#### COMPROMISE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

The State of Louisiana, Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State

Police (hereinafter the "Division") and Barbara Enterprises, Inc., Permit No.

P082602574 (hereinafter the "Permittee") do hereby represent and agree as follows:

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board has issued a Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action to the Permittee, which notice alleges certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law; and

WHEREAS, the issues raised by the said Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action are set for hearing before the Louisiana Gaming Control Board Administrative Hearing Office; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto are desirous of fully and finally compromising and settling all disputes and issues raised in connection with the said Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the parties hereto do hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

#### **STIPULATIONS**

- 1. Mr. Tara O'Meallie, Jr. is the President/Secretary of Barbara Enterprises, Inc. Barbara Enterprises is the holder of Non-Gaming Supplier Permit #P082602574.
- 2. On April 27, 2006, Mr. O'Meallie was arrested by warrant by the St. Bernard Sheriff's Office. Mr. O'Meallie was charged with Contractor-Misapplication of Payment.
- 3. On February 12, 2007, the Division received an Annual Permit Update Form from Barbara Enterprises, Inc. During the investigation, the Division discovered Mr. O'Meallie had been arrested. Mr. O'Meallie failed to notify the Division within fifteen (15) days of his arrest in violation of gaming law.
- 4. On December 2, 2008, the charges were dismissed against Mr. O'Meallie.
- 5. On February 6, 2009, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board issued a Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action alleging certain violations of Louisiana Gaming Control Law.
- 6. The Permittee acknowledges that it was in violation of gaming law in that it failed to timely disclose an arrest.

## **TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- 1. The Permittee agrees to pay a civil penalty of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00).
- The Division hereby agrees to accept the payment of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) in full and final settlement of the Notice of Recommendation of Administrative Action.

- 3. The Division reserves the right to take into consideration these admitted stipulations and violations in connection with any future investigation, violation or assessment of penalty, and in connection with any future determination of the suitability of the Permittee.
- 4. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Division and the Permittee pertaining to the subject matter contained herein and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations and understandings of the parties.
- 5. This Compromise and Settlement Agreement is subject to approval by the Hearing Officer and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. It is expressly understood that if this proposed settlement is approved by the Hearing Officer, this agreement is not thereby executory, but will be submitted to the Louisiana Gaming Control Board for its determination as to whether to approve same or to remand the matter to the Hearing Officer for a full hearing on the merits.
- 6. If approved, the Permittee must make full payment of the civil penalty and delinquency fee to the Division within ten (10) days of approval by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board. Failure to do so shall result in the immediate suspension of the license without the necessity of any further administrative action until such time as the penalty is paid in full.

7. The terms of this Compromise and Settlement Agreement shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of Louisiana.

I have read this entire Compromise Settlement Agreement, understand it, and agree to all Stipulations, Terms and Conditions hereof.
