21	Okay. Moving into our revenue
22	reports, Ms. Jackson. Good morning. The
23	real Santa Claus, bringing us all of these
24	good numbers. Good morning.
25	MS. JACKSON:



Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board Members. My name is Donna Jackson with the Louisiana State Police, Gaming Audit Section.

In November, the 14 operating riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts of \$140,545,518. The state collected fees totaling \$30,217,286.

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date are \$695 million, a slight increase or \$1.3 million or .2% from fiscal year '22-'23.

As of November 30th, 2023, the state collected \$149.5 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24. Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue broken down by regional market.

The overall increase from October was \$8 million or 6%. Compared to last November, this month's revenues represent an increase of \$5 million or 3.8%.

Next is a summary of the November 2023 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans found on page 3. Harrah's generated \$20,783,578 in gross gaming



revenue.

These revenues represent an increase from last month of \$1 million or 5.8%, but a decrease of \$2.5 million or 11% from the same month last year.

During November, the state received \$5,327,869 in minimum daily payments.

The adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date are \$96.5 million, a decrease of \$14 million or 13% from fiscal year '22-'23.

As of November 30th, 2023, the state collected \$27 million in fees for fiscal year '23-'24.

Next I'll present the revenues for slots at the Racetracks. During November, the four racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted gross receipts of \$23,794,229, an increase of \$1.4 million or 6.4% from last month, with a slight increase of 1.5% when compared to the same month last year.

During November, the state collected \$3.6 million in fees. Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year '23-'24 to date



1 are \$123.8 million, a decrease \$5.5 2 million or 4% for fiscal year '22-'23. 3 As of November 30th, 2023, the state 4 has collected approximately \$18.8 million 5 in fees for fiscal year '23-'24. 6 I will now move on to the video 7 gaming information. 8 There are 11,885 video gaming 9 devices activated at 1,392 locations. Net 10 device revenue for November 2023 was \$60,224,153, an increase of \$863,986 or 11 12 1.5% when compared to October 2023 with a 13 decrease of \$1.4 million or 2.3% when 14 compared to last November. Total 15 franchise fees for November 2023 totalled 16 \$18.3 million. 17 Fiscal year to date net device 18 revenue is \$302.8 million, a decrease of 19 \$15.2 million or 4.8% when compared to 20 last fiscal ear. 21 As of November 30th, 2023, the state 22 has collected \$91.8 million in franchise 23 fees for fiscal year 2024. 24 Next, I'll present the November 25 revenue for Sportsbook.



1	During November, the 18 retail
2	sportbooks accepted \$33.5 million in
3	sports wagers, resulting in net proceeds
4	of \$1.3 million, and \$158,879 in state
5	taxes.
6	One new mobile sportsbook operator,
7	Bet365, commenced operation in Louisiana
8	during November. Total mobile sports
9	wagers written during November were \$322.9
L O	million, which resulted in net proceeds of
1	\$18 million and \$3 million in taxes paid
12	to the state.
L3	Finally, for Daily Fantasy Sports,
4	gross revenues for November were \$1.4
15	million, with net revenue of approximately
6	\$156,000 and taxes of \$12,500.

24	into our casino gaming issues. First on
25	the agenda today is the consideration of a



1 certificate of compliance for the 2 alternate riverboat inspection of Premier 3 Entertainment Shreveport, LLC, doing 4 business as Bally's Shreveport Casino & 5 Hotel. 6 Good morning. 7 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL NATHAN: 8 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 9 Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney 10 General Andrea Nathan, and with me is 11 Moriah Reed of AVS. 12 We are here in the matter of the issuance of the certificate of compliance 13 14 for Premier Entertainment Shreveport, LLC, 15 doing business as Bally's Shreveport 16 Casino & Hotel. 17 On October 18th, 2023, AVS began the 18 inspection process for the approval of Bally's Shreveport Casino & Hotel's 19 20 certificate of compliance. 21 The inspection process was completed 2.2 on November 21st, 2023, and Ms. Reed will 23 provide the details of AVS's inspection. 24 MS. REED: 25 Good morning, Chairman Johns and



Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with American Vessel Services. And here is the report on the annual certification for Bally's Casino in Shreveport.

The inspector's people and I did on October 18th of 2023 attend the riverboat Hollywood Dreams to conduct the annual inspection in accordance with the Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program.

We have reviewed fire protection measures, egress routes, observed emergency lighting, tested the emergency generator, inspected the mooring system and conducted a fire drill as well as other required life safety items.

There were two deficiencies as noted on page 7 of the annual survey report. And a follow-up supplemental report was prepared on November 21st of 2023, and all outstanding items are now considered satisfactory as outlined in that supplemental survey.

The 2023 annual survey is required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and the casino vessel

2	continue its intended service and dockside

12	Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney
13	General Venise Johnson, with me is Ms.
14	Moriah Reed of AVS. We are here in the
15	matter of the issuance of a certificate of
16	compliance from Boomtown Bossier City. On
17	October 25th, 2023, AVS began the
18	inspection process for the approval of the
19	Boomtown Bossier City certificate of
20	compliance. Ms. Moriah Reed will now
21	provide the details of the AVS inspection.
22	MS. REED:
23	Good morning, Chairman Johns and
24	Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with
25	American Vessel Services. I'm here to



report on the annual certification for the Mary Surprise Casino at the Boomtown Bossier Casino.

The inspectors people who then came and did on October 25th, 2023 attend Mary Surprise to conduct an annual inspection in accordance with the Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program.

They reviewed fire protection measures, egress routes, tested the emergency lighting, tested the emergency generator, inspected the mooring system and conducted a fire drill as well as other required life safety items.

The deficiencies are noted on pages 6 and 7 of your report. The property provided documentation to AVS to verify that the deficiencies of the annual survey have been corrected. A supplemental survey was then provided to the board on December 6 that indicates all deficiencies have been satisfied and are now considered closed. The satisfied deficiencies can be found on page 2 of the supplemental survey.

The 2023 annual survey as required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and the casino vessel Mary Surprise is considered fit to continue its intended service as a dockside gaming riverboat in the state of Louisiana.

It is the recommendation of AVS that the Mary Surprise at the Boomtown Casino

It is the recommendation of AVS that the Mary Surprise at the Boomtown Casino Bossier be issued the certificate of compliance for 2023.

ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JOHNSON:

We now present these findings to the board and request that upon the Board accepting a report submitted by AVS we would move with the issuance of compliance to Boomtown Bossier City, which expires on December 31st, 2024.

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

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Okay. Any questions from the board? Hearing none, I would entertain a motion to issue a certificate of compliance for Boomtown Bossier City, which will expire December the 31st of 2024.

And Mr. Jackson has made that motion. Ms. Lewis has seconded that



motion. 1 2 Is there any opposition to that 3 motion? 4 Hearing none, that motion carries. 5 And thank you, Ms. Johnson. Item C will be the consideration of 6 7 a certificate of compliance for the 8 riverboat inspection of the gaming vessel Louisiana I Gaming, a partnership doing 10 business as Boomtown New Orleans. 11 Good morning. 12 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL HOUSTON: 13 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 14 Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney 15 General Delancey Houston, and with me 16 today is Moriah Reed from AVS. 17 We are here in the matter of the 18 issuance of a certificate of compliance to 19 Boomtown Casino, which is located in 20 Harvey, Louisiana. 21 On August 16th, 2023, AVS began the 2.2 inspection process for the approval of 23 Boomtown Casino's annual certificate of 24 compliance. A temporary certificate of 2.5 compliance was issued to Boomtown Casino



due to their request for additional time to repair -- due to repairs taking longer 3 than anticipated. 4 Ms. Moriah Reed will now provide the 5 details on AVS's inspection. MS. REED: 6 Good morning, Chairman and Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with American Vessel Services, and I'm here to report on 10 the annual certification for CV Boomtown 11 Belle II at the Boomtown Casino New 12 Orleans property in Harvey, Louisiana. 13 14

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The inspectors people and I did on August 16th of 2023 attend the riverboat Boomtown Belle II to conduct an annual inspection in accordance with Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program.

Follow-up inspections were conducted in October and November and as a result the property requested extensions, which the board approved.

On December 7th another follow-up survey was done and three deficiencies These deficiencies are noted on remained. page 2 of the supplemental survey dated



December 11 in your package. 1 2 However, as of yesterday, all of 3 these deficiencies are cleared and 4 considered satisfactory. 5 On Friday, December 15th, I received a letter from Priority Systems confirming 6 7 that the work on the fire alarm control 8 panel is complete and it's functioning properly. 10 In addition, the sprinkler system is reported clear. This cleared up 11 12 deficiencies No. 19 and 20. 13 In regards to deficiency No. 21, I 14 have inspected the required repair and 15 proper repairs have been made. 16 A report documenting these items as 17 satisfactory will be returned to the board 18 as soon as possible. 19

With these deficiencies cleared, the

2023 annual survey as required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and the Boomtown Belle II is considered fit to continue its intended service as a dockside gaming riverboat in the state of Louisiana.



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It is the recommendation of the AVS 1 2 that the Boomtown Belle Casino be issued 3 the certificate of compliance for 2023. 4 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL HOUSTON: 5 We now present these findings to the 6 board and request that upon the board 7 accepting the report submitted by AVS, you 8 will move for the issuance of a 9 certificate of compliance to Boomtown 10 Casino, which will expire on December 11 31st, 2024. 12 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 13 Thank you very much, ladies. Okay. So, Members, in your packet, your 14 15 original package you received there was an 16 ask for a temporary certificate, which 17 would have been January 31st, 2024, but 18 Boomtown has made some special efforts, 19 and thank you Boomtown New Orleans for 20 making those efforts to get that 21 completed. 2.2 So is there any questions for the 23 ladies at the table? 24 Hearing none, I would then ask for a



motion to issue a certificate of

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1 compliance, which will expire on January 2 the 31st of 2024 for Boomtown New Orleans. 3 So Judge Sholes has made that 4 motion. Ms. Hamilton-Acker has seconded 5 that motion. 6 Is there any opposition to that 7 motion? 8 Hearing none, the motion carries. 9 Okay. Again, Boomtown, thank you 10 again for that special effort to make that 11 I appreciate it. happen. 12 Members, moving along, we 13 have the consideration of a certificate of 14 compliance for the riverboat inspection of 15 the gaming vessel of Golden Nugget Lake 16 Charles, LLC, doing business as Golden 17 Nugget. 18 Good morning. 19 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JACKSON: 20 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 21 Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney 2.2 General Ouintele Jackson here on behalf of 23 the Division, with me is Ms. Reed of AVS. 24 And we're here today in the matter of the 25 issuance of the certificate of compliance



1 of Golden Nugget Lake Charles, LLC. 2 On October 10th and 11th of this 3 year, AVS conducted an inspection of the 4 dockside vessel, and on November 2nd of 5 this year, AVS conducted a follow-up 6 inspection. 7 Ms. Reed will now provide the 8 details of those inspections. 9 MS. REED: 10 Good morning, Chairman Johns and Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with 11 12 American Vessel Services. I'm here to 13 report on the annual certification for the 14 Golden Nugget Casino in Lake Charles. 15 The inspectors people and Jeff Boil 16 did on October 10th and 11th of 2023 17 attend the permanent casino platform of 18 the Golden Nugget to conduct the annual 19 inspection in accordance with the 20 Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program. 21 The inspectors reviewed fire 2.2 protection measures, egress routes, 23 observed emergency lighting, tested the 24 emergency generator, inspected the mooring



system and conducted a fire drill as well

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1 as other required life safety items. 2 There were two deficiencies as noted 3 on pages 8 and 9 of the annual survey 4 report. The follow-up supplemental report 5 6 was prepared on November 15th of 2023, and 7 all outstanding items are now considered 8 satisfactory. 9 The 2023 annual survey as required 10 by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and Golden Nugget is 11 12 considered fit to continue it's intended 13 service as a dockside gaming riverboat in 14 the state of Louisiana. 15 16

It is the recommendation of AVS that the permanently moored casino platform the Golden Nugget be issued a certificate of compliance for 2023.

Good morning, Chairman Johns and Board Members. I'm Moriah Reed with American Vessel Services, and I'm here to report on the annual certification for the Sam's Town Casino in Shreveport, Louisiana.

The AVS inspectors people and Ben Teeman did on October 26th of 2023 attend the riverboat Shreve Star to conduct the annual inspection in accordance with the Louisiana Alternative Inspection Program.

They reviewed fire protection



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measures, egress routes, observed emergency lighting, tested the emergency generator, inspected the mooring system and conducted a fire drill as well as other required life safety items.

In the original annual inspection report of October 26 of 2023, there were seven deficiencies as noted on page 6 of that survey report. Documentation from the property was then provided to AVS as a follow-up to the original inspection; and as such a supplemental survey report was provided to the board dated November 7th of 2023. And all deficiencies are now considered satisfactory.

The 2023 annual survey as required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and the casino vessel Shreve Star is considered fit to continue its intended service as a dockside gaming riverboat in the state of Louisiana.

It is the recommendation of AVS that the Sam's Town Casino be issued the certificate of compliance for 2023.

22	On December 15th, 2022, this Board
23	considered and approved the licensee's
24	request to relocate its gaming operation
25	to a land-side facility within 1200 feet



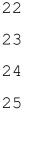
of its licensed berth.

Due to the sale of the membership interest and the licensee to LRGC Gaming investors, the Board later adopted a resolution that required the licensee to submit the full architectural blueprint and detailed plan of design and construction for the approved project for board review and acceptance by December 15th, 2023.

The licensee timely submitted its plans and specs to the board, which is up for board consideration today.

The licensee is subject to a certain non-gaming amenities contained in condition No. 6 of the Statement of Conditions.

To be compliant with the Statement of Conditions, at a minimum the licensee's approved project must include a hotel with a minimum of 405 rooms, a sport wagering lounge, a ballroom or event space totaling a minimum of 25,000 square feet, capable of hosting live entertainment and with meeting space, a minimum of three food and



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beverage outlets with a total minimum seating capacity 450, a minimum of one retail outlet, a fitness center, and an outdoor pool complex.

The Division and Attorney General's office have reviewed the plans and specs and confirm that all required elements of the approved project are present in the plans and specs.

However, on December 14th, 2023, the licensee filed a petition explaining that the submitted full plans and specs included the required non-gaming amenities contained in the licensee's Statement of the Conditions which is considered the base scope, as well as several potential increased scope projects that exceed what is required for the approved project under the Statement of Conditions.

The licensee is seeking Board acceptance for the plans and specs for the base scope and approval to add one or more of the increased scope projects as determined by the licensee throughout the length of the project.



The petition also requests that the Board grant the Chairman the authority to 3 accept any change orders for interim 4 construction, as well as throughout 5 construction of the land-side facility. 6 According to the licensee, this is 7 to continue renovations and expedite completion of the project. The current deadline to submit the 10 full construction contract for the approved project for board review and 11 acceptance is March 15th, 2024. 12 13 14 15 16 board.

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The construction contract for the approved project must be consistent with the full plans and specs accepted by the

The current deadline for the licensee to complete construction and commence gaming operations at the land-side facility is December 15th, 2025.

A resolution has been prepared accepting the architectural blueprint and detailed plan of design and construction presented to the board in the form of the base scope plans and any potential



increased scope project, and also granting the Chairman the authority to accept the revised plans and specifications, supplements and any related change orders for the approved project on the Board's behalf until the full construction contract is submitted to the board for review and acceptance.

The Board is within its authority to grant the licensee's request placing whatever limitations on the licensee as the Board deems fit.

Now I'll turn it over to Mr. Barbin and Mr. Hudolin to explain the licensee's request in more detail and answer any questions that the board members may have. MR. BARBIN:

Thank you, Ms. Landry.

I'll point out that you have some colored plans in front of you that highlight the additional projects. The base scope is the rest of the -- the layout that you'll see on the four pages and the additional projects are highlighted in yellow. And with that,



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I'll turn it over to Keith.
MR. HUDOLIN:

Thank you, Chairman Johns and to the Board Members. We are very excited to present these plans and we appreciate the Board's consideration of the increased scope of projects.

As we are racing to get this project opened as quickly as possible and to get the full construction contract before the Board for consideration. We determined that there are some things that we really would like to do as part of this project that we are just not quite yet in a position to commit to as we're still finalizing the design and pricing out the project.

But in the interest of speed and making sure that, you know, once we're ready to move forward, we submitted both the base scope project as well as the additional projects now for the Board's review and approval with the hope that we will be able to move forward with everything that has been presented.

CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

Okay. Well, Board Members, this past week Ms. Hood and Mr. Jackson from the board and myself attended the official groundbreaking ceremony at the Diamond Jacks property. I will tell you it was a first-class event. A lot of excitement in the city of Bossier. A lot of press coverage. And we greatly appreciate the hospitality, but the fact that you're wanting to move forward very quickly.

I know your -- your agreement with us is to be finished by the end of 2025, but as some of your higher-ups have told me, y'all would really like to open a lot quicker than that, so.

MR. HUDOLIN:

Absolutely.

And I know when you've got dollars going out and none coming in, it just doesn't work too well, does it, for your bankers.

On the 18th day of December of 2023, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board did, in a duly noticed public meeting, consider the petition for approval of plans and request to grant Chairman authority to approve additional interim construction filed by Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company and the issue of the licensee's submission of its architectural blueprints and detailed plan of design and construction of the approved project, and upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board adopted this resolution.

Whereas, on April 4th, 2023, the



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Board adopted a resolution which required the licensee to submit full architectural blueprints and a detailed plan of design and construction of the approved project to the Board by December 15th, 2023 and all necessary contracts for the construction by March 15th, 2024.

Whereas, in accordance with the April 4th, 2023 resolution, the Board accepted the licensee's contractor agreement and general conditions, GMP Amendment No. 1, and subsequent change order with Andercorp, LLC for interim construction on the approved project.

Whereas, on December 1st, 2023, the licensee submitted its full plans and specs for the approved project for Board to review and acceptance.

Whereas, on December 14th, 2023, the licensee filed the petition explaining that the submitted full plans and specs include the required minimum non-gaming amenities contained in the licensee's current Statement of Conditions to the Riverboat Gaming License, as well as



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several potential additional non-gaming amenities. The plans and specs when limited to the non-gaming amenities contained in the licensee's current conditions shall be referred to herein as the base scope plans.

Whereas, in order to continue renovations and expedite completion of the approved project, the licensee has requested the Board grant the Chairman additional authority to approve change orders related to interim tasks and throughout the construction of the approved project, if and when presented, including without limitation, change orders related to the increased scope projects.

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the architectural blueprints and detailed plan of design and construction, presented to the Board in the form of base scope plans and when including any or all increased scope projects, submitted for the approved project as the date of this resolution be deemed submitted and



accepted.

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Be it further resolved that the Chairman is hereby authorized to accept revised plans and specifications, supplements, and any change and any related change orders for the approved project on the Board's behalf until the full construction contract is submitted to the Board for review and acceptance for which the submission deadline is March 15th, 2024.

All architectural plans and its specifications and will -- I'm sorry. All architectural plans and specifications and related change orders submitted shall comply with the licensee's Statements of Conditions to the Riverboat Gaming License, and all applicable laws and regulations, including, but not limited to, environmental, fire and safety codes.

I'm Assistant Attorney 15 General Hafiz Folami. We're here in the 16 matter of an appeal filed by the permitee 17 Ms. Gillis. 18 The Division recommended that 19 non-key gaming employee permit held by Ms. 20 Gillis be revoked due to her arrest and 21 pending charges for possession of 2.2 marijuana, possession of drug 23 paraphernalia and possession of

On July 13th, 2023, the Louisiana



methamphetamine.

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Gaming Control Board issued a notice of recommendation of revocation of the permitee's permit. 4 Based on the allegation of that on June 24th, 2023, the Calcasieu Parish 6 deputy responded to a medical emergency call to assist Ms. Gillis, who was unresponsive. 10 vehicle.

Upon arrival, the officers made contact with Ms. Gillis and they said they detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The odor of marijuana prompted the deputies to search her

The search revealed several paraphernalia, marijuana, methamphetamine and \$550 in United States currency.

When Ms. Gillis was asked about the contraband located in her vehicle, she admitted to ownership, and she was arrested.

On August 22nd, 2023, the Calcasieu Parish District Attorney's Office filed a bill of information against Ms. Gillis charging her with possession of marijuana,



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possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of methamphetamine, which is a felony and carries a term of imprisonment that is greater than one year.

During the revocation hearing, the Division was able to prove that Ms. Gillis was arrested for the offenses and that the offenses were pending at the time of the hearing.

The hearing office found Ms. Gillis to be unsuitable and in accordance that her permits be revoked. On October 25, 2023, Ms. Gillis requested an appeal.

Gaming law states that a person must prove their suitability by clear and convincing evidence. To be suitable means to have good character, integrity, honesty and not to pose a threat to the public interest of this state.

The permitee shall never engage in any criminal activities. The Board shall not grant a permit to any person who has been arrested for an offense that carries a term of imprisonment that is greater than one year. Having a permit is a



privilege and a right.

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The Division contends that the hearing office's order revoking Ms. Gillis's permit and finding that her unsuitability was correct and should be affirmed. Ms. Gillis has a duty to prove her suitability by plain and convincing evidence.

She appeared at the administrative hearing and she had the opportunity to provide evidence and testimony on her behalf, but she declined to do so. She did not refute the fact that she was arrested for these offenses or the fact that the offenses were pending at the time of the hearing.

Ms. Gillis failed to maintain suitability and was statutorily disqualified from possessing a permit due to her pending charges, her activities and her actions pursuant to the Louisiana gaming law.

At the hearing, the Division proved that the permittee had, in fact, been arrested and was under prosecution for



1	these offenses, one of which is a felony
2	and is punishable by a term of
3	imprisonment that is greater than one
4	year.
5	Based on these reasons, the Division
6	respectfully requests that this honorable
7	Board affirm the hearing officer's
8	decision to revoke Ms. Gillis's permit and
9	the finding of unsuitability.
10	Thank you.
11	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
