Okay. We have a quorum. Thank you members for -- thank you ladies and gentlemen. Thank you members for being here not on our regular day. It's really worked out well as you will see on the agenda here as later on.

Members, we now move into public comments. Is there anyone in the audience today that would like to make a public comment? This is the time for you to come forward.

Okay. Seeing none, we'll now move into the approval of the minutes. I would entertain a motion to waive the reading and approve the minutes of the July 20th, 2023 meeting.

Ms. Berry has made that motion and Mr. Poole has seconded that motion. Is there any opposition to that motion?

Hearing none, that motion carries.

Okay. Members, before I get into the -- the agenda this morning, I just want to share some -- I think some very special news for our -- our state and what

we do here with the gaming industry in Louisiana.

As you know, Ms. Janet Miller is the executive director of the Louisiana Association of Compulsive Gambling. She's been in that position since 2014. And recently at a national meeting in Washington, D.C., at the National Council on Compulsive Gambling, Ms. Miller was recognized with a very, very special award. She was recognized for her work with an award called the Joanna Franklin Annual Service Award.

And doing some reading on it, I understand it's a very prestigious award, and it's an acknowledgment of her lifetime service to compulsive gambling issues here in the State of Louisiana.

I know that Ms. Miller normally watches these meetings online. I hope you're with us again today, Janet, and we want you to know that we're just so proud of you. We thank you for your professionalism, your leadership, your passion for helping those that are in need



1 of compulsive gambling services. 2 And last, a couple of weeks ago, Ms. 3 Hood and myself actually toured her two 4 facilities up in the Shreveport/Bossier 5 area, and I cannot tell you how impressed 6 we were, what an eye-opening experience to 7 the incredible work that -- that they do 8 up there. 9 So, Ms. Miller, we want you to know 10 that the State of Louisiana is very, very 11 proud of your program and the work that 12 you do and your leadership. 13 So if you have a chance to reach out 14 to Janet, please do so. 15 Okay. Members, we're going to move 16 into the revenue reports. 17 Ms. Jackson could not be with us 18 today. I think Ms. Wear, is that correct? 19 Thank you -- thank you for being here. 20 MS. WEAR: 21 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 22 board members. My name is Tranessa Wear 23 with the Louisiana State Police Gaming 24 Audit Section. 25 During July, the 14 operating



riverboats generated adjusted gross
receipts of \$146,631,626. The state
collected fees totalling \$31,525,800.

Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue
broke down by regional market. This
month's revenues represent a decrease from
June of 2.3 million or 1.5 percent and a
decrease from last July of 5.6 million or
3.7 percent. As information, this July

Next is the sum of the July 2023 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans found on page 3. Harrah's generated \$17,475,647 in gross gaming revenue.

These revenues represent a decrease from last month of approximately 2.4 million or 12 percent and a decrease of 5 million or 22.8 percent from the same month last year.

had one last Friday than July of 2022.

During July the state received \$5,505,465 in minimum daily payments.

Next I will present the revenues for slots at the racetracks. During July the four racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted gross receipts of



1 \$27,560,068 and a slight increase of 1.3 2 percent from June but a decrease of 1.8 3 million or 6 percent when compared to last 4 July. During July the state collected 5 approximately 4.2 million in fees. 6 I will now move to video gaming 7 information. There are currently 11,919 8 video game devices activated at 1,394 9 locations. Net device revenue for July 10 2023 was \$61,512,557, a decrease of 327,515 or 0.5 percent when compared to 11 12 June of 2023 and a decrease of 5.2 million 13 or 7.8 percent when compared to last July. 14 Total franchise fees for July 2023 15 total 18.6 million. As of July 31st, 16 2023, the state has collected 18.6 million 17 in franchise fees for fiscal year 2023. 18 Next I represent the sportsbook 19 revenue. During July the 18 retail 20 sportsbooks accepted 12.2 million in 21 sports wagers resulting in net proceeds of 22 approximately 1.9 million and 174,000 in 23 state taxes. 24

The eight mobile sportsbooks operators accepted 122.5 million in sports



1 wagers resulting in net proceeds of 15.7 2 million and approximately 2 million in 3 taxes paid to the state. 4 Finally, for daily fantasy sports 5 gross revenues for July were 512,000 with 6 net revenue of approximately 53,000 and 7 taxes of \$4,222. 8 Are there any questions? 9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 10 Okay. Members, any questions for 11 Ms. Wear? Any questions? Okay. 12 Ms. Wear, I see no questions. Thank 13 you for your great work and we appreciate 14 you being here with us today. 15 Okay. Members, we now move into 16 compliance reports. This will be for the 17 second quarter of 2023. 18 Good morning. 19 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JEREMY GATHE: 20 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 21 board members. I'm Assistant Attorney 22 General Jeremy Gathe. Today, I'll present 23 the staff reports on riverboat and 24 racetrack casino licensees compliance with 25 employment and procurement conditions for



the second quarter of 2023.

I'll begin with the riverboats. The second quarter reports are taken from figures reported by the 15 operating riverboats of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. In the second quarter of 2023, approximately 8,934 people were employed by the riverboat industry. Of that number 8,756 were Louisiana residents, 5,253 were minorities, and 4,811 were women.

One licensee achieved total compliance this quarter, and that licensee is Margaritaville Resort Casino.

Next I'll address employment. 12
licensees did not meet their total
employment goals and they are Diamond
Jacks Casino & Resort, which achieved 11
out of a goal of 650; Sam's Town Hotel &
Casino, which achieved 382 out of a goal
of 700; L'Auberge Baton Rouge, which
achieved 794 out of a goal of 800;
Horseshoe Bossier City, which achieved 558
out of a goal of 1,000; Boomtown New
Orleans, which achieved 458 out of a goal
of 555; Belle of Baton Rouge Casino, which

achieved 147 out of a goal of 450;
Treasurer Chest Casino, which achieved 333
out of a goal of 500; Hollywood Casino
which achieved 281 out of a goal of 450;
Amelia Belle Casino, which achieved 169
out of a goal of 325; Horseshoe Lake
Charles, which achieved 547 out of a goal
of 650; Boomtown Casino Bossier which
achieved 286 out of a goal of 650; and
Bally's Shreveport, which achieved 635 out
of a goal of 950.

All licensees either met or exceeded their goals in all of the subcategories under the main category of employment with the exception of Treasurer Chest Casino and L'Auberge Lake Charles Casino under the subcategory of female employment.

Under this category Treasurer Chest Casino achieved 44.1 percent out of a goal of 51.86 percent, and L'Auberge Lake Charles achieved 50.5 percent out of a goal of 51.86 percent.

Next I'll address procurement. The licensees are grouped according to three subcategories, which appear on your



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report. And those subcategories are:
Louisiana, minority and female
procurement. Also, the voluntary
conditions under these subcategories now
reflect the amended voluntary procurement
goals, which were approved by the board at
its December 15th, 2022 board meeting.

Under Louisiana procurement, all licensees either met or exceeded their goals. Under the subcategory of minority procurement, three licensees did not achieve compliance with their voluntary conditions, and those licensees are Diamond Jacks Casino which achieved 2.6 percent out of a goal of 10 percent; Golden Nugget Lake Charles which achieved 10.2 percent out of a goal of 11 percent; and Boomtown New Orleans which achieved 11.9 percent out of a goal of 13 percent.

For female procurement one licensee did not achieve compliance with its voluntary conditions, and that licensee is Golden Nugget Lake Charles which achieved 12.7 percent out of a goal of 15 percent.

I'm Mora Read with 6 American Vessel Services, and I'm here to 7 report the annual certification for the CV 8 Belle of Orleans at the Amelia Belle Casino in Amelia, Louisiana. 10 The inspector Pete Bullard did on May 24th of 2023 attend the riverboat 11 12 Belle of Orleans to conduct the annual 13 inspection in accordance with the Louisiana alternative inspection program. 14 15 The inspector reviewed fire 16 protection measures, egress routes, 17 observed emergency lighting, tested the 18 emergency generator and inspected the 19 mooring system and conducted a fire drill 20 as well as other required life safety 21 items. 2.2 This annual report was provided to 23 the board on May 26th 2023. 2.4 deficiencies were noted on page 6 of your 2.5



report.

A follow-up inspection was done on June 29th and all but two deficiencies were satisfied. This supplemental report dated July 7th of 2023 was provided to the board, and the deficiencies were noted on page 2 of that report.

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The property then requested an extension to allow more time to satisfy the deficiencies. This extension was accepted by the board at the July 20th, meeting. The property has since resolved the deficiencies, and a second supplemental survey report was issued on August 10th of 2023 confirming all deficiencies are completely satisfied.

The 2023 annual survey as required by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now complete and a CV Belle of Orleans is considered fit to continue its intended service as a dockside gaming riverboat in the State of Louisiana.

It is the recommendation of American Vessel Services to issue the Amelia Belle Casino a certificate of compliance for the Belle of Orleans.

Is there any opposition to the 1 2 motion? 3 Hearing none, that motion carries. 4 So, thank you very much for your work and thanks for being with us today. 5 6 All right. Members, we now move 7 into the consideration of petition to 8 commence gaming operations for Louisiana 9 Casino Cruises doing business as the Queen 10 of Baton Rouge. 11 MS. LANDRY: 12 Good morning, Chairman Johns and 13 board members. I'm Assistant Attorney 14 General Lisha Landry here today to present 15 Louisiana Casino Cruises, LLC's request to 16 commence gaming operations at its land 17 side riverboat gaming facility. 18 The licensee is owned by The Queen 19 Casino & Entertainment, Inc., formally 20 known as CQ Holding Company, Inc., and the 21 licensee's real property assets are owned 2.2 by Gaming and Leisure Properties, Inc. 23 The licensed riverboat is located in 24 East Baton Rouge Parish along the 2.5 Mississippi River. The board previously



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approved the licensee's request to construct and relocate its gaming operations to a land side facility within 1200 feet of its licensed berth.

As a reminder, the board also approved new non-gaming amenities for the approved project listed in the licensee's statement of conditions which include: A sports bar restaurant and entertainment center with a minimum of 250 seats, a restaurant with bar with a minimum of 90 seats, a sports wagering lounge and viewing area with a minimum of 115 person total capacity and a minimum of 46 seats, a conference area with a pre-function and banquet area with a seating of at least 200 and two meeting rooms.


The licensee is requesting board approval to open and commence gaming operations at its newly-constructed land side facility for a soft opening currently scheduled for tomorrow, August 22nd, 2023, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., and a grand opening currently scheduled for Thursday, August 24th, 2023, at 9:00 p.m. These



requests are up for board consideration today.

Before the licensee can commence gaming operations at its land side facility, the board must determine that the land side facility and approved project, including all non-gaming amenities, are substantially complete. The board must issue the licensee a riverboat gaming land side facility certificate of compliance to operate, and the board must grant the licensee approval to commence gaming operations.

The board may alternatively grant the chairman the authority to determine and issue those approvals on the boards behalf. In order for the board to determine substantial completion, the board must receive an inspection report from the Office of State Fire Marshal, a certificate of substantial completion and readiness for occupancy and use from the approved project's architect, a certificate of occupancy and written confirmation from the Louisiana State



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Police Gaming Enforcement Division of substantial completion.

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The board has received all of these requirements except for written confirmation of substantial completion from the division. It has also received all state and local permits required for the licensee's facility opening.

As it relates to the riverboat gaming land side facility certificate of compliance, Act 126 from the 2023 regular session requires land side facilities to be inspected prior to commencing of gaming operations annually and as requested by the board.

The Office of State Fire Marshal is authorized to inspect riverboat land side facilities seeking a license or certificate of compliance from the board. A board issued certificate of compliance is needed to allow a licensee to commence gaming operations at its land side facility.

On August 17th, 2023, the Office of State Fire Marshal issued its inspection



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report for the licensee's land side facility. The inspection report indicated that the facility is in compliance with all codes and requirements and that the land side facility can be issued a certificate of compliance to commence gaming operations by the board.

Therefore, the board is within its authority to issue the licensee a riverboat land side facility certificate of compliance with an expiration date of August 31st, 2024.

As it relates to the commencement of gaming operations, under the administrative rules, a licensee cannot commence gaming operations at a land side facility until the division determines that all necessary staffing, training, security and surveillance, technical accounting and internal controls are acceptable.

The division determines and confirms substantial completion through a successful completion of a preoperative inspection of the land side facility. The



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
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licensee has ceased gaming operations on its vessel and has transported all gaming devices to the new land side facility.

As of today, the division has successfully completed portions of its preoperative inspection of the licensee's riverboat gaming land side facility, including approval of all internal controls, table play, credit/markers, casino bank, rotation of dealers/pit/floor personnel, security and surveillance systems, related plans and staffing and testing and verification of some of the gaming devices.

However, the division has not completed the preoperative inspection of all the gaming devices that the licensee intends to operate at the facility.

The division has certified the software and all gaming devices and verified that the games comply with the requirements of gaming laws and regulations but has not completed communication testing on all devices to confirm that they will adequately and



accurately report all activity at the device to the licensee's slot machine monitoring system.

The division only allows licensees to place those games with confirmed communications to the slot machine monitoring system up for patron play. Therefore, the division's preoperative inspection as it relates to the gaming devices is ongoing.

As the division continues to test and approve games, more gaming devices will be available for patron use and play at the soft opening. The continued testing and approval should not prohibit the opening of the landside facility for a soft opening on August 22nd, but please note that only those games that have been approved and verified by the division will be permitted for patron use and play at the soft opening.

In its petition the licensee requested the board to grant the chairman the authority to issue any approvals necessary for the licensee to conduct the



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soft opening currently scheduled for tomorrow, August 22nd, from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m., and the grand opening currently scheduled for Thursday, August 24th at 9:00 p.m.

Given that the division has not completed it's preoperative inspection and the soft opening is scheduled to occur tomorrow at 4:00 p.m., the board may authorize the chairman to determine substantial completion and approval to commence gaming operations at the soft opening tomorrow and the recommencement of gaming operations for the grand opening on Thursday, all subject to further inspection and approval of the division.

The division will send written notification of the number of machines allowed to operate for the soft opening. Whether the division considers the licensee for the riverboat gaming land side facility substantially complete for the soft opening and whether any issues or deficiencies occur during or after the soft opening.



Following the soft opening, an audit and reconciliation of the play, the division will send the chairman another letter informing him of its findings and anything that would delay or prevent the recommencing of gaming operations at the land side facility for the grand opening scheduled for Thursday, August 24th at 9:00 p.m.

Based on the current status, a resolution has been prepared for the board's consideration granting the licensee's land side facility a certificate of compliance and granting the chairman the authority to act on behalf of the board for any other necessary approvals.

The statement of conditions, indemnity agreement and related documents have been updated to reflect the mere change in the name of the licensee's parent company and the change in the licensee's DBA from Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge to The Queen Baton Rouge, which was previously approved by the board back in

Good morning, gentlemen. morning, Chairman Johns and members. I just -- before Matt walks through the presentation, I just want to take a quick moment to tell you how proud and excited we are to be bringing The Queen on land side in Baton Rouge. It's been through just a tremendous effort by all of the team members, the old ones, all of the new ones. It's -- it starts early in the morning and it's been going late into the early morning hours to get it ready. with all of that being said, none of this would have been possible without the support of the Baton Rouge community, the Louisiana State Police, the attorney



1 general's office and the Louisiana Gaming 2 Control Board; and we have really 3 appreciated your leadership in this whole 4 thing, so thank you very much. 5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 6 Thank you. Thank you. 7 Mr. Shehadi, good morning. 8 MR. SHEHADI: 9 Good morning, Chairman Johns. Good 10 morning board members. My name is Matthew 11 Shehadi. I'm the general manager at The 12 Queen Baton Rouge. 13 Kind of the same thing as what Terry 14 said, I have been working hand in hand 15 with the attorney general on a daily, 16 weekly basis, as well as LSP audit and 17 enforcement and nothing but positive and 18 great things to say about the process. So 19 far, it's been open, the communication has 20 been there, and I just want to send a big 21 thanks to everyone involved in this 22 operation. So thank you again. 23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 24 All right. 25 MR. SHEHADI:



So we kind of start with the presentation here. I'm really excited about what The Queen's going to bring to downtown Baton Rouge and the community. I just want to hit some of the major highlights.

We are going to be at over 100,000 square feet of gaming, dining, entertainment for downtown Baton Rouge. Six thousand square feet meeting space. You really just have got to come see it. It's hard to even put pictures to it. The views of the Mississippi River are just stunning out of the floor-to-ceiling glass windows and in most of the space up there.

Out of the 100,000 plus square feet, 30,000 square feet of that is gaming -- gaming space with a gaming patio, which is the Lit casino. It's -- it's just high design. You can't even really tell. It's designed as we -- we designed that as a -- another casino, so it's like Lit casino and bar. We designed it as a separate -- as almost like as a separate entity in the property.



So about 100 games in there, full bar. You're going to have table games in there as well. So we're going to have 18 total table games throughout the property, 12 in nonsmoking and then six in the smoking pit. Roughly 730 games currently on the floor.

A big influx of capital went into roughly over 200 new products, latest and greatest products in the industry are on the floor currently. We have four dining designations, 1717 full service restaurant. It has a loft as well overlooking the Mississippi River. Two, 32-foot projector TVs that you can view anywhere in the establishment. It's -- it's very, very -- I've never seen a projector so clean in my life, so it's beautiful.

Over 40 TVs, so it's a place to come watch a game. We definitely -- we have a stage, entertainment area in there that we're going to be able to program live entertainment with a state of the art technology TV behind the stage as well.



We'll be able to do Super Bowl parties, March Madness, LSU national championship games, stuff of that nature.

We also have three -- three quick service restaurants, Shaq's Big Chicken, that's his first foray into the Baton Rouge area with his brand. They're growing quickly and expanding. It seems like they're opening a new place around the United States on a weekly basis. They're really -- really growing quickly. Three Woks Noodle Bar and then Capitol Coffee will both be on the casino floor.

State of the art DraftKing

Sportsbook. We have 20 betting kiosks all around -- all around that sportsbook.

28-foot TV wall, which is all of the brand-new tech out there, so it's clean.

You can see -- you can see the sportsbook throughout the property, which kind of glance at the energy that we're anticipating on the -- the casino floor.

But one of the big things when I came to this property was the security and making people feel safe when they come out



1 to the Hollywood, now The Queen. We redid 2 -- the parking lot is completely redone, so new stripes, wider spaces. A lot of 3 4 complaints on people getting their cars 5 beat up so we widened the spaces. 6 Upgraded lights throughout the property so 7 it's bright. It's almost like you're 8 pulling up to a stadium. We've added 9 plenty of security, roving bike teams. 10 So we just want people to come, have a great time, be safe and really enjoy 11 12 themselves when they come downtown. 13 So we'll kind of get into what the 14 property looked like pre-construction. that was the old Hollywood and as we start 15 16 to kind of thumb through this presentation 17 you kind of see the progress of how 18 massive of an increase this was for the 19 footprint of The Queen.

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This is Capitol Coffee. This is located directly on the gaming floor so you can be able to get smoothies, sandwiches, coffee, extended hours so, you know, if you're there late or early you'll be able to divulge into anything coffee



related.

This is the entryway to the left, the Big Chicken. And then the main dining area to the right, quick serve, order at the counter, pick your food up. It's been — we've been testing it the last couple of days. It's good stuff, so I look forward to seeing you guys come out and definitely try it.

This is Lit. This is the entryway to Lit. So you're going -- you go in there and you make a left and then there's doors that kind of separate the smoking from the nonsmoking. We've -- we've tested smoke machines, basically inundated that room with smoke and the air handlers and the increase of technology in that room to remove the smoke is, I mean, 45 seconds that room was clear. So it's definitely going to be a great experience. You're not going to smell like an ashtray when you leave there.

This is the view looking at the -- at the front door with the design of the table games pit. So when you walk in,



you'll have 12 table games right when you walk in. So we have craps, roulette, pai gaw, black jack and some carnival games, Cajun stuff.

This quick little view of the DraftKings sign. So I'm just real excited to be able to offer sportsbook experience and the amount of amenities that we're going to provide at The Queen of Baton Rouge compared to the boat is just going to be fantastic for the community.

This is the entrance to our 1717 restaurant that I mentioned, full-service restaurant, rustic American. You can kind of get a little bit of everything. If you want a steak, if you want some fish, Philly cheese steak, nachos, whatever you've got a hankering for, 1717 is -- definitely has an eclectic menu to kind of all areas. And then the loft is just -- the views, sunset views across the river are stunning.

This is the interior space. I had mentioned those 32-foot projectors, that's them at the top left. And then that's the



loft upstairs for an elevated dining experience as well.

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
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Event space that we mentioned earlier, able to do a multitude of different events in the events space with utilizing the pre-function space as well, so it's definitely going to be a -- I think a very, very positive addition to the downtown area, especially when the legislation is in town to be able to throw some pretty outstanding parties and events with us at The Queen.

A quick little look at what we can do in that space. Those are the floor-to-ceiling windows I had mentioned. And there is the daylight exterior view of -- of -- if you -- just the increase of square footage that the property added. And then here is a quick little look at what the front entrance with the main port cochere entry. There is -- you can't really see on the top left corner, there's a couple of lights above the port cochere that we can control colors for Christmastime, LSU, Southern games.

between now and next week, I mean this
coming Thursday, you've got a lot of work
left to do, but thank all of y'all for



that.

To the attorney general's office, Chris, and all your staff, y'all have done a phenomenal job on getting this ready for an opening.

So, gentlemen, we thank you for your commitment. I know you've got another commitment coming right down the street over at The Belle.

And while you're at the table, could I just ask you a quick question on that? I know it's not on the agenda, but I just want to ask you, is that proceeding as anticipated.

Whereas on August 20th, 2020, the board previously approved the licensee's request to relocate its gaming operations to a newly-constructed land-side facility to be included as a part of the approved project.



1 Whereas the Louisiana State Police 2 Gaming Enforcement Division preoperative 3 inspection of the land-side facility and 4 approved project is ongoing, and whereas 5 the board is in receipt of the certificate of substantial completion, the readiness 6 7 for occupancy and use submitted by the 8 architect for the approval project, the certificate of occupancy and the 10 inspection report issued by Louisiana 11 Office of State Fire Marshal and all other 12 required state and local permits for the 13 licensee's land-side facility. 14 Now therefore, be it resolved that 15 the licensee be issued a riverboat gaming 16 land-side certificate of compliance with 17

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an expiration date of August 31st, 2024.

Be it further resolved that the chairman is hereby authorized to determine substantial completion of the approved project in accordance with the licensee's statement of the conditions to the riverboat gaming license on behalf of the board.
