

TO THE HONORABLE ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER:


COME NOW State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police (hereinafter the "Division") and PIZZA TOWN CAFÉ, L.L.C., Permit No. 0904210745 (hereinafter "Pizza Town Café" or "Licensee"), who file this Joint Motion for Approval of Compromise and Settlement Agreement, and in support thereof would respectively show unto the Hearing Officer as follows:

1.

The Division and Licensee are desirous of compromising and settling all disputes between them relative to the referenced administrative proceeding. In connection therewith, the parties have entered into a compromise and settlement agreement which by its terms will become effective upon approval by the Administrative Hearing Office and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board.

A true and correct copy of the proposed Compromise and Settlement Agreement is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated by reference for all purposes.

COMPROMISE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police (hereinafter the "Division") and PIZZA TOWN CAFÉ, L.L.C., Permit No. 0904210745 (hereinafter "Pizza Town Café" or "Licensee") do hereby represent and agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the Louisiana General Gaming Division has issued a Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action, alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law; and

WHEREAS, the issues raised by the said Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action, are set for hearing on August 16, 2006, before the Louisiana Gaming Control Board Administrative Hearing Office; and

WHEREAS, the Division and Licensee are desirous of fully and finally compromising and settling all issues and disputes arising out of and in connection with the said Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto do hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

STIPULATIONS

1. Licensee stipulates that Pizza Town Café temporarily ceased operations on or about January 14, 2005, under its owner Robert Williams. On or about February 11, 2005,

Robert Williams sold Pizza Town Café to 2905 Youree Drive, L.L.C., a company solely owned by Harold Rosbottom. The Licensee resumed operations on or about February 22, 2005.

2. Pizza Town Café was closed for more than thirty (30) consecutive days and failed to place its gaming license on Hold Status in violation of **LAC 42:XI 2405B.9a; LAC 42:XI 2405D.1-7; LAC 42:XI 2405D.3a-d; and La. R.S. 27:310B(1)(c).**

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Within fifteen (15) days of the approval of this settlement by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, Licensee shall pay Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars for the violation of **LAC 42:XI 2405B.9a; LAC 42:XI 2405D.1-7; LAC 42:XI 2405D.3a-d; and La. R.S. 27:310B(1)(c).**

2. The Division hereby agrees to a Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollar fine for the Licensee's violation of **LAC 42:XI 2405B.9a; LAC 42:XI 2405D.1-7; LAC 42:XI 2405D.3a-d; and La. R.S. 27:310B(1)(c).**

3. The terms of this Compromise and Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of Louisiana.

4. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Division and Licensee pertaining to the subject matter contained herein and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations and understandings of the parties.


5. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement is subject to approval by the Hearing Officer and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. It is expressly understood that if this proposed settlement is approved by the Hearing Officer, this agreement is not thereby executory, but will be submitted to the Louisiana Gaming Control Board for its determination as to whether to approve same or to remand the matter to the Hearing Officer for a full hearing on the merits.

6. If approved by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, Licensee must pay Five Thousand and No/100 (\$5,000.00) Dollars within fifteen (15) calendar days of such approval. Any failure to meet this requirement will result in immediate revocation of the gaming license without the necessity of any further administrative action.

I have read this entire Compromise Settlement Agreement and agree to all stipulations and terms and conditions hereof.
