19	IV. REVENUE REPORTS
20	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
21	Okay. Moving on to revenue reports.
22	Ms. Jackson, good morning. The highlight of the
23	meeting for me.
24	MS. JACKSON:
25	Good morning, Chairman Johns
	10
1	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
2	Good morning.
3	MS. JACKSON:
4	and Board Members. My name is
5	Donna Jackson. Is it on?
6	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
7	Now you are.
8	MS. JACKSON:
9	My name is Donna Jackson with
10	Louisiana State Police, Gaming Audit Section.

11 In August, the 13 operating

12 riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts of

13 \$134,692,916. The State collected fees totaling

14 \$28,958,977. Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal

15 year 2023 to date are approximately \$287 million,

16 an increase of \$4 million, or 1 percent, from

17 fiscal year 2022. As of August 31, 2022, the

18 State collected \$61.7 million in fees for fiscal

19 year 2023.

20 Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue

21 broken down by regional market. The overall

22 decrease from July was approximately

23 \$17.5 million, or 11.5 percent. The calendar was

24 more favorable in July with five full weekends,

25 whereas August only had four. Compared to last

11

1 August, this month's revenues represent an

2 increase of \$15.7 million, or 13 percent, with the

3 end of last August being impacted by

4 Hurricane Ida.

5 Next is a summary of the August 2022

6 gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans, found on

7 page 3. Harrah's generated \$19,342,353 in gross

8 gaming revenue. These revenues represent a

9 decrease from last month of \$3.3 million, or

10 14.5 percent, but an increase of approximately

11 \$6 million, or 41.5 percent, from the same month

12 last year. During August the state received

13 \$5,520,548 in minimum daily payments.

14 Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal 15 year 2023 to date are approximately \$42 million, an increase of over \$2.5 million, or 6 percent, 16 17 from fiscal year 2022. As of August 31, 2022, the 18 State collected \$11 million in fees for fiscal 19 year 2023. 20 Next, I'll present the revenues for 21 slots at the racetracks. During August the four 22 racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted 23 gross receipts of \$25,385,558, a decrease of 24 \$3.9 million, or 13.4 percent, from July 2022 but 25 an increase of \$1.8 million, or 7.8 percent, when 12 compared to the same month last year. During 1 August the State collected over \$3.8 million in 2 fees. 3 4 Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal 5 year 2023 to date are \$54.7 million, a decrease of 6 \$1.2 million, or 2 percent, from fiscal year 2022. 7 As of August 31, 2022, the State has collected 8 \$8.3 million in fees for fiscal year 2023. 9 I will now move to the video gaming 10 information. There are 12,147 video gaming devices activated at 1,424 locations. Net device 11 revenue for August was \$64,203,035, a decrease of 12 \$2.5 million, or 3.8 percent, when compared to 13 14 July but an increase of \$5.6 million, or 15 9.6 percent when compared to last August. Total

16 franchise fees for August totaled \$19.4 million, a

17 decrease of \$744,000 when compared to July 2022

18 but an increase of \$1.7 million when compared to

19 August 2021.

20 Net device revenue for fiscal year

21 2023 to date is approximately \$131 million, a

22 decrease of \$1.6 million, or 1.2 percent, when

23 compared to fiscal year 2022. Total franchise

24 fees collected for fiscal year 2023 to date are

25 \$39.6 million, a decrease of 1 percent when

13

1 compared to last fiscal year.

2 Next, I will present the August 3 revenue for sportsbook. During August the 17 retail sportsbooks accepted approximately 4 5 \$16.2 million in sports wagers, resulting in net proceeds of \$2.2 million and \$212,000 in state 6 7 taxes. The seven mobile sportsbook operators accepted \$112 million in sports wagers, resulting 8 9 in net proceeds of \$7.3 million and approximately 10 \$1.6 million in taxes paid to the State. 11 Finally, for daily fantasy sports, gross revenues for August were \$546,500 with net 12 13 revenue of approximately \$53,000 and taxes of 14 \$4,300. 15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

15 CHAIRMAN JOHNS.

16 Okay. Thank you, Ms. Jackson. And I

17 think it's really important -- I know you

18 mentioned it, but July did have five week -- five

19 weekends, and August only had four, and those

20 weekends make a huge difference in the industry's

21 numbers.

- 22 So, Members, any questions for
- 23 Ms. Jackson? Any comments on revenue from the

24 Board?

25 (NO RESPONSE)

1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

- 2 Okay. Members, I will tell you that
- 3 the number one question I get everywhere is,

4 "What's sports wagering doing, and how much money

5 is it bringing in?" And so I did a little math

6 last night at home after I got Ms. Jackson's

7 report, and it appears, overall, since we rolled

8 out retail back in November and then mobile in

9 very, very late January -- it appears we've done

10 about 1.4 billion in wagering, which has resulted

11 in a little over -- about \$18.3 million in state

12 revenue total between retail and -- and mobile put

13 together. So the real -- the numbers seem to be

14 driven by mobile at this point.

15 And the fact that we are now entering

16 into our first full football season, college two

17 weeks ago and then the NFL last weekend, no doubt

18 it's going to drive -- drive some numbers and some

19 revenue for us. So we're -- we're just anxious to

20 see what football season does for us; so . . .

21 So thank you, Ms. Jackson. We

22 appreciate it. Any -- any comments? Any

- 23 questions?
- 24 (NO RESPONSE)
- 25 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

- 1 Okay. Hearing none, thank you.
- 2 V. CASINO GAMING ISSUES
- 3 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 4 Okay. All right. Ladies and
- 5 Gentlemen, we're going to move on to casino gaming
- 6 issues. Next on the agenda will be the
- 7 consideration of a Certificate of Compliance for
- 8 the riverboat inspection of L'Auberge Casino &
- 9 Hotel here in Baton Rouge.
- 10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 11 Good morning.
- 12 MS. JAMES:
- 13 Good morning, Chairman and Board
- 14 Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General
- 15 Lekiesha James here with Ms. Moriah Reed of AVS.
- 16 We're here in the matter of the issuance of the
- 17 second Temporary Certificate of Compliance for
- 18 L'Auberge Baton Rouge.
- 19 On August 22, 20 -- 2022, this Board
- 20 granted a Temporary Certificate of Compliance to
- 21 L'Auberge Baton Rouge, with an expiration date of
- 22 September 30, 2022. Ms. Reed will now provide an
- 23 update.
- 24 MS. REED:
- 25 Good morning, Chairman Johns.

- 1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 2 Good morning.
- 3 MS. REED:
- 4 Good morning.
- 5 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 6 Welcome.
- 7 MS. REED:
- 8 Thank you, sir. Good morning,
- 9 Chairman Johns and Board Members. I am
- 10 Moriah Reed, a naval architect and inspector with
- 11 American Vessel Services. I am here to report on
- 12 the current status of the L'Auberge Casino
- 13 Baton Rouge Temporary Certificate of Compliance.
- 14 At the August 22 board meeting, the
- 15 Board unanimously approved and granted a Temporary
- 16 Certificate of Compliance to L'Auberge
- 17 Baton Rouge. This allowed the property additional
- 18 time to complete their five-year hull inspection,
- 19 which is a requirement of the Louisiana
- 20 Alternative Inspection Program.
- 21 As of this date, the property has not
- 22 completed their five-year hull inspection, which
- 23 was due in July 2022. The property has requested
- 24 an additional extension to complete this
- 25 inspection, and a copy of this request is included

17

- 1 in your package. This extension request is a
- 2 result of adverse high water river conditions

3 which were experienced earlier this year. Those
4 conditions would have put divers and survey crews
5 at risk.
6 Currently, the property is working

7 diligently with their marine contractors to get 8 the hull inspections completed, and they intend to 9 be completed later this year. AVS's 10 Mr. Pete Bullard has been involved with the 11 development and progress of the surveying and 12 confirmed the property's efforts to complete it. 13 AVS does not feel that this extension 14 poses any risk to the life safety of the 15 passengers or crew of the casino vessel. It is the recommendation of American Vessel Services to 16 17 grant the L'Auberge Casino Baton Rouge a Temporary Certificate of Compliance to allow the property 18 19 adequate time to complete the hull inspection. 20 MS. JAMES: 21 We now present these findings to the 22 Board and ask that, upon the Board's acceptance of 23 AVS's report, you will move for the issuance of the second Temporary Certificate of Compliance for 24 25 L'Auberge Baton Rouge, which would expire on 18 1 October 31, 2022. 2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

3 Okay. So these are circumstances --

4 excuse me -- that are just unavoidable. It's just

5 Mother Nature --

6	MS. JAMES:
7	Yes.

21	is?
22	MS. REED:
23	Yes, sir.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Okay. All right. Any questions from

2	(NO RESPONSE)
3	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
4	Okay. I would entertain a motion at
5	this time that we issue a Temporary Certificate of
6	Compliance for L'Auberge Baton Rouge, which will
7	expire on October 31, 2022.
8	MS. HAMILTON-ACKER:

9	(Indicating)
10	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
11	Ms. Hamilton-Acker has moved to issue
12	that certificate.
13	MR. POOLE:
14	(Indicating)
15	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
16	And Mr. Poole has seconded that
17	motion. Is there any discussion on the motion?
18	(NO RESPONSE)
19	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
20	Hearing none, is there any opposition
21	to the motion?
22	(NO RESPONSE)
23	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
24	Okay. That motion carries. Thank
25	you very much. Okay.
	20
1	MS. JAMES:
2	Thank you.
3	MS. REED:
4	Thank you.
5	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
6	Okay. Moving on, now we have the
7	consideration of the Petition for the Relocation
8	of the Gaming Operations and a Modification of
9	License Conditions for Catfish Queen, LLC, doing
10	business as the Belle of Baton Rouge. And I think
11	we will have a PowerPoint presentation for for

12 this agenda item coming up.

13 MS. LANDRY:

14 Good morning, Chairman Johns and

15 Board Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General

16 Lisha Landry. With me is Tammy Haupt from

17 Louisiana State Police, Audit. We're here in the

18 matter of Catfish Queen, LLC, doing business as

19 Belle -- doing business as Belle of Baton Rouge

20 Casino's request to relocate its gaming operations

21 to a landside facility and modify certain license

22 conditions.

23 During the 2018 regular session, the

24 Louisiana Legislature passed Act 469, which gives

25 each riverboat licensee the opportunity to

21

1 relocate its gaming operations to a facility

2 within 1,200 feet of its licensed berth. Gaming

3 law and rules requires a licensee seeking

4 relocation to submit a site plan, a capital

5 improvement and reinvestment plan, a financing

6 plan, a construction schedule, and property

7 descriptions. All required documents were

8 submitted by the licensee to the Division for

9 review and investigation.

10 According to the information

11 submitted by the licensee, its proposed new

12 \$35 million, 50,720 square foot landside facility

13 will be located within 1,200 feet of the

14 riverboat's licensed berth in Downtown

- 15 Baton Rouge. The facility will include 16,500
- 16 square feet of gaming space located in its
- 17 existing Atrium, a sportsbook and lounge, food and
- 18 beverage facilities, and cruise line dock access.
- 19 The licensee will also be remodeling a portion of
- 20 its existing hotel. The land where the facility
- 21 will be located is owned by GLPI through a real
- 22 estate investment trust. GLPI has agreed to fund
- 23 up to \$28 million for the relocation project, and
- 24 the licensee and its parent company, CQ Holding,
- 25 will fund the remaining \$7 million.

1 The licensee is also requesting to

2 amend its Statement of Conditions to its riverboat

3 license to change its required non-gaming

4 amenities under the Approved Project to only

5 include a hotel with a minimum of 90 rooms, a

6 fitness center, a business center, a minimum of

7 three restaurants with a total minimum seating

8 capacity of 288, a 14,000 square foot Atrium, a

9 sportsbook, viewing area, and bar with a minimum

10 seating capacity of 75.

11 The licensee is also requesting to

12 reduce its required employees from 450 to 350 in

13 its Statement of Conditions as well.

14 The licensee's petition is up for

15 consideration today. Gaming law and rules do not

- 16 dictate a minimum monetary investment for
- 17 relocation. It's within the Board's discretion to

- 18 grant approval on a case-by-case basis.
- 19 If it's the Board's pleasure to
- 20 approve the licensee's requests, a resolution has
- 21 been prepared for your consideration. The
- 22 licensee will be allowed to begin construction
- 23 subject to further Board approval and to commence
- 24 gaming activities at its new facility only after
- 25 the Division has determined that all necessary

- 1 staffing, training, security, surveillance,
- 2 technical, accounting, and internal controls are
- 3 acceptable. After Audit reports its findings,
- 4 representatives from the licensee are here today
- 5 to give you a presentation on their proposal.

6 MS. HAUPT:

- 7 Good morning, Chairman Johns and
- 8 Board Members.
- 9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 10 Good morning.
- 11 MS. HAUPT:
- 12 My name is Tammy Haupt. I'm an
- 13 auditor with the Louisiana State Police, Gaming
- 14 Audit Section. Catfish Queen, LLC, doing business
- 15 as Belle of Baton Rouge, requested the Board's
- 16 approval to relocate its gaming operations from
- 17 its existing riverboat casino to a landside
- 18 facility in the existing -- existing Atrium, as
- 19 well as amend the license conditions necessary to
- 20 accommodate the relocation that were previously

21 outlined by Lisha Landry, Assistant Attorney

22 General.

23 The total landside project has a proposed

24 budget of \$35 million with funding commitments

25 from the licensee's parent company, CQ Holding

24

1 Company, to pay the estimated \$7 million in soft

- 2 costs associated with the project from its cash
- 3 flows and its landlord, Gaming and Leisure
- 4 Properties, GLPI, a real estate investment trust
- 5 that owns the real estate assets associated with

6 the Belle property and leases the assets back to

7 the Belle under a triple net lease, to fund up to

8 \$28 million of hard costs utilizing its

9 \$1.75 billion revolving credit facility. In

10 return, Belle's lease rent will increase by an

11 amount equal to 8.25 percent cap rate applied to

- 12 the total GLPI funded project cost.
- 13 On May 13, 2022, GLP Capital, an
- 14 affiliate -- affiliate of GLPI, entered into a

15 credit agreement that provided for a \$1.75 billion

16 unsecured revolving credit facility maturing in

17 May of 2026, plus two six-month extensions at

18 GLP Capital's option. GLP Capital is the primary

19 obligor under the credit agreement guaranteed by

20 GLPI with Wells Fargo Bank, NA serving as

21 administrative agent for the lenders.

- 22 As of June 30, 2022, GLPI reported a
- 23 \$394 million gross outstanding balance on the

- 24 revolving credit facility with contingent
- 25 obligations under letters of credit issued of

1 approximately \$0.4 million, leaving GLPI with over 2 \$1.3 million in available borrowing capacity under 3 its revolver to finance the \$28 million investment in this project. At June 30, 2022, GLP confirmed 4 5 it was in compliance with all financial covenants 6 under its revolving credit facility. 7 The proposed landside facility will have more than 50,000 square feet of total space, 8 9 which includes 16,500 square feet of gaming space 10 comprised of the main casino floor, a smoking casino patio adjacent to the casino floor with 14 11 gaming tables and 316 slot machines, allowing 12 13 guests to play slots, table games, and utilize 14 self-service sports betting kiosks to place wagers 15 in non-smoking and smoking environments; a new --16 a new \$2,492 -- 2,492 square foot sportsbook bar 17 and viewing area, four additional food and 18 beverage facilities, and hotel renovations to its existing hotel that has been closed since 2020. 19 20 The planned renovations will modernize the design 21 of the hotel rooms, the front desk and lobby, and 22 update its amenities. 23 According to the information provided by the Belle, the relocation of its gaming 24 25 operations and the update to non-gaming operations

26

- 1 at the landside facility will improve
- 2 accessibility to the casino and its amenities, as
- 3 well as off -- allow Belle -- allow the Belle to
- 4 offer its current dock space to cruise lines for
- 5 Mississippi cruise -- River cruises, thus
- 6 increasing foot traffic to the Belle's facility.
- 7 Based on the projected costs
- 8 associated with the new facility, Casino Queen's
- 9 historical reported cash flows and GLP's
- 10 borrowing -- borrowing available -- availability
- 11 against its revolving credit facility, the
- 12 Division determined that -- that the Belle has the
- 13 necessary funding available to make the capital
- 14 investment in the project.
- 15 The Corporate Securities Audit
- 16 Section found no information related to the
- 17 available financing to preclude the Board from
- 18 approving the proposed project.
- 19 MS. LANDRY:
- 20 We would be happy to answer any
- 21 questions you have.
- 22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 23 Okay. Any questions for our two
- 24 presenters this morning?
- 25 (NO RESPONSE)

- 1 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 2 Okay. Thank you, ladies. Appreciate
- 3 that. If we could ask CQ to come up to the table.

4	Mr. Downey, if you would, bring your guests with
5	you. And, Members, I think we're going to have a
6	PowerPoint presentation here. And before you, you
7	have the information on what's being proposed.
8	MR. BARBIN:
9	Good morning, Chairman Johns.
10	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
11	Good morning.
12	MR. BARBIN:
13	I'm Jeff Barbin with Phelps Dunbar.
14	We're excited to be here today to present
15	Casino Queen's landside petition. With me this
16	morning, Terry Downey, to my left, the CEO of
17	Casino Queen.
18	MR. DOWNEY:
19	Good morning.
20	MR. BARBIN:
21	To his left, Bruce Woods, who is the
22	new General Manager at Belle of Baton Rouge.
23	MR. WOODS:
24	Good morning.
25	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
	28
1	Good morning, Bruce.
2	MR. BARBIN:
3	And to his left is Stacy Stagg, who
4	is the VP of non-gaming ops for Casino Queen. And
5	now we have a PowerPoint presentation. I'm going
6	to turn it over to Mr. Downey

6 to turn it over to Mr. Downey.

7	MR. DOWNEY:
8	Okay. Good morning.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Good morning, Mr. Downey.
11	MR. DOWNEY:
12	We're really excited to show you
13	these slides.
14	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
15	Why don't you speak right into the
16	microphone, if you would,
17	MR. DOWNEY:
18	Okay.
19	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
20	because we want to make sure we
21	capture it.
22	MR. DOWNEY:
23	We're very excited this morning to
24	show the slides of how we envision the future
25	of of the Belle. And we'll get started.
	29
1	This map shows the present layout of
2	the property where the boat is, the dock, the
3	walkway to the Atrium. That's the Atrium circled
4	in blue. The big circle shows the the Atrium
5	is within 200 feet of the current dock.
6	As we go into this slide, this is
7	kind of a balloon look at the layout of what we're
8	looking at. All the way over to the right is the
9	entryway with a brand-new designed front desk and

lobby area. And right above that in the gray is a 10 terrace cafe. This whole area will be accessible 11 12 to -- just on the terrace and the lobby area to families that are visiting the hotel. So they'll 13 14 have full use of food and beverage that way. 15 As you step up into the casino, right -- yeah, right in that area right there, the 16 17 blue area is, or purple -- I have a little trouble 18 with colors; so -- the purple area is the actual 19 gaming space. You can see you walk in. You'll 20 step into a table games area and surrounded by 21 slots. You see it go up through a little bit of a 22 hallway at the top, and there's a smoking patio out there, which is, we all know, so important in 23 this day and age. 24 25 Down to the left in green is where

30

the sportsbook area is planned for. We're very 1 2 excited. We have roughly, I believe, 125 seats in that area, including the bar. If you go to the 3 4 green area above, it's the restaurant product, and 5 it's -- it's going to be -- you know, this whole project is -- is very boutiquey, very fun, and 6 7 we're looking at this as a first phase project, this first \$35 million. So we're going to have a 8 wine bar in there, a pizza kitchen, an oyster bar. 9 10 And then at the very top, you'll see 11 going across that back wall there's two bowling lanes in there. And it's just going to be kind of 12

13 a loungey, fun place for people to hang out, have

14 a cocktail, and just enjoy themselves.

15 So as you go over to the left, you see the event space in pink. That's the rest of 16 17 the Atrium. The -- right now we won't be 18 developing, but we will, you know, put in new 19 carpet, new drapes, everything in there. We'll be 20 able to do events, concerts, that sort of thing. 21 If you move down to the hotel area, 22 there's presently, roughly, 280 rooms, and in 23 Phase 1 we want to renovate -- the top four floors 24 will yield about 90 rooms out of it. 25 And with that being said, let's move

31

to the next slide, and I'll give you a little more 1 detail on the floor. You can see down to the 2 3 right, you walk in. You see the whole new front desk area, the cafe. Then you step up in the 4 5 casino. You see the table games. You walk right into it. Down at the far end, you're seeing 6 7 straight through to the sportsbook areas and all the big screens. Up to the right is most of the 8 9 slot floor, and then upper right of that is the -the pizza kitchen, the wine bar, the oyster bar, 10 and the loungey bar area up there with -- with the 11 entertainment, such as the bowling lanes and such. 12 13 So the next slide, I want to walk you 14 through what the look of it is going to be, and 15 it's -- you know, we kind of studied the Atrium in

16 its past and -- and what it looks like sitting 17 there, and we decided to go with this kind of 18 modern industrial theme. And so to the left you 19 see the lobby area behind that pony wall and the 20 front desk behind it. Those -- those lines going 21 up behind the front desk that you see are, like, 22 old railroad ties. And so very modern industrial. 23 Over to the right will be the terrace cafe. Then 24 as you pass -- just past the terrace cafe, you see 25 a coffee grab-and-go there, and then just left to

32

1 that is the entrance going up into the casino.

And if you look up at the ceiling,
you know, the Atrium is -- is quite tall. There
will be floating ceiling pieces throughout the
lobby in the casino. You'll -- you'll see it in
some of the other slides.

7 This slide is -- now you've stepped 8 up into the casino from the lobby area. You're 9 kind of looking at a straight shot down through 10 the casino. So to the left you have table games, a few slots, and you see the sportsbook in the 11 12 background with the big TVs. 13 This next slide, this is the entrance 14 up into the oyster bar, bistro, wine bar area, and when you look at it, that -- that's the hostess 15 stand that you're looking at, and that's the 16 17 wheels of an old railroad car. So we're 18 continuing with this industrial theme, and we'll

19 carry it throughout. And you see the finishings

20 and the look. Very modern industrial.

This is once you've stepped up into
it. You can see the wine bar down to the right.
You see the pizza ovens, and then to the left
would be the oyster bar. When you get over into
the loungey -- don't worry about, "Rebel Without a
33

1 Cause." It's -- we will put something appropriate 2 up there. This was a designer's idea of fun. But 3 you see the bowling lanes and kind of a loungey area, a good place to, you know, hang out after 4 5 work or whatever you're in the hotel for. 6 This next slide is the remaining piece of the Atrium. And, like I say, we totally 7 plan on doing some entertainment in there. We can 8 9 get quite a few people in there. We'll have all 10 new carpet. We'll have new sound drapes all the 11 way around. And then, in addition to that, you'll 12 get a great view out of the Atrium in the evening 13 when you're most likely to be using this space. 14 Probably wondering, those of you that 15 have been to the hotel there, what we're going to do with it. We're going to carry the modern 16 industrial theme through the hotel rooms. So what 17 you're looking at is the living room of a 18 19 one-bedroom suite. You see the modern industrial 20 look, the big slider door. And then the regular 21 hotel room, as you look through the entry into the

bedroom, will -- will have that look of that -- of
the bedroom. So we're really happy with this
design that we've been able to develop.

25 This is just to give you an idea of 34

1 the size of the Atrium. The casino itself is

2 pretty high. You see some of the floating

3 ceilings in there, and you still have that much

4 Atrium over the top. So it -- you know, it's a

5 massive building. From the very first time we

6 looked at it, we got excited about it, and there's

7 unlimited potential on this property. There's --

8 there's other buildings on the property that we

9 can phase into as we -- as we go. As

10 Chairman Johns said, the cost of the project right

11 now is \$35 million, and we think we're going to

12 put out a beautiful Phase 1 with that \$35 million.

13 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

14 You're welcome to spend more than

15 that, if you would like to; so . . .

16 MR. DOWNEY:

17 I -- I've noted that from several

18 conversations with Chairman Johns. And so just to

19 go into a little bit more detail, I want to turn

20 it over to Stacy Stagg, and she's going to clarify

21 and interpret anything that I said.

- 22 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 23 Great.
- 24 MS. STAGG:

25	Thank you, Chairman
	35
1	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
2	Good morning, Stacy.
3	MS. STAGG:
4	Good morning, Chairman Johns and the
5	Board. I really appreciate your time this
6	morning. Terry just presented the overall plan to
7	move the Belle landside, and we feel this design
8	significantly improves the guest experience and
9	will allow us to grow our revenues in a highly
10	competitive market here in Baton Rouge.
11	I would like to continue on and
12	highlight some of the a few key elements that
13	will assist us in accomplishing this. First,
14	moving the Belle landside will improve the
15	accessibility to our gamers and our patrons.
16	Significantly, right now it it takes you almost
17	three foot the length of three football fields
18	to get out to the casino. Many of you might have
19	traveled that length. We want to fix that for our
20	guests.
21	Second, the much needed hotel
22	renovation, which we hear across the city, is
23	highly needed, and we want to update the room
24	product and help the property reengage with the
25	city traveler and the convention business here in

1 Baton Rouge. We feel like we can contribute to

2 that.

3	Our our food and beverage program,
4	we're is extremely robust for the boutique
5	hotel that Terry described. We are going to cater
6	to both the casino and the hotel guests, as Terry
7	described. We have several options for
8	non-gamers, as well as gamers to frequent the
9	hotel. We're excited about that as well.
10	Also, which is semi-new down here in
11	Louisiana is the sportsbook live, you know,
12	betting system. We're accustomed to it in other
13	markets, and we see the high traffic that that
14	brings and the new demographic that that brings to
15	the properties, as well as an energy that is
16	unknown. If you've ever been in a small sports
17	bar, you get a little taste of that during
18	football season. This is on a grander level, and
19	we're excited to expose that to the entire
20	property.
21	The property is also seeing a large
22	turndown in business due to the smoking ban. So
23	the addition of the smoking area in the casino is
24	going to help us recapture some of that business
25	back that we have lost over at the Belle.
	37

2 Intent from the American Cruise Line, as you heard

3 the auditor say, that will utilize our dock and

4 bring in thousands of patrons a week, which will

- 5 add to the Baton Rouge community. And we feel
- 6 like, with this design, we'll be able to capture
- 7 and benefit from all of the things that we're
- 8 adding and -- and benefit from those patrons
- 9 coming on.
- 10 In doing that, we're also proud to
- 11 say that we will be adding 200 more positions to
- 12 the property. The Belle currently has 150
- 13 employees, and we'll be adding a total of 200 to
- 14 make that 350 total employees with us in Phase 1.
- 15 And now I would like to turn it over
- 16 to our general manager, who is fairly new to the
- 17 Belle, and we're glad to have him. He's a
- 18 longtime resident of Baton Rouge, Bruce Woods, and
- 19 he'll give some color on the culture now and what
- 20 we currently have and what we want it to be.
- 21 Right, Bruce?
- 22 MR. WOODS:
- 23 Yes, Stacy.
- 24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 25 Good morning, Mr. Woods, and welcome
 - 38
- 1 to our meeting, and congratulations on your
- 2 position, and we look -- you and I have spoken by
- 3 phone but --
- 4 MR. WOODS:
- 5 Yes.
- 6 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 7 -- so glad to meet you, and we look

8 forward to working with you.

9 MR. WOODS:

10 Well, thank you, Chairman Johns.

11 Good morning, sir. To all the Board Members, good

12 morning and thank you for allowing me to be here

13 before you this morning.

14 As Terry and Stacy stated, it's --

15 I'm very excited about the project that we're

16 doing here. I've been a Baton Rouge resident now

17 for 28 years. And the Office of the Mayor, as

18 well -- as well as the Downtown Development

19 District, the Baton Rouge Area Chamber, have done

20 a great job of revitalizing Downtown. And I

21 believe what we're going to do with this project,

22 we're only going to enhance what they've done

23 already in terms of making Downtown a more

24 appealing place for people to go and visit and

25 dine and enjoy themselves.

39

1 But what we're going to do here is 2 we're going to be a casino that has a lot of energy. The way that it's designed, it's -- like 3 4 Terry mentioned, it's a boutique casino, but it's 5 a first-class project, and we're going to offer first-class service. 6 7 Like Stacy mentioned, we have 150 team members now, and many of them are day-one 8 9 team members. And most of them have been there 10 for at least a decade; so they're very committed

11 to the Belle, have an emotional attachment there,

12 as well as so -- a lot of the people in the

13 community.

14 So we think it's going to be great

15 for Downtown. It's going to be great for the

16 community, and we're real excited to do this

17 project, if approved.

18 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

19 Well, I will tell you, visiting with

20 the Visit Baton Rouge folks, they're extremely

21 excited about the reopening of this hotel.

22 They -- they want and they need more rooms in the

23 Downtown area. And I know we're -- on the

24 resolution today is a minimum of 90 rooms, and

25 it's just our hope that in the future y'all will

40

1 be expanding that as needed. So I hope you really

2 need them; so . . .

3 A question I do have on the river

4 cruises, will both Hollywood and the Belle both be

5 docking river cruises?

6 MS. STAGG:

7 Yes.

8 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

- 9 Are they two different --
- 10 MS. STAGG:

11 Yes.

12 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

13 -- cruise lines?

14	MS. STAGG:
15	Viking will be at the Hollywood,
16	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
17	Okay.
18	MS. STAGG:
19	and American Cruise Lines and
20	there's two American Cruise Lines. If we're
21	approved for landside, we can start negotiating
22	and kind of schedule the docking along the
23	river
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Okay.
	41
1	MS. STAGG:
2	with both properties.
3	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
4	Which of the cruise lines actually
5	bring in more cruise ships out of the two? Would
6	you have an idea on that?
7	MS. STAGG:
8	Viking right now.
9	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
10	Viking would?
11	MS. STAGG:
12	And then American Cruise Lines has
13	the bigger cruise line, and then they have a
14	smaller one as well; so
15	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
16	Okay.

17	MS. STAGG:
18	pretty comparable, Chairman Johns.
19	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
20	Okay. I'm excited about that.
21	That's
22	MS. STAGG:
23	Uh-huh.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	That's real possibilities for
	42
1	Baton Rouge for Downtown Baton Rouge.
2	MS. STAGG:
3	We are too because of the influx of
4	new
5	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
6	Right.
7	MS. STAGG:
8	patrons coming in on a weekly
9	basis. That's exciting for us in the in our
10	industry, as well as what it can bring to the
11	to the Baton Rouge area. They dock for about ten
12	hours; so they're here all day.
13	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
14	Well, great. And they need something
15	to do. Right?
16	MS. STAGG:
17	They've got to yeah, they spend
18	that money.
19	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

20 We hope. So, Board Members, any

21 questions? Mr. Poole, our local Baton Rouge board

22 member here.

23 MR. POOLE:

24 Yeah. Can someone give me an idea of

25 the construction schedule that you're looking at,

43

1 if the approval goes through?

2 MR. DOWNEY:

3 Sure. We actually have a slide, if

4 we can throw it back up. There we go. And -- and

5 pardon us, because we were anticipating hopefully

6 making the August agenda; so we just have to add a

7 month to this slide, but I'll read it how it is.

8 Hoping, obviously, for landside approval by

9 September, we'll have contracts signed with

10 architectural MEP and the AV people. By January

11 we should be ready to submit for -- for permits

12 and -- and bidding out everything.

13 Preconstruction will also start in January. The

14 start of construction will be in March of '23,

15 with a grand opening roughly 12 to 13 months

16 later.

17 And I -- I should also note, you

18 know, we've been operating the property for a few

19 months now, and we've already started -- we've

20 committed, I believe, \$1.35 million. We pulled

21 some demo permits. We've already been working in

22 the hotel, not constructing but the demoing,

23	figuring out what's laying ahead of us, and so
24	we're kind of getting a jump-start on it.
25	MR. POOLE:
	44
1	Is Phase 2 contingent upon the
2	performance and the success of the
3	MR. DOWNEY:
4	Yes.
5	MR. POOLE:
6	of the casino?
7	MR. DOWNEY:
8	Yes.
9	MR. POOLE:
10	Okay. So there's no commitment to
11	Phase 2 at this point?
12	MR. DOWNEY:
13	The commitment I feel very, very
14	confident about it, and I this property is
15	going to do very well with with what we've
16	designed here. And I I can't say there's a
17	commitment to it other than, when we hit certain
18	cash flow hurdles, it will happen.
19	MR. POOLE:
20	Right. It's a great property, and
21	everybody in Baton Rouge wants to see it succeed.
22	MS. STAGG:
23	Uh-huh.
24	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
25	Mr. Poole, would you pull the mic up

	45
1	a little closer?
2	MR. POOLE:
3	Yeah. They want to see it succeed
4	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
5	Great. There you go.
6	MR. POOLE:
7	All right. So, yeah, everybody in
8	Baton Rouge wants to see that property succeed,
9	and so we're all backing you. We're looking
10	forward to it. And the hotel, we would love to
11	see that completed out as well. So you've heard
12	that from four or five people at least. Right?
13	MR. DOWNEY:
14	We've been coming here for about a
15	little better than a year and a half now, and
16	everyone we meet, where we stay, where we eat,
17	everyone talks about wanting to see something
18	great at the Belle; so we're very excited.
19	MR. POOLE:
20	Great. We appreciate it.
21	CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
22	Thank you, Mr. Poole. Mr. Sholes?
23	MR. SHOLES:
24	Yes, sir. Can you tell me what
25	percentage of your construction cost now would be
	46
1	dedicated to disadvantaged businesses?
r	

2 MS. STAGG:

3	Advantage positions?
4	MR. DOWNEY:
5	Disadvantaged businesses.
6	MS. STAGG:
7	Oh, disadvantaged businesses.
8	MR. DOWNEY:
9	I don't have an answer for that at
10	this point.
11	MR. SHOLES:
12	And if you're anticipating 350
13	employees, what percentage of those are going to
14	be earning less than \$15.00 an hour?
15	MR. DOWNEY:
16	I do have an answer for that. I was
17	forewarned. Stacy?
18	MS. STAGG:
19	Yeah. Right now, currently, our
20	blended rate is \$16.02 on the on the Belle, and
21	we anticipate that to maintain as we move forward.
22	MR. SHOLES:
23	Forgive me. Can you explain the
24	blended rate?
25	MS. STAGG:
	47
1	Yeah. So we have a non-tip position
2	and a tipped position, and when we blend those
3	together, based on the amount of team members,
4	that's the blended rate; so we have Bruce, do
5	you have that sheet? Oh, tipped rate right now is

- 6 \$14.08, and non-tipped is \$16.25.
- 7 MR. SHOLES:
- 8 And I notice on Exhibit B -- I saw

9 the numbers where you've got from 8-something down

- 10 to 3.51. I didn't see anything -- how you got
- 11 from 4.50 to 3.50. One day when you have some
- 12 time, I would like somebody to explain that one to
- 13 me.
- 14 MS. STAGG:
- 15 I can quickly give you an overcap.
- 16 MR. SHOLES:
- 17 Great. Thank you.
- 18 MS. STAGG:
- 19 In 2013, our understanding is that
- 20 they came forward and got an agreement for the
- 21 4.50, and they exceeded that up until 2020, the
- 22 fourth quarter -- during COVID. And with the
- 23 closure of the hotel, the restaurants and all of
- 24 that, they haven't needed -- and table games.
- 25 Those are -- those are going to be the bulk of

- 1 where we're adding the -- the team members back,
- 2 in table games, the hotel, reopening the hotel,
- 3 and the food outlets. We're going to have a lot
- 4 more food and beverage outlets than the Belle did,
- 5 existing labor, but it's in Phase 1. We're going
- 6 to gradually get there. So with the 200 more team
- 7 members, that's the bulk.
- 8 MR. SHOLES:

9 Thank you.

10 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

11	And I would comment on that also. I
12	know, unfortunately, virtually every property in
13	this state, the employment numbers are down. I
14	think COVID had a lot to do with it. Hurricanes
15	over in Southwest Louisiana, and then Ida last
16	year, no doubt, had some some play into that
17	but I think COVID more than anything and then just
18	market conditions, particularly up in the
19	Shreveport-Bossier market.
20	So there are some voluntary goals out
21	there, and we we hope everybody would meet
22	those goals, but we're we're actually in talks
23	with the with the association now on a
24	different methodology of of certain goals;
25	so But I'm excited. I knew y'all were down
	49
1	to about 150 employees, and to add 200 more
2	employees to Baton Rouge is a big deal, and we
3	we thank you for that.
4	So any other questions from the
5	Board? Any other questions? Ms. Berry?
6	MS. BERRY:
7	I just want to make a quick comment.
8	I'm kind of glad to see that you brought your
9	employee goal down to more of a realistic number.
10	I know we've been fighting this for years and
11	years, to meet those voluntary numbers, and I

12	think,	if	l'm	not	mistaken,	you'r	e the	first one
----	--------	----	-----	-----	-----------	-------	-------	-----------

- 13 that's come down to lower it to a little bit more
- 14 realistic number; so maybe some of the others will
- 15 follow, because there's been so many changes and
- 16 COVID problems that -- making some of these
- 17 casinos look bad, because they're not meeting
- 18 those employee levels. It was a little bit
- 19 unrealistic; so I think -- I'm proud of y'all for
- 20 doing that.
- 21 MS. STAGG:
- 22 Thank you.
- 23 MR. DOWNEY:
- 24 Thank you. Thank you.
- 25 MS. STAGG:
 - 50
- 1 And, Ms. Berry, we -- we took it
- 2 to -- the level that you said, we actually
- 3 constructed schedules for a 24-hour operation in
- 4 all of the departments, made our own new
- 5 compendium based on the 90-room hotel and the
- 6 table games addition, the sportsbook addi -- all
- 7 of the additions; so we really feel like that is a
- 8 true number that we need to maintain that
- 9 property.
- 10 MS. BERRY:
- 11 I think that's very important, not to
- 12 mention it's -- it went up; so that's good.
- 13 MS. STAGG:
- 14 Yes. Yes.

15	MS.	BERRY:

- 16 So thank you very much.
- 17 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 18 I can remember going into the Atrium
- 19 years ago when it was a really viable building and
- 20 looking around and saying, "This could make a
- 21 great casino"; so it's -- it's coming to fruition.
- 22 Okay. Okay. Any further questions, Members?
- 23 (NO RESPONSE)
- 24 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 25 Anything else, Mr. Downey, that you
 - 51

1 would like to share in closing?

- 2 MR. DOWNEY:
- 3 No. I -- I feel we laid it out here
- 4 pretty much, and Stacy and Bruce both expanded on
- 5 it a little bit, and we're -- like I say, we've
- 6 kind of put our foot in the water already doing a
- 7 little work around the hotel, and we're just real
- 8 excited to get our approvals and get rocking.

9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:

- 10 Well, I'll tell you -- I think I can
- 11 speak for the entire board. I hope I can, but we
- 12 want to thank CQ for your commitment to
- 13 Baton Rouge in the last year or so. I mean,
- 14 you're putting 80 million, or, according to one
- 15 comment I made, 100 million, but -- it may be
- 16 100 million before, you know, the smoke clears.
- 17 But, no, seriously, CQ is making a significant

18 commitment to this community, and we -- we greatly 19 appreciate that, and to our state; so we thank 20 y'all very much. 21 MR. DOWNEY: 22 Great. We've -- since we've started 23 coming here, we love Baton Rouge. It's -- I'm 24 here, so far, twice a month, a couple of weeks a 25 month, and --52 MS. STAGG: 1 2 I lived here this summer. MR. DOWNEY: 3 4 And Stacy lived here this summer, and 5 Bruce has lived here for a long time. So we truly enjoy the area and the environment, and I've 6 7 over-enjoyed the -- the food and -- but we're 8 excited to be here. 9 CHAIRMAN JOHNS: 10 Well, great. Thank you very much. 11 So members, to approve this, we have to do it by 12 resolution, and I -- we have a resolution that's 13 before you. - 3 CQ Holding is the parent company of
- 4 licensees Louisiana Casino Cruises LLC, doing
- 5 business as Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge, and
- 6 Catfish Queen, LLC, doing business as Belle of
- 7 Baton Rouge. CQ Holding is wholly owned by
- 8 SGCQ Gaming, LLC, which is owned by Standard
- 9 General Master Fund II and Standard General Focus
- 10 Fund.
- 11 On June 15, 2022, Louisiana Casino
- 12 Cruises and Catfish Queen notified the Board of a

- 13 new debt transaction where CQ Holding would become
- 14 the borrowing party to a \$120 million Term B loan
- 15 from Fortress Credit Corporation. This new debt
- 16 transaction is related to Standard General Master
- 17 Fund II's strategic investment in Intralot, which
- 18 is a global lottery and sports betting technology
- 19 provider and whose CEO and founder is Sokratis
- 20 P. Kokkalis. Intralot is buying out its minority
- 21 shareholders in its U.S. subsidiary through a
- 22 rights issue, which allows the company to issue
- 23 shares offered at a special price to existing
- 24 shareholders in proportion to the shares they
- 25 currently hold.

- 1 The purpose of the initial
- 2 \$120 million loan agreement is for CQ Holding to
- 3 finance a loan to Mr. Kokkalis related to the
- 4 Intralot rights offering, to fund an Intralot
- 5 Backstop Purchase to guarantee that a certain
- 6 amount of shares in Intralot will remain available
- 7 for Mr. Kokkalis to purchase, fund the refinancing
- 8 of all existing third-party debt, including the
- 9 \$29 million loan from Citizens Bank executed in
- 10 December of 2021, to acquire Louisiana Casino
- 11 Cruises and Catfish Queen, and pay fees and
- 12 expenses associated with the transaction. This
- 13 transaction also allows CQ Holding to request
- 14 increases to the initial term loan facility in the
- 15 total aggregate amount of \$10 million. The

- 16 effective interest rate of this loan is
- 17 11 percent. The loan agreement requires both
- 18 guaranty and mortgage of all subsidiaries of
- 19 CQ Holding, including Louisiana Casino Cruises and
- 20 Catfish Queen. There is no change in ownership of
- 21 the two licensees occurring at this time.
- 22 After review of the proposed debt
- 23 transaction, the Audit Section and our office have
- 24 determined that the proposed new debt financing
- 25 entered into by CQ Holding and Fortress Credit

1 requires Board approval.

2 Additionally, when the Board was notified of the proposed debt transaction, the 3 licensees requested that CQ Holding be allowed to 4 5 close on the financing in order to take advantage 6 of current market conditions. On June -- on 7 July 12, 2022, Chairman Johns, by letter, advised 8 the licensees that the financing could close 9 pending Board approval subject to the condition 10 that Catfish Queen and Louisiana Casino Cruises would not guarantee the loan or provide any 11 12 pledges of assets or other securities until the debt transaction was approved by the Board and 13 that CQ Holding or any of its subsidiaries or 14 affiliates would not pledge its ownership interest 15 in the licensees until Board approval of the full 16 17 debt transaction was obtained. On July 13, 18 CQ Holding closed on the financing. This matter

19 is now before the Board for your consideration and

20 full approval.

21 Audit has completed its review of the

22 debt transaction and will now report its findings

23 to the Board.

24 MS. JACKSON:

25 Good morning, Chairman Johns and

1 Board Members. My name is Donna Jackson with

- 2 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Audit Section.
- 3 CQ Holding Company, Inc., proposes to

4 borrow \$120 million under a new credit facility

- 5 agreement with Fortress Credit Corp. as the
- 6 administrative agent and sole lender. The uses of
- 7 the loan have previously been described and are
- 8 shown on the schedule on page 4 of our report. In
- 9 addition to the \$120 million loan, CQ Holding will
- 10 utilize a portion of its cash on hand. A chart
- 11 depicting the components of this transaction are
- 12 shown on page 6. The representations, warranties,
- 13 and covenants of this agreement are those usual
- 14 and customary when compared to similar agreements.
- 15 The loan will mature in five years.
- 16 CQ Holding representatives stated
- 17 they project improvement and financial performance
- 18 due to business initiatives and investments in the
- 19 properties and feel CQ Holding can cover its debt
- 20 service and meet its financial covenants. The
- 21 Audit Section can't -- cannot state with any

- 22 degree of certainty that CQ Holding will be able
- 23 to achieve its projections given the increase in
- 24 CQ Holding's debt, the 11 percent effective
- 25 interest rate on the loan, and the historical

1 revenue performance of CQ Holdings' operating

2 subsidiaries. No other financial issues came to

3 our attention to preclude the Board's approval of

4 this transaction.

5 MS. LANDRY:

6 And if it's the Board's pleasure to

7 approve the debt transaction, a resolution has

8 been prepared for your consideration.

- 2 business and business assets to the applicant; and
- 3 Amid Travel Plaza, Incorporated, sold all of its
- 4 rights, title, and interest in the immovable

5 property and improvements of the truck stop

- 6 facility to Stopanbuy Investments, LLC.
- 7 Also, on March 2, 2021, the applicant
- 8 and Stopanbuy Investments entered into a lease for
- 9 the immovable property and improvements of the
- 10 truck stop facility. On May 3, 2021, Stopanbuy
- 11 Investments, LLC, sold a 19 percent interest in
- 12 the immovable property and improvements of the
- 13 truck stop facility to Kata Family, Limited

14 Partnership. Srinivas Kata is the sole member of

16 Criminal Investigator William Landry 17 conducted a suitability investigation of the 18 relevant person associated with the applicant and 19 conducted an on-site inspection of the truck stop facility. He is present today and will report the 20 21 Office of State Police's findings to the Board. 22 MR. LANDRY: 23 Good morning, Chairman Johns, and 24 Board Members. Investigator William Landry with 25 Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement. I

- 12 spouses are Mina Tejani, Kiran Tejani,
- 13 Chetnaben Patel, Nikita Patel, Sarina Patel, and
- 14 Roshni Patel.
- 15 Investigator William Landry inspected
- 16 the truck stop facility and conducted suitability
- 17 investigations of the associated persons, and he
- 18 is here this morning to report the Division's
- 19 findings to the Board.

20 MR. LANDRY:

- 21 Good morning, Chairman, again, and
- 22 Board Members. I conducted the suitability
- 23 investigation and updated background checks on all
- 24 the relevant persons associated with this
- 25 application. An on-site inspection was conducted,

- 1 and it was determined that it met all criteria for
- 2 a qualified truck stop facility. All licenses and

- 3 permits were posted at the time of inspection.
- 4 The establishment consists of 10.655 acres.
- 5 As the applicant purchased the business from the previous licensee, Brushy Creek 6 7 Development Corporation, who was originally 8 licensed on June 2, 1994, it is not subject to the 9 rule that they must be within one mile from a 10 school, church, playground, synagogue, public 11 library, residence, or building on a National 12 Historic Register. I found no information that 13 would preclude the issuance of a Type 5 video 14 poker gaming license to Tallulah Travel Plaza, 15 LLC, doing business as Tallulah Travel Plaza or to preclude Aziz Tejani, Mina Tejani, Alnoor Tejani, 16 17 Kiran Tejani, Snehal Patel, Chetnaben Patel, Amit Patel, Nikita Patel, Pinu Patel, 18 19 Sarina Patel, Ankur Patel, and Roshni Patel from 20 participating in the gaming industry. 21 MS. MURRAY-BROWN: 22 And the Office of the Attorney 23 General has reviewed the file prepared by the Office of State Police, and the information 24 25 contained therein would not preclude the issuance 76 1 of a Type 5 license.
- 2 CHAIRMAN JOHNS:
- 3 Okay. Sounds like a real family

- 8 Pursuant to Louisiana Revised
- 9 Statute 27:601, the Board is charged with issuing
- 10 or denying applications of sports wagering
- 11 licenses. The applicant is eligible for a sports

- 13 riverboat gaming licensee. The Board issued a
- 14 Temporary Certificate of Authority to the
- 15 applicant to conduct business as a sports wagering
- 16 licensee with an effective date of March 17, 2022.
- 17 The TCOA expires on September 17, 2022.
- 18 State Police's Gaming Division has
- 19 reviewed the investigation of the application and
- 20 will now report its findings to the Board.

21 MS. HAUPT:

- 22 Good morning, Chairman Johns and
- 23 Board Members. My name is Tammy Haupt. I'm with
- 24 Louisiana State Police's Gaming Audit Section.

25 The Audit Section has reviewed the financial

- 1 information submitted by the sports wagering
- 2 license applicant, Louisiana Cruises, LL --
- 3 Louisiana Casino Cruises, LLC, doing business as
- 4 Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge, and its parent
- 5 company, CQ Holding Company, Inc. In addition to
- 6 Hollywood, Casino Queen operates one additional
- 7 gaming property in the state of Louisiana,
- 8 Catfish Queen, LLC, doing business as Belle of

9 Baton Rouge.

- 10 On November 15, 2021, Hollywood
- 11 entered into a sports wagering agreement with
- 12 DraftKings, Inc., doing business as DraftKings
- 13 Sportsbook, a Delaware Corporation and wholly
- 14 owned direct subsidiary of Direct -- of

- 15 DraftKings, Inc., a Nevada Corporation. The
- 16 agreement allows DraftKings to provide the
- 17 licensee a turnkey retail sports wagering

18 operation under the DraftKings brand, as well as

19 on premise online sports wagering. This allows

20 Hollywood's patrons to place on premise online

21 sports wagers via DraftKing's mobile app.

22 It is our assessment, based on the

23 information reviewed, Hollywood possesses the

24 financial ability to develop, construct, operate,

25 and maintain its sports wagering operations. No

1 financial issues came to the Audit Section's

2 attention that were of such nature as to preclude

3 the Board from approving the issuance of a sports

4 wagering license to Hollywood. Licensing will now

5 present their findings.

6 MR. PERKINS:

7 Good morning, Chairman Johns, Members

8 of the Board. I'm Criminal Investigator

9 Rodney Perkins with Louisiana State Police, Gaming

10 Enforcement Division.

11 On November 15, 2021, Louisiana State

12 Police, Gaming Enforcement Division, received a

13 sports wagering license application from

14 Louisiana Casino Cruises, LLC, doing business as

15 Hollywood Casino Baton Rouge. In accordance with

25	provider permit application of RSI LA, LLC, doing

1	business as BetRivers.
2	Pursuant to the Louisiana Sports
3	Wagering Act, the Board is charged with issuing or
4	denying applications for sports wagering platform
5	provider permits. The Board issued a Temporary

6 Certificate of Authority to the applicant to

- 7 conduct business as a sports wagering platform
- 8 provider with an effective date of
- 9 January 26, 2022. The TCOA was set to expire on
- 10 July 26, 2022; however, after a request was made
- 11 by the applicant for an extension of time, the
- 12 expiration of the TCOA was extended for 90 days,
- 13 and that began July 27, 2022. The TCOA expires on
- 14 October 25, 2022.
- 15 State Police's Gaming Division has
- 16 reviewed and investigated the application and will
- 17 now present its findings to the Board.

18 MS. HAUPT:

- 19 Good morning. My name is Tammy Haupt
- 20 with Louisiana State Police's Gaming Audit
- 21 Section. The Audit Section has reviewed the
- 22 financial information submitted in conjunction
- 23 with the sports wagering platform provider permit
- 24 applicant, RSI LA, LLC, doing business as
- 25 BetRivers, as well as its -- its direct and

87

1 indirect parent companies.

2 RSI LA is a wholly owned subsidiary

3 of Rush Street Interactive, LP, and an indirect

4 subsidiary of Rush Street Interactive, Inc., with

- 5 RSI, Inc., owning 29 percent of RSI, LP, and
- 6 non-controlling interest -- interests owning the
- 7 remaining 71 percent. RSI, Inc., establishes and
- 8 utilizes subsidiaries, usually in the form of
- 9 limited liability companies, to facilitate its

- 10 operations in jurisdictions where it's licensed to
- 11 operate; therefore, RSI, Inc., and its
- 12 subsidiaries will be collectively referred to as
- 13 RSI.
- 14 RSI generates the majority of its
- 15 revenues from a combination of real-money online
- 16 casino, online sports betting, and/or retail
- 17 sports betting in 17 jurisdictions. This includes
- 18 14 U.S. states, Columbia, Mexico, and Canada, with
- 19 its revenue predominantly coming from U.S. op --
- 20 U.S. operations.
- 21 In February of 2021, RSI entered into
- 22 a Sports Wagering and Interactive Gaming License
- 23 with Penn National Gaming, Inc., now known as
- 24 Penn Entertainment, Inc. This strategic
- 25 partnership allows RSI to offer it's

88

- 1 BetRivers-branded sports betting and casino
- 2 platform and services to Penn subsidiaries and
- 3 affiliated entities for up to 20 years in seven
- 4 U.S. states, including Louisiana, if and when
- 5 authorized under applicable law.
- 6 Since Louisiana sports wagering laws
- 7 require sports wagering platform provider
- 8 permittees to contract directly with a licensee,
- 9 two joinders to this agreement were executed in
- 10 January of 2022 and June of 2022 to include both
- 11 the Louisiana sports wagering licensee and
- 12 platform provider permittee. As a result, RSI

- 13 became Bossier Casino Ventures, LLC, doing
- 14 business as Margarita Resort Casino's Louisiana
- 15 gaming partner utilizing one of Margaritaville's
- 16 legally authorized mobile licenses.
- 17 RSI has generated record levels of
- 18 revenue for 13 consecutive quarters with second
- 19 quarter revenue reported at \$143.7 million in
- 20 2022, up 17 percent from \$122.8 million in 2021,
- 21 and revenues for the fiscal year ending
- 22 December 31, 2021, reported at \$488.1 million, an
- 23 increase of 75 percent when compared to
- 24 \$287.5 million in 2020.
- 25
- RSI's current revenue projections for

89

1 the full year ending December 31, 2022, are

- 2 between \$600 million and \$630 million. This
- 3 represents a 26 percent increase year-to-year
- 4 growth increase in revenue using the \$615 million
- 5 midpoint. The increase in forecasted revenue for
- 6 2022 is mainly due to and directly correlated with
- 7 RSI's growth in the majority of its existing
- 8 markets as -- and expansion into new markets.
- 9 RSI has a history of operating
- 10 losses, reporting operating losses of
- 11 \$75.8 million for the second quarter of 2022 and
- 12 operating losses of \$94.3 million and
- 13 \$133.4 million for the years ending December 31,
- 14 2021, and 2020, respectively. Operating losses
- 15 are not uncommon with emerging sports wagering

- 16 platform providers, as significant investments are
- 17 required for entry into new regulated

18 jurisdictions, as well as increased costs related

19 to online and retail penetration.

20 Although RSI has incurred operating

21 losses over the past three years, it has achieved

22 record revenue growth while achieving a working

23 capital surplus beginning in the first quarter of

24 2021 and maintaining unrestricted cash balances

25 ranging from 200 to \$365 million with no debt

90

1 outstanding.

During RSI's press conference held on
August 4, 2022, Richard Schwartz, CEO of RSI,
stated that the company was well-positioned to
achieve the goal of adjusted EBITDA profitability
in the second quarter of 2023 based on its
continued growth in the U.S. and international
markets.

9 Since RSI does not have an investment 10 in a brick -- in a brick and mortar facility in Louisiana, we feel there is minimal risk to the 11 12 state if they do not achieve profit -- the profitability they're projecting. Additionally, 13 14 there is minimal risk to Louisiana patrons, as state gaming laws require RSI to segregate player 15 deposits from its operational funds and maintain 16 17 sufficient cash reserve to cover outstanding 18 sports wagers on future events, unpaid winnings,

19 and sports wagering account balances to ensure

20 players can withdraw funds at any time.

21 In our assessment, based on the

22 information reviewed by the Audit Section, RSI

23 possesses the financial ability to support its

24 sports wagering operations. No financial issues,

25 other than its negative operating profits
