- 22 CHAIRMAN JONES: Good morning.
- 23 MS JACKSON: Good morning, Chairman
- 24 Jones, Board Members. My name is Donna
- 25 Jackson with Louisiana State Police

1 Gaming Enforcement Division.

2	The riverboat revenue report for
3	July 2015 is shown on page one of your
4	handout. During July, the 15 operating
5	riverboats generated Adjusted Gross
6	Receipts of \$179,959,451, which is a new
7	monthly high for riverboats. This total
8	represents an increase of \$21 million or
9	13.3 percent from last month, and an
10	increase of \$28 million or 18.7 percent
11	from July 2014, when there were only 14
12	riverboats in operation. July revenues
13	are historically higher than June, and
14	this July had one additional Friday
15	gaming day than last month and
16	July 2014. During July, the first month
17	of the fiscal year, the state collected
18	fees totaling \$38,691,282.
19	Next is a summary of the July 2015
20	gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans
21	found on page three. During July, the
22	first month of fiscal year 2015-2016,
23	Harrah's generated \$35,964,794 in gross
24	gaming revenue, up \$15.2 million or 73.5
25	percent from last month, and up
	10
1	\$7.4 million or 26 percent from
2	July 2014. We did want to note that
3	there was a single day in July 2015 with
4	an unusually high win total. Without

5	that day, revenues would still be up
6	15.6 percent from June, but they would
7	be down 16 percent from July 2014.
8	We're providing this additional
9	information just as we did last month to
10	account for the unusually large win on a
11	single day in June 2014. Regardless of
12	the impact of the single day, the July
13	revenue number is the largest revenue
14	month for Harrah's since May 2008.
15	During July, the state received
16	\$5,081,967 in minimum daily payments.
17	Slots at the Racetracks revenues are
18	shown on page four. During July, the
19	four racetrack facilities combined
20	generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
21	\$32,368,138, an increase of almost \$3.8
22	million or 13 percent from last month,
23	but a decrease of 1.7 percent from
24	July 2014. During July, the state
25	collected fees totaling \$4,910,247.
	11
1	Overall, riverboats, land-based and
2	Slots at the Racetracks combined
3	generated \$248 million in AGR and \$48.7
4	million in state fees.
5	Are there any questions before I
6	present the Harrah's employee
7	information?

8	CHAIRMAN JONES: Board Members, any
9	questions? [No response.]
10	MS. JACKSON: Harrah's New Orleans
11	is required to maintain at least 2,400
12	employees and bi-weekly payroll of
13	\$1,750,835. This report covers the
14	three pay periods in July 2015. For the
15	first pay period, the Division verified
16	2,464 employees with a payroll of
17	\$1,851,000. For the second pay period,
18	the Division verified 2,451 employees
19	with a payroll of \$1,881,000. For the
20	third pay period, the Division verified
21	2,475 employees with a payroll of
22	\$1,860,000. Therefore, Harrah's met the
23	employment criteria during July.
24	CHAIRMAN JONES: Questions, Board?
25	There are none.
	12
1	MS. JACKSON: Thank you.
2	CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you. Video
3	poker.
4	MR. BOSSIER: Good morning. Good
5	morning, Chairman Jones and Board
6	Members. My name is Jim Bossier with
7	the Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit
8	Section. I'm reporting video gaming
9	statistics for July 2015 as shown on
10	page one of your handout.

11	Twenty-one new video gaming licenses
12	were issued during July: Nine bars,
13	four restaurants, four truckstops and
14	four device owners'. Eight new
15	applications were received by the Gaming
16	Enforcement Division during July and are
17	currently pending the field: Six
18	truckstops and two device owners'.
19	The Gaming Enforcement Division
20	assessed and collected \$1,000 in
21	penalties in July, and there are
22	currently \$1,100 in outstanding fines.
23	Please refer to page two of your
24	handout.
25	There are presently 14,502 video
	13
1	gaming devices activated at 1,885
2	locations.
3	Net device revenue for July 2015 was
4	\$48.6 million. This is a \$1.9 million
5	or 4 percent increase when compared to
6	June 2015, and a \$900,000 increase, or
7	1.8 percent, when compared to July 2014.
8	Net device revenue so far for fiscal
9	year 2016 is \$48.6 million, a \$900,000
10	increase, or 1.8 percent, when compared
11	to fiscal year 2015. Page three of your
12	handout shows a comparison of net device

14	Total franchise fees collected for
15	June 2015 were \$14.5 million, a \$500,000
16	increase when compared to June 2015, and
17	a \$200,000 increase when compared to
18	July 2014. Total franchise fees
19	collected for fiscal year 2016 are \$14.5
20	million, a \$200,000 increase or
21	1.8 percent when compared to fiscal year
22	2015. Page four of your handout shows a
23	comparison of franchise fees.
24	Does anybody have any questions?
25	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions,
	14
1	Board Members? There are no questions.
2	MR. BOSSIER: Thank you.
3	CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you, Jim.
4	V. COMPLIANCE REPORTS
5	CHAIRMAN JONES: We'll now ask Mesa
6	Brown, Assistant Attorney General, to
7	come talk us about the compliance
8	reports. Good morning, Mesa.
9	MS. BROWN: Good morning. Good
10	morning, Chairman Jones, Board Members.
11	I'm Mesa Brown Assistant Attorney
12	General. Today I'll present the staff
13	reports on riverboat and racetrack
14	casino licensees' compliance with
15	employment and procurement conditions
16	for the second quarter of 2015.

17	I'll begin with riverboats. The
18	second quarter reports are taken from
19	the figures reported by the 15 operating
20	riverboats to the Louisiana Gaming
21	Control Board. In the second quarter of
22	2015, approximately 15,343 people were
23	employed by the riverboat industry. Of
24	that number, 14,963 were Louisiana
25	residents, 9,579 were minorities, and
	15
1	8,699 were women.
2	Five licensees achieved total
3	compliance this quarter, and they are:
4	Golden Nugget, L'Auberge Casino & Hotel
5	Baton Rouge, Belle of Baton Rouge
6	Casino, Isle of Capri Casino St.
7	Charles, and L'Auberge Casino & Hotel
8	Lake Charles.
9	Next I'll address employment. Four
10	licensees did not meet their total
11	employment goals. They are:
12	DiamondJacks Casino & Resort, who
13	achieved 532 out of a goal of 650;
14	Hollywood achieved 440 out of 450;
15	Boomtown Casino Bossier achieved 598 out
16	of 650, and Eldorado Resort Shreveport
17	achieved 1,170 out of 1,200.
18	All licensees with the exception of
19	Treasure Chest Casino either met or

20	exceeded their goals in all of the
21	subcategories under the main category of
22	employment. Treasure Chest did not meet
23	its female employment goal. It achieved
24	49.6 out of a goal of 51.86.
25	Next I'll address procurement. The
	16
1	licensees are grouped according to three
2	subcategories which appear in your
3	report. They are Louisiana, minority
4	and female procurement. Under Louisiana
5	procurement, one licensee did not
6	achieve compliance with its voluntary
7	conditions. It is Margaritaville Resort
8	Casino, who achieved 81.5 out of 90
9	percent.
10	Minority procurement, nine licensees
11	did not achieve compliance with their
12	voluntary conditions, and they are:
13	DiamondJacks, who achieved 5.5 percent
14	out of a goal of 10 percent; Sam's Town
15	achieved 10.7 out of 25; Horseshoe
16	Casino & Hotel achieved 5.4 out of 35;
17	Boomtown New Orleans achieved 9.8 out of
18	15; Treasure Chest Casino achieved 5.3
19	out of 15; Amelia Belle Casino achieved
20	11.3 out of 30; Margaritaville achieved
21	4 out of 10 percent; Boomtown Casino
22	Bossier achieved 8.9 out of 10 percent,

23	and Eldorado Resort Shreveport achieved
24	22.3 out of 25 percent.
25	Female procurement, two licensees
	17
1	did not achieve compliance with its
2	voluntary condition, and those licensees
3	are Horseshoe, who achieved 34.1 out of
4	a goal of 35 percent, and Hollywood
5	Casino, who achieved 8.1 out of a goal
6	of 10 percent.
7	Are there any questions?
8	CHAIRMAN JONES: Board Members, any
9	questions on procurement or employment?
10	[No response.]
11	MS. BROWN: Thanks. I'll begin with
12	racetrack. In the second quarter of
13	I'm sorry. Was there a question? Okay.
14	I'm sorry.
15	In the second quarter of 2015,
16	approximately 1,869 people were employed
17	by the racetrack casino industry. Of
18	that number, 1,608 were Louisiana
19	residents, 1,027 were minorities, and
20	1,098 were women.
21	One racetrack casino achieved total
22	compliance this quarter, and that is
23	Fairgrounds. Delta Downs did not
24	achieve its Louisiana employment
25	condition. It achieved 64.5 out of the

1	80 percent condition. Louisiana Downs
2	did not achieve its female employment or
3	its minority procurement goal. It
4	achieved 54 out of the 60 percent goal
5	for female employment and 4.8 out of 6
6	for minority procurement. Also, Old
7	Evangeline Downs did not achieve its
8	minority procurement goal. It achieved
9	3.2 out of 5 percent.
10	Are there any questions regarding
11	the racetrack casinos?
12	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions on
13	racetracks, Board Members? No, ma'am.
14	MS. BROWN: Thank you.
15	CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you very
16	much. Mesa, thank you for the help that
17	you provided the Board in preparation
18	for our last month's meeting. As you
19	know, we had a special item on the
20	agenda to deal with the issue of
21	procurement, and the data you provided
22	for us was very helpful.
23	Any comments or questions on
24	procurement data before we move on? I
25	think the Board indicated its position
	19
1	from a policy standpoint last month.

2 We're going to continue to track this.

3	General managers may receive
4	correspondence from me from time to time

20	Shelf Approval of Debt Transactions by
21	the Isle of Capri Casino, Inc.
22	Good morning.

24	Good morning, Chairman Jones and
25	Members of the Board. My name is

1	Trnessia Ware with Louisiana State
2	Police Corporate Securities Audit.
3	Miss Janet Boles, local counsel for
4	Isle of Capri Casino, notified the Board
-	has better the table of Country and the

5 by letter that Isle of Capri seeks the

6	Board's approval for shelf transactions
7	in an amount up to \$1.15 billion for a
8	period of three years. Isle stated it
9	anticipates that the potential use of
10	such proceeds will be for capital
11	expenditures, working capital,
12	refinancing existing debt and repayment
13	of amounts outstanding under Isle's
14	revolving credit facility.
15	In Isle's renewal report in
16	February 2015, Isle projected capital
17	expenditures at St. Charles Gaming in
18	excess of \$4 million for years 2015
19	through 2019. Isle's longtime debt
20	schedule is shown on page five. Isle's
21	credit facility consists of a
22	\$300 million revolving line of credit.
23	Isle's availability under its credit
24	facility at April 26th, 2015, was
25	approximately \$218 million.
	21
1	Isle projects sufficient cash flows
2	from operation to maintain its debt.
3	Based on Isle's historical financial
4	data on these cash flows, Isle's
5	projections appear reasonable.
6	In conclusion, no financial issues
7	came to our attention to preclude the
8	Board's approval of Isle of Capri

9	Casino's shelf application.
10	Are there any questions?
11	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions,
12	Board Members? [No response.] No
13	questions. Does Isle have anything to
14	add, representatives of the Isle?
15	MS. BOLES: No, sir.
16	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions for
17	the representatives of the property from
18	the Board? There are none. It's clear.
19	Do I have a motion to adopt the
20	resolution?
21	MR. GASTON: I'll move.

8	Conditions by Golden Nugget Lake
9	Charles, LLC, No. RO16502995.
10	Good morning, ladies and gentlemen.
11	MS. MOORE: Good morning, Chairman
12	Jones, Board Members. I'm Assistant
13	Attorney General Charmaine Moore, and
14	we're here in the matter of Golden
15	Nugget Lake Charles, LLC's, petition for
16	relief from the requirement of certain
17	license conditions. With me this
18	morning is Mr. Paul West, attorney for
19	the licensee.
20	

20 Conditions were originally placed on

21	the license of Golden Nugget on
22	February 17th, 2011, when the Board
23	issued the license. At that time, the
24	licensee was owned by Creative Casinos.
25	Thereafter it was the licensee was
	26
1	transferred three times, first to
2	Ameristar Casinos, then to Pinnacle
3	Entertainment and then to Golden Nugget.
4	No new conditions have been added;
5	however, the original conditions have
6	been amended several times since 2011.
7	Those amendments primarily concern the
8	construction and financing of the
9	approved project and the expected dates
10	of completion.
11	Beginning in 2012 with the renewal
12	of the license of L'Auberge Lake
13	Charles, the Board has been
14	consolidating and updated the conditions
15	of each riverboat licensee as its
16	license came up for renewal. Golden
17	Nugget is the only riverboat licensee
18	whose conditions have not been
19	consolidated and updated. Its license
20	expires on April 19th, 2016. It was
21	intended that their conditions would be
22	consolidated and updated when its
23	license was renewed in 2016; however,

25 relieved of certain of its current

1	conditions, the majority of which
2	concern the construction, preopening
3	procedure, preopening financing and
4	work-in-progress reporting relative to
5	the approved project, it was decided to
6	go ahead and consolidate and update the
7	conditions at this time.
8	The A.G.'s Office worked with
9	counsel for the licensee to consolidate
10	and update the conditions. All
11	conditions that were completed,
12	satisfied or are no longer applicable
13	were removed. Some substantive changes
14	were made, and some editing was done.
15	The licensee has accepted and agreed to
16	be bound by the conditions, and a
17	proposed resolution has been prepared if
18	the Board approves the proposed
19	statement of conditions.
20	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions for
21	Miss Moore? [No response.]
22	Mr. West, do you have anything?
23	MR. WEST: I want to thank Miss
24	Moore for her help and your staff. In
25	trying to get some of these conditions

1	out, we were actually making
2	construction reports that didn't say
3	anything, but they wanted to continue to
4	do them as long as it was a condition to
5	their license. So I think it's a lot
6	cleaner, and it does line up with the
7	other riverboats. Thank you.
