DECISION OF THE LOUISIANA GAMING CONTROL BOARD

IN RE: TOBY IS DEAD, INC. D/B/A THE JIMANI NO. 3601104287

This matter is before the Louisiana Gaming Control Board on a motion filed by Toby Is Dead, Inc. d/b/a The Jimani (the "Licensee") requesting reconsideration of the Notice of Revocation dated January 6, 2026, wherein its Type 1 video draw poker gaming license, No. 3601104287, was revoked. The basis of the revocation was due to the Licensee's failure to timely request an administrative hearing within ten (10) calendar days of the Licensee's receipt of a Notice of Recommendation of Revocation dated December 2, 2025, issued for failure to submit its Annual Licensee Form, appropriate fee, and required documents as required by gaming laws and regulations.

Counsel for the Licensee states that the Licensee submitted its Annual Licensee Form, appropriate fee, and required documents to the Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division after the deadline to request an administrative hearing, but prior to the date that the Louisiana Gaming Control Board issued the Notice of Revocation dated January 6, 2026. Counsel for the Licensee alleges that there was a misunderstanding as to the status of the matter and the request for an administrative hearing was possibly overlooked.

Louisiana Revised Statute 49:977.1(A) enumerates the grounds upon which an agency may rehear, reopen, or reconsider its decision and provides:

- A. A decision or order in a case of adjudication shall be subject to rehearing, reopening, or reconsideration by the agency, within ten days from the date of its entry. The grounds for action shall be one of the following:
 - (1) The decision or order is clearly contrary to the law and the evidence.
 - (2) The party has discovered since the hearing evidence important to the issues which he could not have with due diligence obtained before or during the hearing.
 - (3) There is a showing that issues not previously considered ought to be

examined in order to properly dispose of the matter.

- (4) There is other good grounds for further consideration of the issues and the evidence in the public interest.

The Louisiana Gaming Control Board finds that the Licensee failed to present sufficient grounds in accordance with La. R.S. 49:977.1(A) to warrant reconsideration of the Notice of Revocation dated January 6, 2026. The Licensee was not deprived of an opportunity to be heard or its statutory right to a hearing. Further, the Licensee received proper notice, which detailed the process to request an administrative hearing, but failed to timely request an administrative hearing. Therefore, the Motion to Rescind or Reconsider filed by the Licensee is denied and the revocation of its video draw poker gaming license is final.

ORDER


This matter having been considered by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board in open meeting of February 26, 2026:

IT IS ORDERED THAT the Motion to Rescind or Reconsider filed by Toby Is Dead, Inc. d/b/a The Jimani, No. 3601104287, requesting reconsideration of the Notice of Revocation dated January 6, 2026, is **DENIED** for the reasons set forth in this decision.
