15	opportunity.
16	Okay. Seeing none, we'll move into
17	the approval of the minutes. Members,
18	before you, you have the minutes of the
19	August 21st, 2023 board meeting. I would
20	ask for a motion to waive the reading and
21	approve those minutes.
22	MR. JACKSON:
23	I motion.

1	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
2	Mr. Jackson has moved that we
3	approve the minutes of August 21st, 2023,
4	second by Ms. Berry.
5	Is there any opposition to that
6	motion?
7	Hearing none, that motion carries.
8	Hearing none, the motion carries.
9	At this time we would call for our
10	revenue reports.
11	Ms. Jackson, good morning.
12	MS. JACKSON:
13	Good morning, Chairman Johns, board
14	members. Good morning.
15	Chairman Johns and Board Members, my
16	name is Donna Jackson with Louisiana State
17	Police, gaming audit section. In August
18	the 14 operating riverboats generated
19	adjusted gross receipts of \$136,071,837.
20	The state collected fees totalling
21	\$29,255,445. Adjusted gross receipts for
22	fiscal year 2024 to date are 282.7 million
23	dollars, a decrease of 4.2 million dollars
24	or 1% from fiscal year 2025 2023.
25	Sorry. As of August 31st, 2023, the state

1	collected \$60.8 million in fees for fiscal	
2	year 2024.

	Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue	
4	broken down by regional market. The	
5	overall decrease from July was	
6	approximately \$10.6 million or 7.2%.	
7	Compared to last August, this month's	
8	revenues represent a slight increase of	
9	\$1.4 million dollars or 1%.	
10	Next is the summary of August 2023	
11	gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans,	
12	found on page 3. Harrah's generated	
13	\$17,958,566 in gross gaming revenue.	
14	These revenues represent a slight	
15	increase from last month of 2.8%, but a	
16	decrease of approximately \$1.4 million or	
17	7.2% from the same month last year.	
18	During August, the state received	
19	\$5,505,465 in minimum daily payments.	
20	Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal	
21	year 2024 to date are approximately \$35.4	
22	million, a decrease of \$6.5 million or 16%	
23	from fiscal year 2023.	
24	As of August 31st, 2023, the state	
25	collected \$11 million in fees for fiscal

2	Next I'll read out the revenues for
3	slots at the Racetracks. During August
4	the four racetrack facilities combined
5	generated adjusted gross receipts of
6	\$25,036,305, a decrease of \$2.5 million or
7	9% from July of 2023, and a decrease of
8	1.4% when compared to the same month last
9	year. During August, the state collected
10	\$3.8 million in fees.
11	Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal
12	year 2024 to date \$52.6 million, a
13	decrease of \$2 million or 4% from fiscal
14	year 2023. As of August 31st, 2023, the
15	state collected approximately \$8 million
16	in fees for fiscal year 2024.
17	I will now move to the video gaming
18	information. There are 11,883 video
19	gaming devices activated at 1,398
20	locations. Net device revenue for August
21	2023 was \$61,600,667 million, a slight
22	increase of .1% when compared to July
23	2023, but a decrease of \$2.6 million or 4%
24	when compared to last August. Total
25	franchise fees for August 2023 totaled



1	\$18.7 million. Fiscal year to date net
2	device revenue is \$123 million, a decrease
3	of \$7.8 million or 6% when compared to
4	last fiscal year. As of August 31st, the
5	state has collected \$37.3 million in
6	franchise fees for fiscal year 2024 (sic).
7	Next, I'll present the August
8	revenue for sportsbook. During August the
9	18 retail sportsbook accepted \$15 million
10	in sports wagers, resulting in net
11	proceeds of approximately \$2 million and
12	\$190,000 in state taxes. One additional
13	mobile provider, Betway, went live in
14	August. The nine mobile sportsbook
15	operators accepted almost \$139 million in
16	sports wagers, resulting in net proceeds
17	of \$15 million and \$1.9 million in taxes
18	paid to the state.
19	Finally, for daily fantasy sports,
20	gross revenues for August were \$532,000
21	with net revenue of approximately \$53
22	thousand and taxes of \$4,300.
23	Any questions?
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Thank you, Ms. Jackson.



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1	Any questions for Ms. Jackson on
2	revenue?
3	The only thing that kind of stood
4	out to me, Members, was on mobile sports
5	bet if you compare August of '23 to August
6	of '22, a substantial increase about
7	almost 24%, I think, from the previous
8	from the previous year. So kind of an
9	interesting statistic. And now I know
10	we're moving into football season and we
11	should see some substantial numbers there,
12	I would think.
13	Any questions for Ms. Jackson?
14	Hearing none, Ms. Jackson, thank you
15	so much. I appreciate your hard work as
16	usual.
17	Members, we will move into casino
18	gaming issues. First on the agenda this
19	morning will be the consideration of a
20	request for manning the variance and
21	certificate of compliance for the
22	riverboat inspection of Louisiana Casino
23	Cruises, LLC, doing business as the Queen
24	of Baton Rouge.
25	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY LANDRY:



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1	Good morning, Chairman Johns and	
2	Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney	
3	General Lisha Landry here in the matter of	
4	the approval of the manning variance	
5	request and the issuance of a certificate	
6	of compliance for Louisiana Casino	
7	Cruises, LLC, doing business as the Queen	
8	Casino Baton Rouge's vessel, the CASINO	
9	ROUGE. The vessel's current certificate	
10	of compliance expires on September 30th,	
11	2023. And I'm also joined by Jeff Barbin,	
12	who is legal counsel for the licensee.	
13	MR. BARBIN:	
14	Good morning, Chairman Johns.	
15	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:	
16	Good morning.	
17	MR. BARBIN:	
18	Good morning Chairman Johns and	
19	Board Members, I'm Jeff Barbin from Phelps	
20	Dunbar representing Queen Baton Rouge, and	
21	to my right is Matt Shehadi, who is the	
22	general manager of the Queen.	
23	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LANDRY:	
24	So the Queen's landside facility	
25	opened to the public on August 24, 2023

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1	and was issued a riverboat gaming landside
2	facility certificate of compliance to
3	conduct gaming operations in the facility
4	in accordance with Louisiana law and
5	regulations.
6	Although the licensee is no longer
7	conducting gaming operations upon its
8	vessel, as of today the licensee's vessel
9	still remains docked on the property with
10	approximately 330 registered gaming
11	devices still remaining onboard. Those
12	gaming devices stored on the vessel are
13	nonoperational at this time.
14	Also, until the vessel is removed
15	from the property, Viking Cruise Lines
16	will also continue to nest or tie up
17	alongside the licensee's vessel in order
18	to use the vessel to embark and disembark
19	cruise line passengers and supplies to and
20	from the landside facility.
21	Normally, a certificate of
22	compliance for the vessel would not be
23	necessary if the vessel was closed to the
24	public and shuttered, no gaming devices
25	were stored on the vessel, and the vessel

1	was not being used for any purpose
2	was not being used for any purpose whatsoever.
3	However, to ensure the safety of
4	
	passengers, patrons and the public while
5	on the vessel and the security of the
6	gaming devices onboard, the licensee
7	should maintain a certificate of
8	compliance for the vessel to ensure that
9	safety standards are not compromised.
10	Safety standards for vessels for
11	riverboat gaming licensees come from
12	American Vessel Services, also known as
13	AVS, which is the board's third-party
14	inspector for vessels.
15	So as far as the inspection for the
16	vessel, on July 26th, 2023 AVS inspector
17	Pete Bullard did conduct an inspection of
18	the licensee's vessel in accordance with
19	the Louisiana alternative inspection
20	program. The inspection the inspector
21	reviewed fire protection measures, egress
22	routes, observed emergency lighting as
23	well as other required life safety issues.
24	This annual report was provided to
25	the board and the deficiencies of the

1	initial inspection are noted on page 5 of
2	the report.
3	A follow-up inspection was done on
4	August 21st and according to AVS, the
5	inspector confirmed that all outstanding
6	items are now considered satisfactory, as
7	outlined in the supplemental inspection
, 8	report.
9	AVS considers the vessel fit and
10	
11	recommends issuance of a certificate of
	compliance by the Board.
12	The current manning staff that's
13	required to be on the licensee's vessel
14	while patrons are on onboard for riverboat
15	gaming operations consists of one captain
16	in charge, one engineer in charge, and one
17	captain of the watch, which all may not be
18	onboard but are on call 24/7, one engineer
19	as a watch, one assistant captain of the
20	watch, three riverboat technicians, and
21	four security officers.
22	Given that the licensee is not
23	conducting gaming operations on its
24	vessel, on September 18, 2023, the
25	licensee requested approval for two

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1	different manning variances for its vessel
2	from AVS. One manning staff requirement
3	for when the vessel has no passengers
4	onboard, and a second manning staff
5	requirement for when the vessel has Viking
6	Cruise Line passengers using the vessel to
7	embark and disembark to and from the
8	landside facility.
9	AVS has completed its review and
10	inspection for the two alternate manning
11	variances for the vessel. According to
12	the manning variance report in your
13	folders, AVS has approved the manning
14	variance requests provided that: One,
15	when the vessel is in idle status with no
16	patrons onboard, the licensee must have
17	one captain in charge who may be onboard
18	or on call 24/7, one marine crew member
19	when the captain in charge is not on the
20	property, and one security officer.
21	When the Viking Cruise Line ship is
22	nested or tied alongside the licensee's
23	vessel transferring passengers through the
24	vessel in accordance with its proposed
25	passenger route, then the vessel must have

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1	one captain in charge who may be onboard
2	or on call 24/7, two marine crew members
3	and three security officers.
4	According to the report, AVS has
5	concerns as to the safety and stability of
6	the docking and nesting of the Viking
7	Cruise Line ship to the licensee's vessel.
8	Therefore, AVS has requested that the
9	licensee provide a signed affidavit from a
10	third-party naval architect, engineering
11	company or Viking Cruises that certifies
12	that the proposed docking/nesting
13	arrangement is stable and safe for both
14	vessels and the mooring apparatus to the
15	shore.
16	The licensee has been notified of
17	this requirement and will provide the
18	signed affidavit to AVS, the Board, the
19	AG's office and the Gaming Enforcement
20	Division. But please note that no
21	passengers will be allowed on the vessel
22	until a copy of the signed affidavit is
23	received by the Board, the AG's office and
24	the Gaming Enforcement Division.
25	If approved, a certificate of

2	
3	AVS's recommendations along with alternate
	manning requirements for cruise line
4	passengers while onboard has been prepared
5	for the Board's consideration.
6	And we have representatives from the
7	licensee available who can answer any
8	questions that the Board may have.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Thank you, Ms. Landry.
11	Thank you Ms. Landry. I do not like
12	this new system, for the record, okay, for
13	the record.
14	Thank you very much for your report.
15	You've answered some of my questions that
16	I was concerned about the marine crew and
17	how that was going to work. You
18	definitely answered my questions.
19	Any questions from the board members
20	for Ms. Landry at this point? Any any
21	questions?
22	Okay. Ms. Berry.
23	MS. BERRY:
24	I want to make sure I understand.
25	They're just using the vessel to transport



1 passengers from the Viking to the 2 landside? There's nothing going on other 3 than walking across; is that correct? 4 MR. SHEHADT: 5 Yes, that's correct. 6 MS. BERRY: 7 And there's no other way to get the 8 passengers from Viking to -- other than 9 the pass through? 10 MR. SHEHADI: 11 Correct. 12 MS. BERRY: 13 Okay. And when do you see removing 14 the gaming devices from the vessel? Are 15 they going to be moved to the landside or 16 they're just going to be disposed of? 17 MR. SHEHADI: 18 Yeah, the current machines on the 19 vessel will not be coming to land, so it's 20 just going through the liquidation process 21 and selling the boat as well. 22 MS. BERRY: 23 Okay. 24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 25 All right. Thank you. Thank you,

3	know the boat's up for sale; is that
4	correct, Mr. Shehadi? And the quicker you
5	get it get it sold and get it out of
6	there, the quicker you can I think
7	there's going to be a complete renovation
8	of that docking facility, if I'm not if
9	I'm not mistaken?
10	MR. SHEHADI:
11	Correct. Correct. We're diligently
12	in the process of offloading the vessel.
13	Currently, I'm in active negotiations with
14	a couple interested parties. So when that
15	boat gets sold, then Viking Cruise is
16	coming in and renovating that docking
17	the docking facility in totality.
18	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
19	Okay. Mr. Barbin, anything you want
20	to add on that?
21	MR. BARBIN:
22	I just want to say thanks to the
23	AG's office. This is kind of a, you know,
24	weird scenario we've had to work through
25	this week. It was very last minute, but



1	we we will be working with Viking to
2	get the necessary affidavit. We expect to
3	be able to get it before the boarding next
4	week. And we'll continue to keep you all
5	updated on the progress.
6	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
7	Okay. Thank you.
8	While you're at the table, let me
9	just say this publicly. Your grand
10	opening in August was just beyond our
11	expectations, Mr. Shehadi. Everything was
12	complete. There were no deficiencies. A
13	couple little minor glitches a few hours
14	out, you know, from opening, but we just
15	appreciate your hard work. And I
16	encourage the board members to go by there
17	and look at the facility, the property.
18	It is just absolutely first class and it's
19	just a great addition to the gaming market
20	in Louisiana and a great addition to
21	downtown Baton Rouge.
22	MR. SHEHADI:
23	Thank you.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Okay. Any questions?

5	And good morning, sir.	
6	ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL GATHE:	
7	Good morning, Chairman Johns and	
8	Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney	
9	General Jeremy Gathe here in the matter of	
10	St. Charles Gaming Company, LLC doing	
11	business as Horseshoe Casino Lake Charles.	
12	It's a petition to amend license	
13	conditions and stipulation.	
14	Present with me today is Mr. Robert	
15	Urland, who is the senior vice president	
16	of regional operations with Caesars	
17	Entertainment, and Jeffrey Barbin, local	
18	counsel for the licensee.	
19	In December of 2022, Horseshoe	
20	Casino Lake Charles filed a petition to	
21	commence gaming operations at its landside	
22	facility. Because several of its	
23	non-gaming amenities were not fully	
24	completed by its anticipated opening	
25	dates, the licensee requested that the

1	Board amend its conditions subject to a
2	timeline of completion for the then
3	outstanding non-gaming amenities.
4	Several of those non-gaming
5	amenities were not completed by the
6	deadlines imposed, and the licensee failed
7	to request an extension of those
8	deadlines. As a result, the licensee did
9	not maintain compliance with its licensed
10	conditions.
11	As of today, there are still
12	non-gaming amenities that have not been
13	completed. They are the fourth
14	restaurant, a Gordon Ramsay Steakhouse,
15	which will be completed on November 11,
16	2023, and the second multipurpose event
17	space, which will be completed on November
18	30th, 2023.
19	Because these non-gaming amenities
20	are part of the approved project, but will
21	not be completed until later dates, the
22	licensee's conditions have to be amended
23	in order for the licensee to be in
24	compliance with its licensed conditions.
25	As such, on September 8, 2023, the



1	
1	licenses filed a notition to smoot the
1 2	licensee filed a petition to amend the
	license conditions seeking approval to
3	extend the deadlines for all outstanding
4	non-gaming amenities not completed, and to
5	update its conditions to reflect the
6	current status of the approved project.
7	Due to the licensee's nonperformance
8	and noncompliance with its conditions, the
9	licensee and division have entered into a
10	stipulation requiring licensee to complete
11	all outstanding non-gaming amenities by
12	the new deadlines and to pay a
13	nonperformance payment.
14	These items are now before the Board
15	for its consideration. And if it is the
16	Board's pleasure to approve the amendment
17	of the licensee's conditions and
18	stipulation, a resolution has been
19	prepared for the Board's adoption and the
20	Chairman's signature.
21	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
22	Okay. Thank you, Mr. Gathe. I
23	appreciate the report.
24	Mr. Barbin or Mr. Urland
25	MR. BARBIN:



1	Good morning, Mr. Chairman.
2	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
3	who would like to go first?
4	MR. BARBIN:
5	I'll go first.
6	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

23	Mr. Chairman, Board, AG's office,
24	Louisiana State Police, I am Robert
25	Urland, and I am the regional president

	Coast region. And I am here today to
3	apologize on behalf of Caesars for us not
4	meeting the conditions that we agreed to
5	in Lake Charles.
6	We have put us in this situation and
7	for that I sincerely apologize.
8	But I do want to assure the Board,
9	the Chairman, the AG's office, as well as
10	the State Police that we have addressed
11	those issues. We have made the
12	appropriate changes in Lake Charles and we
13	have addressed the issues that have put us
14	in that situation.
15	We have as of today, we have
16	completed of the seven that were out of
17	compliance, we have completed the pool,
18	the gym, the two meeting rooms, the
19	convention space, three of the four
20	restaurants. And where we are still out
21	of compliance and what we're asking to
22	change the conditions here today is Gordon
23	Ramsay's Steakhouse. Gordon Ramsay's
24	Steakhouse is has been turned over, but
25	pending the health department inspection.

1	We will then start a rigorous eight-week	
2	training with Gordon Ramsay. We intend to	
3	have the staff and the culinary front and	
4	back of the house hired. After that	
5	training is complete, we are going to do a	
6	grand rib cutting on Veterans Day, which	
7	is Saturday, November 11th.	
8	For the event space that is	
9	outstanding, we are looking to have that	
10	completed by November 30th. And when that	
11	happens, we will be current with those	
12	conditions.	
13	But I've just got to tell you, I	
14	truly appreciate Mr. Chairman and the	
15	Board and especially the AG's office, the	
16	local LSP, that we've been working with	
17	for the patience with me and the team as	
18	we have navigated through some of those	
19	changes, especially most recently, and	
20	we're now making those changes that we	
21	won't be in this position again.	
22	And since 2005, since I've been with	
23	started off with the Eldorado and 20	
24	years later that we're now the New Empire	
25	Caesars Entertainment, we have not had

1	issues like this. And we know that with
2	these changes, we won't have issues like
3	this as we move forward to continue to
4	extend capital and expand our footprint at
5	our properties.
6	And, again, I'm just here to
7	apologize and answer any questions that
8	you may have.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Well, Mr. Urland, thank you very
11	much for your for your transparency,
12	for being here today with us. It's an
13	unfortunate situation, and and we
14	surely take the Board takes no pleasure
15	of entering in this kind of of of an
16	agreement, but we do appreciate the
17	proactive approach that you have taken.
18	And that's that's just in my eyes the
19	best way to handle it. We'll put it
20	behind us. We'll get on. And you'll grow
21	your property and grow your market there
22	in Lake Charles and move on from this.
23	MR. URLAND:
24	Yes, sir.

9	Catfish Queen and Louisiana Casino Cruises
