15	III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES
16	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Okay, hearing none,
17	we'll move on to Approval of the
18	Minutes. Everybody's had a chance to
19	review their minutes. Do we have a
20	motion to waive reading and approve the
21	minutes of the February 18th meeting?
22	MR. AVANT: So moved.
23	CHAIRMAN NOEL: By Mr. Avant and
24	seconded by Mr. Poole I'm sorry,
25	Mr. West.

1 All in favor say "aye." [Collective 2 "aye."] 3 Any opposed? [No response.] Motion 4 carries. Thank you. 5 IV. REVENUE REPORTS 6 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Next we'll do 7 Revenue Reports, and we have someone 8 from State Police. 9 MS. JACKSON: Good morning, Chairman 10 Noel and Board Members. My name is 11 Donna Jackson with Louisiana State 12 Police Gaming Enforcement Division. 13 The gaming licensees continue to 14 operate subject to COVID-19 restrictions. 15 16 During February, the 13 operating 17 riverboats generated Adjusted Gross 18 Receipts of \$112,390,715. This total 19 represents a decrease of \$20 million or 20 15 percent from last month, which had 2.1 five full weekends compared to this 22 month's four, and a decrease of 23 \$43 million or 27.7 percent from last 2.4 February, which had 29 gaming days and 25 one additional Saturday. Some of the

casinos experienced reduced patronage due to the winter storm, while others had to close for one to three days.

Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$941.6 million, a decrease of \$250 million or 21 percent from fiscal year 2020.

During February, the State collected fees totaling \$24 million. As of February 28, 2021, the State collected \$202.5 million in fees for fiscal year 2021, which is down almost \$54 million from last fiscal year.

Next is a summary of the February 2021 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans. Harrah's generated \$15,756,573 in gross gaming revenue during February. These revenues represent an increase from January of \$900,000 or 6 percent, but a decrease of \$10.8 million or 40.7 percent from last February.

Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$114 million, a decrease of \$80 million or 41 percent from fiscal year 2020.

During February, the State received \$4.6 million in minimum daily payments.

As of February 28, 2021, the State collected approximately \$40 million in fees for fiscal year 2021.

Next I will represent revenues for Slots at the Racetracks. During February, the four racetrack facilities combined generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of \$22,941,114, a decrease of \$4 million or 15.5 percent from last month, and a decrease of \$7.4 million or 24.5 percent from last February.

Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are almost \$188 million, a decrease of \$38 million or 17 percent from fiscal year 2020.

During February, the State collected \$3.5 million in fees. As of February 28, 2021, the State has collected \$28.5 million in fees for fiscal year 2021.

I will now present the Video Gaming information. There are currently 12,007 video gaming devices activated at 1,456 locations.

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Net Device Revenues for February

2 2021 was \$53.6 million, a decrease of

\$7.7 million or 12.5 percent when

compared to January, and a decrease of

\$1.3 million or 2.5 percent when

compared to February 2020.

Net Device Revenue for fiscal year

Net Device Revenue for fiscal year 2021 to date is \$447 million, an increase of \$36 million or 8.6 percent when compared to fiscal year 2020.

Total Franchise Fees collected during February were \$16.2 million, a decrease of \$2.4 million when compared to January, and a minimal decrease when compared to February 2020.

Total Franchise Fees collected for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$136 million, an increase of \$12.7 million or 10.3 percent when compared to fiscal year 2020.

Overall in February, all four types of gaming combined generated approximately \$205 million in revenue, which is down 23.5 percent from last February. Total fees to the State were

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1 down or \$10.8 million or 18 percent. 2 Are there any questions? 3 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions for 4 Ms. Jackson? [No response.] 5 I know LSP is working on a 6 comparison number, 2020 compared to 7 2019, and I think next month we'll have 8 a much better picture because you'll 9 have the month of March that we can 10 include. 11 MAJOR MCNEAL: Correct. 12 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. 13 VI. CASINO GAMING ISSUES 14 A. Consideration of the Renewal Application 15 for the Riverboat Gaming License of Golden 16 Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, - No. R016502995 17 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Okay, we'll move on 18 to Casino Gaming issues and first up is 19 Consideration of Renewal Application for 20 the Riverboat Gaming License for Golden 2.1 Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, No. 22 R016502995. We'll have first Ms. Landry 23 from the Attorney General's Office and 2.4 State, and the Golden Nugget 25 representatives can be available to

address the Board also.

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MS. LANDRY: Good morning, Chairman
Noel and Board Members. I'm Assistant
Attorney General Lisha Landry appearing
with Miss Donna Jackson with the
Louisiana State Police Audit Division
and Mr. Donnie Gautreaux with the Gaming
Enforcement Division.

We are in the matter of the renewal of the riverboat gaming license for Golden Nugget Lake Charles, LLC, doing business as Golden Nugget Lake Charles.

Pursuant to Louisiana Revised

Statute 27:75.A, the Board is required

to act on any renewal application no

later than 30 days prior to the

expiration of the current license.

Riverboat gaming licenses are issued for
a five-year term, and Golden Nugget's

riverboat gaming license is due to

expire May 19th, 2021.

The Office of State Police has reviewed the financial circumstances of the licensee and completed its suitability investigations for the

licensee, its parent companies and its principals. At this time Ms. Jackson will now report Audit's findings to the Board.

MS. JACKSON: Good morning, Chairman Noel and Board Members. My name is Donna Jackson with the Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit Section.

Golden Nugget Lake Charles or GNLC seeks the five-year renewal of its gaming license. GNLC is 100 percent owned by GNLC Holding. Fertitta Entertainment, Inc., is the ultimately parent through intermediate subsidiaries.

GNLC commenced gaming operations on December 6, 2014. During its six years of operation, GNLC generated approximately \$1.6 billion in AGR and paid \$361 million in state gaming fees. GNLC competes with two other riverboats and one racino in the Lake Charles gaming market. For fiscal years '18-'19 and '19-'20, GNLC ranked first in the market with gross receipts of

approximately \$320 million and \$259 million respectively.

During 2020, the revenues have been impacted by the Coronavirus pandemic, as well as Hurricane Laura, which caused damage to the facility and surrounding area.

For the years 2016-2020, GNLC spent approximately \$114 million for capital expenditures, which includes \$90 million for a new hotel tower which opened in May 2017. The licensee projects it will spend approximately \$55 million for capital expenditures for years 2021 through 2025.

GNLC is party with its parent companies to a Trademark License Agreement, as well as a Shared Services Agreement, which includes a Restaurant Management Agreement. Fees for these agreements approximate \$2 million annually. GNLC also pays an allocation relating to their Corporate Call Center, which for the last six years totaled \$4.6 million.

1 GNLC has a Ground Lease Agreement 2 with the Lake Charles Harbor & Terminal 3 District and has made rental payments of 4 approximately \$8 million from 2015 5 through 2020. They also pay the port a 6 percentage of Net Gaming Proceeds, which 7 totaled approximately \$12 million for 8 the same time period. Finally, GNLC 9 pays the Calcasieu Parish Gaming 10 District a percentage of net gaming 11 proceeds adjusted for the rental 12 calculation to the port. For the years 13 2015 through 2020, the gaming district 14 received \$49.5 million from GNLC. certain percentage of this amount is 15 16 disbursed to various local entities. 17 In conclusion, no financial issues 18 came to our attention to preclude the 19 Board from approving the Golden Nugget 20 Lake Charles license for a period of 2.1 five years effective May 19, 2021. 22 Licensing will now present their 23 findings. 2.4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. 25 MR. GAUTREAUX: Good morning,

Chairman Noel and Board Members, I'm

Donnie Gautreaux with Louisiana State

Police Enforcement Division. The

Division conducted an investigation in

regards to the five-year license renewal

of Golden Nugget Lake Charles and its

subsidiaries. The investigation

included the officers, directors and

persons with a 5 percent or more

ownership interest in the company's.

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The investigation consisted of inquiries through federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, computerized criminal history databases, financial and civil jurisdictions and gaming regulatory agencies. At the conclusion of the investigation, no information was discovered which would prohibit Golden Nugget Lake, LLC, its subsidiaries or any of its key personnel to continue to participate in the Louisiana gaming industry.

MS. LANDRY: If its the Board's pleasure to renew the riverboat gaming license of Golden Nugget Lake Charles,

1 LLC, a proposed Resolution has been 2 prepared for the Board's adoption and 3 the Board's signature. 4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. Do we 5 have any questions from the Board or 6 State Police or the A.G.'s Office at 7 this point? [No response.] 8 Okay. Anyone from Golden Nugget 9 here? Good morning. 10 MR. HENNIGAN: Good morning, 11 Chairman, Board Members. My name is 12 Greg Hennigan. I'm the General Manager 13 for Golden Nugget in Lake Charles. 14 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you, Greq. Do 15 you -- I did have one question. 16 know -- and perhaps you can add a little 17 bit to it. I know in the renewal, it's 18 projected to spend, I believe 50ish on 19 capital expenditures going out five 20 years. Can you describe some of the 2.1 things that y'all are looking to do with 22 that capital expenditures and 23 improvements. 2.4 MR. HENNIGAN: Yes, building 25 improvements. We're constantly looking

1 at renewing restaurant themes and 2 remodeling and keeping them up to date 3 which is necessary to keep them 4 attractive to our -- to our guests, a 5 lot of that also has to go -- will be 6 going towards slot capital -- slot 7 machine capital and general improvements 8 of the property. 9 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any other thoughts 10 on what Golden Nugget may be doing in 11 the future as far as to remain 12 competitive? 13 MR. HENNIGAN: Just getting back 14 going, everything back open is a nice first step, but we are -- we are 15 16 re-theming a couple restaurants, and, 17 you know, we've -- with Landry's 18 corporation we've got about -- we've got 19 a lot of restaurant brands so we're 20 looking at refreshing a couple of those. 2.1 CHAIRMAN NOEL: How much damage from 22 Hurricane Laura? 23 MR. HENNIGAN: North of 2.4 \$150 million. We're still working on 25 some of those repairs today.

1 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any other questions 2 from the Board for Mr. Hennigan? 3 response.] 4 Thank you. All right, now I'll ask 5 if we have a motion to adopt the 6 Resolution -- a motion to adopt? 7 I'll make a motion. MR. POOLE: 8 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Motion by Mr. Poole. 9 We have a second by Mr. Avant. 10 Read the Resolution. 11 MS. Consideration of the Petition for
Approval of Relocation of a Portion of
Gaming Operations for PNK Lake Charles,
LLC, doing business as L'Auberge Lake
Charles, No. R011001707.

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MR. PICOU: Good morning, Chairman
Noel, Members of the Board. I'm
Assistant Attorney General Charlie Picou
now appearing in the matter of the
petition of PNK Lake Charles, LLC, doing
business as Lake Charles -- L'Auberge
Lake Charles for approval to relocate a
portion of its gaming operations to a
facility within 1,200 feet of its
approved berth site.

The licensee has satisfied the relocation requirements set forth in Louisiana Administrative Code 2401(b)2 substantial completion of the riverboat vessel and approved project was completed after January 1, 2015, and cost in excess of \$200 million.

Furthermore the licensee is requesting to move less than 6 percent of its gaming positions to a facility

that will function as a poker room. The licensee is currently operating 2,042 gaming positions and is requesting 54 positions for the poker room for a total of 2,096 gaming positions, which is below the maximum amount of gaming positions allowed by Louisiana Revised Statue 27:44.

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All required documents were submitted by the Licensee to the Division for review and investigation.

If it is the Board's pleasure to approve the request, a Resolution has been prepared for your consideration.

The licensee be allowed to commence gaming activities at its new facility once the Division has determined that all necessary staffing, training, security, surveillance, technical accounting and internal control procedures are acceptable.

Representative of the licensee are here to answer any questions and will present an overview of the proposed relocation, but first Sergeant Dallas Brasseaux with

of the Louisiana State Police will present the Division's findings.

CHAIRMAN NOEL: Sergeant Brasseaux, could we -- I hate to go out of order, but could we have L'Auberge come up and join their presentation, and then you can talk.

MR. PIERSON: Sure. Good morning,
Chairman Noel and Board Members, so my
name is Randy Pierson. I'm the
Vice-President of Casino Operations at a
L'Auberge Baton Rouge, and Angie
Theunisson is Director of Compliance.

So thank you for inviting us. We've been asked to come here to talk about our poker room and request approval to open. It's -- the poker room -- pre-COVID, we had a poker room, so this is not a new venture for us -- and when COVID hit, with the restrictions we had, we decided this wasn't really a viable option to maintain on the floor, so we removed those five tables, and then we added some slot machines at social distancing pieces and some video poker.

We did this while always anticipating that we would be finding a new home for poker. Poker is a really -- it's a viable amenity for us. It is -- as we are a resort, so it something that's always needed and recommended for, and we get requests from guests consistently as to when we're going to get another room, so that's kind of been the decision we made.

This is obviously also a source of revenue for us, and we are providing more jobs, so we're currently training some team members to be in that area, and we anticipate that within the next three weeks or so we'd be ready to open in kind if the -- kind of the restrictions dictate.

And I know that Chairman Noel, you've seen the location as to where we are. It's approximately 150 up the gaming floor as we have today, and as you can see, we sent this -- the poker room project a little. Hopefully everybody has that, and it's a 1,200

square foot facility with six tables, 54 spots. We will -- we'll have a security podium outside of the room and so just to maintain that legal age requirement. And then we'll have a cage inside the room as well.

and then the next couple pages you can just see some pictures to where we are with construction today. And as we — so it probably looks better today because were continuing to get it closer and closer. So — and then the final pages, just a business update, and I'm not going to go through that; but if anybody has any business questions for me on that, I'll be more than willing to talk them through it.

CHAIRMAN NOEL: Ms. Theunisson, did you have anything to add?

MS.THEUNISSON: No, we have been working steadily with State Police every step of the way, and we do have a couple of more approvals to seek out. Once we get prepared, we will submit for those and be ready.

1 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. 2 Any questions from the Board for the 3 L'Auberge? 4 MR. AVANT: Has COVID caused this move -- this transition? 5 6 MR. PIERSON: Yes, sir. So when 7 we -- so just prior to opening, we kind 8 of made a decision, hey, our poker room 9 doesn't make sense on the casino floor 10 just because we wouldn't be allowed to 11 open it. It was a -- there was a 12 desperate need to just have more games 13 on the floor at that point because of 14 the social distancing piece. So we're 15 literally today -- I think we opened 16 with 50 percent and then 25 percent 17 occupancy so it was, like, every other 18 game, kind of like where we are today, I 19 guess, and so there was a need for us to 20 just have more floor space. 2.1 MR. AVANT: Plus you have more slots 22 now. 23 MR. PIERSON: Yes, sir. 2.4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any other questions? 25 You mentioned that -- I did have

1 You mentioned that this project one. 2 will require some additional staffing? 3 MR. PIERSON: Yes, sir. Yes, sir, 4 we probably are looking at 40 more team 5 members that will be required, and we're 6 consistently hiring. One thing, I think 7 it's mentioned in here too, staffing has 8 always been a challenge. The housing 9 with the hurricanes and things like that 10 have been a challenge for us. So we --11 the good news is in the gaming 12 department, so slots and table games, 13 hasn't been as big of an issue; however, 14 just finding those, so we've -- we've 15 starting training, and we're comfortable 16 we'll get there. 17 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Okay. I think State 18 Police, Sergeant Brasseaux, why you came 19 prepared. 20 MR. PIERSON: Thank you. 2.1 MS.THEUNISSON: Thank you. 22 SERGEANT BRASSEAUX: Good morning, 23 Chairman Noel and Members of the Board, 2.4 Sergeant Dallas Brasseaux with the 25 Louisiana State Police Gaming

Enforcement Division. I'm assigned to the Lake Charles field office.

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The Division received L'Auberge's request to move their poker area from the traditional gaming floor to the --where they had it -- the made it the My Choice Area. During that time they put up partitions around the area -- glass partitions, doors and -- with a frosted covering. They moved table games into that area, and they've added carpet throughout the area. So far the Division sees that they're lacking the surveillance camera coverage and the security that they mentioned.

CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.

Any questions from the Board for Sergeant Brasseaux? [No response.]

I do know that, of course, should the Board give approval today, the last piece will be for State Police to do a final inspection to make sure all those components -- security surveillance, any other procedural requirements are met before they can actually go live. Upon

1 completion of the project, the Division 2 will do the inspections necessary so 3 they can actually go live. 4 Yes, sir. 5 SERGEANT BRASSEAUX: Upon completion 6 of the project, the Division will do the 7 inspections necessary for it to be in 8 compliance with the regulations, and 9 once those inspections are complete, 10 we'll give final approval. 11 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you. 12 All right. Do we have a motion to 13 adopt the Resolution on this item? 14 MS. LEWIS: I'll move. 15 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Ms. Lewis makes a 16 motion. Do we have a second? 17 MR. I'm Assistant Attorney General Charmaine Moore. are here today in the matter of the petition of Jazz Casino Company, LLC, doing business as Harrah's New Orleans, for approval of its schematic and design plans for the construction of a new hotel and improvements and renovations and improvements to the casino. Act 171 of the 2019 regular session of the legislature and the amended and restated operating contract require the casino operator to make a capital investment in the property of at least \$325 million prior to July 15th, 2024.

The casino operating contract gives the Board the right to review and approve the schematic and design plans for the capital investment. The plans submitted by the casino operator to the Board and the Division provide for the

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construction of a new hotel adjacent to the casino for renovations and improvements to the casino floor and for further development of the second floor of the casino.

The Resolution prepared for your adoption in addition to providing for their approval of the plans, also provide for the approval of a rebranding of the casino from Harrah's New Orleans to Caesars New Orleans. Although the casino operating contract allows Jazz to change his d/b/a without prior Board approval, we included both an approval of the d/b/a change in the rebranding in the Resolution so that everyone concerned will know that that will happen.

There's another provision in the Resolution notifying Jazz and Caesars of the Board's desire to receive budget and work progress information on a quarterly basis. Simir Mowad, the General Manager of Harrah's New Orleans, and Senior Vice-President of Jazz is here today

1 with a slide presentation to take you 2 through the proposed capital investment 3 highlighting the renovations and 4 improvements to the casino property. 5 And Captain Pat Bradley is here from the 6 Enforcement Division of State Police to 7 address the Division's review of the 8 plans. 9 CAPTAIN BRADLEY: Morning, Mr. 10 Chairman, Board. I'm Captain Pat 11 Bradley with Louisiana State Police. 12 The Division has received and reviewed 13 the design plan for the expansion of 14 Harrah's New Orleans, including all the 15 improvements interior and exterior, and 16 will monitor and stay in communication 17 with Harrah's New Orleans and personnel 18 moving forward. 19 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Do we have any 20 questions for the A.G.'s Office or State 2.1 Police at this point? If not, we'll ask 22 Harrah's to come up and do their 23 presentation. I know everyone has a 24 handout.

MR. MOWAD: Good morning, Chairman

Noel, Members of the Board. It's a -my name is Simir Mowad. I'm the General
Manager of Harrah's New Orleans, and
it's my pleasure this morning to walk
you through some of the highlights of
our design plan.

Manager at Harrah's New Orleans. I've been -- I've been back since August, but this -- this project, certainly the beginning of it, predates my arrival. In fact, it goes back to my last stint at Harrah's New Orleans that ended in 2016, but ultimately, I think, many of you know that our operating contract was set to expire, and we were able to work out a 30-year extension that was signed in April; and ultimately that comes with the privilege to spend \$325 million in capital to help improvements to help transform the property.

Some of the highlights of what we're hoping to do is certainly, as you just heard, one of the big ones is to rebrand from Harrah's New Orleans to Caesars New

Orleans and bring our -- our best brand to the -- the State of Louisiana and City of New Orleans. We're gonna add a 340-room hotel tower right above our current porte cochere. We're going to refresh all of our food and beverage offerings. We'll have the hotel lobby check-in and a lobby bar on the second floor that overlooks the Mississippi River.

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We have a sports bar that we certainly hope will also house a sports book as some point if -- if that comes to fruition. We'll add 10,000 square feet of meeting space and entertainment venue that's allowed per the operating contract. We'll have a -- we'll redo our porte cochere drop-off area in once the hotel tower is done. We'll add a fitness area for that hotel tower, and then we'll have a refresh of the gaming floor that will be commensurate with the Caesars theme and with the -- with the new food and beverage outlets that we'll introduce.

This is just an overview of the property, and it really just lays out sort of where we sit down at the corner of Canal and Poydras and -- and all of the neighbors around us. You know, we have the new Four Seasons we'll be opening across the street in the old World Trade Center building, and then you have really just a lot of quality hotel product around us; and we're looking to -- along with our current Harrah's Hotel, and we're looking to -- to make sure that the -- the new Caesars Hotel will be -- you know, fit right in with all of that.

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This is really detailing where a lot of these updated amenities will sit, and you can see where the new hotel tower -- will be over the porte cochere. The state house is where it currently is. It will just get refreshed.

The sports bar, there -- there is a bit of debate and discussion right now internally about whether it will sit there or shift to a -- a different

position. We're going to replace -- the buffet will be refreshed with a food hall type concept, and then where you see "Beacon," that's our busiest entrance heading right into the French Quarter down on Canal Street, and so we'll add a three-meal restaurant with a patio area over there, and then we'll also have a specialty restaurant in addition that will be right across from the -- the river and the Four Seasons and the Convention Center area.

This so this is an overview of what our project will look like at this point when the hotel tower is added and refresh it to -- to have the Caesars theme and the Caesars motif, and so you can see on the inside what about the -- current layout of the property looks like from an aerial view, and then you can see what it looks like with the hotel tower added and the -- the Caesars logo and branding facing right down into the French Quarter.

This is the Canal Street entrance,

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our primary entrance where we see the -the lion's share of our admissions, again, coming from the French Quarter and downtown. And the idea here, again, is just to make sure we're reflective of our theme and our branding and to -- we will-- we will build out the -- the apron a little bit so it's a little bit more inviting and easy to access, and I think a real theme you'll see as we go through these pictures is we tried to be very thoughtful about inside/outside. And that's something that we -- the current structure, while its great, definitely has a bit of a compound feel, and you walk around and it's not as inviting as it could be. And then when you also think about our desire to -- to have inside and outside feel like they flow together more. Even with COVID, that's something that is -- is something that we've thought about as well as we think about our restaurants and -- and outdoor dining and things like that.

This is -- as you come into that

entrance, we would actually push the security podium a little bit, and -- and even to the left would be the entrance to the three-meal restaurant, and -- and another factor is that -- the restaurants would be available to all ages, as opposed to now, you have to be 21 years old to enter the facility in order to dine at one of the restaurants that's inside the building.

And I will tell you, I have let our design and construction folks know that the security podiums, the barriers aren't going to work. You know, if I can get over, it's probably not a good thing, and we'll make sure that's all secured and appropriate and approved by LSP as we move forward.

This is just a refresh of some of outdoor decks, and, in fact, this one is something that we'll be adding that will be a part of that three-meal restaurant, again, just so you we can have the inside/outside.

And then this is a -- a view of the

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current smoking deck where we have some outdoor gaming, and we would just refresh this for the theme and update it.

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And then this is just as you walk into that the entrance, and you get the views of the floor. The decor may

This is our Poydras Street/South Peters entrance, and currently our steak house sits here, you can see, just to the right. Current -- you have to currently go inside. We don't have any outside area. And, again, this would be accessible to all ages, and you'd be able to sit out on the patio and dine. The interesting part is too, the building as -- as the design folks have worked with it, there are elements of it that lend nicely to the Caesars theme. So if you look at the inset picture, the changes aren't dramatic to the building, and it's really just as you bring in the color schemes and branding. It really does carry the Caesars theme very well and the brand. And then this is just as you walk

change a little bit just as we continue to refine the design it, but the idea that this will all be refreshed and treated is really the most part.

And then this is just an aerial You can see the steak house there and where the outdoor tables will go, and we really feel like that will be a win in terms of people finding that restaurant more attractive. This is the convention center entrance, and ultimately it's where we hope to -- to position our food hall. You know, we'll have multiple concepts that just meet certain -- they'll hit all the different culinary highlights that we want to make sure we're offering for And, again, as you enter the everyone. building, this area will be accessible to all ages. Just a few more views of that, and you'll see where we built the apron out a little bit just to make it a little more inviting.

Then is the new hotel tower, and the goal here was, we have a cap on the

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height, which 196 feet the tower has to stay under, and so we try to design to still make it like it's, you know, soaring and has a sense of height to it while still maintaining the cap that we have allowing for views for our neighbors.

This is the view just at the ground level with the porte cochere, and then just as you're pulling in and you sense are the Caesar's theme and then go into the entrance; and, again, you don't have the best view of it here, but even if you will look inside this main entrance, there are escalators that are to the right and the left, and those will bring you up to the second floor of the hotel, which is ultimately where the lobby check-in for that hotel tower is, prior to the entrance to the casino floor is opposed to that.

And then this is our rendering of the bar up on that second floor which will give you a view of the river and, you know, out into the French Quarter;

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and then this is the design of the hotel room, where this is consistent with the design of the hotel room at our Caesars properties. This is one of the suite views where I -- you know, just more space inviting. We're excited about the ability to add suites as well with the Caesars theme. With now international flights into New Orleans, we really feel like we're going to be able to draw a whole other level of customer to the city and to Caesars New Orleans that previously maybe we just didn't check that box in terms of bringing them in.

And then this is just a view of some the finishes in the restroom. And just back to that aerial overview that kind of sets the stage for where we're hoping to go as -- as we make this significant investment into -- into the property downtown.

That's the -- that's the highlights of the presentation that you-all received and certainly available to answer any questions that you might

2	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Thank you.
3	Real quick, I did want to recognize,
4	Ms. Hamilton-Acker is here.
5	MS. HAMILTON-ACKER: Yes.
6	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Mr. Poole, do you
7	have a question?
8	MR. POOLE: Yeah, yeah, I have a
9	question.
10	Mr. Simir, thank you for being here
11	today.
12	MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir.
13	MR. POOLE: What is Caesars' plans
14	for the whole sports book operation or
15	the sports bar at the moment, assuming
16	that sports book passage happens here in
17	the State of Louisiana? Will that look
18	anything like what a Las Vegas sports
19	books would look like?
20	MR. MOWAD: Certainly when you think
21	Caesars sports and the Caesars sports
22	book and, you know, it's funny,
23	myself and my boss, our former GM, Dan
24	Real, were talking about this yesterday,
25	and we certainly have a vision in our

head that is born out of when walk into
the sports book at Caesars Palace.

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That's partly where the location becomes important. It's also worth noting that not just if the sports books are approved but also how they are approved in the sense of what's allowed and what isn't will have some bearing on what the final product ends up looking like. But we're certainly aware that it's a driver.

Some of our competitors and sister properties around the state, ours might look a lit bit different, a little bit more robust in the sense of we see -- you know, the City of New Orleans is a place that is similar to Las Vegas where bachelor parties, groups of guys, groups of gals come in, bachelorette parties to do things like that, and the sports book can be a big part of it? It might not just be a more of local types destinations. We have a few different versions of it, quite frankly, just sort of waiting and see where that goes.

1 MR. POOLE: So you feel like the 2 decision about what happens in the 3 state, all that will drive the 4 development and you won't be forced to 5 make a decision on there prior to --6 MR. MOWAD: No, we -- what we have 7 planned out originally is a sports bar 8 that can be converted to a sports -- but 9 the sports bar, is still relevant in the 10 City of New Orleans, especially Saints 11 games, the college games, all the 12 different traffic, NCA tournaments, 13 things like that. I think we're the 14 Final Four host next year, I believe, 15 hopefully. 16 So all of that factors in. We have 17 currently planned a multi-functional 18 space that we will be able to pivot into 19 what we believe is appropriate. 20 interesting, even in the sense of how do 2.1 we design it and we lay it out, we're 22 trying to be a little noncommittal right 23 now, in the sense of it will be a 2.4 shelled out space that will be flexible.

MR. POOLE: Thank you. I appreciate

1	it.
2	MR. AVAST: How many rooms do you
3	have?
4	MR. MOWAD: 450.
5	MR. AVANT: So this is an
6	additional?
7	MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir.
8	MR. AVANT: What about parking?
9	MR. MOWAD: I mean, ultimately our
10	two parking garages, which are on 501
11	and 601, Convention Center garages, so
12	we have a plethora of parking, and
13	ultimately the hotel may just soak up
14	more of that parking as opposed to now
15	we even whatever goes unused
16	internally, we have spaces that we sell.
17	It's a traditional parking garage.
18	MR. AVANT: No problem with the
19	parking.
20	MR. MOWAD: No, sir. The, you know,
21	valet might get a little more
22	challenging. As I did find out that as
23	we drive pilings for a 340-room hotel,
24	all of the spots underneath may not be
25	available, but ultimately you know,

1 that's more of an internal problem. 2 quests will never perceive how we figure 3 that out. 4 MR. AVANT: Thank you. 5 MR. MOWAD: Absolutely. 6 CHAIRMAN NOEL: I believe, Mr. West. 7 MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir. 8 MR. WEST: Live Entertainment venue, 9 is that taken out now when you move 10 these restaurants? 11 MR. MOWAD: No, sir, the film war 12 will still be upstairs where it is now, 13 and then even as we have the convention 14 space that we'll add where we can even 15 do -- have some flexibility of our own 16 if we so desire to use it. And then on 17 top of that, we have enough space up 18 there also where we'll still be talking 19 to third parties about different 20 entertainment options as well. But the 2.1 Philmore, we're in regular contact with 22 them, and much like a lot of us, they're 23 just waiting for appropriate recovery 2.4 where the restrictions allow them to

That was

successfully execute on shows.

1 a big success for us, prior to COVID, in 2 the sense of all the traffic that they 3 drove. 4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Ms. Lewis, I think 5 you have a question. 6 MS. LEWIS: Are you at liberty to 7 discuss the types of restaurants that 8 are going into the food hall? Will it 9 be Vegas style and some of those brand 10 names? 11 MR. MOWAD: I would tell you that I 12 think Caesars is well renowned for the 13 brands and the names that we're 14 associated with, and you can absolutely 15 expect that some of those associations 16 will be carried over. At the same time, 17 we're also planning to have a diverse 18 option of restaurants, and that includes 19 who the operators, both -- not only some 20 of our international associations, but 2.1 most importantly some local 22 associations. 23 MS. LEWIS: Thank you. 2.4 MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir. 25 CHAIRMAN NOEL: With regard to the

overall project short-term -- and I guess short-term meaning the construction phase itself and, you know, long-term after construction is completed -- what's the impact on employment for Caesars, for Harrah's but also, you know, construction and third party type of employment.

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MR. MOWAD: Absolutely. So short-term it's really interserting, more so I would argue because of -- of COVID and how that recovery looks relative to when construction starts. You know, rough time lines that I'm not a hundred percent committing to, but our goals right now are we're starting demo late summer. We're driving pilings, you know, early fall, and so from there as recovery continues to happen; and certainly we recognize that right now our employment, our mandates have -we've been given the chance to be relaxed. It's something where we think about the outlets we're going to open and how we'll employ the correct number

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of people while also safely doing that as we work through construction. we're definitely considering how we figure that out. It's a complex problem right now. Even in February, as you know, Chairman Noel, our admissions were down 66 percent, and just because of the nature of the business in the City of New Orleans, you know, tourism has been so hard hit, and so, you know, I'm proud of the way our company has handled everything in the sense of even for the employees that are still on furlough, we're paying their benefits to this day; and we have a plan to get back to full employment when it is so appropriate.

CHAIRMAN NOEL: Okay. Any other questions? Mr. West, I see your button is pressed it, but that's -- okay.

One of the last questions I had, you know, we're looking at a \$325 million project. I'm really pleased to see the comprehensive approach as opposed to just putting up a hotel. I mean, again, you're branding, you're doing the casino

and adding a number of things. What's the approximate -- out of that 325, what is the approximate cost for the casino refresh?

MR. MOWAD: So we -- we submitted a rough budget, and even I'd love to answer that question non-publicly.

That's why we submitted it in advance just in terms of where those buckets fit dollars wise. While the lion share of the money, meaning over half is being spent on the hotel, it's broken out, and even I have a copy of it and can review it with you immediately following this.

CHAIRMAN NOEL: I am familiar with the number, and what I wanted to bring out was, it is a fairly significant number.

MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir. There's no question that where we see -- look, the hotel is an awesome amenity that we're able to add, and it's something that helps our business strategy. The biggest piece of all of that is making the project Caesars New Orleans, and

when you walk into what is now Harrah's New Orleans -- we were actually having this discussion yesterday of, when do you flip from Harrah's to Caesars? And the answer is when you walk in, it's got to feel like Caesars New Orleans.

Obviously, I'm a Caesars employee, have been for a long time, so I get that I'm drinking the Kool-Aid. But when you walk in to Caesars Palace, right, I think that there's a reason it's the most famous casino in the world, right, because you know you're at Caesars

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Palace.

And that's what Harrah's New Orleans has to feel like, and so the idea that we can throw up a new hotel tower and call it Caesars, I would reject that idea and certainly our brand team would reject that idea. And so that's the goal of our project. We have -- while we do get national business that flies in and stays in the hotels, we also get a ton of regional drive in business, and, you know, even in the city you have

1	all the hotel rooms, you have Airbnb,
2	BRBO, all that stuff, people are going
3	to be able to stay in our hotel, so
4	that's what's driving that investment.
5	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Are you rebranding
6	the current Harrah's hotel, or will that
7	still stay Harrah's?
8	MR. MOWAD: So we're while I'm
9	not ready to put a stake in the ground
10	on that, our ideas is probably to leave
11	that as the Harrah's Hotel, and that way
12	you're not asking what Caesars where
13	you're staying at. You know you're
14	staying at the Caesars Tower. But I may
15	come back and have an alternate
16	suggestion on that. We shall see.
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Sure. Any last
18	questions? [No response.]
19	So at this point, I will see if we
20	have a motion to adopt the Resolution.
21	MR. POOLE: I'll make a motion.
22	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Motion by Mr. Poole.
23	MR. WEST: I'll second.
24	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Mr. West seconds.
25	Ms. Thurman, could you read the

Resolution into the record.

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MS. THURMAN: On the 18th day of

Be it resolved that the schematic plans for the \$325 million capital investment to include the construction of certain improvements to the land based casino, including the construction of a new hotel, are hereby approved.

Be it resolved that pursuant to
Section 9.33(a)II of the Casino
Operating Contract, the Board hereby
notifies Caesars Entertainment, Inc.,
and Jazz Casino Company, LLC, that in

1 regard to the capital investment, A, at 2 least 30 days prior to the commencement 3 of construction, Caesars and the casino 4 operator shall submit to the Board a 5 comprehensive budget for the capital 6 investment, and, B, beginning 90 days 7 after the commencement of construction 8 and quarterly thereafter, Caesars and 9 the casino operator shall submit a 10 written report that provides a 11 reasonable summary of the then current 12 status of the capital investment work 13 and capital investment expenses as those 14 terms are defined in the COC as well as 15 a then current development budget for 16 the capital investment. 17 Be it resolved that as provided in

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Be it resolved that as provided in Section 8.7 of the Casino Operating Contract, the rebranding of the casino property as well as the d/b/a of Jazz Casino Company, LLC, from Harrah's New Orleans to Caesars New Orleans, is hereby approved.

9	really carried the heavy load.
10	MR. MOWAD: Yes, sir. So thank you.
