21	CHAIRMAN JONES: We'll now call
22	Revenue Reports. Good morning.
23	MS. JACKSON: Chairman Jones, Board
24	Members, my name is Donna Jackson with

1	Enforcement Division.
2	The 15 operating riverboats
3	generated Adjusted Gross Receipts of
4	\$139,820,552 in January. This total
5	represents an overall decrease from last
6	month of \$32 million or almost
7	19 percent, and a decrease of \$6 million
8	or 4 percent from last January. The
9	decrease can be partially attributed to
10	the winter weather in mid-January. As
11	you will notice on the bar chart,
12	December revenues are historically
13	stronger than January revenues. In
14	addition, this December had five full
15	weekends compared to four in January.
16	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
17	year 2017-2018 to date are
18	\$1,088,000,000, a decrease of
19	\$22 million or 2 percent from fiscal
20	year 2016-2017. During January, the
21	State collected fees totaling
22	\$30,061,419. As of January 31st, 2018,
23	the State has collected \$234 million in
24	fees for fiscal year 2017-2018.
25	Next is a summary of the
	8

1 January 2018 gaming activity for

2	Harrah's New Orleans found on page
3	three. During January, Harrah's
4	generated \$20,444,006 in gross gaming
5	revenue, a decrease of \$5 million or
6	20 percent from last month, and a
7	decrease of 4.6 percent from last
8	January.
9	Revenues for fiscal year 2017-2018
10	to date are \$163 million, an increase of
11	\$8.7 million or 6 percent from fiscal
12	year 2016-2017.
13	The State received \$5,095,890 for
14	January gaming dates. As of
15	January 31st, 2018, the State has
16	collected \$35 million in fees for fiscal
17	year 2017-2018.
18	Next I'll present the revenue for
19	Slots at the Racetracks. During
20	January, the four racetrack facilities
21	combined generated Adjusted Gross
22	Receipts of \$26,528,051, a decrease of
23	\$3.3 million or 11 percent from last
24	month, and a decrease of \$1 million or
25	four percent from January 2017.
	9
1	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
2	year 2017-2018 to date are almost
3	\$196 million, an increase of \$1.5
4	million or 1 percent from fiscal year

5 2016-2017.

6	During January, the State collected
7	\$4,024,305 in fees. As of January 31st,
8	2018, the State has collected almost
9	\$30 million in fees for fiscal year
10	2017-2018.
11	Overall in January, Riverboats,
12	Landbased and Slots at the Racetracks
13	combined generated \$187 million in AGR
14	and \$39 million in state fees. These
15	revenues represent a decrease from
16	January 2017 of \$8 million or
17	4.2 percent.
18	Any questions before I present the
19	Harrah's employee information?
20	CHAIRMAN JONES: Miss Donna, I
21	haven't seen this much red on the
22	riverboat report in a long time.
23	MS. JACKSON: 1 apologize.
24	CHAIRMAN JONES: What's your sense
25	of what happened here, for the benefit
	10
1	of my Board Members.
2	MS. JACKSON: The weather oh, I
3	think is a factor. I didn't speak to
4	them directly but with the road
5	closures, and then December is just a
6	high month. It was probably in the top
7	ten of gaming revenues overall. So in

8	comparison, it makes it look worse,
9	probably, but it wasn't that far out of
10	the ordinary. If you look at the bar
11	chart, you know, looking at December
12	compared to January, it's down a little
13	bit.
14	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yeah, this is
15	fairly consistent from previous years
16	for the same time period.
17	MS. JACKSON: Right.
18	CHAIRMAN JONES: You're going to do
19	better next month?
20	MS. JACKSON: I'll do what I can.
21	Get rid of the red ink?
22	CHAIRMAN JONES: There are no
23	questions on that. Please proceed.
24	MR. GASTON: 2013 we were way up.
25	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yes.

1	MS. BERRY: I have a question.
2	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yes, ma'am, Miss
3	Berry.
4	MS. BERRY: It may seem kind of
5	random, but how does Carnival season
6	affect that gaming revenues? Like,
7	January and February, is it normally
8	they spend more on Mardi Gras or more on
9	gaming, or does it affect
10	MS. JACKSON: I think it does affect

11	especially at Harrah's New Orleans.
12	They have more people there, and
13	somebody in the office said they were in
14	Harrah's Monday and it was really busy.
15	But that's going to be on a Tuesday
16	in February
17	MS. BERRY: Yeah.
18	MS. JACKSON: date, not January.
19	MS. BERRY: Okay. I was just
20	curious.
21	MS. JACKSON: They do see more
22	traffic.
23	CHAIRMAN JONES: The traffic does go
24	up, particularly at the landbased, but a
25	lot of the people are just sort of

1	walking through. There's a lot more
2	traffic, but there's
3	MS. BERRY: Traffic but not money.
4	CHAIRMAN JONES: Not appreciably,
5	and then Real could correct me, but I
6	don't think there's that much
7	appreciable more play during that period
8	of time.
9	MS. BERRY: I think January is kind
10	of bad after Christmas for everybody.
11	Okay. Thank you.
12	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yes, ma'am.
13	MS. JACKSON: Harrah's New Orleans

14	is required to maintain at least 2,400
15	employees and a bi-weekly payroll of
16	\$1,750,835. This report covers pay
17	periods in January 2018.
18	For the first pay period, the
19	Division verified 2,596 employees with a
20	payroll of \$2,205,000. For the second
21	pay period, the Division verified 2,583
22	employees with a payroll of \$2,146,000.
23	Therefore, Harrah's met the employment
24	criteria during January.
25	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions? The

2	MS. JACKSON: Thank you.
3	CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you. Video
4	poker, please. Good morning.
5	MR. BOSSIER: Good morning. Good
6	morning, Chairman Jones and Board
7	Members. My name is Jim Bossier with
8	the Louisiana State Police Gaming
9	Enforcement Division here to report
10	video gaming statistics for January 2018
11	as shown on page one of your handout.
12	Eighteen new video gaming licenses
13	were issued during January: Twelve bars
14	and six restaurants. Eleven new
15	applications were received by the Gaming
16	Enforcement Division during January and

17	are currently pending in the field:
18	Seven bars, three restaurants and one
19	device owner's.
20	The Gaming Enforcement Division
21	assessed \$3,250 and collected \$5,799 in
22	fines during January, and there are
23	currently \$1,500 in outstanding fines.
24	Please refer to page two of your
25	handout.
	14
1	There are presently 13,007 video
2	gaming devices activated at 1,735
3	locations.
4	Net device revenue for January 2018
5	was \$44.3 million, a \$5.1 million, or
6	10.4 percent, decrease when compared to
7	December 2017, and a \$1.1 million
8	decrease, or 2.5 percent, when compared
9	to January 2017.
10	Net device revenue so far for fiscal
11	year 2018 is \$324 million, a
12	\$2.1 million decrease, or six-tenths of
13	1 percent, when compared to fiscal year
14	2017. Page three of your handout shows
15	a comparison of net device revenue.
16	Total franchise fees collected
17	during January 2018 were \$13.3 million,
18	a \$1.5 million decrease when compared to
19	December 2017, and a \$300,000 decrease

20	when compared to January 2017.
21	Total franchise fees collected for
22	fiscal year 2018 are \$97 million, an
23	\$800,000 decrease, or eight-tenths of
24	1 percent when compared to fiscal year
25	2017. Page four of your handout shows a
	15
1	comparison of franchise fees.
2	Does anybody have any questions?
3	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions,
4	Board Members?
5	MR. BRADFORD: I have a quick
6	question.
7	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yes, sir,
8	Mr. Bradford.
9	MR. BRADFORD: It's not a test, Jim.
10	I'm just curious. Two or three years
11	ago we were running around 14,000
12	machines in 2,000 locations, and I've
13	noticed it's kind of dropping. Now
14	we're at 13,000 machines at about 1,700
15	locations. Does that fluctuate up and
16	down?
17	MR. BOSSIER: Yes, sir, it does. I
18	could come here tomorrow and give you a
19	completely different it would be
20	completely different, but that number
21	does fluctuate, yes, sir.

24	MR. BOSSIER: Yes, sir, some go in
25	and out of warehouses, and as long as
	16
1	they can be they could be not
2	actually in play but be in the
3	warehouse, but as long as they're paying
4	their franchise fees, they're still

11	V. COMPLIANCE REPORTS
12	CHAIRMAN JONES: We will now move to
13	Compliance Reports, Mesa. Good morning.
14	MS. BROWN: Good morning, Chairman
15	Jones, Board Members. I'm Mesa Brown
16	Assistant Attorney General. Today I'll
17	present the staff reports on riverboat
18	and racetrack casino licensees'
19	compliance with employment and
20	procurement conditions for the fourth
21	quarter of 2017. I'll begin with
22	riverboats.
23	The fourth quarter reports are taken
24	from figures reported by the 15
25	operating riverboats to the Louisiana

1	7

1	Gaming Control Board. In the fourth
2	quarter of 2017, approximately 13,660
3	people were employed by the riverboat
4	industry. Of that number, 13,356 were
5	Louisiana residents, 8,482 were
6	minorities and 7,774 were women.
7	Four licensees achieved total
8	compliance this quarter, and they are
9	Golden Nugget, L'Auberge Casino and
10	Hotel Baton Rouge, Isle of Capri Casino
11	St. Charles and L'Auberge Lake Charles.
12	Next I'll address employment. Five
13	licensees did not meet their total
14	employment goals. They are DiamondJacks
15	Casino & Resort, who achieved 406 out of
16	a goal of 650; Belle of Baton Rouge
17	achieved 439 out of 450; Hollywood
18	achieved 396 out of a goal of 450;
19	Amelia Belle achieved 300 out of 325,
20	and Boomtown Casino Bossier achieved 475
21	out of 650.
22	All licensees either met or exceeded
23	their goals in all of the subcategories
24	under the main category of employment
25	with the exception of Treasure Chest who
	18
1	failed to meet its female employment
2	goal. It achieved 50.1 out of a goal of

3	51.86.
3	51.86.

4	Next I'll address procurement. The
5	licensees are grouped according to three
6	subcategories which appear in your
7	report. They are Louisiana, minority
8	and female procurement.
9	Under Louisiana procurement, three
10	licensees did not achieve compliance
11	with their voluntary conditions. Those
12	licensees are Treasure Chest, who
13	achieved 72.7 out of 75 percent; Amelia
14	Belle, 74.1 out of 80 percent, and
15	Margaritaville Resort Casino, who
16	achieved 76.5 out of a goal of
17	90 percent.
18	Minority procurement, five licensees
19	did not achieve compliance with their
20	voluntary conditions, and they are Sam's
21	Town, who achieved 13.3 out of
22	25 percent; Horseshoe achieved 25.3 out
23	35 percent; Boomtown New Orleans
24	achieved 14.1 out of 15 percent;
25	Treasure Chest achieved 13.7 out of
	19
1	15 percent, and Eldorado achieved 20.4.
2	Female procurement, one licensee did
3	not meet its female procurement goal
4	this quarter, and that is Horseshoe who
5	achieved 33.5 out of 35 percent.

6	Are there any questions regarding
7	the riverboats?
8	CHAIRMAN JONES: Just a quick
9	comment. I want to thank you for
10	providing me some historical information
11	based on my request after the last
12	meeting, and we will be extending
13	invitations to three properties to come
14	before the Board in March, I believe.
15	If I look back over twenty quarters, one
16	of those properties was compliant with
17	only three out of the twenty quarters.
18	The other was compliant five quarters
19	out of twenty, and both of those
20	properties have been noncompliant for
21	three consecutive years. There may be
22	some reasonable explanation for that.
23	We're going to hear it, and more
24	importantly, we're going to hear what
25	plans they have to get closer to that
	20
1	goal.
2	So I appreciate your sharing that
3	information. The three GMs of those
4	properties will be getting an email from
5	me probably next week, and we'll docket
6	that, so everybody bring your peanut
7	butter and jelly sandwich for the next
8	month. It may be a little longer.

9	Thank you. Go ahead.
10	MS. BROWN: Now I'll begin with the,
11	racetracks. In the fourth quarter of
12	2017, approximately 1,410 people were
13	employed by the racetrack casino
14	industry. Of that number, 1,183 were
15	Louisiana residents, 725 were
16	minorities, and 820 were women.
17	Two racetrack casinos achieved total
18	compliance this quarter, and they are
19	Evangeline Downs and Fair Grounds.
20	Delta Downs did not achieve its
21	Louisiana employment condition. It
22	achieved 64.3 out of the 80 percent
23	condition, and Louisiana Downs did not
24	achieve its female employment condition.
25	It achieved 55.2 out of a 60 percent
	21
1	goal.
2	Are there any questions regarding
3	the racetracks?
4	CHAIRMAN JONES: Any questions on
5	racetracks, Board Members? There are no
6	questions.
7	MS. BROWN: Thank you.
8	CHAIRMAN JONES: Thank you, Mesa.
9	Just as an administrative note,
10	we'll begin the legislature will
11	begin a special session on Monday, and

12	then the regular session begins in
13	March, so our March meeting we will have
14	to move to our revenue building.
15	THE CLERK: LaSalle.
16	CHAIRMAN JONES: Yeah, the LaSalle
17	building. We'll be meeting there for
18	the next three months. Everything will
19	be posted on the website, so we'll be
20	relocated to another location during the
21	time that the legislature is in session.
22	Yes, and the meetings will shift to
23	Mondays because that's when the facility
24	is available for us. So just make your
25	calendar notes as necessary.

2	A. Consideration of request for refinancing of
3	debt by Churchill Downs Louisiana Horse
4	Racing Co., LLC, d/b/a Fair Grounds Race
5	Course - No. T103602541
6	CHAIRMAN JONES: We'll now move to
7	Casino Gaming Issues. We have:
8	Consideration of request for refinancing
9	of debt by Churchill Downs Louisiana
10	Horse Racing Co., LLC, doing business as
11	Fair Grounds Race Course, No.

12 TO13602541. Good morning.

13 MS. WARE: Good morning, Chairman

14 Jones, Members of the Board. My name is

15	Trnessia Ware with the Louisiana State
16	Police Corporate Securities Audit. With
17	me today, I have David Waguespack,
18	counsel for the licensee, and I also
19	have Doug Shipley, President of Fair
20	Grounds.
21	Churchill Downs is requesting the
22	Board's approval for its refinancing
23	transaction of a new \$400 million senior
24	secured term loan B, a \$7 million
25	revolver representing a \$200 million
	23
1	increase over its previous \$500 million
2	revolver, and issuing \$500 million in
3	4.75 percent senior unsecured notes.
4	The issuance of \$500 million in publicly
5	traded senior unsecured notes does not
6	require Board approval.
7	Churchill also advised the Board
8	with transaction to repurchase its
9	publicly traded common stock for a
10	purchase price of between 230 and \$265
11	per share. Churchill accepted for
12	payment \$265 per share for 1,886,792
13	shares of its stock. The transaction
14	did not require the Board's approval.
15	Churchill previously repurchased
16	one million shares in June 2017 for
17	\$158.89 million. Subsequent to the

18	refinancing, Churchill's consolidated
19	debt balance increased by approximately
20	36 million. According to the sources
21	and uses schedule on page four of our
22	report, Churchill plans to only draw
23	approximately \$258 million under its
24	revolver for this transaction.
25	No financial issues came to our
	24
1	attention to preclude the Board's
2	approval of Churchill's credit
3	facilities in the amount of a
4	400 million term loan and a 700 million
5	revolver.
6	Are there any questions?
7	CHAIRMAN JONES: Board Members, any
8	questions? [No response.]
9	What's going on with the track,
10	Mr. Shipley?
11	MR. SHIPLEY: Good morning.
12	CHAIRMAN JONES: Morning.
13	MR. SHIPLEY: Lots of fun stuff
14	right now.
15	CHAIRMAN JONES: Just tell us a
16	little bit about it. You-guys fly so
17	far below the radar, you know, and
18	that's a good thing. That's good.
19	MR. SHIPLEY: My name's Doug
20	Shipley. I've been in the casino

21	business a little more than 35 years. I
22	spend most of my career in either Nevada
23	or on the Gulf Coast working with
24	companies like Ameristar, Grand Casinos
25	and Caesars, and I have been with the
	25
1	Fair Grounds now for close to a year.
2	My most recent employment was with Live
3	Casino, which was located in between
4	D.C. and the Baltimore area, and I'm
5	here to say I'm very happy to be back
6	down in the Louisiana, Mississippi area.
7	CHAIRMAN JONES: We're glad to have
8	you. I had a visit with him when he
9	came down, and he's on my regular
10	rotation. I'll be back to see you soon.
11	Board Members, any questions on the
12	proposed transaction? [No response.]
13	Do I have a motion to adopt the
14	Resolution?
15	MR. GASTON: I'll move,
16	Mr. Chairman.
