17	IV. REVENUE REPORTS
18	CHAIRMAN NOEL:
19	All right. Next up, Ms. Jackson, I
20	believe, with our Revenue Reports.
21	MS. JACKSON:
22	Good morning, Chairman Noel, Board
23	Members. My name is Donna Jackson with Louisiana
24	State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division. As we
25	all recall, last March was a partial month due to

COVID closures; so the casinos only had 16 days of operation. For your reference, I have included an additional chart in your folder which shows a three-year comparison of admissions, revenue and state fees to show how this year compares to the year prior to COVID.

During March, the 13 operating riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts of \$168,218,035. This total represents an increase of \$55.8 million, or 49.7 percent, from last month, and an increase of \$96 million, or 133 percent, from last March. Margaritaville generated its highest month ever, with \$19.8 million, while Golden Nugget generated its second highest month ever, at `\$30.7 million. When comparing March 2021 to March 2019, riverboat revenue was down 7.2 percent, although that month was the second highest riverboat total on record.

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$1,110,000,000 a decrease of \$154 million, or 12 percent, from fiscal year 2020 and a decrease of \$295 million, or 21 percent, from fiscal year 2019.

During March, the State collected fees totaling \$36 million. As of March 31, 2021,

the State collected \$238.6 million in fees for
fiscal year 2021, which is down \$33 million from
fiscal year 2020 and down \$63.5 million from
fiscal year 2019.

Next is a summary of the March 2021

gaming activity for Harrah's New Orleans.

Harrah's generated \$22,447,362 in gross gaming revenue during March. These revenues represent an increase from last month of \$6.7 million, or 42.5 percent, and an increase of \$12 million, or 114 percent, from last March. When compared to March 2019, Harrah's revenue is down 22.6 percent, while admissions are down 56.5 percent.

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$136.8 million, a decrease of \$68 million, or 33 percent, from fiscal year 2020 and a decrease of \$82.5 million, or 38 percent, from fiscal year 2019.

During March, the State received \$5,095,890 in minimum daily payments. As of March 31, 2021, the State collected approximately \$45 million in fees for fiscal year 2021.

Next, I will present the revenues for slots at the racetracks. During March, the four racetrack facilities combined generated adjusted

gross receipts of \$34,406,444, an increase of

\$11.5 million, or 50 percent, from last month, and

an increase of almost \$20 million, or 136 percent,

from last March. When compared to March 2019, the

racetrack facilities' revenue is down 4.6 percent,

and admissions are down 30 percent.

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal

Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year 2021 to date are approximately \$222 million, a decrease of \$18 million, or 8 percent, from fiscal year 2020 and a decrease of almost \$43 million, or 16 percent, from fiscal year 2019.

During March, the State collected \$5.2 million in fees. As of March 31, 2021, the State has collected \$33.7 million in fees for fiscal year 2021, which is down \$2.7 million from fiscal year 2020 and down \$6.5 million from fiscal year 2019.

I will now move to the video gaming information. There are currently 12,244 video gaming devices activated at 1,497 locations.

Net device revenue for March 2021 was \$84.7 million, an increase of \$31 million, or 58 percent, when compared to February 2021, and an increase of \$52.5 million, or 163 percent, compared to March 2020. When compared to March

2019, video poker revenue is up 39 percent. This month's revenue is the highest generated, by almost \$20 million since our current monthly records back to January of 2000.

Net device revenue for fiscal year 2021 to date is \$532 million, an increase of \$88 million, or 19.8 percent, when compared to fiscal year 2020 and an increase of \$78.7 million, or 17 percent, when compared to fiscal year 2019. Page 3 of your handout shows a comparison of the net device revenue.

Total franchise fees collected during March 2021 were \$25.7 million, an increase of \$9.5 million when compared to February 2021 and an increase of \$16 million when compared to March 2020.

Total franchise fees collected for fiscal year 2021 to date are \$161.9 million, an increase of \$28.8 million, or 21.6 percent, when compared to fiscal year 2020 and an increase of \$26 million, or 19 percent, when compared to fiscal year 2019.

Overall in March, all four types of gaming combined generated approximately \$309.7 million in revenue, which is \$180 million, or 140 percent, more than what was generated in the partial month

1 of March 2020 and represents a slight overall 2 increase of .8 percent due to the increase in 3 video poker revenue. Questions? 4 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 5 Thank you. Do we have any questions 6 for Ms. Jackson? 7 (NO RESPONSE) 8 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 9 I do have one, Donna. Real quick, on 10 the land-based revenue, of course, you see the 11 drastic reductions, and you have for the past 12 year, with regards to admissions and their 13 revenue -- gross gaming revenue, but we don't see 14 that reduction when their -- when it comes to 15 their fees to the State, and that's -- correct me 16 if I'm wrong -- that's because Harrah's has a 17 minimum payment that's due? 18 MS. JACKSON: 19 The \$60 million for the Correct. 20 year, they have continued to pay the regular 21 amount for the minimum -- minimum daily payment. 22 It does show a decrease from March of 2019, and 23 that was because that year had a true-up payment 2.4 of, I think, about \$3.5 million. 25 CHAIRMAN NOEL:

1 Yeah. So --2 MS. JACKSON: 3 So it shows that it's down a little 4 because they didn't have the revenue that 5 generated from true-up. 6 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 7 Right. What's that threshold for 8 true-up? 9 MS. JACKSON: 10 They pay the minimum payment of 11 \$60 million, and then at the end of that fiscal 12 year, if 21 1/2 percent exceeds the 60 million, 13 then they pay the difference. 14 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 15 Thank you. Any other questions? 16 (NO RESPONSE) 17 CHATRMAN NOEL: 18 All right. Thank you very much. 19 V. CONSIDERATION OF CONTRACT WITH HEARING OFFICER 20 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 2.1 All right. Next we have on the 22 agenda is consideration of our contract with our 23 hearing officer for the board. I just -- I have a 2.4 few notes just to update you and give you a 25 summary of what this contract covers. It's a

1	one-year term that will start July 1, 2021, and it
2	expires June 30, 2022. And, of course, the
3	contract is between the board and Judge Suzan
4	Ponder, who serves as our hearing officer to
5	render decisions and findings of fact and
6	conclusions about the law in administrative
7	enforcement and licensing matters and other
8	matters that the board may that may come under
9	the board's jurisdiction.
10	The maximum amount of the contract is
11	25,000. Generally, hearings are held once a week.
12	And, again, it also contains the customary
13	language that you would find in all State
14	contracts. I know you have a copy. Do we have
15	any questions board members have any questions
16	about the contract?
17	(NO RESPONSE)

21	want to take a moment to recognize someone
22	who's I think he's in the audience back there.
23	And this is kind of because since we're talking
24	about truck stops. Sergeant Mike Linn, who has
25	been with the State Police for almost 28 years, I

1 believe, will be retiring later this week. And he 2 actually has spent the majority of his career, a 3 little over 20 years, in the Gaming Division and 4 serving the citizens of the State, serving the 5 State itself, the organization, the board, as well 6 as the industry. 7 You know, when you talk to someone in 8 the industry -- and I find it interesting, when 9 you tell them that Mike Linn is retiring, the 10 first reaction is -- is somewhat of shock. And 11 the next question is, "Who is going to replace 12 him, " because -- because of the contributions he's 13 made and the way he was able to work, and has 14 worked, with the industry and served everyone 15 with -- with professionalism. 16 So I want to take a moment to thank He's sitting in the back. 17 him publicly. Waive 18 your hand, Mike. 19 (APPLAUSE) 20 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 2.1 It's well-deserved, so thank you. 22 SERGEANT LINN: 23 You're welcome. Thank you, Chairman and the Board and everyone else. It's been --2.4 25 I've had a great career in Gaming.

17	video gaming licensees Super Lucky Louie's
18	Casino, LLC, Lucky Louie's Truck Stop, LLC, and
19	Grand Paradise, LLC.
20	On February 28, 2020, Jason Paul
21	Allen Inter Vivos Trust No. 1 sold its 20 percent
22	membership interest in Super Lucky Louie's Casino
23	LLC, and its 25 percent membership interest in
24	both Grand Paradise, LLC, and Lucky Louie's Truck
25	Stop, LLC, to Dacen Allen Inter Vivos Trust No. 1

and Cayden Allen Inter Vivos Trust No. 1, in equal shares. The two trusts were set up for Jason P. Allen's two minor children. The co-trustees of each trust is Jody J. Guillory, Rachael R. Kelly, Wendy J. Vielee, and Summer V. Shaw.

Criminal Investigator Rodney Perkins conducted an investigation of the transfers of membership interest. He also conducted updated suitability checks on the relevant persons associated with the licensees. He will present the Office of State Police's findings to the board.

#### MR. PERKINS:

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Good morning, Mr. Chairman and the Board. I conducted an updated suitability check on Louis B. Vielee, Susan G. Vielee, Jody J. Guillory, Anne H. Guillory, Rachael R. Kelly, Wendy J. Vielee, Summer V. Shaw, Brandi S. Vielee. All of them previously met suitability under these licenses, and I found no information that would preclude them from continuing to participate in the gaming industry. I conducted the investigation of the transfers of membership interest and found no information that would preclude continued licensing of Grand Paradise,

1 LLC, doing business as Grand Paradise, LLC; Grand 2 Paradise, LLC, doing business as Grand Paradise, 3 LLC, #2; Lucky Louie's Truck Stop, LLC, doing 4 business as Lucky Louie's Truck Stop; and Super 5 Lucky Louie's Casino, LLC, doing business as Super Lucky Louie's Casino. 6 7 MR. PITRE: 8 The Office of the Attorney General 9 has reviewed the file compiled as a result of the 10 investigation conducted by the Office of State 11 Police. Our review indicates that no information 12 has been found which would preclude approval of 13 the transfers. 14 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 15 Thank you. Do we have any questions 16 from the board about these transfers? 17 (NO RESPONSE) 18 CHAIRMAN NOEL: 19 All right. No questions. I would 20 ask that there's a motion to approve the transfer 2.1 of interest in these entities. 22 MR. JACKSON: 23 So moved. 2.4 MS. BERRY: 25 Second.

13	for the Alternate Riverboat Inspection of the
14	gaming vessel of Treasure Chest Casino, LLC d/b/a
15	Treasure Chest Casino - No. R012600098
16	CHAIRMAN NOEL:
17	Okay. We'll move on to Casino Gaming
18	Issues. First up is consideration of a
19	Certificate of Compliance for the Alternate
20	Riverboat Inspection of the gaming vessel of
21	Treasure Chest Casino, LLC, doing business as
22	Treasure Chest Casino, No. R012600098.
23	MS. LANDRY:
24	Good morning, Chairman Noel and Board
25	Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General

Lisha Landry, and with me is Mr. John Francic of ABSG Consulting. We are here in the matter of the issuance of the annual Certificate of Compliance for Treasure Chest Casino, LLC, doing business as Treasure Chest Casino. On March 3, 2021, ABSG began the inspection process for the approval of Treasure Chest Casino's annual Certificate of Compliance. Mr. Francic will now provide the details on ABSG's inspection.

## MR. FRANCIC:

Good morning, Chairman and Board
Members. I'm John Francic with ABSG Consulting
here to report the answer for certification for
Treasure Chest Casino. Inspectors Don Chapman and
Pete Bowlin (phonetic) did, on March 3, attend the
Riverboat Treasure Chest to conduct the annual
written inspection in accordance with the
Alternate Inspection Program.

The inspectors reviewed fire protection equipment, egress routes, warning system, and conducted a fire drill. There were deficiencies found during the inspection. Some were corrected before the inspection was completed, but there were a few items that were completed and supplemented in a report.

1	The 2021 annual survey as required by
2	Louisiana Gaming Control Board is considered to be
3	complete and can provide the services for a
4	dockside gaming vessel in the state of Louisiana.
5	It is the recommendation of ABSG that Treasure
6	Chest be issued a Certificate of Compliance.
7	MS. LANDRY:
8	We now present these findings to the
9	board and request that, upon the board accepting
10	the report submitted by ABSG, you will move for
11	the issuance of Treasure Chest Casino's annual
12	Certificate of Compliance, which expires on
13	May 31, 2022.

12	Financing for Churchill Downs Louisiana Horse
13	Racing Company, LLC d/b/a Fair Grounds Race
14	Course - No. T013602541.
15	CHAIRMAN NOEL:

17	of Petition for Approval of Financing for
18	Churchill Downs Louisiana Horse Racing Company,
19	LLC, doing business as Fair Grounds Race Course,
20	No. T013602541.
21	MS. JACKSON:
22	Good morning, Chairman Noel and Board
23	Members. My name is Donna Jackson with Louisiana
24	State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division.
25	Churchill Downs is requesting the board's

1 approval of its \$500 million financing 2 transaction, consisting of a \$300 million 3 incremental term loan B-1 under Churchill's 4 existing credit agreement and \$200 million of 5 additional 4.75 percent senior unsecured notes. 6 The issuance of notes does not require board 7 approval, as they were issued to accredited 8 investors in accordance with Rule 144A under the 9 Securities Act. 10 Churchill and certain of its 11 subsidiaries entered into Incremental Joinder 12 Agreement No. 1, which amends their December 27, 13 2017, senior secured credit agreement providing 14 for the term loan B-1 in the aggregate principal 15 amount of \$300 million. 16 Churchill intends to use the proceeds 17 from the term loan B-1 and notes to repay 18 outstanding indebtedness under its revolver; fund 19 related transaction fees and expenses; and for 20 working capital and other general corporate 21 purposes. 22 As you can see on the schedule on 23 page 3 of our report, Churchill's overall debt 24 will have a net increase of approximately \$350 25 million. Churchill projects sufficient cash flows

,	
1	to service the debt.
2	No financial issues came to our
3	attention to preclude the board's approval of this
4	transaction.
