Mr. President, Mr. Speaker and Members of the Louisiana Legislature

The Louisiana Gaming Control Board submits the 28th annual comprehensive report to the Legislature in accordance with La. R.S. 27:15(B)(9)(b).

Statutes legalizing and regulating gaming were enacted in 1991 by the Legislature and, in 1996, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board was created. The Board consists of nine members who are appointed by the Governor, confirmed by the Senate, and serve staggered terms of six years. At least one member is appointed from each congressional district and is eligible to be reappointed for one additional term. The Board is required by law to meet at least once a month. Minutes and transcripts of Board meetings are found on the Board's website and, when the technology is available, meetings are streamed live over the internet.

The Chairman serves in a full time capacity and fulfills the role of CEO for the Board in the conduct and management of its regulatory responsibilities. The Board has three other full time employees who manage the day-to-day affairs of the Board.

The Board exercises regulatory authority, control, and jurisdiction over all aspects of gaming activities and operations as authorized pursuant to the provisions of the Louisiana Gaming Control Law which includes the Louisiana Riverboat Economic Development and Gaming Control Act, the Louisiana Economic Development and Corporation Act, the Video Draw Poker Devices Control Law, and the Louisiana Pari-mutuel Live Racing Facility Economic Redevelopment, Gaming Control Act, Fantasy Sports Act, Sports Wagering Act.

The Board's operating budget for FY 2022-2023 was \$1,029,479 funded through statutory dedicated funds of \$847,366 from the Riverboat Gaming Enforcement Fund, \$99,020 from the Sports Wagering Fund and \$83,093 from the Pari-mutuel Live Racing Facility Gaming Control Fund.

On June 10, 2021, the Louisiana State Legislature approved legislation establishing a licensing framework for retail and online sports betting in the fifty-five Louisiana parishes that voted to authorize sports betting in the November 2020 election. Fantasy Sports went live in July of 2021, retail sportsbooks went live in October of 2021, and mobile sports wagering went live in February of 2022.

Act 286 of the 2023 regular session established a Uniform Human Trafficking Awareness and Prevention Training program. Human trafficking is a serious and widely recognized problem. It is imperative for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the state of Louisiana that a comprehensive and uniform human trafficking awareness and prevention training be developed for the gaming industry. The board in conjunction with the governor's office of human trafficking prevention and industry professionals shall develop and implement a comprehensive in-person and digital human trafficking awareness and prevention training for the gaming industry. The training shall include but is not limited to training on identifying victims of human trafficking at gaming establishments in Louisiana.

Act 286 also granted that three percent of the monies collected pursuant to §625. State tax; levy, or five hundred thousand dollars, whichever is greater, shall be credited to the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund established by R.S. 28:842.

The fiscal year ended June 30, 2023 with adjusted gross revenue of \$1,768,545,516 a decrease of \$39,899,287 from the previous year.

RIVERBOAT GAMING

Fifteen riverboat casinos are authorized to operate in Louisiana. This report reflects the data for all fifteen riverboat casinos.

There are six riverboat casinos in the Shreveport-Bossier City area; three in Lake Charles; three in East Baton Rouge Parish; and one each in Kenner, Harvey and Amelia. These riverboat casinos employ approximately 8977 individuals and, in FY 2022-2023, contributed \$380,237,286 in net revenue to the state. Adjusted gross revenue increased in Lake Charles, and Baton Rouge, Shreveport/Bossier and New Orleans.

The Shreveport-Bossier City market had adjusted gross revenues of \$540,766,558 for FY 2022-2023, a decrease of \$42,988,761 from the previous fiscal year, with \$116,264,809 in fees paid to the state.

The Lake Charles market had adjusted gross revenues of \$740,525,538 an increase of \$56,252,584 from the previous fiscal year, with \$159,212,991 in fees paid to the state.

The riverboat casinos in Kenner, Harvey and Amelia had adjusted gross revenues of \$239,312,809 a decrease of \$31,771,784 from the previous fiscal year, with \$51,454,404 in fees paid to the state.

The riverboat casinos in East Baton Rouge Parish had adjusted gross revenues of \$247,930,611 a decrease of \$21,401,326 over the previous fiscal year, with \$53,305,081 in fees paid to the state.

HARRAH'S NEW ORLEANS

The landbased casino in New Orleans generated \$260,189,114 in gaming revenue. This was a \$31,918,488 increase from the previous fiscal year, with \$64,955,722 in fees paid to the state. Harrah's employed 1868 individuals.

RACETRACK GAMING

Slot machine gaming at the racetracks adjusted gross revenue for FY 2022-2023 was \$320,953,271 a decrease of \$8,923,082 from the previous fiscal year, with \$4,125,237 in fees paid to the state. After subtracting the Support Contribution Deduction of \$48,142,990 for Purse Supplements, Executive Committee of the Louisiana Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, and Executive Committee of the Louisiana Quarter Horse Breeders Association, the State received fees in the amount of \$48,688,611. There were 1353 individuals employed at the racing facilities.

VIDEO POKER

As of June 30, 2023, there were 1,399 video poker outlets and 11,875 devices in the 31 parishes where video poker gaming had been approved in the local option election of November 5, 1996. These machines are authorized in bars, restaurants, hotels, off-track betting parlors, and truckstops. Franchise fees to the state from video poker amounted to \$236,345,114 for FY 2022- 2023 a decrease of \$14,230,071 from the previous fiscal year.

FANTASY SPORTS

Act 141 of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session was signed by Governor Edwards on June 9, 2020. This piece of legislation provided the regulatory structure and laws for the operation of fantasy sports. It required the Louisiana Gaming Control Board to institute rulemaking procedures no later than August 1, 2020. During the Boards July 16, 2020 meeting, the Board approved the institution of rulemaking for Fantasy Sports. The Board, State Police Gaming Division, and the AG's Gaming Division worked diligently to promulgate rules and facilitate the applications for fantasy sports operations in Louisiana. Emergency rules were not authorized in the legislation. Therefore, in order to comply with the Administrative Procedures Act and due to substantive changes, the rulemaking process took from July 16, 2020 until February 20, 2021.

Fantasy Sports went live on July 15, 2021. The State of Louisiana levies a tax of 8% upon the net revenues of fantasy sports contest offered to the consumers within the state. From July 2022 through June 2023, the Gross Fantasy Sports Contest Revenues are \$20,970,284 net revenue is \$2,169,412 and \$173,553 was paid in taxes.

SPORTS WAGERING

On June 10, 2021, the Louisiana State Legislature approved legislation establishing a licensing framework for retail and online sports betting in the 35 Louisiana parishes that voted to authorize sports betting in the November 2020 election.

During the 2021 Regular Session, the Louisiana Legislature adopted Act 440, which directs the Gaming Control Board to adopt emergency rules for the promulgation of the initial administrative rules pertaining to sports wagering that shall be considered to constitute a matter of imminent peril to public health, safety, and welfare. The rules codify Acts 80, 435, and 440 of the 2021 Regular Legislative Session and Act 215 of the 2020 Regular Legislative Session that enact the Louisiana Sports Wagering Act and authorize the conducting, application, licensing, permitting, enforcement, collection of fees and taxes, and regulation of racehorse wagering and sports wagering.

The State of Louisiana levies a 10% tax upon the net gaming proceeds from sports wagering conducted onsite at a licensed sports wagering establishment. Any sports wagering conducted through mobile application or a website on the premises of a licensed sports wagering establishment is taxed at a 15% tax rate. After deposit into the State Treasury, the state treasury credits the following amounts into the following funds:

- o 2% of the monies collected or \$500,000, whichever is greater, shall be credited to the Behavioral Health and Wellness Fund.
- o 25% of the monies collected, not to exceed \$2 million dollars, shall be credited to the Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund.
- o 10% of the monies collected shall be credited to the Sports Wagering Local Allocation Fund.
- o 2½ % of the monies collected shall be credited to the Sports Wagering Purse Supplement Fund.
- 3% or five hundred thousand dollars, whichever is greater, shall be credited to the Compulsive and Problem Gaming Fund established by R.S. 28:842

Retail Sports Wagering went live in October of 2021. From July of 2022 through June of 2023, there were \$307,148,101 wagers written. The net proceeds were \$38,441,824 and \$3,768,839 were paid in taxes. The win percentage was 12.5%.

Mobile Sports wagering went live in January of 2022. From July of 2022 through June of 2023, there were \$2,216,845,201 wagers written. The net proceeds were \$206,819,945 and \$35,104,617 were paid in taxes. The win percentage was 9.3%.

INDIAN GAMING

This report contains limited statistical information on tribal gaming. None of the three tribes are required to pay any fees directly to the state nor can they be required to provide the Gaming Control Board with any financial figures. All of the tribes make contributions to local governments in their respective locations. The Board does wish to acknowledge the Chitimacha Tribe in Charenton for its continued cooperation in voluntarily providing the information shown in this and previous reports.

CONCLUSION

Gaming revenue continues to be a substantial part of the Louisiana economy, generating \$3,377,039,368 for FY 2022-2023, an increase of \$2,612,088,089 from the previous fiscal year.

The revenue generated from gaming operations funds various programs in the state and is a primary source of funding for the Support Education in Louisiana Fund (SELF). Any decline in revenue or changes in statutory dedications could adversely affect the SELF fund.

The Louisiana Legislature adopted public policy approving gaming as an economic opportunity for the state and its citizens. The Gaming Control Board is committed to the thorough regulation and control of gaming activities under its jurisdiction in a manner which instills public confidence and ensures that regulated activities are free from criminal and corruptive elements. Additionally, the Board strives to foster a regulatory environment that provides optimum economic opportunity for both gaming operations and the Louisiana citizens who are employed by and/or benefit from this industry.



LIVE RACING FACILITY PARI-MUTUEL SLOT MACHINE GAMING

LOUISIANA

By Act 721 of the 1997 Regular Session, the Legislature authorized slot machine gaming at live horse racing facilities in St. Landry, Bossier, and Calcasieu Parishes. Voters approved slot machine gaming in those parishes and taxing districts have been authorized and established.

By Act 352 of the 2003 Regular Session, the Legislature authorized limited slot machine gaming at the eligible facility in Orleans Parish. By Act 591 of the 2006 Regular Session, the Legislature authorized a maximum of seven hundred slot machines at the eligible facility in Orleans Parish.

Slot machine gaming at Delta Downs in Calcasieu Parish commenced on February 13, 2002. Harrah's Racetrack & Casino in Bossier Parish commenced slot operations on May 21, 2003. Evangeline Downs in St. Landry Parish opened for slot machine gaming on December 19, 2003. Slot machine gaming at the Fair Grounds commenced operation in a temporary facility on September 19, 2007, with the permanent facility opening on November 7, 2008.

SPORTS WAGERING

LOUISIANA

Overview

From 1992 to 2018, the Professional and Amateur Sports Protection Act, also known as PASPA or the Bradley Act, was a law which effectively banned sports betting nationwide, excluding a few states. In May of 2018, the United States Supreme Court determined that PASPA was unconstitutional in that it conflicted with the Tenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution. In the aftermath of the Supreme Court's ruling, numerous states, including Louisiana, proceeded to establish legalized sports betting.

Pursuant to Act 215 of the 2020 Louisiana Regular Legislative Session, voters in each parish considered a proposition to allow sports wagering activities and operations in their parish. The election was held on November 3, 2020. Fifty-five (55) out of sixty-four (64) parishes in Louisiana voted in favor of allowing sports wagering in their respective parishes, with the voters of Caldwell, Catahoula, Franklin, Jackson, LaSalle, Sabine, Union, West Carroll, and Winn voting no on the proposition.

Pursuant to La. R.S. 27:601 et seq., The Louisiana Sports Wagering Act, grants the Louisiana Gaming Control Board (the "Board") complete authority, control, and jurisdiction with respect to the regulation of sports wagering in the state of Louisiana. In accordance with the Act, the Board has developed qualifications, standards, processes and procedures for the issuance and renewal of a license to operate a sports book. Although not yet operating, La. R.S. 47:9001 et seq., establishes regulatory authority of the Louisiana Lottery Corporation to operate a sports book to allow sports wagering at retail establishments. A summary of the framework of the Act is provided below.

Sports Wagering Related Licenses and Permits:

Sports Wagering License

- The initial application fee for a sports wagering license is \$250,000 and is nonrefundable.
- The license fee for a sports wagering license issued is \$500,000.
- The license is for a term of five years.
- The license fee shall be submitted on the anniversary date of the issuance of the license every five years.

Sports Wagering Platform Provider Permit

- The initial application fee for a sports wagering platform provider permit is \$100,000 and is nonrefundable.
- The permit fee for a sports wagering platform provider permit issued is \$250,000.
- The permit is for a term of five years.
- The permit fee shall be submitted on the anniversary date of the issuance of the permit every five years.

Sports Wagering Service Provider Permit

- The initial application fee for a sports wagering service provider permit is \$10,000 and is nonrefundable.
- The permit fee for a sports wagering service provider permit issued is \$12,500.
- The permit is for a term of five years.
- The permit fee shall be submitted on the anniversary date of the issuance of the permit every five years.

Sports Wagering Distributor Permit

- The initial application fee for a sports wagering distributor permit is \$5,000 and is nonrefundable.
- The permit fee for a sports wagering distributor permit issued is \$2,500.
- The permit is for a term of five years.
- The permit fee shall be submitted on the anniversary date of the issuance of the permit every five years.

State Taxes and Funds:

State Taxes

- The State of Louisiana levies a 10% tax upon the net gaming proceeds from sports wagering conducted onsite at a licensed sports wagering establishment.
- Any sports wagering conducted through mobile application or a website on the premises of a licensed sports waging establishment is taxed at a 15% tax rate.
- All taxes collected are forwarded to the state treasurer for immediate deposit into the state
 treasury. Funds deposited into the treasury shall first be credited to the Bond Security
 and Redemption Fund.

Funds

- After deposit into the State Treasury, the state treasury credits the following amounts into the following funds:
 - o 2% of the monies collected or \$500,000, whichever is greater, shall be credited to the Behavioral Health and Wellness Fund.
 - 25% of the monies collected, not to exceed \$2 million dollars, shall be credited to the Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund.
 - o 10% of the monies collected shall be credited to the Sports Wagering Local Allocation Fund.
 - o 2½ % of the monies collected shall be credited to the Sports Wagering Purse Supplement Fund.

Sports Wagering Requirements and Prohibitions

- A person placing a wager shall be at least 21 years of age.
- A person must be physically located in a parish that has approved a proposition authorizing sports wagering.
- A person must have a wagering account established with the operator if the player is

attempting to place the sports wager through a website or a mobile application.

- A person must not be prohibited from wagering with the operator by law, rule, policy of the operator or self exclusion.
- No sports wagers may be accepted or paid by an operator on any of the following:
 - o On any sport or athletic event not authorized by law or the Board.
 - On any sport or athletic event which the operator knows or reasonably should know are being placed by or on behalf of an athlete, coach, referee or other official, or staff of a participant or team that is participating in that event.
 - On the occurrence of injuries or penalties, the outcome of an athlete's disciplinary rulings, or replay reviews.
 - o On other types, forms, or categories of wagering prohibited by the Board.

Louisiana Sports Wagering Licensees and Sports Wagering Platform Providers

The Board may award twenty (20) sports wagering licenses to eligible applicants which, during the initial licensing phase, includes riverboat licensees, slots-at-the track licensees, and the land-based casino operator. The licensees may operate the sportsbook or contract with a sports wagering platform provider to operate the sportsbook. In November of 2021, retail sports wagering became live in Louisiana, with mobile sports wagering following on January 28, 2022. The following licensees and their respective platform providers have been awarded licenses and permits to conduct sports wagering in Louisiana. ¹

FANTASY SPORTS

LOUISIANA

Overview

During the 2018 legislative session, the Louisiana legislature enacted Act 322, which began the process for legalizing and regulating fantasy sports contests and called for a statewide referendum on the measure in Louisiana. Pursuant to the November 2018 election, forty-seven (47) of the sixty-four (64) parishes in Louisiana voted in favor of fantasy sports in their respective parishes, with the voters of Allen, Avoyelles, Beauregard, Caldwell, Catahoula, Franklin, Grant, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, LaSalle, Morehouse, Richland, Sabine, Union, Vernon, West Carroll, and Winn voting no on the referendum. The measure was approved by Louisiana's most populated urban parishes including New Orleans, Baton Rouge and Lafayette, among others, bringing legal fantasy sports to more than 90% of the state's population. However, the referendum only authorized lawmakers to introduce legislation legalizing daily fantasy sports. It was not until 2020, when the Louisiana legislature passed Act 141 during the 2020 Regular Session, Act 34 of the 2020 First Extraordinary Session, and Act 44 of the 2020 Second Extraordinary Session, that the tax structure and the creation of a regulatory framework for daily fantasy sports began.

Pursuant to La. R.S. 27:301 et seq, the Louisiana Fantasy Sports Contest Act, the Louisiana Gaming Control Board (the "Board") was granted all regulatory authority with respect to fantasy sports contests. Based on the legislation, the Board promulgated rules in the Louisiana Administrative Code ("LAC") which provided the structure necessary to properly regulate, enforce, and administer the operation of fantasy sports contest in Louisiana. A summary of the regulatory framework for daily fantasy sports is provided below.

Fantasy Sports Contest Operator

- Before obtaining a license to offer fantasy sports contests in this state, a fantasy sports contest operator must:
 - O Be a person domiciled in Louisiana; or a domestic business entity with a certificate of existence from the Secretary of State and in good standing; or a foreign corporation with a certificate of authority to transact business in this state from the Secretary of State and in good standing.
 - o Demonstrate to the Board that the operator is suitable for licensing pursuant to R.S. 27:28.
 - o Provide the Board with financial statements indicating any gross fantasy sports contest revenue for the previous three years.

Fantasy Sports Contest Operator License

- The initial application fee is \$1,000 and is non-refundable.
- The license fee for a fantasy sports contest license shall be submitted to the Louisiana State Police, Gaming Enforcement Division prior to the issuance of the license.

- Each license is granted for a term of three years.
- The license fee shall be as follows:
 - o If the three-year average of the licensee's gross fantasy sports contest revenue is less than \$100,000 or the licensee has no previous revenue, the fee shall be \$5,000.
 - o If the three-year average of the licensee's gross fantasy sports contest revenue is \$100,000 or more, but less than \$300,000, the fee shall be \$15,000.
 - o If the three-year average of the licensee's gross fantasy sports contest revenue is more than \$300,000, the fee shall be \$40,000.
- The renewal fee for a fantasy sports contest license shall be submitted on the anniversary date of the issuance of the license and shall be assessed in the same manner as the original license fee was assessed.

State Taxes and Fund

- The State of Louisiana levies a tax of 8% upon the net revenues of fantasy sports contest offered to the consumers within the state.
- All taxes imposed and collected are forwarded upon receipt to the State Treasurer for the immediate deposit into the state treasury.
- Funds deposited are first credited to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund in accordance with the Louisiana Constitution.
- Afterward, the State Treasurer deposits the proceeds of the tax into the Louisiana Early Childhood Education Fund.

Fantasy Sports Contest Prohibitions

- As a condition of licensure, a fantasy sports contest operator shall submit evidence to the Board that the operator has established and will implement commercially reasonable procedures for fantasy sports contests with an entry fee and shall do the following:
 - Ensure that any of following persons do not participate in fantasy sports contests:
 - Athletes and individuals who engage in or officiate a game or competition that is a real-world sport or athletic event that is the subject of a fantasy sports contest.
 - Any sports agent, team employee, referee, or league official associated with a real-world sport or athletic event that is the subject of a fantasy sports contest.
 - o Verify that a fantasy sports contest player is 21 years of age or older.
 - o Provide fantasy sports contest players with access to information on responsible play.
 - o Provide fantasy sports contest players with access to the fantasy sports contest player's play history and account details that are not confidential.
 - Allow individuals to restrict themselves from entering a fantasy sports contest upon request and provide reasonable steps to prevent the person entering fantasy sports contests offered by an operator.
 - Segregate fantasy sports contest player funds from operational funds or maintain a
 reserve that exceeds the amount of player funds on deposit, which may not be
 used for operational activities. Reserve funds may take the form of cash, cash

equivalents, payment process reserves, payment processor receivables, an irrevocable letter of credit, a bond, or a combination thereof, in the amount that must exceed the total balances of the fantasy sports contest players' accounts.

Fantasy Sports Contest Operators in Louisiana


On July 15, 2021, the Board awarded DraftKings a fantasy sports contest operator license. In doing so, it allowed DraftKings to launch its operations in the 47 parishes that allowed fantasy sports contests in their respective areas. On October 21, 2021, the Board approved the license application of Fanduel, the second fantasy sports contest operator to be licensed in the state of Louisiana. Both companies submitted to background investigations and financial examinations by the Louisiana State Police, with Gaming Enforcement Division (the "Division") in connection to their licensing applications. The Division ensures that both operators are in compliance with all gaming regulations and law, specifically those related to daily fantasy sports.


