VISION:

To ensure to the citizens of Louisiana that gaming is strictly and impartially regulated as provided by the laws of this state.

MISSION:

To regulate all gaming activities under its jurisdiction in a manner which instills public confidence and trust that gaming activities are conducted honestly and free from criminal and corruptive elements and to ensure the integrity of individual gaming activities by the regulation of persons, practices, associations, and activities within the gaming industry.

PHILOSOPHY:

To effectively achieve our mission by providing professional and knowledgeable service while maintaining impartial but strict regulation of gaming activities.

GOAL:

I. To strictly regulate all gaming activities under the jurisdiction of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board by ensuring the initial and continuing suitability of all licensees and permittees and eliminating to the extent possible known criminal and corrupt influences on the gaming industry in accordance with the provisions of the Louisiana Gaming Control Law. See La. R.S. 27:2, 27:15, 27:15.1, 27:28, 27:42, 27:70, 27:202, 27:234, 27:235, 27:304, 27:306(A), 27:310, 27:352, 27:363, 27:364, 27:601, 27:603, 27:604, and 27:605

OBJECTIVE: I.1.

To ensure that 100% of the known disqualified and unsuitable persons identified by the Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division and/or La. Attorney General's Office, Gaming Division are denied a license or permit, in order to eliminate criminal and known corrupt influences on the gaming industry each year through the end of FY 2030-2031.

STRATEGY:

- I.1.1. To coordinate with law enforcement agencies to identify corrupt influences within the gaming industry operating in Louisiana.
- I.1.2. To benchmark methods used by other gaming jurisdictions to identify and eliminate corrupt influences and unsuitable persons in their gaming industries.
- I.1.3. To administer the appropriate state agencies in the conduct of investigations of all persons required by law to meet suitability.
- I.1.4. To require the compliance of the gaming industry with all statutory requirements for gaming.

LOUISIANA GAMING CONTROL BOARD STRATEGIC PLAN – APPENDIX FY 2026-2027 THROUGH 2030-2031

1. The Louisiana Gaming Control Board serves the citizens of the State of Louisiana through the regulation of the gaming industry as mandated by the legislature.

2. INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL VARIABLES

INTERNAL FACTORS:

The Louisiana Gaming Control Board consists of nine members and two ex officio members. The Chairman is the only full-time member and serves as the Board's CEO. The Board currently has three staff positions, one confidential assistant, one principal assistant, one administrative coordinator. The Board also has a docket clerk who is an employee of the Attorney General's Office.

The Attorney General is statutorily authorized to serve as legal advisor and legal representative to the Board and to provide investigative services to the Board. The Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police, has the responsibility for investigation violations of and enforcing gaming law, rules and regulations, and may issue certain gaming licenses and permits in accordance with gaming law.

There is one individual serving as a hearing officer whose duty is to conduct administrative hearings and render decisions. The Hearing Officer's support staff consists of employees of the Attorney General's Office.

In addition to the internal factors affecting the Board's operation, there are several external factors which affect the Board's functions.

EXTERNAL FACTORS:

Measuring outcomes is difficult in any context, but particularly so in gaming regulation. We must be guided principally by the legislative mandate to strictly regulate gaming. "Success" is attained when gaming is strictly, impartially and fairly regulated. It is not reducible to simple numerical counts of license or permit issuances, denials, revocations or suspensions. "Success" is obtained when crime, wrongdoing or unsuitable conduct is deterred through effective regulation; yet quantitative measurement of the benefits of this deterrence remains a complex challenge.

In addition, it is extremely difficult to isolate the particular effects of regulatory activity from other factors that affect outcomes and over which the Board has little control.

A. Social-Structural factors.

The opportunity for adolescents and young adults has increased due to the increase of licensed gaming facilities and mobile sports wagering in Louisiana. Absent successful intervention, commensurate growth in underage gaming can be expected due to increased opportunities. Additionally, the Board is compelled by statute to provide for the enforcement of compulsive gaming regulations and programs.

B. Emergencies and other unpredictable events.

History suggests that the temporary closure of a licensed riverboat due to hurricanes, flood conditions, a particularly sensitive and complex case, or some other crisis that strains our time, attention and resources may occur.

C. Changing statutory responsibilities.

The Board's mission, goals, priorities and workload are affected directly by laws enacted by the legislature; for example, the enactment of legislation requiring the establishment and quarterly update of a central registry of all licensed gaming operators and the enactment of new forms of gaming in Louisiana.

D. Rule promulgation process.

Changes in rules are necessary due to outside influences and changes in gaming law. The Board remains adaptable and flexible to the changing needs of the State.

E. Changing technology.

Advancing technology affects the Board's ability to keep pace with the regulation of the gaming industry. Not only is the technology more complex, but there are changes in the way it is being applied. Technology holds great promise for strengthening the capabilities of gaming regulation and criminal investigations. At the same time however, technology is increasing the ability of potential criminals to evade detection and providing new opportunities for criminal behavior. The Board's goal in decreasing criminal behavior and corrupt influences is dependent in large measure upon the ability of its support agencies to wisely use technology.

F. The effectiveness and capacity of our state partners.

Maintaining proactive regulatory policies requires the coordinated efforts of all levels of government. For the continued success of the Board, the support of the agencies which provide regulatory, investigative, enforcement and legal services is needed.

G. Developments in gaming industry.

There have been many recent developments in the gaming industry stemming from past legislative changes and capital reinvestments affecting the work of the Board.

Act 469 of the 2018 Regular Legislative Session amended the definition of a riverboat to include a facility within 1,200 feet of a riverboat's licensed berth and set forth application requirements for a licensee's relocation from a vessel to a landside facility. Act 469 also required a licensee to submit a relocation plan and a detailed capital improvement and reinvestment plan in order to be approved to construct and relocate to a riverboat gaming landside facility. Since Act 469 became effective, the Board has approved the opening of four (4) riverboat gaming landside facilities in Louisiana. As of February of 2025, all fifteen (15) riverboat gaming licensees, including Louisiana Riverboat Gaming Company, LLC, are currently operational.

The official gaming establishment in New Orleans completed its capital reinvestment plan and rebranding of its establishment from Harrah's New Orleans to Caesars New Orleans in October of 2024.

Act 141 of the 2020 Regular Session provided the regulatory structure and laws for the operation of fantasy sports contests in Louisiana. Fantasy Sports went live on July 15, 2021, in the forty-seven (47) parishes where fantasy sports contests had been approved in the local option election of November 6, 2018. The State of Louisiana levies a tax of 8% upon the net revenues of fantasy sports contests offered to the consumers within the state. The Board has adopted administrative rules and has regulatory authority over fantasy sports contests in Louisiana.

Acts 440, 435, and 80 of the 2021 Regular Session provided the regulatory framework for the operation of retail and mobile sports wagering in Louisiana in the fifty-five (55) Louisiana parishes that voted to authorize sports wagering in the local option election of November 3, 2020. Retail sports wagering went live in October of 2021 and mobile sports wagering went live in February of 2022. The State of Louisiana levies a 10% tax upon the net gaming proceeds from sports wagering conducted onsite at a licensed sports wagering establishment. Any sports wagering conducted through mobile application or a website is taxed at a 15% tax rate. The Board has adopted administrative rules and have regulatory authority over sports wagering in Louisiana.

Act 286 of the 2023 regular session established a Uniform Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Training program. The Board, Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division, the Louisiana Attorney General's Office, Gaming Division, and the Louisiana Governor's Office of Human Trafficking Prevention worked in conjunction to create a mandatory training program for Louisiana Gaming Control Board licensees and permittees. This training includes information on how to identify and report human trafficking that may occur in gaming

establishments in Louisiana. Completion of this training will be a mandatory licensing requirement for the official gaming establishment, riverboat casinos, slots at the track facilities, and video draw poker establishments.

Additionally, the Board has created a new website which affords gaming licensees, permittees, applicants, and the general public the ability to locate gaming information and file complaints with ease.

- 3. Statutory Requirements: The statutory requirement for the Louisiana Gaming Control Board is Louisiana Gaming Control Law, or La. R.S. 27:1 et seq. The Board exercises regulatory authority, control, and jurisdiction over all aspects of gaming activities and operations as authorized by and pursuant to the provisions of the Louisiana Gaming Control Law which includes the Louisiana Riverboat Economic Development and Gaming Control Act (La. R.S. 27:41 et seq.), the Louisiana Economic Development and Gaming Corporation Act (La. R.S. 27:201 et seq.), the Video Draw Poker Devices Control Law (La. R.S. 27:401 et seq.), the Louisiana Pari-mutuel Live Racing Facility Economic Redevelopment and Gaming Control Act (La. R.S. 27:351 et seq.), the Louisiana Fantasy Sports Contests Act (La. R.S. 27:301 et seq.), and the Louisiana Sports Wagering Act (La. R.S. 27:601 et seq.).
- 4. Development of Objectives and Strategies: Objectives and strategies were developed primarily by internal/external assessments, mandatory process priorities, master plans and legislative review and input of proposed plan.
- 5. The primary persons who will benefit from the plan are the gaming industry that the Board regulates, the Office of State Police's Gaming Enforcement Division, and the citizens of the State of Louisiana
- 6. Duplication of Effort: No true duplication of effort has been identified within the Louisiana Gaming Control Board program.
