

STIPULATION AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Stipulation and Settlement Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by:

- (i) the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, Office of State Police. Casino Gaming Division (the "Division") acting herein for and on behalf of themselves and for the State of Louisiana (the "State"); and
- (ii) Louisiana Casino Cruises, Inc., d/b/a Casino Rouge ("Casino Rouge") acting herein on its own behalf and on behalf of Penn National Gaming, Inc., its parent and all of the subsidiaries of Penn National Gaming, Inc.

Stipulations:

Whereas, a Notice of Violation and Penalty was issued by the Division to Casino Rouge on January 31, 2002 alleging that Casino Rouge made payments to Ralph & Kacoo's Restaurant during calendar year 2000, after the company which owned Ralph & Kacoo's Restaurant, Piccadilly Cafeteria's Inc., had been denied it non-gaming supplier permit in 1995;

And Whereas, the Notice of Violation and Penalty assessed a penalty in the amount of \$10,000;

And Whereas, Casino Rouge did do business with Ralph & Kacoo's Restaurants during the time period beginning in 1997 and continuing through April 2001, although Ralph & Kacoo's Restaurant was sold to an entity which had not been denied in March 1999.

And now, therefore, in consideration of the foregoing Stipulations, the Division and Casino Rouge hereby propose and agree to the following Settlement:

- 1. Casino Rouge admits to failing to implement procedures, on several occasions, to reasonably insure that function duties and responsibilities are appropriately segregated and performed in accordance with sound practices by competent and qualified personnel in failing to discover that Piccadilly Cafeterias, Inc. had been denied, which is a violation of LAC 42:XIII.2715(a)(7).
- 2. Consistent with two violations of 42:XIII.2715(a)(7). Casino Rouge agrees to pay a fine in the amount of \$5,000 for the violations admitted in paragraph one above.
- 3. Subject to the approval of the Hearing Officer of the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, in consideration of the foregoing Stipulations and Settlement proposal, the Division agrees to accept the Casino Rouge payment of \$5.000 in full and final settlement of Violation CGD: 010082, and the Division agrees it will not assess violations of gaming control law against Casino Rouge relating to any payments made to Ralph & Kacoo's Restaurants or any of their parent or subsidiary companies for any time prior to May 16, 2001. The Division, however, reserves its right to take this violation into consideration during the prospective period for 42:XIII.2715(a)(7), for purposes of assessing future violations of the same regulation.
- 4. It is expressly understood that this proposed Agreement, if approved by the Hearing Officer is expressly conditioned upon approval by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, but will become a binding agreement among the parties upon such approval. The parties hereby consent to this procedure.
- 5. If approved by the Hearing Officer and the Louisiana Gaming Control Board, the parties hereto waive their rights to appeal this Stipulation and Settlement Agreement.

6. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of Louisiana.
