Licensee and Foundation following the transfer of membership interest for which Foundation will continue to receive an ongoing economic interest in the Licensee as part of the consideration for the acquisition by LRGC Investors; Execution of all necessary documents to carry out the transactions contemplated by the Purchase and Sale Agreement and related agreements; and Enhancements to the Licensee's landside facility relocation plan related to the transfer of interest in the Licensee and the development of the property into a landside "Live! branded casino resort and entertainment destination", requiring LRGC Investors to make a \$270.7 million investment (as currently estimated) in the approved project.



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Foundation and LRGC Investors entered into the Purchase and Sale Agreement on March 14, 2023, whereby, LRGC Investors agreed to acquire all membership interests of the Licensee from Foundation for a total estimated purchase price of \$31.1 million. The purchase price includes a fixed sum and reimbursement for certain approved costs.

The Purchase and Sale Agreement and the Participation Agreement fully address the consideration to be provided for the proposed transaction.

The Participation Agreement outlines a monthly fee to be paid to Foundation in consideration of the Foundation work. As explained in the agreement, the Foundation work was comprised of significant time, effort and resources that Foundation dedicated and supplied to the acquisition and management of the Licensee, as well as to the planned redevelopment of the property.

According to all parties, Foundation's post-closing role will be



that of a passive investor, one who does not have any decision-making authority or voting or consent rights with respect to the business. However, from time to time Foundation may be consulted during the construction and operation of the facility.

The parties expect to close on the Purchase and Sale Agreement and related agreements by October 31st, 2023, transferring 100% membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Investors.

LRGC Investors will be using cash and marketable securities of its parent company, Pratt Street Management, LLC, which value -- which values exceed the amount needed to fund the acquisition of the membership interests in the Licensee and the projected costs for the first year of the Approved Project.

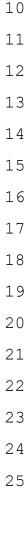
According to Cordish's management, three of its Principals (Jonathan, Reed and Blake Cordish) are committed to extending lines of credit to LRGC Investors, if necessary, secured by their



personal cash and marketable securities, to finance the remaining estimated costs. The value of the Principals' liquid assets combined exceed the remaining costs anticipated to complete the project.

According to a Cordish representative, Pratt Street Management receives distributions from its ownership stake in Live! Casino and Hotel Maryland that are enough to cover the construction costs of the project. These funds are fully unencumbered and can be used exclusively to finance the equity needs of LRGC Investors.

Therefore, LRGC Investors do not believe the line of credits from the Principals will ultimately be necessary since LRGC Investors has access to funds in excess of the contemplated project costs strictly and solely from internal sources. However, LRGC Investors will petition the Board for approval if they decide to enter into a Credit Agreement with a financial institution at a later date.



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During our review, no financial issues came to our attention that would preclude the Board's approval of these transactions.

I will now turn the presentation over to Criminal Investigator Rodney
Perkins in Gaming Enforcement Licensing to present their findings.

#### MR. PERKINS:

Good morning, Chairman Johns and
Members of the Board. I'm Criminal
Investigator Rodney Perkins with Louisiana
State Police Gaming Enforcement Division.

On April 14, 2023, LRGC Gaming
Investors, LLC and its parent companies
submitted Level 1, Part A, New Business
Suitability Gaming Applications. The key
individuals associated with the applicant
submitted Multi-Jurisdictional Personal
History Disclosure Forms and Louisiana
Supplemental Forms in conjunction with the
transfer of membership interest in
Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company, LLC,
doing business as DiamondJacks Casino &
Resort.

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In accordance with the rules and regulations of the Gaming Enforcement Division, a background investigation was conducted on LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC, parent companies, officers, directors, key individuals and persons with 5% or more ownership or economic interest in the license.

The background investigation consisted of inquiries to federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, civil jurisdictions, gaming regulatory agencies, the Louisiana Department of Revenue and a computerized criminal history database.

Based on its investigation, no information was found that would preclude the Board from approving the Joint Petition for Approval of Transfer of Membership Interest in the Licensee from Foundation Gaming & Entertainment, LLC to LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC.

#### CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

Okay. Thank y'all very much for -for your reports. Before we get into any
questions or we get further, I just want



1 to say thank you to the attorney general's 2 office gaming division, state police 3 gaming division. I don't think very few 4 people realize the thousands of hours that 5 goes into a suitability investigation like this. So thank you for your diligence. 6 7 Thank you for your hard work and we 8 greatly, greatly appreciate your -- your 9 very, very good work. So thank y'all very 10 much. Any questions from the Board or our 11 12 staff at the table at this point? 13 Okay. I have no questions. 14 I would like to call up

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I would like to call up representation from Cordish now, and I think we have a presentation scheduled.

MR. BARBIN:

Chairman Johns and Members, my name is Jeff Barbin. I'm here representing LRGC Investors. And we're very excited, as you mentioned, to be back to talk about the transfer of interest.

To my far right is Rob Norton, he's the president of Cordish Gaming. And in the middle is Joe Billhimer, who is the



1	COO and chief development officer, and to
2	my immediate right is Mark Stewart, who is
3	the general counsel of Cordish.
4	And I'm going to turn it over to
5	Mark for a presentation.
6	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
7	So Mr. Norton, Mr. Billhimer, Mr.
8	Stewart, welcome to Louisiana, welcome to
9	the Gaming Control Board Meeting. We're
10	very excited to have you here today.
11	And if you would like to move
12	forward, who's going to go first?
13	Anybody?
14	MR. STEWART:
15	That would be me, Mr. Chairman.
16	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
17	Good, Mark.
18	If y'all, as you start speaking
19	identify yourself for the record, if you
20	don't mind. Okay?
21	MR. STEWART:
22	Absolutely.
23	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
24	Okay.
25	MR. STEWART:



Good morning, Mr. Chairman and Members of the Board. Thank you for having us.

My name is Mark Stewart.

And thank you, Jeff, for the introduction.

As you know, we're here today on the petition for the approval of the transfer of the interests in LRGC and also to provide an update on our progress and our plans.

At the outset, let me just echo the Chairman and we want to offer our sincere thanks and appreciation to the Attorney General's Office, the Louisiana State Police and the Board staff. They were tremendous to work with throughout the process and their professionalism was beyond compare. So we greatly appreciated that process and their efforts.

As you know, Cordish Gaming Group, you can see our leadership on the slide. Before I get into that and we -- we move on, let me just pause for a moment to remind the Board that the Cordish



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companies and Live! is more than a gaming company. We're a multifaceted company. We have entertainment districts, sports stadium anchor districts, residential, retail, co-working space, so we -- we're active and a leader in multiple verticals. And just recently indicative of this, just last month we opened our new three light residential building in Kansas City, which is quite something; and I welcome and encourage the Board to check that out.

We opened Nashville Live, which is adjacent to the Tennessee Titan Stadium and one of our newest entertainment complexes, and we are hopeful -- apologies to any Houston Astros fans, and any Diamond Back fans that might be in the room, but we're hopeful that there'll be an all-live World Series with the Phillies in our Xfinity Live next to their stadium battling the Rangers in Texas live.

With that, allow me to turn it over to Joe Billhimer who will talk about two pillars of our company.

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:



All right. Mr. Stewart, I don't know if Mattress Mack would agree with you on that. I think he's got a lot riding on the Astros. MR. BILLHIMER: Good morning. I'm just going to take a couple of minutes and -- and go into the next light. Judge Sholes, you had asked us about to comment on our employment and, you know, compensation levels. I -- I wanted to -- I wanted to start off with our commitments and -- and give you a little bit about our culture.

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We're going to create over 400 new jobs in this -- in this facility. anticipate that our average income will be well over \$55,000 per team member when you include tips. And we also have a very very, very strong commitment for diversity in hiring. And I think if I show you the next slide, I think it depicts it a little bit better. You know, we had a change in slide. Sorry.

I'm a little bit at a loss as to



that -- that flow, but let me go into the benefits that we provide. I mean we -- we feel it's very important to treat our team members. They are the ones that are really going to make or break our fantastic project that you're going to see in a few minutes, and we offer tremendous benefits. Things in here that I like to highlight is our -- is our tuition reimbursement. We encourage our team members to continue their education. We -- we do all kinds of things. I think the slide kind of speaks for itself.

Our -- initiatives as we get going in the Bossier market, we will be working tremendously hard in -- in workforce development efforts and we'll be one of the key pillars here, and something we've actually done in Bossier City before is our gaming school. We're going to take people with great personalities, with -- that fit our cultural DNA, and we're going to give them great careers and teach them, you know, how to deal as well as all of the other aspects that we're going to



endeavor to employ a very diverse workforce.

A few minutes on our culture as far as Live! in the community, we actually brand that. It's Live! in the community. It's actually a -- it's a process that we go through at all of the properties. It's something that we all participate in.

In every market that we operate in, we -- we are leaders in philanthropy.

There's not a market that we're in where I don't think you could call any other local representatives or local politicians or local charities and not here that we're -- we're kind of first to the table. And it's part of our commitment. It's part of our culture. It's what we do. It's not something that we -- you know, we -- we just try to advertise, it's just part of our DNA.

We give back as a company because it's the right thing to do. We -- we -- Rob participates in charity events. Our owners participate in charity events. We do it because it's really -- it's part of



our commitment to the communities in which 1 2 -- in which we work and live to give back. 3 MR. STEWART: 4 Okay. And now turning to the 5 presentation on the updated plans. As you 6 can see here, there's the key elements of 7 our project. Approximately 270 million 8 plus development, over 1,000 slot machines 9 and more than 40 table games are 10 envisioned, and we have substantial non-gaming amenities planned which you'll 11 12 get to see here in a minute. 13 As was mentioned by the Attorney 14 General's Office, we have requested a 15 realignment of our conditions to match 16 these development plans. We certainly 17 would be appreciative of your 18 consideration of that request. We will 19 meet and exceed those goals or conditions. 20 And with that, let me turn it over 21

to Rob Norton, who will give the presentation here.

## MR. NORTON:

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Good morning, Chairman Johns and Board Members. I appreciate the time this



morning to address you and -- and speak to you a little bit about where we're going and kind of our vision for the property.

I will start with reminding you of what -- what the original transaction facility looked like as when we took over -- as we take over the project, this is the starting conditions of the DiamondJacks property. This is kind of what it looks like today. As -- as our -- our friends and colleagues and Foundation have continued to -- to move through the demolition process so that once we are hopefully licensed, that we will be able to move quickly into completing the design and moving forward in construction to -- to develop what we're about to show you.

Now, before I -- I move on to the last slide, which is a fly-through of the facility, I would like to just put a little disclaimer out there that we are still in the final stages of design; and so although I think this is very representative of what we will build, we have -- our final designs are due to you,



I think, on December 15th. That would lock all of this in. And so we are very pleased with where we are, and I'll tell you my personal opinion is we probably are pretty close to what we're showing you, but I want to keep that — that opening out there that if there are some small changes that happen, we will finalize those in the next month or so.

With that, I would appreciate -- I would appreciate your thoughts at the end of -- of this -- it's about a six-minute long video, but it will go much faster than that.

Sorry. I forgot. Just a reminder of our current sight plan, from the top of the screen down, that will be the entrance off of -- as you come off of Highway 20. We re-oriented the road as you come in around the pool, and you can see in the green area that that's roughly a 50,000-square foot, you know, landbased casino facility that is actually wrapped with food and beverage and entertainment experience.



1 And again, I think the -- the video 2 will do much more justice to what we're 3 doing than my words. So enjoy, please. 4 (Whereupon the video is played at this 5 time.) 6 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 7 Impressive. 8 MR. STEWART: 9 All right. Our final slide. 10 to the proposed timeline there, with approval today, we hope to be closing 11 imminently; and then, obviously, we're on 12 13 track to submit those final construction plans in December. We're excited for 2024 14 15 to be a year of construction, and we look 16 forward to the end of first quarter 2025 17 opening. 18 So with that, we would welcome any 19 questions from the Board. 20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 21 Okay. Gentleman, thank you very 22 much. Impressive presentation. 23 Longly anticipated. The press up in 24 Bossier Shreveport is calling like crazy 25 right now wanting to know, you know, what



1 we're going to approve today. So I'm sure 2 you'll see some press this week. 3 Tell me about the existing 4 riverboat. As I understand, it's being 5 dismantled as we speak; is that correct? 6 MR. NORTON: 7 That is correct. The -- from one of 8 the photos earlier in that presentation, 9 you would notice that we're -- it's been 10 dismantled down to about the hull at this point, and probably over the next 20 to 30 11 12 days to be complete dismantling of it. 13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 14 All right. I saw your slides on the 15 way the site looks today and I can tell 16 you -- and, Board Members, it looks a 17 whole lot better than the first time that 18 I walked in there in the fall of 2021. Believe it or not, it looks a lot better 19 20 today than it did. So thanks to the work 21 the Foundation has done. 22 So let's open it up for questions. 23 Any Board Member has questions, comments, 24 anybody for our quests? Anybody?



You're getting off light today.

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1	MR. JACKSON:
2	I have a comment.

12	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
13	Thank you, Mr. Jackson, I appreciate
14	that.
15	Any other Board Members?
16	(No response.)
17	Okay. I want to take a moment to
18	publicly thank Foundation Gaming.
19	Foundation Gaming came to Louisiana when
20	nobody else really wanted to even look at
21	that property. We were worried about it
22	just sitting there forever, and Foundation
23	came and made a real commitment to the
24	state to get it moving, to to do
25	something positive for it.



So, Gentleman, I know they're sitting out in the audience, raise your hands if you would for me, I think Les and Greg are back there and Janet Boles represents them.

But thank you, Gentlemen. Thank your company for the commitment that you made to get this thing moving and your continued commitment working with Cordish to make this thing a reality. So we will always be indebted to Foundation. So thank y'all very, very much.

I forgot -- you know, I thanked
State Police. I thanked the AG's office,
I forgot to thank our own Board Staff for
the hard work. I hope they forgive me,
but they put a lot of work into making all
this happen also. So thank you, Staff.

And I also want to say, while this is exciting for the Bossier Shreveport market, I want to also commend the other five properties in that area right now that are making -- all of them are making some serious investments in their properties. I think y'all are going to



1 help drive a lot of investment dollars, 2 gentlemen, in there. So thank you to the 3 five existing licensees that are in 4 operation right now for your investment 5 dollars and your commitment to try to get that Bossier Shreveport market growing 6 7 back to where it was at one time. 8 thank all of you. Gentlemen, we -- I have no further 10 questions. 11 Any further comments? Mr. Norton. 12 MR. NORTON: 13 Thank you again for your time 14 and consideration. And -- and we as a 15 company look forward to bringing you our 16 family culture and Live! Entertainment 17 experience to the Louisiana market.

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

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Well, your reputation around the country is impeccable. And I talked to a lot of people out at GTUIE (sic) last week about your company and everybody says you're lucky to have them come to Louisiana. So thank y'all for that, and we look forward to working with you very

2	Very much interested in what you do
3	for your employees and bringing that high
4	level of benefits and wages, but also
5	diversity to the to the market there.
6	So thank you for that.

On the 19th day of October 2023, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board did, in a duly noticed public meeting, consider the Joint Petition for Approval of Transfer of Membership Interest filed by the Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company, LLC and Foundation Gaming & Entertainment, LLC and LRGC Gaming Investors, LLC, and upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board adopted this Resolution.

Whereas, on March 14th, 2023, Foundation Gaming and LRGC Gaming entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement providing for the sale of 100% of its membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Gaming.

Whereas, the Board has previously approved the Licensee's request to

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relocate its gaming operations to a landside facility as a part of the Approved Project in accordance with the relocation plan and supporting documents submitted by the Licensee.

Whereas, on April 4th, 2023, the Board approved the Licensee's request to extend the deadlines for submission of its architectural blueprints and detailed plan of design and construction, construction contracts, completion of construction of the Approved Project, and commencement of gaming operations for its riverboat gaming landside facility conditioned upon closing of the sale of the Licensee to LRGC Gaming.

Whereas, Foundation Gaming and LRGC Gaming have agreed to certain commitments between the parties for funding the acquisition of the Licensee and the construction of the landside facility during the pendency of the transfer of membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Gaming.

Whereas, Foundation Gaming will



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continue to receive ongoing economic interest in the Licensee as a part of the consideration for the purchase of the Licensee by LRGC Gaming.

Whereas, LRGC Gaming is using cash or cash equivalent to fund its acquisition of the Licensee and Approved Project; and whereas, the transactions provided for in the Petition, Purchase and Sale Agreement, and related agreements require prior Board approval.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the sale and transfer of 100% of the membership interest in the Licensee to LRGC Gaming pursuant to the Purchase and Sale Agreement is hereby approved.

Be it further resolved that the execution of the Participation Agreement between the Licensee and Foundation Gaming is hereby approved.

Be it further resolved that the execution of all documents necessary to effectuate the transaction contemplated by the Purchase and Sale Agreement and related agreements, all as more



particularly described and provided for therein is hereby approved.

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Be it further resolved that the enhancements to the Licensee's landside facility relocation plan related to the transfer of the interest in the Licensee is hereby approved.

Be it further resolved that
Condition No. 6 of the Statement of
Conditions to the Riverboat Gaming License
be modified and replaced with the
following: A hotel of minimum of 405
rooms, a sports wagering lounge, a
ballroom or event center totalling a
minimum of 25,000-square feet capable of
hosting live entertainment and with a
meeting space, a minimum of three food and
beverage outlets with a total minimum
seating capacity of 450, a minimum of one
retail outlet selling sundries and other
retail items, and a fitness facility and
outdoor pool complex.

Be it further resolved that the approval is granted in this Resolution are subject to and conditioned upon: the



1	effectuation and closing of the transfer
2	of interest in the Licensee from
3	Foundation Gaming to LRGC Gaming, and the

23	representing Catfish Queen, LLC, who is
24	the owner of the Belle of Baton Rouge.
25	And to my right is Terry Downey. He is



the CEO of Queen Entertainment and
Casinos, who's a parent company of Catfish
Queen.

Just a quick reminder and update, the Board approved the landside move for the Belle of Baton Rouge and subsequently approved in July of 2023 the detailed plans and specifications. And as the Chairman mentioned, the construction contract was due to be submitted to the Board on today's meeting.

And despite best efforts to the contrary, the construction contract has not been completed. It's still being negotiated with the -- with the construction company, who was initially chosen to do the work. So we would like to spend the next couple of weeks trying to get that contract completed, and we very much believe that we can do that. So what we're asking for is a 30-day extension to get us to the next board meeting in order to present that contract to you.

If for some reason we are not



1	successful in the next couple of weeks, we
2	will fill another petition. We hope that
3	does not happen. We may have to put the
4	job out to bid on a wider basis if we
5	can't get that contract completed.
6	So we're requesting at this point a
7	30-day extension until that will get us
8	until the November board meeting.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Thank you, Mr. Barbin.
11	And good morning, Mr. Downey.
12	MR. DOWNEY:
13	Good morning.
14	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
15	Congratulations on the Queen's first
16	month.
17	MR. DOWNEY:
18	Thank you.
19	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
20	I greatly appreciate that.
21	Would you like to comment on what
22	our agenda item is today?
23	MR. DOWNEY:
24	Yes. Obviously, in in this type
25	of renovation and construction and moving



1	into old buildings, expanding them,
2	renovating them, mitigating the existing
3	circumstances there, it's a little more
4	nuanced than just a brand-new build.

Whereas, on September 15, 2022, the Board adopted a resolution, as amended on November 17, 2022 and February 16th, 2023, which contained the following provision regarding its riverboat gaming landside facility: 2.b. To enter into all necessary contracts for construction of Approved Project and to submit copies of the contract to the Board for acceptance no later than 90 days after the passage of a Board resolution accepting the plans and specifications. All contracts related to the Approved Project shall be let only by Catfish Queen or its parent company.

Whereas, on July 20th, 2023, the Board adopted a resolution accepting the plans and specifications submitted by Catfish Queen and for the Approved Project.

Whereas, on October 18th, 2023, Catfish Queen filed for a petition requesting Board approval to extend the



1	90-day deadline for submission of its
2	construction contracts through November
3	16th, 2023.
4	Now therefore, be it resolved that
5	Provision 2.b. of the September 15th, 2022
6	Board Resolution, as amended, is hereby

The problem gambling message and 11 12 toll-free number in the print 13 advertisement did not comprise an area 14 equal to 1/20th of the entire advertising 15 type and did not extend the entire width 16 of the advertising as required. 17 The civil penalty contained in the 18 settlement is \$10,000, and the settlement 19 has been signed by the hearing officer and 20 is now before the Board for final 21 approval. 2.2 I'd be happy to answer any questions 23 you have. 24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

new owner or his wife until April 21st of 1 2 2021, which gave rise to a violation of 3 gaming law. 4 The civil penalty contained in this 5 settlement is \$2,000. settlement of Trillions Ventures, LLC
doing business as Ivory Nola Lounge, which
holds a Type 1 video draw poker gaming
license.

This settlement addresses the failure of the Licensee to timely renew it's ATC permit while operating video draw poker devices in its establishment.

Between March 1st and April 2nd, 2023, the Licensee operated video draw poker machines and earned a profit from said devices in the amount of \$4,963.90 without a valid ATC permit, which gave rise to a violation of gaming law.

The civil penalty contained in this settlement is \$2,000, which is an amount that's well settled for a violation of this type.

The settlement has been signed by the hearing officer center and is now before the Board for final approval.

On September 26th, 2022, Ms. Haywood submitted an original application for a non-key gaming employee permit to which she attested to the fact that she had never been arrested for any criminal violation or entered a plea of guilty to any offense or violation.

The Division conducted a background investigation and discovered Ms. Haywood was arrested on October 5th, 2018 for a violation of Louisiana Revised Statute 14:67(b)4, theft. Further, Ms. Haywood pled guilty to that charge on April 3rd, 2019.

On July 11, 2023, the Division issued a notice of denial of original application to the permittee based on permittee's failure to disclose her arrest on the permit application; and due to her conviction of theft, she is statutorily disqualified from hold a gaming permit in Louisiana.

Ms. Haywood requested a hearing on the denial of her original application, and that matter was heard before the



hearing officer on August 9th, 2023.

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On August 30th, 2023, the hearing officer issued a decision and order that Ms. Haywood's non-key gaming employee permit application be denied due to the permittee's failure to disclose her conviction of theft on the application as well as her being statutorily disqualified from holding a gaming permit in accordance with the Louisiana Revised Statute 27:28 (b)1(b) and 4.

The Division and this Honorable
Board have a duty to protect the gaming
industry and to uphold the gaming laws of
this state. Gaming law explicitly states
that the Board or Division shall not grant
a license or permit to any person who is
disqualified on the basis of a conviction
or guilty plea by the applicant or any
person acquired to be suitable under the
provisions of this title for theft; and
further states that no permit shall be
granted to any person for failure to
provide information and documentation to
reveal any fact material to suitability



determination or the supplying of 1 2 information which is untrue or misleading 3 has to a material fact pertaining to 4 suitability criteria. Ms. Haywood indicated on her non-key 5 gaming employee permit application that 6 7 she had never been arrested for any 8 criminal offense or violation. Ms. Haywood also indicated that she 10 had never been convicted of or entered a plea of quilty to any criminal charge or 11 12 offense. 13 14 15 16

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Further, Ms. Haywood signed an affidavit attesting that she was providing true and correct information on the application and understood that her failure to do so could result in the denial of her application.

It was not until the Division performed their background investigation which discovered that Ms. Haywood had, in fact, been arrested and entered a guilty plea to Louisiana Revised Statute 14:67.

As you all are aware, gaming law requires permittees to be found suitable,



2.2

and the burden of proof in the gaming industry is by clear and convincing evidence.

Louisiana Revised Statute 27:28A establishes that the burden lies with the permittee to prove he or she is suitable to possess a gaming permit. Thus, the burden is on Ms. Haywood to approve she is suitable to holding a gaming permit through clear and convincing evidence.

At the administrative hearing that was held, Ms. Haywood did not present any evidence to show that she is suitable to hold a non-key gaming employee permit. Further, Ms. Haywood admitted on to the record that she did, in fact, not disclose her arrest or guilty plea on her application.

However, even if Ms. Haywood had answered truthfully on the original application that she submitted, she would still be ineligible to hold a gaming -- a non-key gaming employee permit in this state due to her being statutorily disqualified on the basis of her arrest

and guilty plea of theft.

Because participation in the gaming industry is a privilege and not a right, the industry is strictly regulated. The Board and the Division have a great responsibility to ensuring the integrity and safety thereof.

Ms. Haywood's actions and unsuitable conduct demonstrate that she is a threat to the public interest of this state and to the effective regulation and control of gaming. The State's responsibility is to protect the gaming industry; therefore, the Division is respectfully requesting that this Honorable Board affirm this hearing officer's decision to deny the non-key gaming employee permit of Ms. Jayante Haywood and its finding that Ms. Haywood is unsuitable to participate in the Louisiana gaming industry.

So thank you for being here today. We look forward to a lot more work with you in the future.

Members, we will meet November the 16th of our next board meeting. It will

14	come away with any clear answers. It was
15	a very frustrating meeting, to be honest
16	with you.
17	But, Ms. Miller, would you would
18	you like to talk about that?
19	MS. MILLER:
20	Certainly. And Janet Miller, the
21	executive director for the Louisiana
22	Association on Compulsive Gambling.
23	Thank you for that great question,
24	and I know we have discussed this. That's
25	actually a program that is managed from a



different district executive director. It is not under our own management or one of our programs through LACG, even though it can be confusing I think is when we had a facility there called CORE South, years ago, pre-Katrina.

So that facility, my understanding, is from the metropolitan district that is -- has its own contract through the behavioral health, which is some of the dedicated money that was put in there for that program.

So probably best for them to speak to that directly or I know Ms. Karen Stubbs is here as well. But my understanding is that they have six beds that they have allocated within a facility that treats substance use. And those six beds are to be portioned for the treatment of problem gambling or gambling disorder.

I don't think that they've had as many people there. I don't think the six beds have been full. I've actually talked to and worked with the executive director from that district on some training,



planning, different ways that we could assist them so that they could go forward with that.

So I'm not really sure exactly why because I know in their contract they had some budget allocations for advertising it as well. I don't know that you've heard that much about it, and so I'm not really sure and clear to tell you what their next step will be with this because it has been opened now for over a year.

And so it did come out -- you're correct, it came out of that behavioral fund from gaming taxes. So there is still money in there to look at for us to -- to do some things with, not only in New Orleans obviously, but around the state which is what I've been advocating is that one is if you don't know about gambling treatment in Louisiana and that it's free, then we need to do something about that; and that's all of us.

And that takes, you know, possibly a marketing firm or a good agency. Behind me are some of the best people to



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advertise, and so I've actually been working with some of the industry to say who do you use. Certainly, you know what, maybe I can't afford or we can't afford in Louisiana as nonprofit to pay for that kind of advertisement, but we need to get the word out.

So the program is there, but I don't know that it's been as attended by citizens in that area. So I have a concern too, Judge, about that and would like to, you know, help in whatever ways we can. But it's certainly -- just so this Board knows, it's not under my purview to supervise it, to manage it, or to direct how it goes, because it's not -it is not our contract for LACG, but we are in relationships with all of the districts in the state because I still get calls from people who don't know that there's free outpatient counselling or like that, that new program in New Orleans or CORE in Shreveport that is for everyone in Louisiana to have free treatment.

And I find that very sad at this



time because our -- the Chairman and other people have asked for statistics on sports wagering and how that's affected people in gambling, and it's showing up exponentially in the calls and the people coming to treatment in the last two years.

And so that information will be sent to the Chairman soon. But I think it's important to ask those questions, but I would say that it is under the direction of the Metropolitan New Orleans branch of the district, and Dr. Dunham is extremely helpful and gives great information on what's going on. I'm sure she would be available to talk to you or anybody on this Board. But it is not under our umbrella of management per se for that facility, so I can only speak some to it in the sense that we have worked with them on in the last two years.

So my hope was it would be more robust by now, sir, and a lot more people showing up for treatment. But we do know that there is -- there is still that barrier for people with gambling disorder



through stigma and prejudice and shame and fear of losing their positions or things in their communities or their jobs. So there's a lot to push through with that, even in New Orleans when you have a program that's like that.

The difference is the CORE program does not have its housing with any substance use, although we do have a large portion of people that have a problem with substance use disorders or mental health.

And so we have to address all that.

So I don't -- I don't know if that's part of it is that they're in a facility that isn't separate for them. I just don't know. I don't have that program under my purview to supervise and let you know more about that.

But Dr. Rochelle Head-Dunham is the executive director for the metro area and would probably gladly love to hear your input. And I -- and I too, again, have been very willing to sit at the table and conference and virtually meet and been training different staff there as well.



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So I think there is absolutely a need, but I also think there's a need for other parts of the state as well and that's what I'm advocating too to bring more outpatient services if people are not able to come in to a facility like CORE in Shreveport or New Orleans, then we need to have more comprehensive help for people; but the biggest thing I keep hearing, sir, is that no one knows that it's free and it's there.

So that's part of my job. And if you could help me with that and those people will help me in other states. So I've been reaching out to other states to get help with how to tell the residents of your state about all of these services, how can we all do that. And so part of that happens when you see that advertisement with the, hey, if you have a gambling problem or you know someone that does, and they run the 877-770-STOP or now 1-800-gambler. That's helpful, but it's not enough. So it's not reaching everybody.



So that's my goal in 2024 is to invest more energy and be down here even more to see how can we go into letting everyone know that there is help for gambling even if you're a family member or friend of and you don't have to pay for it, and it's confidential just like any other medical help. And it's paid through the gaming taxes. Not all of them, but if you want to send them to that fund, not all of them. But it's enough to take care of the people. So certainly with the sports

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wagering increase and that will come with some of that tax money and I think that Louisiana will be in better hands even financially to do more, but I think that we have ten pockets of the state that have outpatient counselling and two that have residential or inpatient, but we need more. We need more help, but we need more people to come and show up for treatment too.

So a long way to answer, I know and I don't know.

1 that we hired her as the medical director 2 for CORE south, so --3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 4 Ms. Miller, how many states actually 5 have an inpatient facility like you have 6 with CORE? 7 MS. MILLER: 8 Just us. We are the only state that 9 offers through the gaming taxes free 10 residential treatment. That's why we've also treated people from 38 other states 11 12 and four other countries. One is because 13 when they do call us, we don't charge them 14 much, \$6,000 for 28 days of treatment. 15 And they can stay as long as they need to 16 for Louisiana, but we charge them very 17 nominal fees so I think that they can come 18 too. 19 But we need to let people know and 20 -- and this helps them know. 21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 22 Thank you very much. 23 MS. SHOLES: 4 Thank you. 5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 6 -- let me remind the Board and the 7 public that we advocated for and were 8 successful in the last legislative session 9 to capture more of the sports betting 10 revenue for compulsive gambling, an additional 3%, so it's going to go from 2% 11 12 to now 5% of all sports betting revenue 13 will go towards compulsive gambling 14 programs. So we thank the legislature. 15 MS. MILLER: 16 It's important to have that because 17 there is such a different way to treat 18 people with sports wagering and online 19 wagering now. As even Wayne Doodie talked 20 a year or so before about that. So it's a 21 very different type of wagering, and you 2.2 very much want to accept that and train 23 your staff and clinicians how to work with 24 that differently. 2.5 So thank you.

13	Governor Edwards for supporting that.

17	Mr. Jackson?
18	MR. JACKSON:
19	Yes, sir, on one condition.
20	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
21	What's that, Mr. Jackson?
22	MR. JACKSON:
23	Not to put you on the spot,
24	Chairman, I was going to say you have to
25	second it. But I will make a motion.
