COMPROMISE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police (hereinafter "the Division") and Kilmartin Industries Incorporated (hereinafter "Kilmartin Industries") do hereby represent and agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board has issued a Notice of Recommendation of Suspension and Penalty to Kilmartin Industries alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law; and

WHEREAS, the issues raised by the said Notice of Recommendation of Suspension and Penalty are set for hearing on April 19, 2006, before the Louisiana Gaming Control Board Administrative Hearing Office; and

WHEREAS, the Division and Kilmartin Industries are desirous of fully and finally compromising and settling all issues and disputes arising out of and in connection with the said Notice of Recommendation of Suspension and Penalty;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto do hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

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STIPULATIONS

- 1. On June 7, 2005, the Louisiana Office of State Police issued, via U.S. mail, an Annual Affidavit form to Kilmartin Industries. Kilmartin Industries was to submit the Annual Affidavit and the annual permit fee by October 25, 2005, which represents the anniversary date of its Gaming Equipment Manufacturer Permit.
- 2. On September 7, 2005, the Division mailed an URGENT REMINDER to KILMARTIN INDUSTRIES via U.S. mail. As of November 17, 2005 the permittee had not submitted an Annual Affidavit form or the annual permit fee.
- 3. On February 3, 2006, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board issued a Notice of Recommendation of Suspension and Penalty to Kilmartin Industries alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law.
- 4. Kilmartin Industries' Annual Affidavit form and annual permit fee were received by the Division on March 24, 2006.
- 5. Kilmartin Industries does admit it violated La. R.S.27:29(I) and La. R.S. 27:29.1(E).

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Kilmartin Industries will pay a civil penalty of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) and a penalty of ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SEVENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$1,875.00) pursuant to La. R.S. 27:29.5(C).
- 2. The Division hereby agrees to accept Kilmartin Industries' payment of the above stated penalty in full and final settlement of the Notice of Recommendation of Suspension and Penalty issued on February 3, 2006.
- 3. The Division reserves the right to take into consideration these admitted violations in connection with any future investigation, violation or assessment of penalty.

4. The terms of this Compromise and Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted

under the laws of the State of Louisiana.

5. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement

between the Division and Kilmartin Industries pertaining to the subject matter contained herein

and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations and understandings of

the parties.

6. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement is subject to approval by the

Hearing Officer and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. It is expressly understood that if this

proposed settlement is approved by the Hearing Officer, this agreement is not thereby executory,

but will be submitted to the Louisiana Gaming Control Board for its determination as to whether

to approve same or to remand the matter to the Hearing Officer for a full hearing on the merits.

Failure to pay the penalty within fifteen (15) days of approval of this settlement shall result in the

immediate suspension of Kilmartin Industries' permit.

I have read this entire Compromise Settlement Agreement and agree to all stipulations and terms

and conditions hereof.
