PUBLIC COMMENT 8 CHAIRMAN NOEL: We have a quorum. 9 thank you. 10 At this time we'll go ahead and ask 11 if there's any Public Comment on any 12 matter before the Board today. [No 13 response.] 14 III. APPROVAL OF MINUETS 15 CHAIRMAN NOEL: Seeing none, we'll 16 move on to the next item, Approval of 17 the Minutes. I'd ask for a motion to 18 waive the reading and approve the 19 October 19, 2020 minutes. By Miss Berry 20 and seconded by Mr. Avant. All in favor say "aye." [Collective 21 22 "aye."] Any opposed? No opposition, 23 the motion carries. Thank you. 24 IV. REVENUE REPORTS 25 CHAIRMAN NOEL: All right, next on 10 1 the agenda is our monthly Revenue 2 Reports with Miss Jackson from State 3 Police.

MS. JACKSON: Good morning, Chairman

Noel, Board Members. My name is Donna

4

6	Jackson with the Louisiana State Police
7	Gaming Enforcement Division.
8	As you know, gaming licensees
9	continue to operate subject to COVID-19
10	restrictions. Also, some casinos closed
11	several days during October due to the
12	effects of Hurricanes Delta and Zeta.
13	Isle of Capri Lake Charles remains
14	closed due to damage it sustained in
15	Hurricane Laura.
16	During October, the operating
17	riverboats generated Adjusted Gross
18	Receipts of \$115,637,529. This total
19	represents an increase of \$21.3 million
20	or 22.6 percent from September 2020, but
21	a decrease of \$21.2 million or 15.5 from
22	last October.
23	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
24	year 2021 to date are \$460 million, a
25	decrease of over \$127 million or
	11
1	22 percent from fiscal year 2020.
2	During October, the State collected
3	fees totaling \$24,862,069. As of
4	October 31st, 2020, that State has
5	collected \$99 million in fees for fiscal
6	year 2021.
7	Next is a summary of the October

2020 gaming activity for Harrah's New

9	Orleans found on page three. Harrah's
10	generated \$13,913,855 in gross gaming
11	revenue during October. These revenues
12	represent a minimal increase of
13	\$1.2 percent from September but a
14	decrease of approximately \$9 million or
15	39.2 percent from last October.
16	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
17	year 2021 to date is \$52.4 million, a
18	decrease of or \$38.3 million or 42
19	percent from fiscal year 2020.
20	During October, the State received
21	\$5,095,890 in minimum daily payments.
22	As of October 31st, 2020, the State
23	collected approximately \$20 million in
24	fees for fiscal year 2021.
25	Next I'll present the revenues for
	12
1	Slots at the Racetracks. During
2	October, the four racetrack facilities
3	combined generated Adjusted Gross
4	Receipts of \$22,712,822, an increase of
5	\$4.8 million or 26.6 percent from last
6	month, but a decrease of \$2.7 million or
7	10.8 percent from last October.
8	Adjusted Gross Receipts for fiscal
9	year 2021 to date are \$91.9 million, a
10	decrease of \$18 million or 16 percent
11	from fiscal year 2020.

12	During October, the State collected
13	\$3.4 million in fees. As of
14	October 31st, 2020, the State has
15	collected \$13.9 in fees for fiscal year
16	2021.
17	Are there any questions before I
18	present the Video Gaming Statistics?
19	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions? No
20	questions. Thank you.
21	MS. JACKSON: Thirteen video gaming
22	licenses were issued in October: Ten
23	bars and three restaurants. Seven new
24	video gaming applications were received
25	by the Gaming Enforcement Division
	13
1	during October and are currently pending
2	in the field: Six bars and one device
3	owner.
4	The Gaming Enforcement Division
5	assessed \$500 in fines but did not
6	receive any fines in October. There are
7	presently \$3,250 in outstanding civil
8	penalties. Please refer to page two of
9	your handout.
10	There are currently 12,546 video
11	gaming devices activated at 1,559
12	locations.
13	Net device revenue for October 2020
14	was \$54.6 million, a \$200,000 increase

15	or three-tenths of 1 percent when
16	compared to September 2020, and
17	\$4.2 [sic] million increase or
18	8.8 percent when compared to October
19	2019.
20	Net device revenue to date for
21	fiscal year 2021 is \$225.2 million, a
22	\$24.9 million, or 12.4 percent, increase
23	when compared to fiscal year 2020. Page
24	three of your handout shows a comparison
25	of the net device revenue.
	14
1	Total franchise collected during
2	October 2020 were \$16.6 million, no
3	change when compared to September 2020,
4	and a \$1.6 million increase when
5	compared to October 2019.
6	Total franchise fees collected for
7	fiscal year 2021 are \$68.6 million, an
8	\$8.6 million increase, or 14.4 percent,
9	when compared to fiscal year 2020. Page
10	four of your handout shows a comparison
11	of the franchise fees.
12	Are there any questions?
13	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions? [No
14	response.]
15	Thank you, Miss Jackson.
16	MS. JACKSON: Thank you.

17 V. COMPLIANCE REPORTS

18	CHAIRMAN NOEL: We'll move to Item V
19	on the agenda, Compliance Reports. Ms.
20	Murray.
21	Just as a note to the Board Members,
22	we have had some discussions about maybe
23	trying to simplify the report, keep the
24	base data but something that may be
25	easier to follow during the board
	15
1	meeting and highlight those areas of
2	emphasis. Thank you.
3	Ms. Murray.
4	MS. MURRAY: Good morning, Chairman
5	Noel, Board Members. I'm Assistant
6	Attorney General Alonna Murray. Today
7	I'll present the staff reports on
8	riverboat and racetrack casino
9	licensees' compliance with the
10	employment and procurement conditions
11	for the third quarter of 2020.
12	I'll begin with riverboat. These
13	reports are taken from figures reported
14	by the 15 operating riverboats to the
15	Louisiana Gaming Control Board. In the
16	third quarter of 2020, approximately
17	8,871 people were employed by the
18	riverboat industry. Of that number
19	8,743 were Louisiana residents; 5,312
20	were minorities and 4.878 were women.

21	One licensee achieved total compliance
22	this quarter, Golden Nugget.
23	Next I'll address employment.
24	Twelve licensees did not meet their
25	total employment goals, and they are:
	16
1	DiamondJacks Casino & Resort, which
2	achieved 51 out of a goal of 650; Sam's
3	Town Hotel & Casino, which achieved 375
4	out of a goal of 700; L'Auberge Baton
5	Rouge, which achieved 625 out of a goal
6	of 800; Horseshoe Casino & Hotel, which
7	achieved 973 out of a goal of 1,000;
8	Boomtown New Orleans, which achieved 362
9	out of a goal of 555; Belle of Baton
10	Rouge Casino, which achieved 165 out of
11	a goal of 450; Treasure Chest Casino,
12	which achieved 314 out of a goal of 500;
13	Hollywood Casino, which achieved 308 out
14	of a goal of 450; Amelia Belle, which
15	achieved 165 out of a goal of 325; Isle
16	of Capri, Casino & Hotel, which achieved
17	600 out of a goal of 650; Boomtown
18	Bossier, which achieved 246 out of a
19	goal of 650; Eldorado Casino Resort,
20	which achieved 475 a out of a goal of
21	950. All licensees except for Treasure
22	Chest Casino either met or exceeded
23	their goals in all of the subcategories

24	out of the main category of employment.
25	45.2 percent of Treasure Chest Casino's
	17
1	employees were women. They have a goal
2	of 51.86 percent.
3	Next I'll address procurement. The
4	licensees are grouped according to three
5	subcategories which appear in your
6	report. Those subcategories are
7	Louisiana, minority and female
8	procurement. Under Louisiana
9	procurement, seven licensees did not
10	achieve total compliance with its
11	voluntary conditions. Those licensees
12	are Boomtown New Orleans, which achieved
13	72.6 percent out of a goal of
14	80 percent; Treasure Chest Casino, which
15	achieved 58.7 percent out of a goal of
16	75 percent; Hollywood Casino, which
17	achieved 70.8 percent out of a goal of
18	80 percent; Amelia Belle, which achieved
19	56.6 percent out of a goal of
20	80 percent; Isle of Capri Casino, which
21	achieved 51.7 percent out of a goal of
22	60 percent; Margaritaville Resort
23	Casino, which achieved 89.6 out of a
24	goal of 90 percent, and L'Auberge Lake
25	Charles, which achieved 73 percent out

1	of a goal of 80 percent.
2	Under the subcategory of minority
3	procurement, six licensees did not
4	achieve compliance with their voluntary
5	conditions. Those licensees are:
6	DiamondJacks Casino, which achieved
7	.4 percent out of a goal of 10 percent;
8	Sam's Town Casino & Hotel, which
9	achieved 7.5 out of a goal of 25
10	percent; Horseshoe Casino & Hotel, which
11	achieved 13.9 percent out of a goal of
12	35 percent; Boomtown New Orleans, which
13	achieved 13.5 percent out of a goal of
14	15 percent; Belle of Baton Rouge, which
15	achieved 11 percent out of a goal of
16	13 [sic] percent, and Eldorado Casino,
17	which achieved 16.9 percent out of 25
18	percent.
19	Under the subcategory of female
20	procurement, three licensees did not
21	achieve compliance with their voluntary
22	conditions, and those licensees are:
23	DiamondJacks Casino, which achieved 9.6
24	percent out of a goal of 10 percent;
25	Horseshoe Casino & Hotel, which achieved
	19
1	18.7 percent out of a goal of
2	35 percent, and Boomtown New Orleans,
3	which achieved 12.2 percent out of a

4	goal of 15 percent.
5	Are there any questions regarding
6	the riverboats?
7	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions? [No
8	response.] Please proceed.
9	MS. MURRAY: I will now move on to
10	the racetracks. In the third quarter of
11	2020, approximately 1,028 people were
12	employed by the racetrack casino
13	industry. Of that number, 840 were
14	Louisiana residents, 500 were minorities
15	and 605 were women.
16	Two racetrack casinos achieved total
17	compliance this quarter, and they are
18	Evangeline Downs and Fairgrounds. Delta
19	Downs did not achieve its Louisiana
20	employment condition. It achieved
21	56 percent out of their 80 percent
22	condition. And Louisiana Downs did not
23	achieve its female employment condition.
24	It achieved 58 percent out of their
25	60 percent condition. Louisiana Downs
	20
1	also did not achieve its minority
2	procurement condition. It achieved 4.5
3	percent out of the 6 percent condition.
4	Are there any questions regarding
5	the racetracks?
6	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions? [No

7	response.]
8	MS. MURRAY: Thank you.
9	CHAIRMAN NOEL: I had asked Mr. Wade
LO	Duty with the Casino Association to come
l1	up briefly and just kind of give us a
12	picture particularly over the last nine
L3	months being in COVID restrictions, a
L4	picture of procurement challenges and
L5	any other challenges.
L6	MR. DUTY: Good morning, Board
L7	Members, Wade Duty, Executive Director
L8	of Louisiana Casino Association. To
19	start off and I'll make this as brief
20	as possible because I understand you
21	have a full agenda I think there's
22	really three things we need to consider.
23	The first being that these goals were
24	voluntary in nature, and they were set
25	primarily during the 1993 and 1996
	21
1	licensing phases. So in 1993, gas was
2	\$1.11, the cost of a new car was
3	\$12,000, and it would be another 14
4	years before the first i-Phone was
5	introduced. These goals have remained
6	largely static since then. So at some
7	point in the future, it would probably
8	be appropriate to revisit some of the
9	goal parameters and bring them more in

10	line with the economic realities of
11	Louisiana.
12	Step two, hurricanes. Many of our
13	suppliers were adversely affected by the
14	4,327 hurricanes that struck Louisiana
15	this year, and they did not come back.
16	I make light of the fact that we've had
17	a number or hurricanes, but not light of
18	the fact that it has materially affected
19	many of our suppliers, particularly
20	minority business enterprises.
21	The third thing is, of course,
22	COVID. What we have learned as we have
23	dug into this issue for this particular
24	phase of the discussion is that the
25	areas that we draw most heavily upon,
	22
1	particularly minority business
2	enterprises, are the exact areas that we
3	are also prohibited from operating in.
4	So, for example, restaurants, the
5	buffets, alcohol service, those are all
6	high volume, high dollar locations that
7	we have been able to fill those
8	necessities using a lot of vendors
9	obviously, Louisiana vendors, and for
10	those we have been extremely restricted
11	because of COVID limitations. As you
12	recall restaurants were closed casinos

13 were closed, and then when we were 14 allowed to reopen, it was on extremely limited basis, 25 percent of your 15 16 occupancy and then later ramping up to 17 50 percent. Alcohol service, as you're 18 aware, is now terminated in Louisiana at 19 11:00 p.m., and that has also materially 20 affected our consumption. 21 I reached out to a couple of the 22 companies and got kind of a snapshot of where we are, and I'll provide those 23 24 numbers for you; and that should give 25 you kind of a sense of where we are. 23

1 Our food consumption is down 44 percent; 2 beverage is down 45 percent; 3 entertainment and equipment expenses in 4 some locations is down 98 percent. Why? 5 Because you don't do concerts; you don't 6 have bands and you close the bars, so a 7 lot of these areas that we traditionally 8 have been able to meet our goals through 9 are not operating venues. Restaurant 10 supplies, disposable equipment, small 11 wear down 68 percent, percent. Printing 12 player's cards, logos and uniforms down 13 54 percent. Linen usage down 52 14 percent. This also is in conjunction 15 with our reduced occupancy in our hotels

16	because people are staying closer to
17	home. They're not traveling. Dry
18	cleaning and wardrobe down 60 percent.
19	So, again, that I think is pretty
20	representative because this
21	predominantly came from an operator
22	that's got properties throughout the
23	state, but the short takeaway is that we
24	are continuing to work through this. We
25	are having to shift distributors and
	24
1	suppliers, particularly those that were
2	based in Lake Charles. For example,
3	Oasis Goods, Oracle Foods and Freshko
4	are either not operating, or they have
5	canceled most of the programs for 2020
6	and not looking to place things for
7	2021. That's primarily a function of
8	hurricane damage. So we are hopeful and
9	we are expectant that some will return
10	to resume operations, but we are
11	awaiting that word, as I'm sure they are
12	as they work with their insurers and try
13	and get their staff.
14	You've already heard from the
15	properties about the difficulties in
16	staffing, particularly in southwest
17	Louisiana because so many private homes
18	were obliterated or heavily damaged.

19	Those people have been displaced. So
20	the job may be available, but you don't
21	have people to put in it. And I'm not
22	talking about for the casinos. I'm
23	talking about for our vendors. So
24	that's kind of where we are.
25	I would like to end on a happier
	25
1	note about where do we go from here.
2	And, again, we are pivoting. We remain
3	extremely mindful of the necessity of
4	trying to source from Louisiana. Our
5	current administrative rules define a
6	vendor for these purposes as one being
7	located in Louisiana, and as you're
8	aware, Louisiana is not an island. It's
9	many times easier to source out of
10	Houston or easier to source out of
11	Memphis or Dallas, but we still are
12	working to keep those dollars spent in
13	Louisiana. So that's kind of where we
14	are.
15	I'll be happy field any questions
16	that the Board Members may have.
17	CHAIRMAN NOEL: Any questions? [No
18	response.]
19	I appreciate Wade giving us that
20	snapshot of where the impact over the
21	past months with the hurricanes and

- 22 COVID and what we're hopefully doing
- 23 moving forward. I know the Association
- and the licensees have always taken this
- as a very serious matter. I know you

- 1 usually a few times a year had job fairs
- 2 or at least events to try and bring
- 3 vendors and the licensees together. I
- 4 know that's difficult right now, I
- 5 believe. I appreciate it.
- 6 MR. DUTY: All right, thank you.

1 Gaubert Oil Company, Incorporated,

2	is the 100 percent owner and sole member
3	of the Type 5 video gaming licensees,
4	Gaubert Food Marts, Incorporated, and
5	Ortego Oil & Supply Company, LLC.
6	On May 22nd, 2020, Gaubert Oil
7	Company, Incorporated, redeemed Nolan J.
8	Gaubert, II's, 131.6667 shares and Jane
9	Gaubert Griffin's 131.6666 shares.
10	Together their shares of stock equated
11	to a 44.183439 ownership interest in
