6	Moving into our revenue reports. Ms.
7	Jackson, good morning.
8	MS. JACKSON:
9	Good morning, Mr. Chairman and board
L O	members. My name is Donna Jackson with
1	Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit
_2	Section.
13	In May, the 14 operating riverboats
4	generated adjusted gross receipts of
15	\$154,713,174. The state collected fees
6	totalling \$33,263,332. Adjusted gross
L 7	receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date
8_	are \$1 billion, 577 million (3), a
L 9	decrease of \$42 million or 3% from fiscal
20	year '22-'23.
21	As of May 31st, 2024, the state
22	collected \$339 million in fees for fiscal
23	year '23-'24.
24	Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue
25	broken down by regional market. The



overall increase from April was \$16.4 million or 11.8%. Compared to last May, this month's revenues represent a slight increase of \$1.3 million or .8%. Next is a summary of the May 2024 gaming activity for Harrah's of New Orleans found on page 3. Harrah's generated \$19,979,397 in gross gaming These revenues represent a revenue.

minimal increase from last month of 3.4%, but a decrease of \$1.7 million or 8% from the same month last year.

During May, the state received \$5,520,548 in minimum daily payments. Adjusted gross receipted for fiscal '23-'24 to date are approximately \$225 million, a decrease of \$15 million or 6% from fiscal year '22-'23.

As of May 31st, 2024 the state collected \$59.7 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24.

Next I'll present the revenues for slots at the Racetrack. During May, the four racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted receipts of



1 \$29,051,519, an increase of \$2.4 million 2 or 9% from the previous month, and an 3 increase of \$1.3 million or 5% when 4 compared to the same month last year. 5 During May, the state collected \$4.4 million in fees. 6 7 Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal 8 year '23-'24 to date are almost \$290 million, a decrease of \$3.9\$ million or 1%9 10 for fiscal year '22-'23. As of May 31st, the state has 11 12 collected almost \$44 million in fees for 13 fiscal year '23-'24. 14 I will now move to the video gaming 15 information. There are 11,959 video 16 gaming devices activated at 1,392 17 locations. Net device revenue for May 18 2024 was \$64,875,732, an increase of \$1.2 19 million or 2% compared to April 2024, and 20 a minimal decrease of .4% when compared to 21 last May. Total franchise fees for May 22 totaled \$19.6 million. Fiscal year to date Net Device 23 24 Revenue was \$689.5 million, a decrease of



\$29 million or 4% when compared to last

1 fiscal year. 2 As of May 31st, 2024, the state has 3 collected \$290 million in franchise fees for fiscal year '23-'24. 4 5 Next I'll present the May revenue for sportsbook. During May, the retail 6 7 sportsbooks accepted \$18.4 million in 8 sports wagers, resulting in net proceeds 9 of \$2.3 million and \$245,000 in state 10 taxes. 11 The mobile sportsbooks accepted \$238 12 million in sports wagers, resulting in net 13 proceeds of \$31 million and \$5.5 million 14 in taxes paid to the state. 15 Finally, for Daily Fantasy Sports, 16 gross revenues for May were approximately 17 \$687,000 with net revenue of \$74,000 and 18 taxes of \$6,000. 19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 20 Thank you, Ms. Jackson. 21 Any questions from the board? Any 22 questions? 23 One item I found interesting on 24 mobile sports betting in May compared to



April, actually did about \$25 million less

1	than last the previous month, I should
2	say, but the actual taxable revenue was
3	about the same. So taxes the taxes
4	paid to the state were significant
5	compared to the amount of actual betting
6	that transpired during that month. So I
7	always find those numbers interesting.
8	So, Ms. Jackson, thank you very much
9	for your work, and I appreciate it.
10	MS. JACKSON:

20	Good morning, Chairman Johns and
21	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
22	General Kanick Lewis, Junior; here with me
23	today is Ms. Moriah Reed.
24	Okay.
25	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:



1 You're on now. 2 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS, JR.: 3 Thank you, sir. 4 Chairman Johns and board members, 5 I'm Assistant Attorney General Kanick 6 Lewis, Junior; here with me today is Ms. 7 Moriah Reed of AVS. 8 We're here in the matter of the 9 issuance of a temporary certificate of 10 compliance for the Belle of Baton Rouge 11 Casino. 12 On June 4th, AVS began the 13 inspection process for the approval of 14 Belle of Baton Rouge Casino's certificate 15 of compliance, and Ms. Reed will now provide details on AVS's inspection. 16 17 MS. REED: 18 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 19 I'm Moriah Reed, a naval board members. 20 architect with American Vessel Services, 21 and I'm here to report the annual 2.2 certification for the Belle of Baton Rouge 23 Casino. 24 The AVS inspectors people did on 25 March 6th, 2024 attend the riverboat



Argacy 3 to conduct the annual inspection in accordance with the Louisiana Alternate Inspection Program. In this original inspection there were deficiencies as noted on pages 6 through 10 of the annual inspection report.

On May 3rd, a follow-up inspection was completed and four deficiencies remained and were outstanding.

As a result of these remaining deficiencies without being completely satisfied, the property requested an extension of their COC at the May 20th meeting, which the board unanimously approved.

Since then, another follow-up inspection has been completed and three deficiencies remain and are outstanding. These are noted on pages 2 and 3 of the report dated June 4th in your package.

As a result of these deficiencies not being completely satisfied, the property has requested an extension to allow sufficient time to complete the deficiencies. The delay appears to be



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contractor and material availability as well as adverse river conditions.

AVS has worked with the property to understand the remaining deficiencies and we feel that they do not pose a risk to the safety of the passengers and crew of the casino vessel.

We also feel that the property is working diligently to correct these deficiencies, and they have provided an extra level of safety by implementing a 24/7 fire watch.

The 2024 annual survey as required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is not complete. As such, the property has requested an extension and this request letter from the property is included in your package.

It is the recommendation of AVS that the Belle of Baton Rouge Casino be issued a temporary certificate of compliance for July of 2024 to allow additional time to satisfy the remaining deficiencies.

12	Okay. We now move into video gaming
13	issues. First on the agenda will be the
14	consideration of truck stops applications.
15	First will be Superior Gaming, LLC
16	doing business as Pelican Cove Casino.
17	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JOHNSON:
18	Good morning, Chairman Johns and
19	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
20	General Venise Johnson appearing before
21	you this morning in the matter of the
22	original application for a type 5 video
23	draw poker gaming license by Superior
24	Gaming, LLC doing business as Pelican Cove
25	Casino.

The truck stop facility is located in Calcasieu Parish. On April 1st, 2024, the following events took place. The applicant acquired the business and business assets of Pilot Corporation, doing business as Pilot Travel Center, No. 1051 Casino, who previously operated a video gaming truck stop at this location; and the applicant leased the immovable property for the truck stop facility is located on Pilot Travel Center, LLC.

The applicant was previously

The applicant was previously approved for a type 6 device owner who is licensed and owns the video draw poker gaming devices operated at this truck stop facility.

Investigator Glenn Verrett inspected the truck stop facility and conducted suitability investigations of the associated persons. He is present this morning to report his findings to the board.

#### MR. VERRETT:

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Good morning, Mr. Chairman and board members. I'm Investigator Glenn Verrett



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with the gaming enforcement division. I conducted an updated suitability check on Hunter Hozan, Gary Brewer and his wife Donna Brewer, who were all previously submitted to suitability investigations in connection with other video poker licenses.

An on-site investigation was conducted, and it was determined that the establishment meets all the criteria set forth in the video gaming laws as a qualified truck stop facility. All required licenses and permits were posted and valid at the time of inspection.

The establishment consists of at least five contiguous acres, specifically 8.635 acres. The applicant is operating the truck stop facility at a location that was licensed within the past 36 months and is not subject to the rule that they must be one mile from a school, church, playground, synagogue, public library, residences and buildings on the National Historic Registry.

I found no information to preclude



1	the issuance of a type 5 video draw poker
2	gaming license to Superior Gaming, LLC
3	doing business as Pelican Cove Casino or
4	to preclude any of the current members or
5	their spouses from continuing to
6	participate in the gaming industry.
7	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JOHNSON:
8	The office of the attorney general
9	has reviewed the file prepared by
L O	Louisiana State Police Gaming Enforcement
1	Division, and the information contained
12	therein would not preclude the issuance of
13	a type 5 video draw poker gaming license
4	to Superior Gaming, LLC doing business as
15	Pelican Cove Casino.
6	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
L 7	Okay. I'm familiar with this
8 .	location. It's in Calcasieu Parish, if
9	I'm not mistaken. And I believe at one
20	time there was a video poker operation
21	there, correct?
22	MR. VERRETT:
23	Yes, sir. Pilot Travel Centers.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Okay. I'm familiar with it. Okay.



1	Any questions from the board members on
2	this application?
3	Okay. If not, I would entertain a
4	motion to issue a certificate of
5	compliance no, excuse me to approve
6	the truck stop application of Superior
7	Gaming, LLC doing business as Pelican Cove
8	Casino.
9	And Ms. Traylor has made that
10	motion, and Ms. Lewis has seconded that
11	motion.
12	And is there any discussion?
13	Is there any opposition to that
14	motion?
15	Hearing none, that motion carries.
16	The application is hereby approved.
17	MR. VERRETT:

ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL SIZEMORE:

Good morning.

Good morning, Chairman Johns, members of the board. I'm Shanna Sizemore, Assistant Attorney General present before the board in the matter of the original application of Pilot Corporation Tennessee doing business as Pilot Travel Center No. 1105 applying for approval of a type 5 video draw poker gaming license.

The truck stop is located in

St. Landry Parish. Pilot Travel Centers,

LLC purchased the immovable property where

Morel G. Lemoine Distributors, Inc. Doing

business as Video Joker II Casino

previously operated a video gaming truck

stop.

The applicant leased the immovable property where the truck stop facility is located from Pilot Travel Centers, LLC. The applicant submitted its application for a type 5 truck stop video draw poker gaming license to Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division. The Video

Draw Poker Device Placement Agreement is 1 2 with Superior Gaming, LLC. 3 Investigator Glenn Verrett with the 4 Louisiana State Police has inspected the truck stop facility and conducted 5 suitability investigations of the 6 7 associated persons, and he's present this 8 morning to report his findings to the board. 10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 11 Good morning. 12 MR. VERRETT: 13 Good morning, again, Mr. Chairman 14 and board members. I'm Investigator Glenn 15 Verrett with the gaming enforcement 16 division. I conducted suitability 17 investigations and updated background 18 checks on all relevant persons associated 19 with the application. 20 An all-site investigation was 21 conducted, and it was determined that the 2.2 establishment meets all criteria set forth 23 in the video gaming laws as a qualified 2.4 truck stop facility. 2.5 All required licenses and permits



1 were posted and valid at the time of 2 inspection. 3 The establishment consists of seven 4 contiquous acres. The location is not subject to the 5 6 rule that it must be one mile from a 7 school, church, playground, synagogue, 8 public library, residences and buildings on the National Historic Registry because 10 Morel G. Lemoine Distributors, Inc. Operated a truck stop facility at this 11 12 location within 36 months of the applicant 13 submitting this application. 14 I found no information to preclude 15 the issuance of a type 5 video draw poker 16 gaming license to Pilot Corporation 17 Tennessee doing business as Pilot Travel 18 Center No. 1105 or to preclude the 19 associated persons from participating in 20 the gaming industry. 21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 2.2 Okay. Total compliance then. Okay. 23 Thank you. 24 Any questions, members? Any 2.5 questions?

19	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON:
20	Good morning, Chairman Johns and
21	board members. I'm Assistant Attorney
22	General Quintele Jackson here on behalf of
23	the division in the matter pertaining to
24	the transfer of the partnership interest
25	in Plantation Truck Stop I'm sorry,



1 Plantation Truck Plaza & Casino, LLC doing 2 business as Plantation Truck Plaza & 3 Casino. 4 It's a type 5 video gaming license 5 and with me is Investigator Glenn Verrett 6 with the Louisiana State Police. 7 Now on March 22nd, 2024, Ms. Janice 8 M. Penn transferred her 25 percent 9 interest in the licensee to Plantation, LLC. Penn Plantation, LLC has two 10 members, Mr. Claude M. Penn, Jr. and Ms. 11 12 Janice M. Penn with each having a 50 13 percent membership interest. 14 Investigator Verrett conducted an 15 investigation into the transfer of this 16 interest, and he would now provide his 17 report to the board. 18 MR. VERRETT: 19 Good morning, again, Mr. Chairman 20 and board members. I'm Investigator Glenn 21 Verrett with the gaming enforcement 2.2 division. 23 I investigated the transfer of 24 partnership interest in the licensee, 2.5 conducted updated suitability checks and



1	found no information that would preclude
2	the licensee or his partners from
3	continuing to participate in the Louisiana
4	Gaming Industry.
5	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON:
6	The office of the attorney general
7	has reviewed the file compiled by state
8	police and the gaming enforcement
9	division, and our review indicated that no
10	information was discovered which would
11	preclude this transfer.
12	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
13	And this is located in Houma, I
14	think; am I correct?
15	MR. VERRETT:
16	Yes, sir.
17	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
18	Okay. I thought so. Okay. I have
19	no questions.
20	Any questions from the board
21	members? Any questions?
22	If not, I would entertain a motion

15	Good morning.
16	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON:
17	Good morning, once again, Chairman
18	Johns and board members. I'm Assistant
19	Attorney General Quintele Jackson here on
20	behalf of the division in this matter
21	pertaining to DK Crown Holdings, Inc.
22	doing business as DraftKings. With me is
23	Ms. Donna Jackson with Louisiana State
24	Police, Gaming Audit Division and
25	Investigator Kevin Biddy with the Gaming



1 Enforcement Division. 2 And we are here in the matter of the 3 consideration for the Fantasy Sports 4 Contest Operator Renewal Application of DK 5 Crown Holdings, Inc. doing business as DraftKings. 6 7 Now pursuant to Louisiana Revised 8 Statute 27:301, the board is the sole 9 regulator of paid Fantasy Sports Contest 10 in Louisiana and is charged with issuing or denying applications. 11 12 Fantasy sports contest operator 13 licenses are issued for a three-year term, 14 and this license is set to expire on July 15 15th of this year. 16 At this time the state police will 17 now provide his report to the board. 18 MS. JACKSON: 19 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 20 board members. My name is Donna Jackson 21

with Louisiana State Police, Gaming Audit Section.

DK Crown Holdings, Incorporated doing business as DraftKings is wholly owned by its ultimate parent company



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DraftKings, Incorporated. DraftKings is one of two fantasy sports contests licensees currently operating in Louisiana. Fantasy Sports revenue generated from contest entry fees from users, net of prizes, and customer incentives awarded to users.

In addition to Fantasy Sports,
DraftKings, Inc. is licensed to provide
online sports betting product offerings in
Louisiana and 24 other states. They also
operate iGaming or online casino in seven
jurisdictions.

DraftKings, Inc. has experienced operating losses and negative operating cash flows for the past three years -- calendar years. While certain areas of their operation may experience improved cash flow, DraftKings, Inc. expects to continue to incur operating losses and negative operating cash flows for the next 12 months.

The Audit Section feels there is minimal risk to the State of Louisiana or DraftKings' players if DraftKings does not



1	achieve the projected profitability, since
2	they are not investing in a
3	brick-and-mortar facility and the players'
4	cash is maintained separately from the
5	operating cash balances.
6	In conclusion, no financial issues
7	came to our attention to preclude the
8	board from approving the renewal of
9	DraftKings Fantasy Sports Contest license
10	for a period of three years, effective
11	July 15, 2024. Licensing will now present
12	their findings to the board.

Additionally, the applicant and its shareholders submitted a level 1 suitability application. The applicant is owned by DraftKings, Inc., a Nevada corporation, a publicly traded company.

In accordance with Louisiana rules and regulations, a background investigation was conducted on DraftKings, Inc., Nevada. The applicant, its shareholders, officers, directors, and persons with 5 percent or more of ownership or economic interest in the applicant.

The background investigation consisted of inquiries to federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, civil jurisdiction, gaming regulatory agencies and the Louisiana Department of Revenue. Inquiries were also made into the computerized criminal history system.

I found no information that would preclude them from participating in the Louisiana gaming industry.

Okay. Next on the agenda sports wagering issues. Consideration of Sports Wagering Platform Provider Permit application of Hillside Louisiana, LLC doing business as Bet 365.

## ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MCINTYRE:

Good morning, Chairman Johns and board members. Assistant Attorney General Talibah McIntyre appearing with Ms. Tammy Haupt with the Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit Section and Trooper Michael Daniel of the Gaming Enforcement Division. Representatives of the applicant are also present.

We're here in the matter of the consideration of the sports wagering platform provider permit application of Hillside Louisiana, LLC doing business as



Bet 365. Pursuant to the Louisiana Sports Wagering Act, the board is charged with issuing or denying applications for sports wagering platform provider permits.

The board issued a temporary certificate of authority to the applicant to conduct business as a sports wagering platform provider with an effective date of October 25th, 2023. The TCLA was set to expire on April 25th, 2024; however, after a request was made by the applicant for an extension of time, the expiration of the TCLA was extended for 90 days beginning April 25th, 2024. The TCLA expires on July 24th, 2024.

Louisiana State Police Gaming
Division has reviewed and investigated the application and will now report its findings to the board.

## MS. HAUPT:

Good morning, Chairman Johns and board members. My name is Tammy Haupt with Louisiana State Police's Gaming Audit Section.

The audit section has reviewed the



financial information submitted by Bet 365 as well as its direct and indirect parent companies. Hillside (US New Media), LLC referred to as Bet 365 US, is a direct parent of Bet 365. In January of 2022, Bet 365 US gained access to the Louisiana market when it entered into an Online Market Access Agreement with Amelia Belle Casino.

Bet 365 launched its mobile sports bet -- sportsbook in Louisiana on November 21st, 2023. Since entering the US sports wagering market in 2019, Bet 365 US has expanded its North American mobile sports wagering operations.

The Bet 365 mobile sports wagering platform is currently live in ten US states and Ontario, Canada. The company has several other market access agreements in place for further expansion in the US.

Hillside (New Media Holdings US),
Incorporated, referred to as Hillside
Holdings US, is the indirect parent of Bet
365. As of March 26th, 2023, Hillside
Holdings US reported an accumulated



deficit of \$156.7 million and reported a loss -- net loss of \$96.6 million for the fiscal year end.

Hillside Holdings US has sustained continued losses and has utilized cash in operations since inception, and expects to incur further -- future additional losses.

Although Hillside Holdings US is a holding company and would not expect to achieve profitability, a representative stated it expects that Bet 365 to achieve or be near profitability at the end of its current financial year, which is March of 2025.

Bet 365 Group, the ultimate parent, stated that they are committed to long-term operations, not just in Louisiana, but in all other US jurisdictions. Bet 365 Group maintains a strong cash position with positive cash flow and working capital. As of March 26th, 2023, Bet 365 Group had no debt issued or executed. The company reported cash and current asset investments held for future trading purposes, totalling

approximately \$3.6 billion, with over \$4.5 billion in total assets.

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In the nine-month period following the March 26th, 2023 fiscal year end, Bet 365 Group provided approximately \$30 million to Hillside Holdings US according to the 2023 consolidated financial statement notes.

The audit section feels there is minimal risk to the State of Louisiana or Bet 365's players if Bet 365 does not achieve the projected profitability, since they are not investing in a brick-and-mortar facility and the players cash is maintained separately from its operating cash balances.

In conclusion, based on the information reviewed by the audit section, Bet 365 possesses the financial backing of Bet 365 Group and its affiliated entities to support its Louisiana sports wagering operations until adequate cash flow is achieved to support the operations.

No financial issues, other than its negative operating profits previously



mentioned, came to the audit section's attention that would preclude the board from approving the issuance of a sports wagering platform provider permit to Bet 365 for a period of five years.

Licensing will now present their findings.

#### MASTER TROOPER DANIEL:

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Good morning, Chairman Johns and members of the board. I'm Master Trooper Michael Daniel with the Louisiana State Police. On September 7th, 2022, Hillside Louisiana, LLC doing business as Bet 365 submitted a sports wagering platform provider application. Bet 365 applied for a permit to provide online market access sports wagering operation on behalf of Belle of Orleans, LLC doing business as the Amelia Belle Casino.

Under the rules and regulations of the Gaming Enforcement Division, a background investigation was conducted on Bet 365, its shareholders, subsidiaries, officers, directors and persons with 5 percent or more ownership or economic



interest in the permit to determine if any 1 2 information would deem Bet 365 unsuitable. The background investigation 3 4 consisted of inquires to federal, state 5 and local law enforcement agencies, civil jurisdictions, gaming regulatory agencies 6 7 and the Louisiana Department of Revenue. 8 Inquires were also made through a computerized criminal history database. 10 Based on the investigation, no 11 information was found that would preclude 12 the board from approving Bet 365's sports 13 wagering platform provider permit. 14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 15 Okay. So all criteria has been met. I'm sorry. Did I interrupt you? 16 17 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MCINTYRE: 18 Go ahead. 19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 20 All criteria has been met and no 21 major concerns. 2.2 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL MCINTYRE: 23 If it's the board's pleasure to 2.4 approve the sports wagering platform 2.5 provider permit application of Hillside

This settlement addresses the licensee's violation of the gaming law. Now, on October 25th, 2022, the division conducted a video gaming compliance inspection of the licensee and discovered several deficiencies at the licensee's truck stop facility and its parking lot.

The deficiencies included several large potholes throughout the parking lot and the travel lanes, and additionally, the licensee's parking lot could not accommodate the required minimum 50 parking spaces for 18-wheeler tractor-trailer motor vehicles, as well as the signage issues relating to the ingress and egress into the truck stop areas.

The licensee was given 60 days to



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remedy these deficiencies and failed to do so. The division then conducted multiple follow-up inspections of the licensee's establishment, and these inspections revealed that several deficiencies remained outstanding.

Due to the violations and the licensee's failure to remedy these deficiencies, a revocation hearing was set in this matter. On April 7th of 2024, the division conducted a follow-up inspection of the licensee. This inspection revealed that all of the remaining deficiencies regarding the parking lot as well as the travel lanes had been remedied, and that the licensee was in compliance with Louisiana gaming law.

Therefore, the division converted this action from revocation to an administrative action. In lieu of an administrative hearing, the licensee and the division agreed to settle this matter for \$20,000.

Given the length of time the licensee was out of compliance, the number



1	of violations regarding the licensee
2	parking lot and travel lanes, the amount
3	was agreed to by excuse me, this amount
4	was agreed to by both parties.
5	The hearing officer has signed the
6	settlement, and it's now before the board
7	for final approval. Thank you.

So, ladies and gentlemen, with this being my last minute -- my last meeting, excuse me, I'm going to ask that you bear with me for a few minutes because I've got a lot of people to thank and a lot -- a lot to say.

On July the 20th of 2021, I was a Louisiana state senator. I was serving in my 10th year or my third term, the 22nd year of my legislative career. The very next day, July the 21st, I was chairman of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board.

There's a billboard on the road today that you'll see and it basically says, if you know, you know. Well, the fact is I didn't know what I thought I knew. Going from being a policy maker to a regulator is much more difficult than I ever thought. I realized then that the legislature tells government agencies what they want done. They just don't tell them



how to do it, and that's where the difficult -- the difficulty of this job comes in.

It was a challenging time. The legislature had just approved the final version of sports betting. The 2018 legislation that allowed the old legacy riverboats to become land based was just taking its stride, and there was a lot of talks and petitions for some properties to take advantage of that legislation.

And then in a very short period of time, due to some very well deserved retirements and then major health issues in the gaming control board office, we completely had to replace our entire staff.

We went from people who had been there 23, 24, 25 years to brand-new staff. And it was -- it was a challenge, but it was a good challenge.

Getting sports betting off and running was much more complicated than I ever dreamed. At that time the legislature and the public wanted it



tomorrow morning. As I tell people, you just don't flip a switch and make something like that happen that quickly. I cannot thank my staff, the state police gaming division, the attorney general's office gaming division enough for their work, their advice, their guidance in doing it the right way. We did it the right way. And that I'm very proud of.

A lot of other states have come in and actually sought our advice on how we've done it so successfully.

Major McNeill, I'm very sorry for all of those phone calls I made to you. I had to push you a little bit, but thank you. I owe that to you.

I'm so proud of where we are on the new land-based properties with three now being completed. We just opened the Treasure Chest two weeks ago down in Kenner. It's a beautiful property. Boyd Gaming, thank you very much for that investment and that commitment. A beautiful property that I know is going to do real well.



We have two more under construction right now, and I will tell you that we're in talks with other licensees on the possibility of them doing the same thing.

With the three completed properties, the two that are underway now, some major upgrades at a lot of other properties and the major project at Caesar's in New Orleans, we can now -- this board can be very proud of \$1.3 billion of capital investment from the gaming division just in the last three years.

So when you begin to thank people publicly, it's very difficult. When I was in the legislature, I got myself in trouble many times because I would always leave somebody out. But if I leave somebody out today, I apologize, but I do thank you.

First, I want to thank former

Governor John Bell Edwards for having the faith in me to lead this board. Governor Edwards, you just told me to do the right thing. That's the only thing you ever told me, just do the right thing. You



never once interfered with my work or my decisions, and I'll always be grateful for that.

And to Governor Jeff Landry, the same. Thank you for allowing me to continue to serve in your administration, and again, for the commitment that you made for me to regulate the way that I saw fit. And I'll always appreciate that cooperation.

A huge thank you to this board. You're an incredible group of people who have done a magnificent job helping to regulate such a large industry. Three years ago the only person that I knew on this board was Ms. Berry. The rest of you are like family to me now. I'll always be grateful for you putting your trust into someone that you had just never met before.

You supported the entire regulatory team during my tenure, and I thank you for that. Be proud that you have done things the right way. I think that's so important for this board as we moved



1 through some very major changes over the 2 past three years. I will always treasure 3 your friendship. 4 To the state police gaming division, 5 Major McNeill, a huge thank you for all of you guiding me, keeping me on the right 6 7 track, finding a way to make things happen 8 when I felt strongly that it was the right

Division head Chris Hebert could not be with us today. He's out of the state on a speaking engagement, but I want to publicly thank not only him but his entire staff for their work at the attorney general's office. Without them, this board and this gaming industry absolutely could not function. So to Chris Hebert and Don Himel, Matthew Weekly, Salandry and everyone, every one of you from the attorney general's office, thank you for sharing your legal minds, your integrity, which is so important; and I will tell you that our state is better off today because of you.

To our staff here at the capital, thank you for your help and your



cooperation each month preparing the committee room for us and for your expertise to video stream my meetings for the public to have access.

And also thank you to a lot of the legislative staff. A lot of the staff has been very, very helpful to us in guiding us with legislation and helping us draft good, solid legislation. So I thank you staff upstairs. I hope you're watching. We greatly appreciate all of the help that you've given me the past three years.

I know in the room today we've got a number of members from the gaming industry, some good friends. I want to thank you for your cooperation, your willingness to work with this board and all involved in the regulatory process. Your understanding when I as chairman had to say no to something that you wanted. Your commitment to this state with your investment dollars, and especially, especially for your ethical approach to doing business in this state.

Your industry many times gets a bad



rap by the media or certain special interest groups. I will say this publicly, that each of you that I have worked with are highly ethical people who have great integrity and are committed to doing the right thing in Louisiana. So thank you very, very much for that. That doesn't happen in every state.

I appreciate the relationship we've had, and I hope that I will be remembered as being a fair but a compliant chairman for your industry.

And to Wade Duty with the gaming association and to Alton Ashy, who represents the video poker, thank you for representing your industry so well and your willingness to not only work with me but to share your knowledge and solutions to problems.

My man, former board Chairman Ronnie
Jones, now living in Virginia, Chairman
Jones, I hope you're watching, but I can
tell you I cannot thank you enough for
being my mentor, for sharing your
knowledge with me, for always taking my



calls no matter what time it was -- you know, he's on eastern time. I'm on central time. A lot of times I'm calling him during his lunch hour or your cocktail hour maybe, but thank you for advising me, thank you for letting me rant and rave when I needed an ear, and just for being such a great friend to me.

I can honestly say, Mr. Chairman, that I never obtained my goal of filling your shoes, and I'm very sorry that you never had the opportunity to make a speech like this when you left the board.

To a whole bunch of outside attorneys and lobbyists who represent the industry, thank you for your professionalism, your willingness to work with me and not letting my personal relationship with you interfere with our work. Thank you for that consideration.

This one is difficult for me. To my extended family at the board office, ladies and gentlemen, I have four incredible ladies who three years ago didn't work at the board, and here we are



today three years with spending three years with them, they are like an extended family to me. Each of them came to our office during difficult times and each of them embraced the ideals and the philosophy that I tried to implement at the board office of having a strong work ethic.

And I would like to introduce each one of them today. I'm going to ask them to stand for a few minutes so that we can recognize and thank them. I've got Frieda Hernandez, Lydia Browning and Jasmine Dunklin, three special ladies who work very hard who keep our board operation running so well each day. I appreciate you very much. Keep standing, please.

And then I have the lady to my right, your left, Ms. Heather Hood, our in-house attorney, my confidential assistant, an incredible lady who has guided me, advised me, fussed at me, beared with me with my bad moods, which weren't very often but occasionally, and worked some long and crazy hours when it




was necessary. It wasn't unusual for me to get a call from Heather on a Saturday night on something very, very important.

Hundreds, if not thousands of nights that I wasn't at home and they were alone when I was doing state's business, not many families experience this, but my family did. I'll always be thankful and grateful for their understanding too where my life has taken me. God blessed me with an incredible wife, a beautiful daughter, and a first class son-in-law and five special grandchildren.

So thank you Michelle for supporting



me this 41 wonderful years. Thank you daughter Clare for understanding why your dad was gone so much and for not being -- but especially for being a special lady and mother that you have become.

And thank you, Marcus, my son-in-law, for what you have meant to my family. And thanks to my grandchildren for each of you being the special individuals that you are. I just want to let you know Poppa loves you.

Michelle, my career is definitely over on June the 30th. Now we can figure out how to spend our daughter's inheritance.
