1 I. CALL TO ORDER

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Okay. Good morning, everyone. Thank  
4 you for joining us. A little different venue for  
5 us here this morning, and thank you for finding  
6 your way over to the Lasalle Building. So today  
7 is March 14, 2022. I would like to call to order  
8 the Louisiana Gaming Control Board meeting.  
9 Ms. Thurman, would you please call the roll?

8 quorum for conducting our business.

9 II. PUBLIC COMMENTS

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

11 We move into Item No. II for public  
12 comments. Ladies and gentlemen, this is the time  
13 during our meeting, if there's any public comment  
14 on anything on our agenda today. As we go through  
15 our different agenda items, there's no new  
16 evidence that can be discussed today. Nothing,  
17 new information, can be offered, but if there are  
18 any public comments, please come forward.

19 (NO RESPONSE)

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

21 Okay. I see no public comments.

22 III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 Before you -- we move into  
25 Item No. III, the approval of our minutes.

1 Members, we have before you the minutes of the  
2 February 17, 2022, meeting. Do I have a motion to  
3 approve those minutes?

4 MS. BERRY:

5 (Indicating)

6 MR. AVANT:

7 (Indicating)

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

9 Ms. Berry moves that we approve those  
10 minutes. Mr. Avant has seconded that motion. Is  
11 there any opposition to approving the minutes?

12 (NO RESPONSE)

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 Hearing none, the minutes of  
15 February 17, 2022, are hereby approved.

16 IV. REVENUE REPORTS

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

18 Item No. IV on the agenda are our  
19 revenue reports. And, Ms. Jackson, good morning.  
20 How are you this morning?

21 MS. JACKSON:

22 Good. How are you?

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 You're bearing good news for us this  
25 morning?

1 MS. JACKSON:

2 I believe so.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4 Thank you.

5 MS. JACKSON:

6 Good morning, Mr. Chairman, Board  
7 Members. My name is Donna Jackson. I'm with  
8 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement  
9 Division.

10 In February, the 13 operating  
11 riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts of  
12 \$151,654,881. The State collected fees totaling  
13 \$32,605,800. Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal  
14 year 2022 to date are \$1,171,000,000, an increase  
15 of \$229 million, or 24 percent, from fiscal year  
16 2021, but a decrease of 2 percent from fiscal year  
17 2019-2020. As of February 28, 2022, the State  
18 collected \$251.8 million in fees for fiscal year  
19 2022.

20 Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue  
21 broken down by regional market. The overall  
22 increase from January was \$5.7 million, or  
23 4 percent. Compared to last February this month's  
24 revenues represent an increase of \$39 million, or  
25 35 percent.

1                   Next is a summary of the February  
2                   2022 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans,  
3                   found on page 3. Harrah's generated \$20,186,087  
4                   in gross gaming revenue. These revenues represent  
5                   an increase from last month of \$2.5 million, or  
6                   14 percent, and an increase of \$4.4 million, or  
7                   28 percent, from the same month last year. During  
8                   February, the State received \$4,602,740 in minimum  
9                   daily payments.

10                   Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal  
11                   year 2022 to date are \$136.7 million, an increase  
12                   of \$22 million, or 20 percent, from fiscal year  
13                   2021 but a decrease of 30 percent from fiscal year  
14                   2020. As of February 28, 2022, the State  
15                   collected approximately \$40 million in fees for  
16                   fiscal year 2022.

17                   Next, I will present the revenues for  
18                   slots at the racetracks. During February, the  
19                   four racetrack facilities combined generated  
20                   adjusted gross receipts of \$25,205,882, an  
21                   increase of approximately \$600,000, or  
22                   2.5 percent, from January 2022 and an increase of  
23                   \$2.3 million, or 10 percent, when compared to the  
24                   same month last year. During February, the State  
25                   collected \$3.8 million in fees.

1 Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal  
2 year 2022 to date are \$211 million, an increase of  
3 \$23 million, or 12 percent, from fiscal year 2021  
4 but a decrease of 6 percent from fiscal year 2020.  
5 As of February 28, 2022, the State has collected  
6 \$32 million in fees for fiscal year 2022.

7 I will now move to the video gaming  
8 information. There are 12,179 video gaming  
9 devices activated at 1,437 locations. Net device  
10 revenue for February 2022 was \$71 million, an  
11 increase of \$5.6 million, or 8.5 percent, when  
12 compared to January 2022 and an increase of  
13 \$17.5 million, or 32.6 percent, when compared to  
14 last February. Total franchise fees for  
15 February 2022 totaled \$21.5 million, an increase  
16 of \$1.7 million when compared to January and an  
17 increase of \$5.3 million when compared to  
18 February 2021.

19 Net device revenue for fiscal year  
20 2022 to date is \$541 million, an increase of  
21 \$93 million, or 21 percent, when compared to  
22 fiscal year 2021.

23 Total franchise fees collected for  
24 fiscal year 2022 to date are \$163 million, an  
25 increase of \$27 million, or 20 percent, when

1 compared to last fiscal year.

2 Next, I will present the February  
3 revenue for sportsbook. During February, the 13  
4 operating retail sportsbooks accepted  
5 \$27.4 million in sports wagers, resulting in net  
6 proceeds of \$643,000 and \$140,000 in state taxes.  
7 The six mobile sportsbook operators accepted  
8 \$211 million in sports wagers, resulting in net  
9 proceeds of \$16.7 million and \$2.2 million in  
10 taxes paid to the State. Any questions?

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

12 All right. Any questions for  
13 Ms. Jackson from the Board?

14 (NO RESPONSE)

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16 Ms. Jackson, it looks like our  
17 numbers are -- we're making a comeback, huh? Is  
18 that --

19 MS. JACKSON:

20 It's a good month.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

22 -- a good way to put it, from --

23 MS. JACKSON:

24 February is typically a strong month.

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1                   -- from last year? We're still not  
2 quite -- quite there from 2020, --

3                   MS. JACKSON:

4                   Right.

5                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6                   -- but -- at least across the board,  
7 but overall just so much better than it was last  
8 year due to the pandemic and, I guess, hurricanes  
9 and catastrophes.

10                  MS. JACKSON:

11                  Right. And last February did have  
12 the COVID restrictions still. So . . .

13                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14                  Right. So okay. Are there any --  
15 any questions?

16                  (NO RESPONSE)

17                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

18                  Okay. Thank you so much. Members, I  
19 know this has nothing to do with -- with our  
20 Gaming Control Board, but I did visit  
21 Louisiana Downs last weekend, and their horse  
22 wagering numbers are up substantially since the  
23 sale of that property. So I think that that  
24 property is headed in the right direction, and I  
25 was very impressed with what they're doing out

1 there. So I just wanted to -- to report that.

2 Okay.

3 V. CONSIDERATION OF CONTRACTS WITH HEARING OFFICER

4 AND COURT REPORTER

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 Okay, Members. We're going to move  
7 on to Item No. V. And Item No. V is the  
8 consideration of the contracts for our hearing  
9 officer and our court reporter. In your packet,  
10 you'll see the contract for the legal services,  
11 first, for our hearing officer, Suzan S. Ponder.  
12 That contract comes up for renewal on July 1,  
13 2022, and it extends through June 30, 2023.

14 Ms. Ponder has done an incredible job  
15 for us. We're very fortunate that she has agreed  
16 to -- to extend that contract. And as chairman,  
17 I'm very, very pleased with the work that she has  
18 done, and we greatly appreciate her -- her  
19 commitment. Is there any -- any questions, any --  
20 any comments from the board on the extension of  
21 this contract?

22 (NO RESPONSE)

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 Okay. I would entertain a motion at  
25 this time that we approve the contract for our



1 hearing officer, Suzan S. Ponder, from July 1,  
2 2022, through June 30, 2023.

3 MR. JACKSON:

4 So moved.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 Mr. Jackson has moved that we extend  
7 that contract.

8 MR. SHOLES:

9 (Indicating)

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

11 Judge Sholes has seconded that  
12 motion. Is there any objection to that motion?

13 (NO RESPONSE)

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 No objection heard. That contract is  
16 hereby approved. The second contract will be for  
17 our legal services -- one second. Next, we will  
18 consider the contract of US Legal Support,  
19 Incorporated, for our court reporting services  
20 from July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2023.

21 Again, we were very -- very, very  
22 pleased with the work that they've done for us,  
23 and we would put this proposal before you today.  
24 Is there any questions on this contract?

25 (NO RESPONSE)

1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

2 I would entertain a motion that we  
3 accept this contract.

4 MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

5 So moved.

6 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

7 Ms. Hamilton-Acker has moved that we  
8 accept the contract with US Legal Support  
9 Services.

10 MR. POOLE:

11 (Indicating)

12 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13 Seconded by Mr. Poole. Is there any  
14 objection to that motion?

15 (NO RESPONSE)

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 Hearing none, the contract is hereby  
18 approved for US Legal Services Support July 1,  
19 2022, through June 30, 2023. Thank you very much,  
20 Members.

21 VI. CASINO GAMING ISSUES

22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

23 Okay. Limping along, Item No. VI,  
24 casino gaming issues. First on our agenda this  
25 morning is the consideration of the renewal

1 application of PNK Lake Charles, LLC doing  
2 business as L'Auberge Lake Charles. Good morning.

3 MR. GATHE:

4 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board  
5 Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General  
6 Jeremy Gathe here in the matter of the renewal of  
7 the riverboat gaming license of PNK Lake Charles,  
8 LLC doing business as L'Auberge Lake Charles.  
9 Here with me today is Ms. Tammy Haupt from  
10 Louisiana State Police, Audit Division, and Master  
11 Trooper Michael Talley from Louisiana State  
12 Police, Gaming Enforcement.

13 Pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statute  
14 27:75(A), the Board is required to act upon any  
15 renewal application no later than 30 days prior to  
16 the expiration of the current license. Riverboat  
17 gaming licenses are issued for a five-year term.  
18 This license was last renewed by the board on  
19 March 16, 2017, and is now set to expire on  
20 April 19, 2022.

21 The Office of State Police has  
22 reviewed the financial circumstances of the  
23 licensee and completed suitability investigations  
24 of the licensee, its parent companies, and  
25 principals. And at this time, Ms. Haupt and

1 Master Trooper Talley will now provide their  
2 findings to the Board.

3 MASTER TROOPER TALLEY:

4 Good morning, Chairman Johns and  
5 Members of the Board. As he said my name is  
6 Master Trooper Michael Talley. I work with the  
7 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement  
8 Division.

9 On November 22, 2021, Louisiana State  
10 Police, Gaming Enforcement Division -- we received  
11 a renewal license application submitted on behalf  
12 of PNK Lake Charles, LLC, and their business  
13 affiliates.

14 During the investigation of PNK  
15 Lake Charles and their affiliates, the background  
16 investigation was conducted on each of the  
17 company's officers, directors, managers, and  
18 persons with a 5 percent or more ownership or  
19 economic interest in the companies. The  
20 background investigations considered -- consisted  
21 of inquiries made of federal, state, and local law  
22 enforcement agencies. Inquiries were made to  
23 civil courts and gaming regulatory agencies, also.

24 No information was found that would  
25 preclude them from continuing to participate in

1 the gaming industry. In addition, all of their  
2 directors and key officers have previously been  
3 found suitable by the Louisiana Gaming Control  
4 Board. Thank you.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 Any questions, Members? Is --

7 MR. GATHE:

8 We have one more presentation.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10 I'm sorry. Good Morning.

11 MS. HAUPT:

12 Hi.

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 My apologizes.

15 MS. HAUPT:

16 No problem. Good morning,  
17 Chairman Johns and Board Members. My name is  
18 Tammy Haupt with Louisiana State Police's Gaming  
19 Audit Section.

20 PNK Lake Charles, LLC doing business  
21 as L'Auberge Casino Resort Lake Charles seeks a  
22 five-year renewal of its gaming license.  
23 L'Auberge Lake Charles is wholly owned by its  
24 parent company Pinnacle MLS, LLC, and  
25 Penn National Gaming, Inc., being its ultimate

1 parent. L'Auberge Lake Charles commenced gaming  
2 operations on May 26, 2006. During its 8 --  
3 during its 17 years of operations, they have  
4 generated approximately 5.3 billion in gaming  
5 revenues and paid 1.1 billion in state gaming  
6 fees. The riverboat casino competes with one  
7 racino and two riverboats in the Lake Charles  
8 gaming market, although Isle of Lake Charles is  
9 currently closed while constructing its landside  
10 facility.

11                   During the past five fiscal years,  
12 L'Auberge Lake Charles generated approximately  
13 1.69 billion in adjusted gross revenue. The 2020  
14 revenues were impacted by the COVID pandemic, as  
15 well as Hurricane Laura that made landfall on  
16 August 27, 2020, causing significant damage to the  
17 property and surrounding area. The hotel and  
18 casino were closed for 16 days with property  
19 damage estimated to be in excess of 100 million.  
20 This includes noncapital amounts related to the  
21 interruption of business.

22                   For the years 2016 to 2021, L'Auberge  
23 Lake Charles spent approximately 51.3 million for  
24 capital expenditures, which included major  
25 enhancements to the property and upgrades to its

1 gaming systems, as well as the hurricane-related  
2 repairs, with a portion being reimbursed by  
3 insurance. The licensee projects that they will  
4 spend 120.2 million for capital expenditures over  
5 the next five years, with 96 million of the  
6 capital projections used to wrap up the  
7 Hurricane Laura rebuild and remodel projects in  
8 2022 and 2023.

9           The estimated hurricane projects  
10 include 67 million for hotel renovations that are  
11 scheduled to begin this month, 4.8 million to  
12 transform its Jacks Dan -- Jack Daniels  
13 Bar & Grill into a barstool-branded retail  
14 sportsbook, with the remainder to be spent on  
15 repairs to the marina beach and landscaping. As I  
16 speak, the L'Auberge Lake Charles is having a  
17 ribbon-cutting ceremony for the grand opening of  
18 its new retailed barstool-branded sportsbook  
19 today. For the years 2016 through 2021, L'Auberge  
20 Lake Charles has paid approximately 73.2 million  
21 to local government authorities.

22           In conclusion, no financial issues  
23 came to our attention to preclude the Board from  
24 approving L'Auberge Casino Resort Lake Charles'  
25 license for a period of five years, effective

1 April 19, 2022. The Director of Regulatory  
2 Compliance at L'Auberge Lake Charles is in  
3 attendance today and available to answer any  
4 questions you may have for her.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 Okay. Thank you very much.

7 Ms. Theunissen here this morning?

8 MS. THEUNISSEN:

9 I am.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

11 Why don't you come on up?

12 MS. THEUNISSEN:

13 (Complying with request)

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 Good morning.

16 MS. THEUNISSEN:

17 Good morning.

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

19 I wish I could be back in  
20 Lake Charles for the grand opening.

21 MS. THEUNISSEN:

22 I know. I know. It's very exciting.  
23 It is.

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25 We are excited. So . . .



1 MS. THEUNISSEN:

2 Good morning, Chairman. Good  
3 morning, Board Members.

4 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

5 I think Vice Chairman Berry has  
6 either some questions or comments. Go ahead.

7 MS. BERRY:

8 Good morning.

9 MS. THEUNISSEN:

10 Good morning.

11 MS. BERRY:

12 I just -- being this is in my  
13 district and you're here today, I would just like  
14 to make a couple of quick comments, that I am just  
15 so pleased with everything going on at L'Auberge  
16 and the capital improvements, the repairs after  
17 the tragic hurricanes, the ice storm, -- forgot  
18 about that, too -- and just everything that  
19 affected L'Auberge and the fact that y'all are  
20 leading the state in gross receipts for all the  
21 riverboats. Led them in February, the last  
22 month -- we just heard reporting -- and leading  
23 the state throughout the fiscal year so far to  
24 date. I would just like to highly commend you and  
25 congratulate our district and --

1 MS. THEUNISSEN:

2 Thank you.

3 MS. BERRY:

4 -- and L'Auberge of Lake Charles.

5 And when it comes time, I will be with accolades  
6 to make the recommendation that your license be  
7 continued.

8 MS. THEUNISSEN:

9 Thank you very much. We appreciate  
10 it.

11 MS. BERRY:

12 Thank you.

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 Any other comments from board  
15 members? Ms. Theunissen, I -- I also want to  
16 offer some comments and to congratulate you and to  
17 thank Penn National for the -- for the critical  
18 commitment that you've made to our community. I  
19 happen to live there; so I get to witness  
20 firsthand what y'all do. Y'all have invested in  
21 the property. You continue to spend a lot of  
22 money to -- on amenities. It's not just about a  
23 casino. It's about other amenities for the  
24 restaurants, the pool area, the spa, the --  
25 everything else, the golf course.

1                   But most important is what you do  
2                   in the -- what your company does in our community.  
3                   The charitable donations that y'all make and the  
4                   commitment that you make to the community at home  
5                   is -- is just off the charts. So we thank you  
6                   very much. It's very noticeable what you do, and,  
7                   I would say, I would like to use this property as  
8                   a model for the rest of the state. And so thank  
9                   you very much, and please offer our sincere thanks  
10                  to your management -- to your management team. So  
11                  thank you very much.

12                               MS. THEUNISSEN:

13                   Thank you very much. We are very  
14                   happy to be part of our community, and we are  
15                   happy that -- that things seem to be settling out  
16                   now within the -- within the community somewhat  
17                   and also within the industry. And so we're  
18                   excited about the future. We obviously have lots  
19                   of projects that are going on in the next five  
20                   years. So we're excited, and we would like to  
21                   invite all of you, not just Ms. Berry but all of  
22                   you, to come over and take a look.

23                               CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24                   Well, I know I'm excited to get back  
25                   and see the new sportsbook. And I have not had

1 the opportunity to see the finished product yet.

2 4.8 million, I think, y'all spent on it, --

3 MS. THEUNISSEN:

4 We did.

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 -- which is phenomenal, and --

7 MS. THEUNISSEN:

8 We did. It is very exciting. It has  
9 four OTCs. It has -- it actually has eight slot  
10 machines and ten electronic table games, so like  
11 an ETG. It also has a restaurant. It has a video  
12 board that's probably half the size of that wall  
13 behind you. So -- with nice recliners that  
14 everyone wants to take a seat at and watch a game  
15 or two. So it's very exciting.

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 Well, my congratulations to you and  
18 to your GM there, Harold Rowland, for -- for the  
19 work, and I understand Drago's has been an  
20 incredible success there.

21 MS. THEUNISSEN:

22 Drago's has.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 Four-hundred seated restaurant  
25 members that -- it's just been an incredible

1 success there. So we appreciate it. You know, we  
2 do --

3 MS. BERRY:

4 I just -- I'm sorry. I forgot one  
5 more comment.

6 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

7 Okay. Ms. Berry.

8 MS. BERRY:

9 He made -- Chairman made a very, very  
10 good point. I know there's a lot of people in the  
11 state that, for one reason or the other, are  
12 against gaming and gambling, and it's also -- it  
13 means a lot to us that you've invested as much  
14 into the non-gaming amenities to help those type  
15 of people, or the -- you know, the ones where --  
16 to get them into your casino and to your gaming  
17 place and to show that that's not what it's all  
18 about, not to mention the volunteering that you do  
19 in the community. Volunteering in the community  
20 means a lot, especially to such a hard-hit area.  
21 I'm sorry. You -- the chairman mentioned that. I  
22 forgot to make that comment. So thank you.

23 MS. THEUNISSEN:

24 Thank you.

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1           Okay. Members, we have a resolution  
2 at the table to -- to adopt that we renew this  
3 license for five years. Vice-chairman Berry has  
4 made the motion to adopt the resolution. Do I  
5 have a second on that?

6           MR. AVANT:

7           (Indicating)

8           CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

9           Mr. Avant has seconded that -- that  
10 motion. And, Ms. Thurman, would you read the  
11 resolution, please?

12          MS. THURMAN:

13           On the 14th day of March 2022, the  
14 Louisiana Gaming Control Board did, in a duly  
15 noticed public meeting, consider the license  
16 renewal application of PNK Lake Charles, LLC d/b/a  
17 L'Auberge Lake Charles, License No. R011001707.

18           And, upon motion duly made and seconded, the Board  
19 adopted the following resolution:

20           Be it resolved that the license to  
21 conduct riverboat gaming issued to PNK  
22 Lake Charles, LLC d/b/a L'Auberge Lake Charles be  
23 renewed for a term of five years, commencing  
24 April 19, 2022, subject to all conditions  
25 currently imposed on the license.

1                   Thus done and signed in Baton Rouge,  
2 Louisiana, this 14th day of March 2002 -- 2022.

3                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4                   Thank you, Ms. Thurman. One of the  
5 shorter resolutions you've had to read this year.  
6 Thank you very much. Members, we have before you  
7 a motion and a second to adopt this resolution.  
8 Is there any objection to that motion?

9                   (NO RESPONSE)

10                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

11                  Hearing none, that motion here is  
12 adopted. Congratulations --

13                  MS. THEUNISSEN:

14                  Thank you.

15                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16                  -- to L'Auberge Lake Charles. And,  
17 again, thank you for everything y'all have done  
18 for our State.

19                  MS. THEUNISSEN:

20                  Thank you.

21                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

22                  Thank you. Good luck.

23 VII. VIDEO GAMING ISSUES

24                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25                  Okay. Item No. VII. Members, we're

1 going to move on to video gaming issues. Good  
2 morning, sir.

3 MR. PITRE:

4 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board  
5 Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General  
6 Earl Pitre, Jr., appearing before the Board in the  
7 matter of the transfer of membership interest of  
8 Madison Auto Truck Plaza & Lucky Dollar Casino,  
9 LLC doing business as Madison Auto Truck Plaza &  
10 Lucky Dollar Casino, a Type 5 video gaming  
11 licensee.

12 On March 8, 2021, Edward A. Amar,  
13 Jr., died. At the time of his death, he held a  
14 15.5 percent membership interest in the licensee.  
15 The membership interest in the licensee was  
16 community property.

17 Edward Jr.'s surviving spouse,  
18 Janice R. Amar, retained her 7.75 percent  
19 membership interest in the licensee as her half of  
20 the community property. Edward, Jr., left the  
21 remaining 7.75 percent membership interest in the  
22 licensee to the Edward A. Amar, Jr., Testamentary  
23 Residuary Trust. Janice R. Amar is the income  
24 beneficiary, and his two sons,  
25 Edward A. Amar, III, and Travis Amar, are the



1 principal beneficiaries of the trust. Travis Amar  
2 and David Danel are the co-trustees of the trust.

3 Master Trooper James Cannon conducted  
4 the investigation of the transfer of membership  
5 interest. He also conducted the updated  
6 suitability checks on the relevant persons. He is  
7 here to present the Office of State Police's  
8 findings to the -- to the Board.

9 MR. CANNON:

10 Good morning, Chairman and Members of  
11 the Board. I'm Master Trooper James Cannon with  
12 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement  
13 Division.

14 I investigated the transfer that  
15 occurred in the licensee due to the death of  
16 Edward A. Amar, Jr. Janice R. Amar, Travis Amar,  
17 and David Danel previously met suitability on  
18 various licenses. I conducted updated suitability  
19 checks on them. I found no information that would  
20 preclude them from continuing to participate in  
21 the video gaming industry. I found no information  
22 that would preclude the continued licensing of  
23 Madison Auto Truck Plaza & Lucky Dollar Casino,  
24 LLC.

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1                   Okay. Thank you very much,  
2 gentlemen, for your -- your report and your  
3 recommendations. Everything is in order, and you  
4 see no issues whatsoever in suitability or . . .

5                   MR. PITRE:

6                   No.

7                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

8                   Your recommendation is to approve.  
9 Is that correct?

10                  MR. PITRE:

11                  Yes, sir. And if I could conclude  
12 and say that the Office of Attorney General  
13 reviewed the file compiled as a result of the  
14 State Police's investigation, and the review  
15 indicated no information was found that would  
16 preclude approval of the transfer.

17                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

18                  Okay. Thank you very much. Okay.  
19 Members, any questions?

20                  (NO RESPONSE)

21                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

22                  Okay. If not, I will entertain a  
23 motion to approve the transfer of membership for  
24 the Madison Auto Truck Plaza & Lucky Dollar  
25 Casino, LLC doing business as Madison Auto Truck

1 Plaza & Lucky Dollar Casino. Do I have a motion  
2 on that?

3 MS. LEWIS:

4 (Indicating)

5 MS. TRAYLOR:

6 (Indicating)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

8 Ms. Lewis has moved that we approve  
9 the transfer of membership. Ms. Traylor has  
10 seconded that motion. Is there any discussion on  
11 the motion?

12 (NO RESPONSE)

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 Is there any objection to the motion?

15 (NO RESPONSE)

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 Hearing none, that -- that motion is  
18 hereby approved.

19 MR. PITRE:

20 Thank you.

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

22 Thank you very much, gentlemen.

23 Thank you for your work on this.

24 VIII. RULEMAKING

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1           Okay. Moving along to Item No. VIII,  
2           our rulemaking. Members, we have a number of  
3           items before us this morning on rulemaking.

4           Ms. Himel, good morning.

5           MS. HIMEL:

6           Good morning, Chairman Johns, Members  
7           of the Board. I'll be presenting all of these  
8           rules together as one. What you have before you  
9           is proposed rule changes which contain the  
10          amendments to the sections that this Board  
11          considered in the emergency rules last month;  
12          however, there were changes made to sections 517  
13          and 707.

14          In 517, you will see more strict  
15          advertising requirements. What we have in our  
16          rules currently under casino gaming law, which is  
17          binding on the sports wagering licensees, deals  
18          with billboards and deals with print  
19          advertisement. So what we're doing here due to  
20          the marketing adverts that sports wagering  
21          operators participate in, we are adding radio and  
22          television requirements to sports wagering  
23          licenses to make it stricter on reporting the  
24          problem -- compulsive gambling number and as far  
25          as certain sizes of the viewing of that number.

1           In 707, the changes that you will see  
2           is that the industry had some input with regards  
3           to the quarterly audits that they have to submit  
4           to. So Division's Audit Department did look at  
5           those and did make some changes, not all the  
6           changes that they wanted, but they are a little  
7           bit different than the February emergency rules.

8           If the Board approves these today,  
9           then a motion to institute rulemaking procedures  
10          is needed. The soonest that these rules could be  
11          promulgated would be July 20; however, depending  
12          on if there are substantive changes, oversight  
13          committee reviews, and the timing of the board  
14          meetings, it could be later than that.

15                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16                   Okay. Is that it, Ms. Himel?

17                   MS. HIMEL:

18                   Yes.

19                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20                   Thank you. I want to personally  
21          thank you for your -- and all of your staff at the  
22          AG's Office for your work on this. This is --  
23          Members, this took a lot of work, and this has  
24          been an ongoing process. I'm sure there will be  
25          changes in the future as we -- we move through the

1 process, but these are items that we felt were  
2 very necessary to do. It's going to make it a  
3 better and a more compliant product that we've got  
4 out there on the market, following what the other  
5 states are doing. So . . .

6 Well, Judge Sholes, I think, has got a  
7 question.

8 MR. SHOLES:

9 Guide me. Under self-exclusion, just  
10 functionally, if a citizen opts to do  
11 self-exclusion and are then found in a facility  
12 where they should not be, but they voluntarily put  
13 their name on self-exclusion, how do they avoid  
14 being -- having their name solicited publicly?

15 MS. HIMEL:

16 The exclusion list is confidential.  
17 So it should never be released in any way. Now,  
18 they can be arrested if they appear at a casino.  
19 If they go try and get onto the gaming floor and  
20 they do game, they could be arrested. So that  
21 would be -- you know, they are dealing with public  
22 records law with regards to criminal actions, but  
23 the list itself and information on the  
24 self-exclusion list is confidential.

25 MR. SHOLES:

1 Thank you.

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Thank you.

4 MS. HIMEL:

5 And I will say with regards to the  
6 changes to 517, the advertising, like you said,  
7 Chairman, because these are national  
8 advertisements that a lot of people engage in, we  
9 didn't want to be the only person doing this. So  
10 we did look at every other state's laws, and the  
11 specific requirements in these are also contained  
12 in New York's laws. So this is not anything that  
13 the operators have not seen. They're already  
14 abiding by it in New York, if they're advertising  
15 there, and other states have similar restrictions.

16 MR. SHOLES:

17 I'm sorry. I guess my problem is  
18 this: If someone is voluntarily agreeing to do  
19 the self-exclusion, it seems to me that it sort of  
20 hinders them to be willing to go on the list if  
21 they know that, if I do make a mistake and go in  
22 while I'm fighting this addiction, I am then now  
23 subject to public shaming. It just seems to me  
24 that we ought to be able to find a way to resolve  
25 that so that the self-excluded person does not end

1 up being publicly shamed, because, quite frankly,  
2 then why would I go on the self-exclusion list if  
3 I know, while I'm fighting this addiction, if I  
4 make this mistake, it will be all over the world?

5 MS. HIMEL:

6 Well, I can't speak to as why a  
7 person might put themselves on the list. I mean,  
8 I assume that they look at everything. Now, as  
9 far as gaming law, it is extremely protected. And  
10 whenever they do sign up for the exclusion list,  
11 they review all of this, and it says in the form  
12 that they have to sign that, "I acknowledge that I  
13 am filling this out and that if I go onto a gaming  
14 floor that I am subject to arrest." So they are  
15 given full disclosure as to the requirements, that  
16 it's five years, that they have to have a mental  
17 health professional clear them to come off the  
18 self-exclusion list. They are fully briefed on  
19 putting themselves on the self-exclusion list.

20 MR. SHOLES:

21 This one is tough for me. Thank you.

22 MS. HIMEL:

23 Thank you.

24 MAJOR McNEAL:

25 I was going to --



1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

2 Major, would you like to add -- add  
3 something to it, Major McNeal?

4 MAJOR McNEAL:

5 No, no. She's answered perfectly.  
6 If there's any questions, I'll -- I'll answer them  
7 for you, Judge, right now.

8 MR. SHOLES:

9 I do have lots of questions about  
10 this. It just seems -- whatever. I will wait and  
11 discuss it later.

12 MAJOR McNEAL:

13 Yes, sir, of course.

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 Is there -- if someone is caught  
16 inside a casino, is it an automatic arrest at that  
17 point, or do they have the option to -- to leave  
18 the property?

19 MAJOR McNEAL:

20 No, sir. They -- they are -- well,  
21 let me say -- when you say "arrest," -- let me  
22 make sure I understand the word "arrest" --  
23 they're issued a citation. So --

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25 A citation.

1 MAJOR McNEAL:

2 -- they're not -- they're not taken  
3 physically to jail, first off, and we found that,  
4 typically, in jurisdictions that we deal with, the  
5 charges are typically dropped by the DA's office  
6 if the person is willing to continue getting help  
7 and not go back.

8 So I can't remember in the last four  
9 years that I've been here that we've actually  
10 prosecuted someone for this crime. It's -- we  
11 hope -- it's more of a deterrent that we use, but  
12 it's not -- they're not -- they're going to be  
13 charged. I know there's a charge, but they're not  
14 prosecuted for that crime. The DA -- DA's office  
15 usually nolle prosses the charge off for them.

16 MR. SHOLES:

17 I think . . .

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

19 In an average year, how many of these  
20 do we actually -- what do you see? Do you --

21 MAJOR McNEAL:

22 I would just be speculating if I gave  
23 you a number, sir.

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25 Very few?

1 MAJOR McNEAL:

2 I can find out and --

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4 Very few. Right?

5 MAJOR McNEAL:

6 No, "few" is -- you know, I can't use  
7 the word "few." I mean, we are talking  
8 potentially two to three a month statewide.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10 Okay.

11 MAJOR McNEAL:

12 I mean, you know, some -- some  
13 properties have none, and some properties there  
14 are others. But, typically, we try to work that  
15 out. So . . .

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 Okay. Well, thank you. Ms. Lewis?

18 MS. BERRY:

19 I have a question.

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

21 Question from Ms. Berry.

22 MAJOR McNEAL:

23 Ms. Berry?

24 MS. BERRY:

25 To be clear, you report yourself on

1 the self-exclusion agreement. You sign, as you  
2 said, all the understandings of what you can and  
3 cannot do. If you're later found -- is it just on  
4 the floor or gaming on the floor?

5 MAJOR McNEAL:

6 Well, if you're on the gaming  
7 establishment -- excuse me -- on the gaming floor  
8 itself. You could be outside the gaming floor.  
9 Like, let's use Baton Rouge here, the hotel or  
10 something, you know, that's different. But it's  
11 actually on the gaming floor itself.

12 MS. BERRY:

13 So if you're on the floor, whether  
14 you're gaming or not?

15 MAJOR McNEAL:

16 Yes, ma'am.

17 MS. BERRY:

18 And you have -- you are the one who  
19 has signed off that this should happen to you if  
20 you are caught on the floor?

21 MAJOR McNEAL:

22 Yes, ma'am. It's explained in the  
23 paperwork what will happen. It explains that  
24 you -- you will be arrest -- could be charged and  
25 arrested for being on --

1 MS. BERRY:

2 Could be?

3 MAJOR McNEAL:

4 Yes, ma'am.

5 MS. BERRY:

6 And you said you are usually --  
7 normally issued a citation?

8 MAJOR McNEAL:

9 Yes, ma'am. You're issued a  
10 citation.

11 MS. BERRY:

12 Is the citation public knowledge like  
13 an arrest is?

14 MAJOR McNEAL:

15 Yes, it could be. I mean, you can  
16 request that through the District Attorney's  
17 Office and ask them, if that charge is there,  
18 "Hey, can I get you to" -- "to release this,"  
19 because it is a public record.

20 MS. BERRY:

21 Okay.

22 MAJOR McNEAL:

23 But it's not -- it's complicated,  
24 when I say "arrest," because, technically, a  
25 citation is always an arrest. Even when you get a

1 speeding ticket, that is considered an arrest.  
2 It's just they're not physically taking you to  
3 jail, so just to make sure I'm very clear on that,  
4 that --

5 MS. BERRY:

6 Yeah, I've got it. I understand  
7 that. So a citation and an arrest are sort of the  
8 same, except you're not physically brought in?

9 MAJOR McNEAL:

10 Yeah. That's right. We do the  
11 process -- physical -- physical arrests, we do not  
12 do that.

13 MS. BERRY:

14 Okay.

15 (MS. HIMEL CONFERRING WITH MAJOR McNEAL)

16 MAJOR McNEAL:

17 Yeah. And they're charged with  
18 trespassing is what the charge is.

19 MS. HIMEL:

20 Yeah. So it's not going to say a,  
21 you know, self-exclusion gaming violation, or it  
22 might, but it's trespassing.

23 MAJOR McNEAL:

24 It's trespassing.

25 MS. BERRY:

1                   Okay. Now I get it. Thank you so  
2 much. That was very clear. Thank you.

3                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4                   All right. Thank you for your -- for  
5 your comments on that. Any -- any further  
6 comments on the rulemaking changes -- the rule  
7 changes that are before you this morning?

8                   (NO RESPONSE)

9                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10                  Any questions?

11                  (NO RESPONSE)

12                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13                  Okay. Hearing none, I would  
14 entertain a motion that we adopt the rulemaking  
15 procedures in Section VIII, A through J. Do I  
16 have a motion on that?

17                  MS. LEWIS:

18                  (Indicating)

19                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20                  Ms. Lewis has moved that we adopt  
21 these rules.

22                  MR. AVANT:

23                  (Indicating)

24                  CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25                  And Mr. Avant has seconded that

1 motion. Is there any discussion on that motion?

2 (NO RESPONSE)

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4 Is there any objection to that  
5 motion?

6 (NO RESPONSE)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

8 Hearing none, the rules in  
9 Section VIII, A through J, are hereby adopted.

10 MS. HIMEL:

11 Thank you.

12 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13 Ms. Himel, again, thank all of you  
14 and State Police for your input and your work on  
15 this. This --

16 MS. HIMEL:

17 Thank you.

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

19 This was a lot of work.

20 IX. CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSED SETTLEMENTS AND  
21 APPEAL

22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

23 Okay. Moving along to consideration  
24 of proposed settlements and appeal. The first one  
25 will be the Village One Stop, LLC doing business



1 as Village Cafe'. Good morning.

2 MS. JOHNSON:

3 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board  
4 Members. I am Assistant Attorney General  
5 Venise Johnson, here in the matter of the  
6 settlement of Village One Stop, LLC doing business  
7 as Village Cafe', which holds a Type 2 video draw  
8 poker gaming license. This settlement addresses  
9 the late submission of annual forms and fees that  
10 are required to be submitted to the Division no  
11 later than July 1 of each year.

12 The licensee did not submit the  
13 annual forms and fees until October 14, 2021,  
14 which gave rise to a violation of gaming law. The  
15 civil penalty contained in this settlement is  
16 \$750, which is an amount that is well-established  
17 for violations of this type. This settlement has  
18 been signed by the hearing officer and is now  
19 before the Board for final approval.

20 I will be happy to answer any  
21 questions that you may have at this time. Thank  
22 you.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 Okay. Thank you very much. Are  
25 there any -- any questions?

1 (NO RESPONSE)

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Okay. At this time I would accept a  
4 motion that we approve the settlement of Village  
5 One Stop, LLC doing business as Village Cafe'.

6 MS. BERRY:

7 (Indicating)

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

9 Ms. Berry has moved that we approve  
10 this settlement.

11 MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

12 And Ms. Hamilton-Acker has seconded  
13 that motion. Is there any discussion on this  
14 motion?

15 (NO RESPONSE)

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 Any objection to this motion?

18 (NO RESPONSE)

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20 Hearing none, this settlement is  
21 hereby approved. Thank you very much.

22 MS. JOHNSON:

23 Thank you.

24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

25 Okay. Next, we have Village One

1 Stop, LLC doing business as Village Cafe'.

2 MS. JOHNSON:

3 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board  
4 Members. I am Assistant Attorney General  
5 Venise Johnson, here in the matter of the  
6 settlement of Village One Stop, LLC doing business  
7 as Village Cafe', which holds a Type 6 video draw  
8 poker gaming license. This settlement addresses  
9 the late submission of annual forms and fees that  
10 are required to be submitted to the Division no  
11 later than July 1 of each year.

12 The licensee did not submit the  
13 annual forms and fees until October 14, 2021,  
14 which gave rise to a violation of gaming law. The  
15 civil penalty contained in this settlement is  
16 \$1,500, which is an amount that is  
17 well-established for violations of this type. The  
18 settlement has been signed by the hearing officer  
19 and is now before the Board for final approval.

20 I would be happy to answer any  
21 questions that you may have at this time. Thank  
22 you.

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 Okay. Thank you. Any questions,  
25 Members?

1 (NO RESPONSE)

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Hearing none, I would adopt -- I  
4 would accept a motion that we approve this  
5 settlement.

6 MR. SHOLES:

7 So moved.

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

9 Judge Sholes has moved that we accept  
10 this settlement.

11 MS. TRAYLOR:

12 (Indicating)

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 And Ms. Traylor has seconded that  
15 motion to adopt the settlement of Village One  
16 Stop, LLC doing business as Village Cafe'. Is  
17 there any discussion on the motion?

18 (NO RESPONSE)

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20 Any objection to the motion?

21 (NO RESPONSE)

22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

23 Hearing none, that motion is hereby  
24 adopted and approved for the settlement. Thank  
25 you very much.

1 MS. JOHNSON:

2 Thank you. We have one more.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4 You want to do the next one?

5 MS. JOHNSON:

6 Uh-huh.

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

8 Okay.

9 MS. JOHNSON:

10 Good morning, Chairman Johns, --

11 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

12 Your show this morning.

13 MS. JOHNSON:

14 -- Board Members.

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16 Okay. Item No. 3, we have  
17 Grobar, LLC doing business as Banks St. Bar.

18 MS. JOHNSON:

19 Okay.

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

21 Again, it's a settlement.

22 MS. JOHNSON:

23 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Board  
24 Members. I am Assistant Attorney General  
25 Venise Johnson, here in the matter of the

1 settlement of Grobar, LLC doing business as  
2 Banks St. Bar, which holds a Type 1 video draw  
3 poker gaming license. This settlement addresses  
4 the late submission of annual forms and fees that  
5 are required to be submitted to the Division no  
6 later than July 1 of each year.

7 The licensee did not submit the  
8 annual forms and fees until February 2, 2022,  
9 which gave rise to a violation of gaming law. The  
10 civil penalty contained in this settlement is  
11 \$750, which is an amount that is well-established  
12 for violations of this type. The settlement has  
13 been signed by the hearing officer and is now  
14 before the Board for final approval.

15 I would be happy to answer any  
16 questions that you have at this time.

17 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

18 Okay. Any questions members?

19 (NO RESPONSE)

20 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

21 Hearing none, I will entertain a  
22 motion to approve this settlement.

23 MR. JACKSON:

24 So moved.

25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

1                   Mr. Jackson has moved that we approve  
2 the settlement offer.

3                   MR. POOLE:

4                   (Indicating)

5                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6                   Mr. Poole has seconded that motion.

7 Any questions on the motion?

8                   (NO RESPONSE)

9                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10                   Any objection to that motion?

11                   (NO RESPONSE)

12                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13                   Hearing none, the settlement between  
14 Grobar, LLC doing business as Bank St. Bar is  
15 hereby approved. Thank you very much.

16                   MS. JOHNSON:

17                   Thank you.

18                   CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

19                   Okay, Members. Moving along. We now  
20 move -- we have a consideration of an appeal for  
21 BRC, LLC doing business as T's Country. Good  
22 morning.

23                   MR. PICOU:

24                   Good morning, Chairman Johns and  
25 Members of the Board. I am Assistant Attorney

1 General Charlie Picou here in the matter of the  
2 appeal of BRC, LLC doing business as T's Country.  
3 Mr. Tilas Herring is the representative of the  
4 licensee. I'm not sure if he's present today or  
5 not.

6 MR. HERRING:

7 I'm here.

8 MR. PICOU:

9 It's his appeal; so I'll let  
10 Mr. Herring proceed first.

11 MR. HERRING:

12 Tilas Herring with BRC, LLC,  
13 T's Country. I couldn't make it to court in  
14 January because of a surgery, but, you know . . .

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16 Thank you for being here today, sir.  
17 We -- at this point, we cannot accept any new  
18 evidence here this morning. That could be done  
19 should this Board approve your appeal to remand  
20 this back to the hearing officer once again, and  
21 that's where you will make your -- your formal  
22 appeal. So, Mr. Picou, would you like to proceed?

23 MR. PICOU:

24 Yes, Chairman. On March 11, 2021,  
25 the Division had sent a video gaming advisory



1 notice to alert the licensee of the necessity of  
2 submitting the required annual forms and fees by  
3 June 30. The licensee failed to do so, which gave  
4 rise to violations of gaming law. Prior to the  
5 administrative hearing on January 19, 2022, the  
6 licensee was given ample opportunity to submit the  
7 annual forms and fees and failed to do so;  
8 therefore, we proceeded with an administrative  
9 hearing.

10 At that hearing, Hearing Officer  
11 Ponder found that the licensee, in fact, did not  
12 submit its annual forms and fees. For that  
13 reason, Hearing Officer Ponder ordered a  
14 revocation of the Type 1 video draw poker gaming  
15 license issued to BRC, LLC doing business as  
16 T's Country.

17 Louisiana gaming law states that a  
18 license may be suspended or revoked if a licensee  
19 fails to submit its annual forms and fees by  
20 August 31; therefore, the hearing officer's  
21 decision to revoke the license, it is consistent  
22 with law and with previous cases of this type.

23 The hearing officer acted properly  
24 and within her legal authority by revoking the  
25 Type 1 video draw poker license of BRC, LLC;

1       however, it has been alleged that the licensee  
2       has, since filing the appeal, submitted the annual  
3       forms and fees to the Division.

4                 Since this Board cannot hear any  
5       testimony or consider any new evidence, it would  
6       be -- we would request that the matter be remanded  
7       for further consideration and evaluation of any  
8       new information at this point.

9                 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10                And so you -- you're recommending  
11       that -- that we grant a new hearing or . . .

12                MR. PICOU:

13                Yes, Chairman, that it would be  
14       remanded for consideration.

15                CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16                Okay.

17                MR. PICOU:

18                It has been alleged that the licensee  
19       has, after filing the appeal, submitted his annual  
20       forms and fees to the Division. So we are going  
21       to evaluate that, if you so grant.

22                MS. BERRY:

23                I'll make a motion to remand it back  
24       to the hearing officer.

25                MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

1 Second that.

2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Okay. Is there any questions?

4 Anybody? Any questions for Mr. Picou this  
5 morning?

6 (NO RESPONSE)

7 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

8 Are you Mr. Owens? Is that your  
9 name?

10 MR. HERRING:

11 No, Tilas.

12 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13 Herring?

14 MR. HERRING:

15 Tilas Herring.

16 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

17 I'm sorry. My apologies, sir. You do  
18 understand that if we approve this motion, you  
19 will have the opportunity to go back to the  
20 hearing officer to plead your case at that point  
21 as to what reasons you were not there and why your  
22 paperwork was not submitted properly? So --

23 MR. HERRING:

24 Yes.

25 MS. BERRY:

1 I would just like to state, also,  
2 Chairman, that we normally don't remand back. We  
3 trust the hearing officer's decision, but due to  
4 your medical issues and the fact that the Attorney  
5 General's Office recommended it, we'll go with  
6 that.

7 MR. HERRING:

8 Thank you.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10 You're getting a pretty big break  
11 here today.

12 MR. HERRING:

13 Thank you. Thank you. Thank you a  
14 lot.

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

16 All right. We do have a motion to  
17 remand this case back to the hearing officer. Do  
18 I have a second on that?

19 MR. AVANT:

20 (Indicating)

21 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

22 Mr. Avant has moved that we second  
23 that motion. Is there any discussion on the  
24 motion?

25 (NO RESPONSE)

1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

2 Hearing none, is there any objection  
3 to that motion?

4 (NO RESPONSE)

5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

6 No objection. This -- this item is  
7 hereby remanded back to the hearing officer.

8 Mr. Picou, thank you for your work. We appreciate  
9 it. And good luck to you, sir.

10 MR. HERRING:

11 Thank you.

12 MR. PICOU:

13 Thank you.

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 Okay, Members. That clears our  
16 agenda. I would like to announce that our next  
17 board meeting will be April 17, back in this room  
18 again. The Legislature has chased us out of the  
19 big building.

20 MS. BERRY:

21 The 18th.

22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

23 Oh, excuse me. The 18th. My  
24 apologizes. The 18th. I looked at my calendar  
25 wrong. Bad day for CPAs, --

1 MS. BERRY:

2 Bad day for CPAs.

3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

4 -- huh, Ms. Berry? So we will be  
5 back here in this room on April 18. That could --  
6 has the potential to be a lengthy meeting; so we  
7 hope to see you here.

8 X. ADJOURNMENT

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

10 At this time I would entertain a  
11 motion that we adjourn.

12 MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

13 (Indicating)

14 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 Ms. Hamilton-Acker has moved that we  
16 adjourn.

17 MS. TRAYLOR:

18 (Indicating)

19 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20 And Ms. Traylor has seconded that  
21 motion. Any objections?

22 (NO RESPONSE)

23 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

24 We are hereby adjourned. Thank you  
25 very much, ladies and gentlemen, for being here
