If anyone would like to 8 comment on an agenda item before the Board 9 today, now is the time to come forward. 10 Okay, I see none. 11 But before we move any further in our 12 agenda, I'd like to take this opportunity on 13 behalf of the entire Gaming Control Board to 14 express our sincere appreciation to our now 15 former board member, Mr. Lamar Poole, for his 16 dedicated service and commitment to the 17 people of Louisiana. Mr. Poole's term has, 18 in fact, come to an end. Throughout his 19 tenure, Mr. Poole has demonstrated 20 professionalism, integrity, and a steadfast 21 devotion to ensuring fairness and 22 accountability with the Louisiana's gaming 23 industry. We thank Mr. Poole for 3 his valuable service and wish him continued 4 success in all of his future endeavors. 5 At this time, I'd like to now introduce 6 Governor Landry's most recent appointee to 7 our Board, Ms. Miquell Hennigan. Miquell 8 Hennigan is a lifelong leader, entrepreneur, 9 and community advocate raised in Alexandria, 10 Louisiana, a graduate of Bolton High School 11 and McNeese State University where she 12 earned her bachelor of science in psychology. 13 Miquell has dedicated over two decades 14 to serving others through ministry, business, 15 and community work. Her career in ministry 16 began in DeQuincy, Louisiana in 1997, leading 17 to senior and co-pastoral roles in Dallas, 18 Texas and San Francisco, California. In 19 2023, she founded The Velveteen Rescue, a 20 non-profit horse and donkey sanctuary on 200 21 acres in Central, Louisiana. The 22 organization rescues equines from the 23 slaughter pipeline and aims to expand its 24 mission to include recovery and community 25 service partnerships that foster healing and</p>

I would ask for a 13 motion to waive the reading and approve the 14 minutes of the September 18th, 2025 board 15 meeting. 16 MR. LANGLEY: 17 So moved. 18 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 19 So moved by Mr. Langley. 20 MS. BECNEL: 21 Seconded. 22 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 23 Seconded by Ms. Becnel. 24 Is there any discussion? 25 Any opposition?</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">8</p> <p>1 Hearing none, that motion carries, and 2 the minutes are approved. 3 Moving on to Item IV on our agenda, our 4 revenue reports. Good morning, Ms. Jackson. 5 MS. JACKSON: 6 Good morning, Chairman Hebert, Board 7 Members. My name is Donna Jackson with 8 Louisiana State Police Gaming Audit Section. 9 In September, the 15 operating 10 riverboats generated adjusted gross receipts 11 of \$131,735,955. The state collected fees 12 totaling \$28,323,230. 13 Adjusted gross receipts for fiscal year 14 '25-'26 to date are \$443.6 million, an 15 increase of \$28.6 million, or 7 percent, from 16 fiscal year '24-'25. As of September 30, 17 2025, the state has collected approximately 18 \$95.4 million in fees for fiscal year 19 '25-'26. 20 Page 2 shows the riverboat revenue 21 broken down by regional market. The overall 22 decrease from August was \$29 million, or 23 18 percent. As information, September had 24 four weekends compared to five full weekends 25 in August. Compared to last September, this</p>

<p style="text-align: right;">9</p> <p>1 month's revenues represent an increase of 2 \$2 million, or 1.6 percent. 3 Next is a summary of the September 2025 4 gaming activity for Caesars New Orleans, 5 found on page 3. Caesars generated 6 \$19,483,745 in gross gaming revenue. These 7 revenues represent a decrease from last month 8 of \$6.3 million, or 24.5 percent, but an 9 increase of approximately \$3.4 million, or 10 21 percent, from the same month last year. 11 During September, the state received 12 \$5,342,466 in minimum daily payments. 13 To date, adjusted gross receipts for 14 fiscal year '25-'26 are \$66.6 million, an 15 increase of \$13.9 million, or 26 percent, 16 from fiscal year '24-'25. As of 17 September 30, 2025, the state collected 18 \$16.4 million in fees for fiscal year 19 '25-'26. 20 Next, I will present the revenues for 21 slots at the racetracks. During September, 22 the four racetrack facilities combined 23 generated adjusted gross receipts of 24 \$23,633,331, a decrease of \$4.5 million, or 25 16 percent, from the previous month and a</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">10</p> <p>1 decrease of \$508,000, or 2 percent, when 2 compared to the same month last year. During 3 September, the state collected approximately 4 \$3.6 million in state fees. 5 To date, adjusted gross receipts for 6 fiscal year '25-'26 are \$78 million, an 7 increase of \$2.3 million, or 3 percent, from 8 fiscal year '24-'25. As of September 30, 9 2025, the state has collected \$11.8 million 10 in fees for fiscal year '25-'26. 11 I will now move to the video gaming 12 information. There are 12,438 video gaming 13 devices activated at 1,378 locations. Net 14 device revenue for September 2025 was 15 \$60,577,697, a decrease of \$4.8 million, or 16 7.3 percent, when compared to August, but an 17 increase of \$3.7 million, or 6.5 percent, 18 when compared to last September. 19 Total franchise fees for September were 20 \$18.2 million. Fiscal year to date net 21 device revenue is \$190.4 million, an increase 22 of \$11 million, or 6 percent, when compared 23 to last fiscal year. As of September 30, 24 2025, the state has collected \$57.4 million 25 in franchise fees for fiscal year '25-'26.</p>
<p style="text-align: right;">11</p> <p>1 Next, I will present the September 2 revenue for sportsbook. During September, 3 the retail sportsbooks accepted approximately 4 \$33.8 million in sports wagers, resulting in 5 net proceeds of almost \$3 million and 6 \$297,000 in state taxes. The mobile 7 sportsbooks accepted \$367.7 million in sports 8 wagers, resulting in net proceeds of \$44.2 9 million and \$9.5 million in taxes paid to the 10 state. 11 Finally, for Daily Fantasy Sports, gross 12 revenues for September were approximately 13 \$1.7 million, with net revenue of \$321,000 14 and taxes of \$25,700. 15 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 16 Okay. Board Members, do we have any 17 questions for Ms. Jackson? 18 Thank you, Ms. Jackson. 19 MS. JACKSON: 20 Thank you. 21 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 22 At this time, we will move on to Item V, 23 casino gaming issues. First up is a 24 consideration of the certificate of 25 compliance for the alternative riverboat</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">12</p> <p>1 inspection of the gaming vessel for 2 Louisiana-I Gaming, a Louisiana Partnership 3 in Commendam, doing business as Boomtown New 4 Orleans. 5 Good morning, gentlemen. 6 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS: 7 Good morning, Chairman Hebert. 8 Assistant Attorney General Kanick Lewis, Jr. 9 MR. FRANCIC: 10 Good morning, Chairman. John Francic 11 with AVS. 12 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS: 13 Again, good morning, Chairman Hebert and 14 Board Members. Mr. John Francic and I are 15 here today to discuss the issuance of 16 Louisiana-I Gaming, a Louisiana Partnership 17 in Commendam, doing business as Boomtown 18 Casino New Orleans, certificate of 19 compliance. 20 On September 4th, the inspection process 21 began for the annual certificate approval. 22 Deficiencies were found that needed 23 correction. AVS completed a follow-up 24 inspection on September 19th, and there were 25 no deficiencies noted. We request, upon the</p>

<p style="text-align: right;">13</p> <p>1 Board accepting the report submitted by AVS, 2 you will move for the issuance of Boomtown 3 New Orleans' certificate of compliance which 4 expires on October 31 of 2026. 5 Mr. Francic will now provide details of 6 that inspection. 7 MR. FRANCIC: 8 Chairman and Board Members, I'm here 9 today to present the results of the 2025 10 annual hull and life safety examination for 11 Boomtown New Orleans Casino. 12 On September 4th, AVS inspectors Pete 13 Bullard and Billy Taylor conducted the 14 required annual inspection of Boomtown Casino 15 in accordance with Louisiana Gaming 16 Alternative Inspection Program. The 17 inspection included comprehensive review of 18 key safety systems. The team evaluated five 19 protection measures. They verified egress 20 routes, observation of the emergency 21 lighting, tested the emergency generator, 22 examined the mooring systems, and oversaw 23 fire drill and other required life safety 24 elements addressed during this visit. 25 The initial deficiencies identified in</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">14</p> <p>1 the inspection were documented in the annual 2 report of September 5. A follow-up exam was 3 conducted on September 19th, to confirm the 4 corrected actions. These updates were 5 formally recorded in the September 30th 6 report. The 2025 annual survey required by 7 Louisiana Gaming Control Board is now 8 considered complete and is fit to continue 9 operating as a dockside gaming riverboat in 10 the State of Louisiana. It is the 11 professional recommendation by AVS that 12 Boomtown Casino be issued a certificate of 13 compliance for 2025. 14 If you have any questions, I'll be happy 15 to answer them. 16 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 17 Board members, do we have any questions 18 for Mr. Francic or Mr. Lewis? 19 If not, I will entertain a motion to 20 issue an annual certificate of compliance 21 which expires on October 31st of 2026. 22 MR. FRANCIC: 14 Thank you. 15 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 16 Item B under casino gaming issues is the 17 consideration of the certificate of 18 compliance for the riverboat gaming temporary 19 landside facility of Catfish Queen, LLC, 20 doing business as Belle of Baton Rouge. 21 You may proceed. 22 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL LEWIS: 23 Good morning, Chairman Hebert and Board 24 Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General 25 Kanick Lewis, Jr. I'm here in the matter of</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">16</p> <p>1 the issuance of certificate of compliance for 2 Catfish Queen, LLC, doing business as Belle 3 of Baton Rouge. 4 On September 18th, the Louisiana State 5 Fire Marshal began the inspection process for 6 the approval of Belle of Baton Rouge Casino's 7 annual certificate of compliance. At the 8 time of the initial inspection, there were 9 deficiencies noted. The property corrected 10 those issues, and the fire marshal completed 11 a follow-up inspection later that day. The 12 Board has a copy of those reports. And as 13 you can see, there were no issues found at 14 the time of the reinspection. I now present 15 these findings to the Board and request that, 16 upon the Board accepting the report as 17 submitted by the state fire marshal, you will 18 move for the issuance of Belle of Baton Rouge 19 Casino's certificate of compliance, which 20 will expire on October 31st of 2026. 21 I'll be happy to answer any questions if 22 you have them. 23 CHAIRMAN HEBERT: 24 Board members, do we have any questions 25 for Mr. Lewis?</p>

I'm Assistant Attorney General</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">18</p> <p>1 Matthew Meek, appearing in the matter of the 2 original application of 5303 Paris, LLC, 3 doing business as Paris Casino, for a Type 5 4 video draw poker license. 5 The truck stop facility is located in 6 St. Bernard Parish. Quality Inn Motel, QI 7 Truck Stop, Inc., doing business as Lucky 8 Bayou, previously operated the truck stop 9 facility. The applicant has submitted an 10 original application for a Type 5 video draw 11 poker gaming license for this location. The 12 applicant has contracted with Lucky Coin 13 Machine Co., LLC to operate the devices at 14 this truck stop facility. Geocor Properties, 15 LLC and Academy Drive Development, LLC each 16 hold a 50 percent membership interest in the 17 applicant. The individuals that make up 18 those two LLCs can be found in your board 19 packet. 20 Investigator Glenn Barrett inspected the 21 proposed truck stop facility and conducted 22 updated suitability investigations of the 23 associated person. He is present this 24 morning to report his findings to the Board. 25 Following his presentation, the Board will</p>
<p style="text-align: right;">19</p> <p>1 need a motion and vote to approve or deny the 2 original application of 5303 Paris, LLC, 3 doing business as Paris Casino. 4 MR. BARRETT: 5 Good morning, Mr. Chairman, Board 6 Members. I'm Criminal Investigator Glen 7 Barrett with Louisiana State Police Gaming 8 Enforcement Division. 9 I conducted updated suitability 10 investigations on John D. Georges, Dathel C. 11 Georges, Gabriel Corchiani, George J. Ackel, 12 III, Adam A. Ackel, Alexander A. Ackel, and 13 Alana A. Tallo. I did not find any 14 information that would preclude them from 15 continuing to participate in the video gaming 16 industry. 17 An offsite investigation was conducted, 18 and it was determined that the establishment 19 meets all criteria set forth in video gaming 20 law as a qualified truck stop facility. The 21 truck park area can accommodate 50 22 tractor-trailers. The travel lanes are 23 constructed of concrete and meets the 24 requirements for ingress and egress. The 25 applicant is contracted with a maintenance</p>	<p style="text-align: right;">20</p> <p>1 service for truck repairs. The facility is 2 equipped with a separate truckers television 3 lounge, a full service laundry facility, 4 private showers for men and women, and has 5 convenience store that sells trucker 6 supplies. Facility has five fuel storage 7 tanks, and all required licenses and permits 8 were posted and valid at the time of 9 inspection. The establishment consists of 10 5.892 contiguous acres. 11 The applicant submitted a video draw 12 poker license application within 36 months at 13 the location, the last being licensed as a 14 qualified truck stop facility, which was held 15 by the Quality Inn Motel, QI Truck Stop, 16 Inc., doing business as Lucky Bayou. 17 Therefore, it is not subject to the rule that 18 it must be at least 1 mile distance from a 19 school, church, playground, synagogue, public 20 library, residence, and buildings on the 21 National Historic Registry. 22 I found no information that would 23 preclude the issuance of a Type 5 video draw 24 poker gaming license to 5303 Paris, LLC, 25 doing business as Paris Casino.</p>

Please identify</p> <p>4 yourselves for the record.</p> <p>5 ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL JONES:</p> <p>6 Good morning, Chairman Hebert and Board</p> <p>7 Members. I'm Assistant Attorney General Bria</p> <p>8 Jones, appearing before you this morning for</p> <p>9 the approval of the transfer of membership</p> <p>10 interest in Red River Casino, LLC, doing</p> <p>11 business as Red River Casino. The truck stop</p> <p>12 is located in Bossier Parish.</p> <p>13 On August 11, 2025, Gulhamrasool Rupani,</p> <p>14 who was the sole member, transferred</p> <p>15 5 percent of his membership interest in the</p> <p>16 licensee to Rahim Amin Rupani.
